36th Annual Report of GHANSHYAMDAS SARAF COLLEGE

Ghanshyamdas Saraf College was established in 1983 and has achieved many milestones in its journey of three decades. The college is imparting value based education through seven undergraduate and three Post Graduate programmes. The student strength today stands at 5015. Our college has been accredited by NAAC twice with A Grade and our CGPA was 3.23

I have great pleasure to present here some of the significant activities conducted during the academic year.

IQAC

- Our Internal Quality Assurance cell conducted One Day International Inter- Disciplinary Conference in collaboration with ACCA (Association of Chartered Certified Accountants), a U.K – based global body for professional accountants. Mr. Mohammed Sajid Khan, Head of International Development, ACCA was the Chief Guest and key – note speaker. Mr Dinesh Jangid of KPMG was another speaker.
- A research journal was released on the occasion with research papers contributed by 157 research scholars. The conference was attended by over 150 delegates from various places.

Research Cell

- Research Proposals of three students in Commerce and one in Economics are approved by the University. Their theses work in in progress.
- Three more proposals under commerce are being processed.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell and Skill academy

- This cell plays a key role in providing job opportunities to the students. This year, so far 42 students have been selected for full time job opportunities with companies like Kotak Mahindra Bank, Reliance Group.
- Besides these, 37 students have been selected for Internship opportunities with companies like Aditya Birla Capital, IIFL.
- The placement cell also works at making our students improve their skills and improve their employability . Saraf college has joined hands with a Govt Body, Skill Development & Vocational Training Institute to offer job-oriented certificate courses in E Taxation & GST Practices and Procedures.
- A course to prepare students for Banking Sector Exams and Youth Employability Skills Program by Technoserve were also undertaken. In addition, training on Appearance, Body Language and Communication Skills and a CASI Global Certificate Course in CSR were arranged.
- Two days workshop on GST in association with ICAI and various sessions on Investor Awareness, Financial Literacy, Mutual Funds etc. were conducted in the year. More than 500 students took advantage of these programmes.

NSS

- NSS volunteers participated in the Yoga workshop and International Yoga day at University of Mumbai, also in Flag Collection Rally and in the Red Ribbon Club Workshop aimed at creating awareness about HIV and AIDS in society.
- Volunteers launched a community based project in Punarvas School Goregaon(w) where student volunteers interacted with mentally challenged children.
- A Blood Donation Drive was organized wherein 90 units of blood were collected.
- A Residential NSS Camp was organized at Karvale village, Saphale. Cleanliness programme, awareness sessions, leadership activities, skill development activities were conducted for NSS volunteers at the campsite.

NCC

- NCC unit of the college witnessed a change of guard during the year. Major Deepika Chatterjee retired after 28 years

of her service as NCC in charge and Dr Rupa Shah took charge as a CTO.

- Our NCC cadets won 1st Prize in Drill Competition held at Ismail Yusuf College. Our cadets participated in many social activities like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Beach Cleaning Drive, Slum area cleanliness drive, ODF awareness rally.
- Surgical Strike Day was celebrated by NCC cadets with a presentation by CEO Capt Yadnik for our NCC cadets.

DLLE

- Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension aims to instill a Sense of Community and belonging through various activities. 175 students enrolled this year and conducted several activities.
- Tree plantation drive was undertaken and saplings of Neem, Mango etc. were planted at Ambedkar Garden, Goregaon.
- Food packets were distributed to Cancer patients and their relatives near Wadia hospital.
- Friendship Day was celebrated with Special children of Punarvas School.
- World Literacy Day was celebrated with the students of BMC School by providing them with Study Kits and interacting with them.
- Workshops on personality development, Financial Planning and breast cancer awareness were arranged.
- To make students understand the concept of small scale business and increase self reliance, a food festival was organized where the students put up food stalls of home made food.
- Students participated in the HOSH Walkathon at Shivaji Park organized by Amba Gopal foundation in association with DLLE, Mumbai University.

Cultural Association

- Cultural Association has always been extremely active with various competitions like Mehendi, on the spot painting, rangoli, cartooning, clay modelling, antakshari.
- A talent hunt programme was arranged to identify best talents in solo singing and solo dance.
- Mauj is a flagship event of Cultural association which is an annual intercollegiate fest The theme of this year's Mauj was 'The Unbounded Imagination' 35 competitive events & 05 gaming events were held.
- The fest received an overwhelming response and was attended by 1200+ participants with 2000+ footfalls from various colleges across Mumbai SHARDA CROP CHEM LIMITED were the Title sponsor

Sports

- Intra College indoor and outdoor events were organized which received an excellent response. More than 500 students participated in these events.
- Annual sports day was held at Goregaon sports club where around 375 students took part.
- Students participated in 21 University level events like Kabaddi, badminton, Chess etc.
- Girls Kabbadi team won the University Gold Medal and 3 of the players from the team Pranali Nagdeote, Sayali Jhadav and Pratiksha Madavkar was selected to play in the University national Team.

E Cell

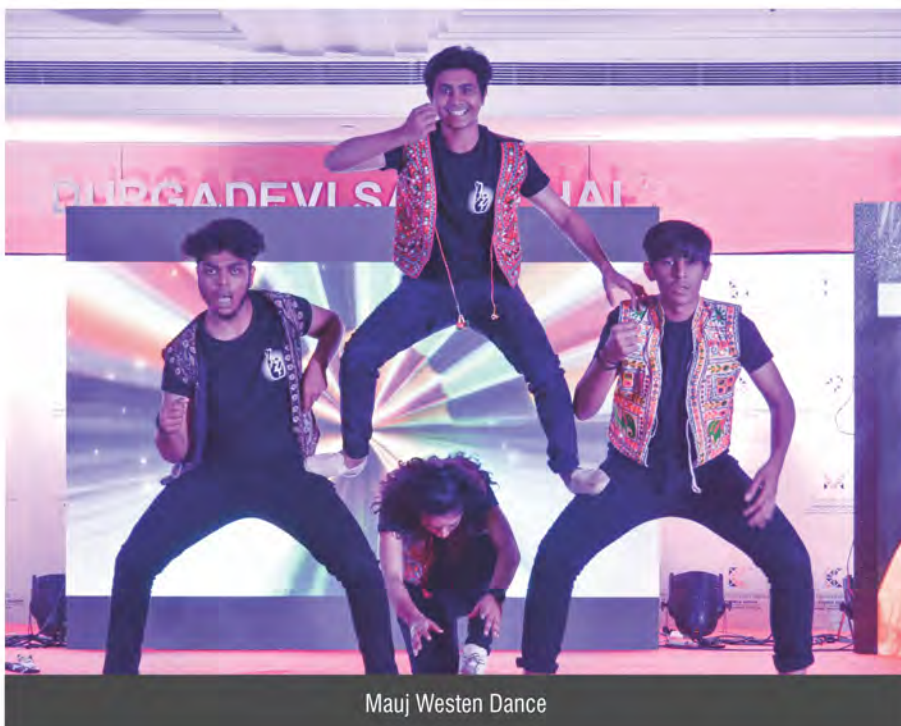

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT COMMITTEE

Career Guidance and Placement Cell plays a pivotal role in providing job opportunities to the students. This year, so far around 140 students have been selected for full time job opportunities with companies like Kotak Mahindra Bank, Reliance Group, Axis Securities, Datamatics, Capital First, Capgemini, L&T, Infosys, Wipro, HR Reflections, ICICI Prudential, Sutherland Global Services, Epicenter Technologies, Asit C Mehta Investment Intermediaries Ltd., HDB Financial Services, Redreamz, Reliance Smart, P3 Architectural Solutions, Karvy, TCS etc.

Moreover, around 75 students have been selected for Internship opportunities with companies like Aditya Birla Capital, IIFL, HR Reflections, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Future Generali India, etc.

This year we offered various add on courses and conducted workshops for developing the skills of the students. We are happy to share that 75 students completed Certificate Course in E Taxation, 68 students completed Certificate Course in GST Practices and Procedures which are offered in association with SDVTII. Moreover, 42 students took Preparatory Classes for Banking Sector Exams organised in association with SSB Educational Trust. 101 students completed Youth Employability Skills Program by Technoserve. 60 students did 3 days training on Appearance, Body Language and Communication Skills (ABC) by At Patshala. 23 students pursued CASI Global Certificate Course. Two days workshop on GST in association with ICAI was attended by 90 students. 47 students completed Certificate Program in Financial Markets – Sales and Operations offered by BSE Institute. 24 students completed training for NISM Module VA related with Mutual Funds which was offered in association with FPA. Moreover, various sessions on Investor Awareness, Financial Literacy, Mutual Funds etc., Career Guidance were also conducted in the year. The highlight of the year was Job fair wherein 343 students participated.

Details of the activities conducted during the year is as follows:

1) Workshop on GST

Career Guidance and Placement Cell of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College in association with Career Counselling Cell of ICAI organized two days workshop on GST for the TY students of B.Com and BCAAF on July 7 and 8, 2018.

On July 7, 2018 CA Archit Agarwal and CA Manoj Chauhan addressed the students. CA Archit's talk helped students in understanding need for GST, Constitutional Amendment, Features of GST, Implications of GST, Transition to GST from existing practices, Tax Rates under GST and Return Filing under GST.

What is creative visualization?

Creative visualization is the technique of using your imagination to create what you want in your life. There is nothing at all new, strange, or unusual about creative visualization. You are already using it every day, every minute in fact. It is your natural power of imagination, the basic creative energy of the universe, which you use constantly, whether or not you are aware of it.

In the past, many of us have used our power of creative visualization in a relatively unconscious way. Because of our own deep-seated negative concepts about life, we have automatically and unconsciously accepted and imagined lack, limitation, difficulties and problems to be our lot in life. To one degree or another that is what we have created for ourselves.

➤ **Three necessary elements of creative visualization**

There are three elements within you that determine how successfully creative visualization will work for you in any given situation:

1. **Desire:** You must have a true desire to have or create that which you have chosen to visualize. Ask yourself, "Do I truly, in my heart, desire this goal to be realized?"
2. **Belief:** The more you believe in your chosen goal and the possibility of attaining it, the more certain you will be to do so. Ask yourself, "Do I believe that this goal can exist?" and "do I believe that it is possible for me to realize or attain it?"
3. **Acceptance:** You must be willing to accept and have which you are seeking. Sometimes we pursue goals without actually wanting to attain them. We are more comfortable with the process of pursuing. Ask yourself, "Am I really completely willing to have this?"

The sum total of these three elements is what I call your intention to create something—that is, you deeply desire it, you completely believe that you can do it, and you are totally willing to have it ---it is very likely to manifest in your life in one way or another.

The clearer and stronger your intention, the more quickly and easily your creative visualization will work. In any given situation, ask yourself about the condition of your intension. If it is weak or uncertain look more deeply to see what your doubts, fears, conflict or concerns may be. Sometimes your hesitations may be an indication of feelings and beliefs that need to be acknowledged and healed. In some cases, hesitation may be an indication that this is not a truly appropriate goal for you.
