I am confident that with all such facilities that we offer, our institutions will transform the potential of the young minds into successful careers resulting in national development. I therefore

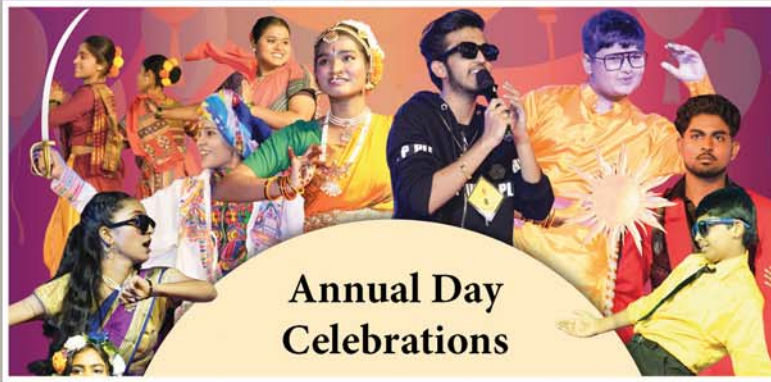

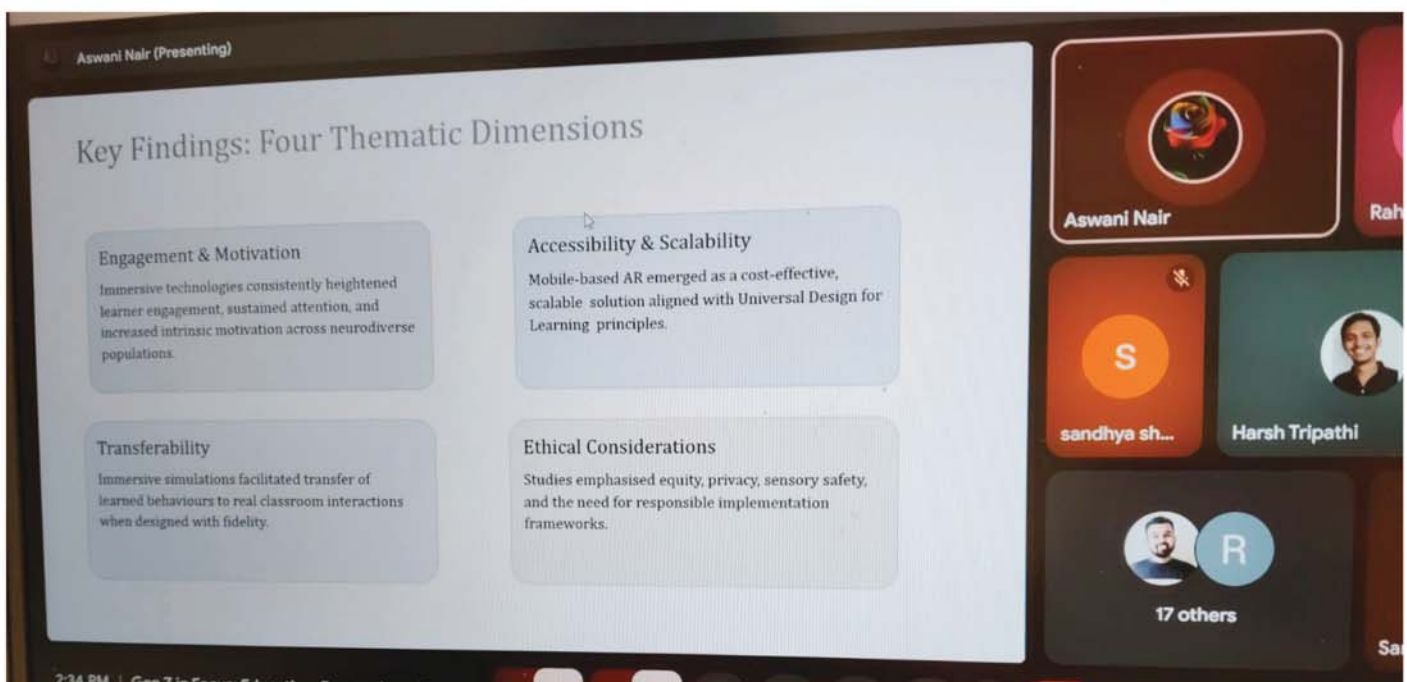
available relief measures, and the procedures for seeking legal help.

**New Initiatives:**

**Software development & updates activities:**

- Changes/Updates were done in Gold Academy's LMS MCQ Test module & Subjective Test modules.

- Emails for security logs and other reports were not triggered from the local system. The issue has been resolved after rebooting the system. The team has been informed to keep the system powered on 24/7.
- SMTP was not working on the existing server. A sample application was created and tested on another system configured with a different SMTP server, where the solution worked successfully. The same setup was then tested on multiple systems and worked correctly, except on the

existing server. Antivirus settings and firewall rules were checked on the server.

- SMTP was configured with the help of IT team and testing was carried out successfully. However, despite the SMTP configuration working, the Task Scheduler on the server was not functioning properly, and scheduled email jobs were not executing as expected.
- Email shooter was not working from local system, issues persist, triggered application manually but not working, same case discussed with IT team and were asked to check firewall and other settings.
- Generated LMS DB backup copy and stored it into AZURE container.
- Email shooter Mails are not working due to SMTP issue, as discussed, new server was given to configure and migrate 172.16.16.51 server data to new server, informed team to install necessary applications and setup the server.
- LMS related updates done and taken regular backup and stored it in local system.
- Altius server migration has been started with installing required application and found new server performance issues, so migration stopped immediately and informed IT team to change or upgrade the system.

- New updates, changes in syllabus and announcements sent to registered users.
- MCQ's test related queries were resolved through email and phone support.
- Renewal mails and SMS were sent to the existing FY and SY B.Com students for admissions in SY & TY B.Com.
- Regular SMS & E-mails were sent to all registered students regarding new updates/changes.
- Promotional SMS & E-mails were sent to new students regarding subscription for B. Com Online Courses.
- YouTube Video Promotion and Face book Post were created and published.

Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel is marching ahead successfully towards its commitment to excellence by providing all amenities as well as safe and secured stay to the students in the hostel. The hostel is under the vigilant care of the Rector Shri V. Sarweswaran. There are other hostel staff who always take care of the comfort and safety of the inmates. The security staff stationed at the Boys' Hostel perform their duty with full punctuality and dedication while the house keeping staff keep the hostel spic and span by cleaning of all the areas at frequent intervals. Students are provided breakfast and dinner by the in-house caterer of the Trust.

During the period October to December 2025, Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys Hostel functioned efficiently with a strong emphasis on student welfare, discipline, safety, and infrastructure maintenance. The hostel maintained full occupancy with a sanctioned strength of 152 students (152/152) throughout the quarter. All facilities provided earlier to the students were continued in this quarter. For the safety and security of the students staying in the hostel, suitable fire detection and fire fighting system has been provided in the building. CCTVs are also installed for 24 x 7 security

### Student Strength & Retention

The hostel recorded excellent student retention and health & hygiene progression during the reporting period:

- Nearly 80% of students renewed their hostel stay extension for the academic period January 2026 to June 2026 and completed payments in time.
- About 20% of students successfully completed their academic programs and secured placements in reputed companies in Mumbai and Pune, reflecting positive academic and career outcomes.

### Infrastructure & Renovation Work

Significant maintenance and renovation activities were carried out to improve living conditions and safety:

- Complete painting work was undertaken for all rooms from the 7th floor to the 1st floor, enhancing the overall appearance and hygiene of the hostel.
- Air-conditioning issues were attended to and rectified ensuring minimal inconvenience to students.
- Nearly seven exhaust fans in restrooms were replaced due to damage caused by water ingress during the rainy season.

- Geyser switches were replaced in approximately four restrooms to ensure electrical safety and uninterrupted hot water supply.
- Main door handle and door closer issues were also rectified by replacing the old ones.
- An additional safety latch was fixed for all cupboards in every room, improving durability and student safety.
- The emergency exit staircase and safety grills of the terrace were painted with 2 coats as a part of periodical maintenance.

### Housekeeping, Hygiene & Utilities

To maintain high standards of cleanliness and hygiene:

- A new housekeeping agency was deployed to ensure improved hostel hygiene and routine cleaning.
- All sofas were thoroughly cleaned with the coordinated efforts of the carpenter and housekeeping staff.
- All water cooler filters were replaced, and complete servicing was carried out on all eight coolers, ensuring safe drinking water for students.
- Wi-Fi router extension issues were also resolved, restoring uninterrupted internet connectivity.

The hostel administration ensured:

- Regular monitoring of discipline, attendance, and cleanliness.
- Prompt resolution of student grievances related to accommodation, facilities, and services.
- A secure, supportive, and student-friendly environment conducive to academic focus and personal well-being.

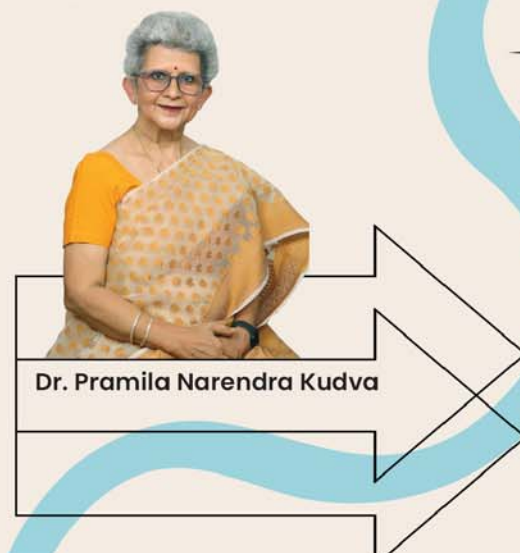

# The Learning Triangle: Infrastructure, Mentorship & Family

**W**hy do children fail academically? As a former principal, this question has stayed with me for years. Here is a perspective on how school infrastructure, teacher–student engagement, and family together shape student success.

Every parent aspires to send their child to a “good” school. But what defines good? For many, it is linked to affordability and the reputation of the board: Once ICSE was considered aspirational; today IB, IGCSE, and other international curricula are in demand. Smaller class sizes, progressive teaching techniques, and modern facilities seem to promise better outcomes. Yet the truth is simple: it is never just one thing.

This article explores three broad influences on student performance:

1. School infrastructure
2. Teacher–student interaction and engagement
3. Family influences

## The role of infrastructure in learning

A child spends nearly 6–8 hours at school. The physical environment therefore plays a critical

role in shaping concentration, motivation, and well-being. Comfortable seating, clean washrooms, safe drinking water, and well-ventilated classrooms are not luxuries; they are essential.

While many elite schools provide these, government schools continue to lag despite sustained efforts. According to UDISE 2020–21:

- Only **65%** of schools have electricity.
- **28%** have computers.
- Just **11%** are connected to the internet.

Equitable resource allocation is crucial if all children are to learn in spaces that foster both comfort and curiosity.

Rigid classroom layouts—benches nailed to the floor, heavy wooden desks causing discomfort—restrict movement, creativity, and sustained concentration. In contrast, flexible, student-friendly designs support active learning.

**A healthy body supports a healthy mind.** Schools that prioritise sanitation, safe infrastructure, and basic comfort are investing not only in academic success but also in long-term student well-being.

## The science of colours in learning

Infrastructure is not just about buildings and desks. The **psychology of colour** also influences mood, focus, and retention.

- **Green:** Light green classrooms, green boards, and indoor plants can sharpen focus and reduce fatigue.
- **Blue:** Research from Columbia University suggests blue lowers stress and boosts problem-solving. Sky blue evokes calm, while deeper shades support serious, focused study.
- **Yellow:** Studies from the University of British Columbia indicate yellow can stimulate alertness and creativity, enhancing memory retention. Of course, no amount of infrastructure can replace a child’s own effort. But schools must create conditions that **enable effort to translate into achievement**.

## Enhancing teacher–student engagement and interaction

Creating an engaging, interactive learning environment is critical for student success. Research consistently shows that lack of interest is a major cause of academic failure; curiosity and a supportive classroom climate can reverse this

trend.

## Barriers to student engagement

Before implementing new strategies, it helps to recognise common obstacles:

- **Overcrowded classrooms** that limit individual attention
- **Unengaging instruction**, such as simply reading from slides or textbooks.
- **Teacher–student disconnect**, where learners do not feel safe to ask questions.
- **Discipline issues**, where the teacher’s energy is spent on crowd control rather than teaching.

## Strategies for cultivating curiosity and relevance

To spark and sustain interest, make learning meaningful and connected to students’ lives.

- **Start with a hook:** Begin lessons with an anecdote, a provocative question, or a real-world problem.
- **Use real-world examples:** Show how concepts link to daily life and current events (for instance, using games to teach integers).
- **Foster inquiry-based learning:** Encourage students to ask their own questions and guide them to find answers.
- **Vary instructional methods:** Combine discussion, group work, visuals, experiments, stories, and technology instead of using a single rigid method.

## Building rapport and an accessible environment

A positive teacher–student relationship is the foundation of effective learning.

- **Be approachable and human**—acknowledge students’ efforts and challenges.
- **Use students’ names**—this simple act builds connection.
- **Actively listen**—show that questions and concerns are welcome.

## Implementing effective teaching practices

Certain classroom practices can maximise engagement, even with challenging dynamics.

- Encourage **peer observation** so teachers can learn from one another.
- **Use differentiated instruction:** adapt methods, material, and assessment to varied learning needs.
- **Give specific, actionable feedback:** explain what was done well, what can be improved, and how.
- **Model good public speaking and enthusiasm:** energy and clarity from the teacher often transfer to students.
- **Invite feedback from students:** this two-way flow builds mutual respect and helps refine

teaching.

## Proactive classroom management

Clear expectations prevent many problems before they start.

- **Establish ground rules collaboratively** so students feel ownership.
- **Use positive framing**—for example, “Raise your hand to speak” rather than “Don’t talk out of turn.”
- **Enforce rules consistently and fairly.**
- **Address minor issues early**, with a quiet word or a change of seating before they escalate.

Simple, logical consequences can also help:

- **“You break it – you fix it”:** if a child spills another’s drink, they apologise and help clean up.
- **Loss of privilege:** rough play on the playground may mean sitting out for the rest of recess.
- **Take-a-break time:** after a fight, students cool off from the immediate conflict before rejoining the group.

## Good parenting and the power of modelling

Children learn as much from what adults do as from what they say. “Children see, children do.” They are more likely to be disciplined if parents are authoritative yet loving, and more likely to be undisciplined if parents are authoritarian or largely uninvolved.

## Preaching versus modelling

Preaching is telling; modelling is showing.

The parent who tells children not to jump signals, yet drives through red lights, is preaching. The parent who waits at the signal and follows traffic rules is modelling—and quietly shaping behaviour.

## Common sayings capture this truth:

- “Like father, like son.”
- “A chip off the old block.”
- “She is definitely her mother’s daughter.”

Research and everyday observation suggest these adages hold more than a grain of truth.

A child raised with physical or verbal abuse is more likely to repeat such patterns as an adult. On the other hand, good behaviour modelled by parents often leads to good emulation by children.

## What is role modelling?

Role models influence others by serving as examples. For most children, the most key role models are parents and caregivers who are present in their daily lives.

Children watch and listen closely; they use what

they see and hear as a blueprint for how life is to be lived.

## How to be a good role model

Being a positive role model is not easy. The saying “Do as I say, not as I do” simply does not work. If parents do not want children to lie about illness to avoid school, they cannot lie about taking “sick days” from work. If they want children to limit screen time, they must model balanced use of devices themselves.

A few guided ideas:

### 1. Model through actions

Children watch how adults’ express anger, handle stress, and treat others. A man who abuses his wife in front of the children may leave them with low self-esteem; later, they may repeat similar patterns.

### 2. Model through words

Children also listen. Language, topics of conversation, and expressed opinions shape values.

In one school, a first grader used abusive language almost daily. He apologised each time but reverted to the same words. The breakthrough came when the principal met the father, who worked in construction and frequently used such words on the phone with workers. The child was simply repeating what he had heard. When the father changed his speech, the child’s language improved too.

### 3. Model the traits you wish to see

Ask: What kind of person do I want my child to become? Kind and considerate? A reader? Then live those traits.

- Show compassion to people and animals.
- Speak kindly to domestic staff.
- Read with young children; discuss books as they grow.
- Spend less time in front of the television.

### 4. Build a strong bond with your children

- Spend quality time together.
- Love unconditionally; avoid statements like “Mummy will not love you if you do this.”
- Listen without judgement when they are upset.
- Avoid corporal punishment.
- When you make a mistake, apologise and explain how you misjudged the situation. This teaches children how to handle their own errors.

## Monitoring and supervision

Effective control is not harshness; it is clear, consistent guidance.

- Set standards appropriate to the child’s age.
- Show them how to meet these standards.
- Reward positive behaviour.
- Enforce rules regularly and explain the

reasons behind them. For example, if a child excels in a competitive exam, celebrate it. Before going to the toy shop, agree on a budget and explain why. Let the child check prices and choose within that limit; this teaches both appreciation and decision-making. Conversely, do not reward negative behaviour. Giving in to a tantrum in a mall because others are watching reinforces the tantrum. Finally,

the warmth and responsiveness parents show deeply shape a child's personality. Comfort them when they are upset, but do not cover up their mistakes.

As Bob Keeshan aptly put it: "Parents are the ultimate role models for their children. Every word, action and movement has an effect. No other person or outside force has a greater effect

on the child than the parent."

In the journey towards academic success, infrastructure, engaged teachers, and conscious parenting form a learning triangle. When all three sides are strong, children stand the best chance not only to perform well in school, but to grow into balanced, responsible human beings.

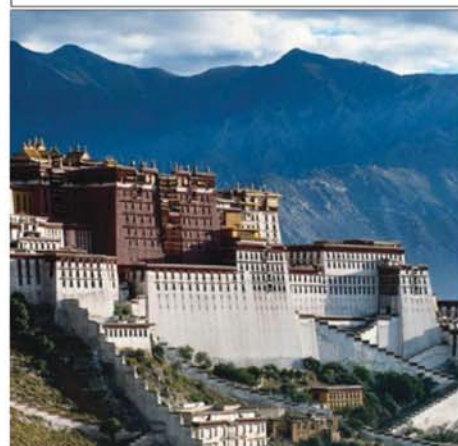
