Dear Reader,

Keeping in mind the well-being of the staff coming in the campus, we have organized successfully two COVID vaccination drives on 24th July and 23rd October respectively in association with Dr. Balabhai Nanavati MAX Super Speciality Hospital to inoculate the employees and their family members free of cost between 9.00 am to 6.00 pm at RSET's Dhurmal Bajaj Hall. More than 250 staff of institutions of RSET and their family members took benefit of both the drives. The first vaccination drive was sponsored by Shri Ramniranjan Ruia, Member, Managing Committee of RSET and Trustee of Nandkishore Bhadermal Ruia Charitable Trust while the second vaccination drive was sponsored by Shri Madhusudan R. Maheshwari, Trustee, RSET and Trustee of Shree Ramdhar Maheshwari Foundation. Indeed our Donors and well-wishers have always come forward with their benevolence for the welfare of the staff and students.

I am very happy to state that in the recent past, institutions run by the Trust have received many awards and accolades. Mainadevi Bajaj International School ranked no.1 in zone D and at no.5 in Mumbai among top schools with International curriculum by Times School Survey 2021. Ramniwas Bajaj English High School ranked at no.6 in zone D and at no.19 in Mumbai among top schools with National curriculum by Times School Survey 2021. Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School ranked at no.8 in Mumbai among top schools with SSC curriculum by Times School Survey 2021. Ramniwas Bajaj English High School received the 'Award of Excellence' in school administration. The award was conferred to Dr. Padmaja Kutty, Principal of the school at Raj Bhavan by Hon'ble Governor of Maharashtra Shri Bhagat Singh Koshiyari. The event was organised by Times Education Group (Nav Bharat Times)

It is a matter of great pride for us that all our schools have excelled in their board results. Tenth batch of IB Diploma students of Mainadevi Bajaj International School have given excellent results in the May 2021 exam series. 1st IB Topper - Mr. Shourya Rao secured 44 points out of 45 points (98%), 2nd IB Topper - Ms. Kajol Dewnani Secured 43 points out of 45 points (96%) and 3rd IB Toppers - Ms. Sadhika Johnson and Mr. Annanya Dhoot secured 41 points out of 45 points (92%). All the toppers have received offers for further studies from reputed universities of UK and USA. Annanya Dhoot has been awarded a GBP 13,000 scholarship by University of Warwick, United Kingdom. At Grade 10 ICSE Examinations of Ramniwas Bajaj English High School, along with 100% result, all 35 students secured 80% and above in aggregate. The school topper, Sajjad Nakhwa secured 98% followed by Jatin Naik with 97.8% and Anushree Gupta with 97.4%.

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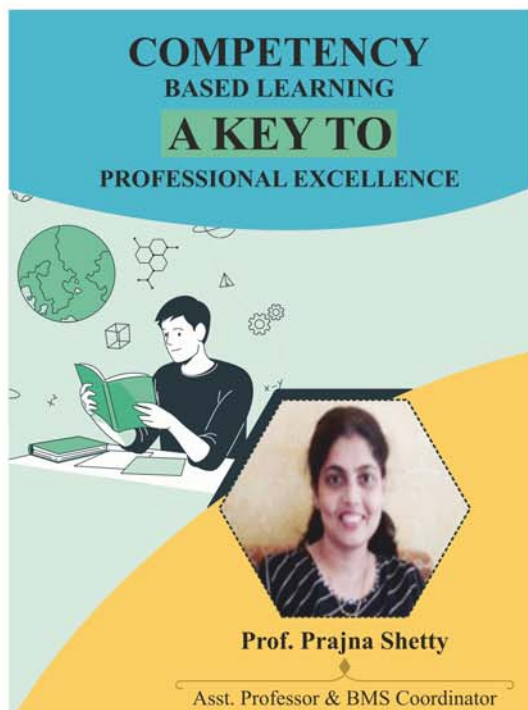
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Hon. Secretary's Message

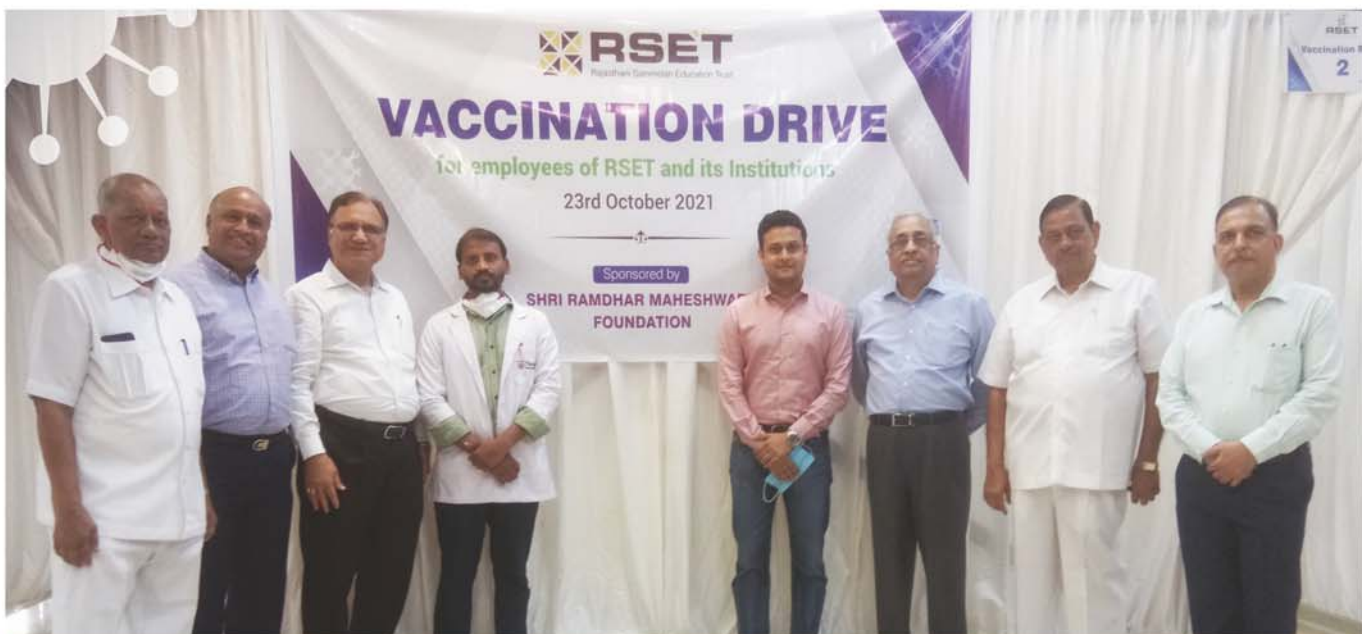

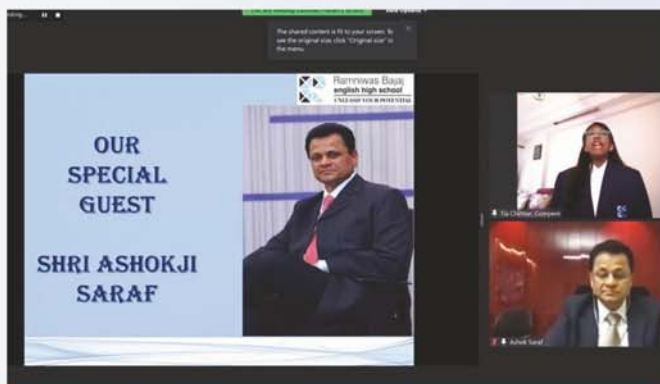

The changed ethos of Teaching -Learning process during the current

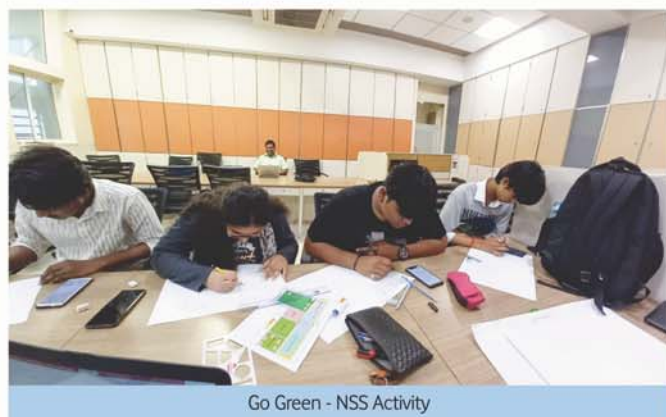

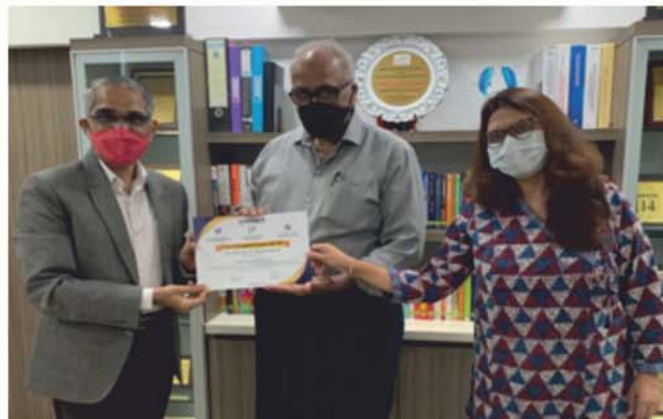

Academic Activities:

1 PGDM SEM II – Examination: 2nd July 2021

Online Examination of FYPGDM Trimester, Batch 2020-22 students was conducted from 2nd July till 7th July'21. The format followed for designing the question paper, credit based, required students to write answers in brief format, under the online supervision of faculty members. The scanned copy of the answer sheet in pdf format sent by the students was mailed to the respective subject faculty members for final assessment.

2 Visit from Joint Director Mumbai Office was conducted on 3rd July 2021

Mr. Gangadhar Data - Administrative Officer and Mr. Kiran Gije – Office Assistant visited DGMC campus to verify documents and inspect the facilities vide GR No. NGC/2021/ (105/21) / MS4 dated 5th June 2021 with regards to obtaining NOC from Mumbai University for the additional 2 Divisions for BAMMC.

3 Admissions – FY BAFTNMP and BAMMC: 5th Aug 2021 onwards

As soon as the 12th std results were announced DGMC staff worked seamlessly towards the admission process. The first merit list for FYBAMMC and FYBAFTNMP was declared on 17th Aug 2021 and subsequently on the 25th Aug 2021 and 30th Aug 2021. Students were assisted from counselling, applying online to pre-enrolment process and final admission and fee payment.

4 Attendance Committee – Parent Teacher Meeting on 6th Aug 2021

For TYBAFTNMP, TYBAMMC, SYBAFTNMP and SYBAMMC students who had an overall average score below 40%, the Attendance Committee deemed it fit to arrange for a one-on-one live interaction with the parent of the student concerned. Warning Emails were sent out to the students and parents whose wards did not meet the minimum attendance requirement criteria of 75%. The idea of sending such warning communication was to alert both the students and parents and enable them undertake corrective measures in this regard.

Parents were advised to visit the campus in person and for those parents who were located outside Mumbai, an online meeting was scheduled on Google Meet. Students were advised to maintain the expected level of

attendance score in line with the Ordinance No. 6086 of the University of Mumbai. The students who attended the Parents Teachers Meeting submitted an undertaking countersigned by their parents stating that they will be regular in attending lectures in the days to follow.

This step could possibly help the parents in extending enough support to ensure that their wards meet the minimum attendance score expectation

5. FYBAMMC Orientation – A & B 6th Sept 2021

Continuing with the campaign a Podcast with guest speaker Mr. Kiran Gurnath Chipkar a Founder of Nirved Foundation was organised. Mr Kiran Chipkar was invited to the DGMC studio for an awareness-generating interview on the ill-effects of addiction. Mr Kiran Chipkar, once an addict himself, today runs a successful Addiction Rehab Centre in Malad (W). He shared his insightful thoughts & experiences with our host Sadiya Iqbal.

15. Becoming Tribal Literate an initiative of the Rotaract Club a Rural Field Visit on 19th Aug 2021

A rural one-day Field Visit titled "Becoming Tribal Literate" proved to be an immersive exercise with a view to studying the tribal life around the suburbs of Mumbai was organized for the Rotaract Club students with the guidance of their mentors. The visit coincided with the World Humanitarian Day.

After taking brief tours to a few villages across Nerul, Panvel, Thane, Saphale and Dahanu, a tribal village named Damkhind located in Palghar district was selected for the purpose of the visit. The purpose of conducting this Field Visit was to facilitate the Media and Film Studies students in learning and exploring various creative research tools that are applicable in studying a rural landscape in a holistic manner.

Students interacted with the tribal people and had the privilege of experiencing their food and culture. Dr. Dutta also spoke about Tribes which the students had no knowledge had existed. This interesting and educating symposium was appreciated by all.

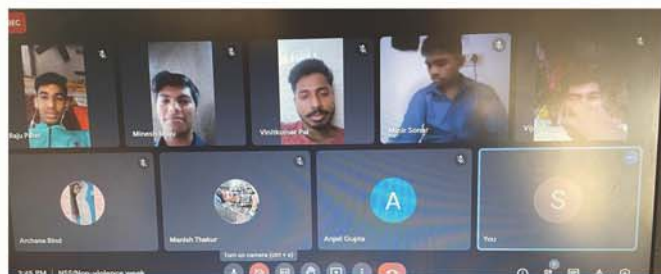

Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy is a multisport academy covering an area of approximately 24,000 sq.ft. It has been built using artificial turf which has been imported from New Zealand. The facility is of an international standard which facilitates sports like basketball, volleyball, tennis, box cricket, football, skating etc. making it a focal point of the Rajasthani Sammelan Education Campus. The floodlights installed provide broadcast level illumination enabling a live broadcast.

In normal times, the ground is being used by the schools and other institutions of RSET in the morning hours from 7.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m. The students use it during their school hours for physical exercise and sports. Sports activities, both professional and recreational, came to a halt during the lockdown period to control the spread of COVID-19 Pandemic. However, with the easing of restrictions, a semblance of normalcy has returned. PDSA is not conducting many sports activities as done in previous years. 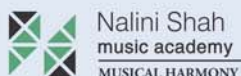

FIFTH QUARTER ONLINE COURSES

COMPETENCY BASED LEARNING A KEY TO PROFESSIONAL EXCELLENCE

Abstract

Competency based learning is a form of education that focuses on cultivating students/ individuals in a customised manner. This in turn will help an individual be industry ready with a high rate of success at the job arena. Competency based learning have paved the path for professional learning by mastering a skill and if implemented in India successfully in different discipline will bid adieu from the traditional classroom-based model.

In a classroom-based model, all students start and end their learning experience at the same time. During a term of study, some students will master most of the course curriculum and earn high grades; others will master less and earn lower grades; and still others will master only about half the required subject matter and end up with a failing grade. So, while these failing students know a considerable portion of the subject matter, their only option will be repeating the whole class again. This is discouraging and frustrating to a few students who might as well end giving up on the whole higher-education experience. In Competency based learning programs, students work toward mastery at their own pace, within the constraints of financial aid, institutional, and state policies.

Introduction

Competency-based learning also known as proficiency-based, mastery-based, outcome-based, performance-based, standards based education,

instruction and learning refers to systems of instruction, assessment, grading and academic reporting that are based on students demonstrating that they have learned the knowledge and skills they are expected to learn as they progress through their education.

While the goal of competency-based learning is to ensure that more students learn what they are expected to learn, the approach can also provide educators with more detailed or fine-grained information about student learning progress, which can help them more precisely identify academic strengths and weakness, as well as the specific concepts and skills students have not yet mastered.

Competency based education v/s Skill based education

In some ways, a skill and a competency are similar. On a basic level, they both identify an ability that an individual has acquired through training and experience. But the two concepts are quite different in terms of the function they perform.

- Skills define specific learned activities. Knowing which skills a person possesses helps us determine whether their training and experience has prepared them for a specific type of workplace activity.
- Skills tell us what type of abilities a person needs to perform a specific activity or job.
- Competencies tell us how an individual applies his skills to perform a job successfully.
- Competencies take "skills" and incorporate them into on-the-job

behaviors. Those behaviors demonstrate the ability to perform the job requirements competently.

- Competencies are more detailed than skills and take a person's knowledge and abilities into account to determine whether a person has the right behaviors to succeed in their roles.

Competencies=Skills + Knowledge + Abilities

To succeed on the job, employees need to demonstrate the right mix of skills, knowledge, and abilities.

Principles of Competency Based Learning

- Student specific - Students receive timely; customized support based on their individual learning needs which further ensure that they are career ready.
- Learning objectives - Competencies include explicit, measurable, transferable learning objectives that empower students.
- Focused on mastery of competencies - Students advance upon achieving mastery. Students are expected to master competencies and meet career ready standards with clear, transferable learning objectives.
- Learning experience - Assessment is meaningful and a positive learning experience for students.
- Based on learning outcomes - Learning outcomes emphasize competencies that include application and creation of knowledge, along with the development of important skills and dispositions.

The Characteristics of Competency Based Learning

Learner-centric

First and foremost, competency based learning focuses on the learner as an individual. Competency based learning empower learners to:

- Understand the competencies they need to master to achieve their goals
- Progress through learning processes without time constraints
- Explore diverse learning opportunities
- Collaborate in learning activities with communities of peers and mentors
- Create learning artefacts that represent their competencies
- Reflect on their own learning achievements
- See what they've mastered, what they still need to accomplish, and where to improve
- Develop an online academic identity, including the ability to manage competencies and portable evidence of learning from multiple sources

Outcomes-based

Competency based learning starts with well-defined learning outcomes. Focusing on outcomes empowers faculty and academic leaders to:

- Develop healthy sets of learning outcomes and competencies
- Re-orient curricular design to start with learning outcomes rather than starting with time/term structures
- Build high-quality sharable resources, assessments, and rubrics designed to support learning outcomes
- Foster authentic assessment that includes demonstrated mastery of competencies
- Effectively identify risk in students' progress toward learning achievements and provide appropriate interventions
- Support transparent analysis of learning outcomes at every level of the institution
- Achieve short-term and long-term academic performance improvements focused on outcomes rather than inputs

Differentiated

Differentiation refers to competency based learning practices that recognize and adjust to meet the needs of individual learners.

- Learners are provided with different learning materials or assessments

based on their mastery.

- Students receive different materials on their requirements of the curriculum or program
- Content is designed with learning alternatives closely tied to the learner's specific interactions with the content.
- Learners can select from among different learning resources and pathways based on their own choices and preferences.
- Personalised, relevant and timely communications tailored to learners' individual activities and needs.
- An appropriate system of feedback, guidance, activities, or tasks designed to help individuals progress along their learning paths.

Benefits of Competency Based Learning:

- Element of flexibility enables learners to move at their own pace
- Efficient and potentially lower-cost degree/credential options for students
- Greater understanding of learning outcomes throughout the academic institution
- Courses, learning resources, and assessments aligned to well-defined goals
- Motivated and engaged students
- Increased student retention and completion rates, particularly when prior learning can be applied to degree progress
- Learners' improved ability to recognize, manage, and continuously build upon their own competencies and evidence of learning
- Employers' improved ability to understand graduates' competencies and learning achievements
- Outcomes-based frameworks for continuous improvement at course, program, and institutional levels

Conclusion

Education is no more about classroom learning; it has also evolved from the teacher being an instructor to one of a facilitator. Today, children have far too many options to gain knowledge. This is where the concept of Competency Based Learning comes into picture.

Considering Indian Demographics and current education system it's a huge challenge that we face today. We have definitely started our journey towards competency based learning but lot of awareness is required to educate the torch bearers of our education system to start implementing process at a grass root level which encourages more of competency based learning and assessments. The role of the teacher will evolve from a stand and-deliver model to one of coaching, mentoring, facilitating and collaborating with students.

Competency Based Learning is the next best way to educate our future generation and will be a success only upon persistent efforts on the part of Indian schools, administration and teaching force at large.

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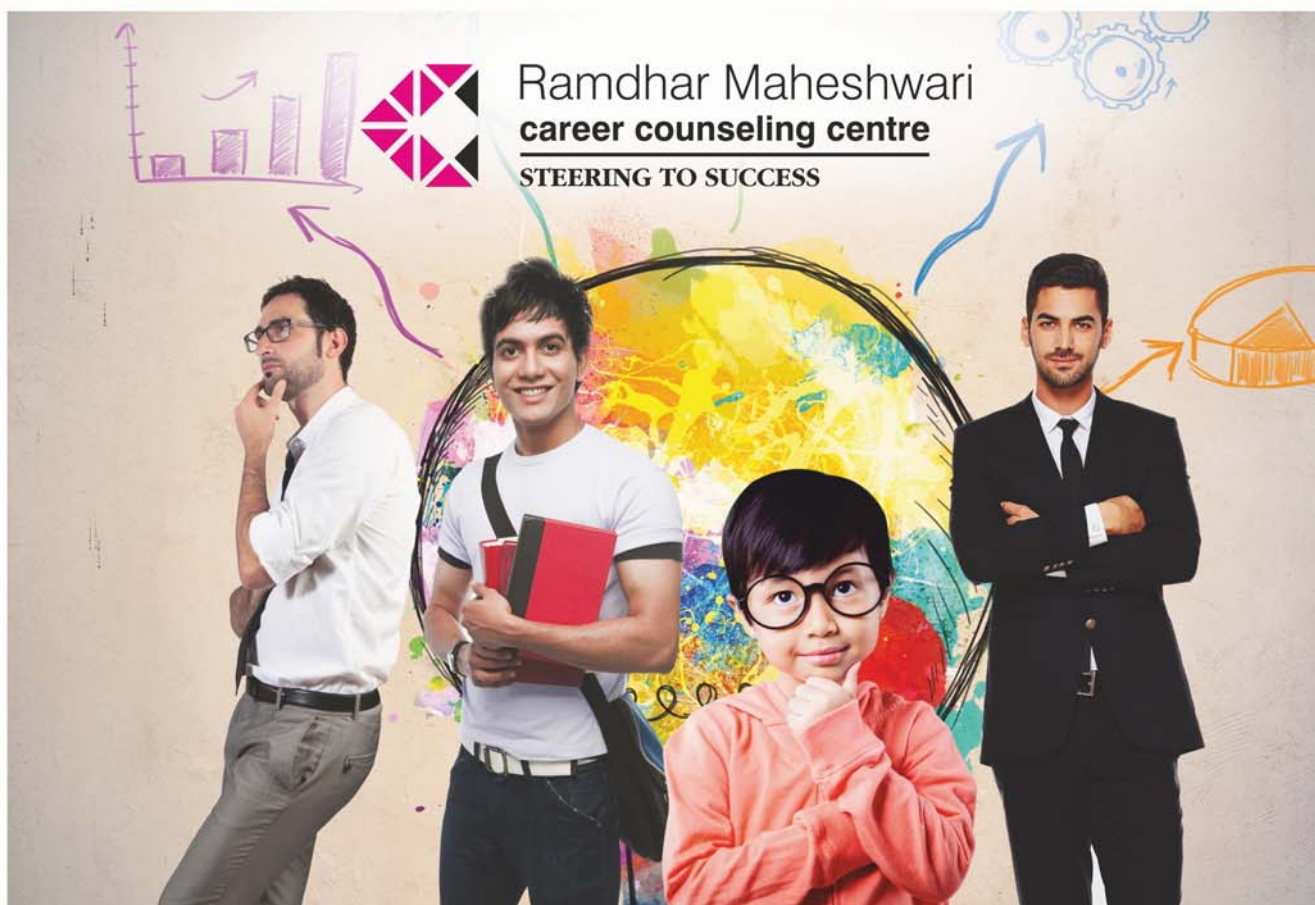
