

Dear Reader,

Goyal Online Academy) of RSET initiated to record and make a repository of online lectures conducted by all institutions with the help of IT & ERP support departments of RSET. A stepwise plan was designed to schedule a lecture, conduct a lecture, record the lecture and give access to students for online learning. Online examinations were also conducted by MCQ type online tests for PGDM students of 3<sup>rd</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Semester of Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies and for internal examinations of the Self-financed Departments of Undergraduate students of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College as well as M.Com students. Schools also held PTA meetings through online platform.

Results of Board examinations were declared in the months of May – June. Our school children fared excellently by giving 100% result in RBHS (ICSE Board), MBIS (IGCSE & IBDP) & KGES (SSC Board) while results of KGSS at SSC exam was 98%.

Along with online academic activities, institutions also organized many extra-curricular activities. Many institutions celebrated International Yoga Day on 21<sup>st</sup> June, where in the students performed asanas as per the videos of sports teacher circulated to students earlier. The students also sent their videos that were compiled by the concerned teachers. DGMC organized an online session on yoga by practicing pranayama and meditation for teaching & non-teaching staff.

## Lockdown not a stumbling block

Dear Reader,

All the three months of this quarter namely April, May and June 2020 were under lockdown and our schools and colleges were closed. However, Lockdown did not prove to be a stumbling block for the efficient working of any of our institution. On the Contrary, the teaching and non-teaching staff took the situation in their stride and utilized the digital space to its optimum for performing the various operations of the institution. To get the students to connect to academics once again after the sudden closure, our institutions sent out assignments and links as online materials. This helped to bridge the gap between the previous class and the new class. The objective of the online sessions was activity based teaching focussed on skill development. Some interesting online activities were also planned and executed during this quarter. One of our School has conducted 1423 classes and 40 meetings in May whilst in June, 1513 classes and 34 meetings were conducted to ensure delivery of quality education across Nursery to Grade 10 ensuring the transition to New Normal.

A large number of additional online activities, like PTA meetings, students admissions, staff meetings, audio and video conferences, results declaration, were also conducted online. It was indeed a unique experience of celebrating International Yoga Day this year as the staff and students performed the various Yoga Asanas at their own homes. The art, craft, and the music training too was taught online to the students of lower classes by their respective teachers. Our counselling centre conducted various webinars like a "Mandala Art Webinar" (with an objective to provide strategy to relax and to cope with stress and anxiety especially amid Covid 19 lock down), Life Skills Programme, emotional

wellbeing and Career Guidance for students. A large number of participants attended these webinars and the testimonials received from the participants was quite encouraging.

# Message From Director of Schools

# A first rate response to a global calamity

Figures and percentages may vary but there is no disputing the fact that the current pandemic has affected a large number of students across the world. Estimates vary from a percentage as high as 70, to an absolute figure of over 1.25 billion students. In Mumbai and across Maharashtra as well as all over the country, schools and other educational institutions continue to be shut, having a devastating impact on not just the education of those affected but also on their future, which has now become uncertain. In the schools of RSET many students who have gone back to their native places and away from Mumbai, the hub of the pandemic, have been unable to return. Some of them are accessing online learning and others are simply waiting for this calamity to pass.

Many local and international organisations led by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) have been involved in assessing and categorising the impact of this pandemic on education.

The main impact is on interrupted learning since schools provide the education which constitutes the umbrella under which overall growth and development of children occurs. While the impact is felt by all students, those coming from economically and socially backward sections of the society experiene this very acutely. In the schools of RSET we have tried to overcome this lacuna by being imaginative about reaching our students.

Many students attend school because almost all state governments provide a free mid-day meal. With school closure accompanied by loss of income for parents, this has been absent and children are suffering from malnourishment.

When schools closed without notice it caused a lot of confusion, stress and anxiety to teachers and students. There was often lack of clarity about their roles and how they were expected to remain connected with their students. And while online learning has been lauded by many and disliked by others, no one denies the frustrations, delays and anxieties involved in this form of learning. No one had imagined that the technical aspect of distance learning would be one of the chief stress causing factors for many families, students and educators.

This is apart from all the health hazards that online learning and the lockdown have entailed. Among other problems, webinars conducted by Mainadevi Bajaj Inernational School focused on ways to deal with eating disorders, anxiety and irritation among children, headaches and eyesight issues caused by spending long hours in front of the screen.

In addition to being shut down in their houses and often without jobs, parents had to take on the role of becoming the main educators in their children's lives. This has been difficult for all parents, but for those without proper education and resources this has become even more challenging. Recognising this, schools of RSET have held several parental training and advisory sessions.

The financial dimensions of this crisis have been varied. It has been very obvious that people have lost their incomes or have had to suffer a substantial drop in them. Schools have been caught up in a bind about reducing or not charging fees. This has been particularly stressful for parents and managements of unaided schools which are entirely dependent on fee. In its generosity the management of RSET instructed

all its heads to ensure that while collecting fee for the current academic year they should show utmost sensitivity to affected parents and offer them whatever concessions that were possible.

In this scenario the global and local response to issues faced by those in the field of education has been as phenomenal as the pandemic itself. UNESCO has been involved in giving technical assistance to quickly prepare and deploy inclusive distant learning solutions, utilizing hi-tech, low-tech and no-tech approaches.

Webinars have been conducted for affected people at all levels including ministers of education, officials from education departments, heads of institutions and other stakeholders to share information about countrywide efforts to maintain the provision of inclusive education in different contexts. The institutions of RSET have themselves conducted innumerable free webinars involving experts to help and promote the interests of their student, parent and staff communities.

The global community has been involved in supplying a selection of digital learning resources that governments, schools, teachers, parents can use to open opportunities for learners unable to attend to school. On an individual level, in our institutes a variety of platforms have been explored to make online learning meaningful and stress free.

In the rural areas of India there have been thousands of initiatives where local governments have created a pool of retired teachers and others able to teach basic subjects. These people have extended education to millions of students who cannot access distance learning.

In every problem, big or small, there is an opportunity to explore the boundaries of human imagination, of human kindness and sensitivity. This pandemic has done exactly that. The world has come together and pooled its resources to ensure that our youngsters do not miss out on a bright future due to this pandemic.

# abacus Education undergoes a seachange

The new academic year of 2020-21 arrived with many uncertainties in the educational sector. Ever since COVID-19 has been declared as Pandemic by World Health Organization (WHO), state governments are taking all the precautionary steps to curb the spread of the disease that includes shutting down educational institutes, vacating hostels, postponing entrance examinations, ceremonies and more. In the wake of this emergency situation, educational institutions have shifted their operations to online learning.

This year, admission process has also undergone a sea change. At the beginning of the academic year, we don't find academic campuses buzzing with new students anxiously looking at the list of admitted students in junior college and undergraduate classes as right from filling of forms, confirmation of admission to payment of fees - all are done through digital portals.

Education is dynamic and both teachers and students have to constantly adapt themselves to new methodologies to ensure continuity in learning during lockdown period. Distance learning tools came into prominence and within a very little time both teachers and students embraced online teaching-learning platforms of Zoom, Google classroom, Google meet etc.

Final year examinations of the universities in Maharashtra were pending for which the government approached UGC, seeking extension to complete the same by 31st October for professional and nonprofessional courses.

University of Mumbai has declared that final year examination for students of all colleges will be held between 1st October and 17th October. For preparing time tables for the exams, the University has set up around 40 clusters of colleges based on the courses they provide i.e. traditional courses, management, engineering, architecture, teacher's training, physical education, law, pharmacy and fine arts among others. Each cluster will have one college in lead. The time table will remain uniform for students belonging to a particular cluster. The exams will be



conducted online in multiple choice questionnaire mode for 50 marks with the time limit of one hour. However, colleges outside Mumbai may find it tough to conduct online exams as there is no guarantee of internet connection there.

In the month of July, the new National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 approved by the cabinet was declared after a gap of 34 years (the last one being in the year 1986). NEP 2020 brings a large number of changes that can revolutionize education in India.


Among the noticeable changes, the 3 year undergraduate studies structure is changed to 4 year pattern with multiple entry and exit points to make higher education more suited to get jobs later. The new system will scrap the existing 10 + 2 format and will make our education system more like the global format. A few of the other changes it brings are extending the coverage of Right to Education (RTE) Act till the age of 18, a change in the pattern of exams and multi-disciplinary holistic education which will help students to pick up their own choice of subjects rather than a few set combinations.


In our RSET campus, all the institutions right from schools to colleges and professional institutes have well adapted themselves to online teaching learning. Even some of the libraries of the institutions are providing online support to the users through OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) wherein they can search in library catalogue to locate books and other collections from their home.

It is indeed heartening to inform that schools and colleges of RSET are conducting statutory meetings of Governing Boards, School Subcommittees, Child Safety Committee and Parent Teacher Association well in time through Zoom platform. We specially acknowledge strong support of IT Department of RSET and Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy (GOLD Academy) for smooth conduction of teaching-learning, board meetings and other activities through online.

The Management has been taking all possible measures of sanitization of the campus from time to time. It is said that 'there is light after every darkness'. We are sure that the present situation due to COVID-19 Pandemic will be under control in due course. But it has taught each one of us in the educational sector to be digitally savvy to face challenges in future.


# Excerpts of Interview of

Shri Vinod V. Podar



# 1)When and How did you get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

My father late Shri Vishwanathji Podar was a great social worker. He also had great concern for girls' education. My father therefore started Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya, the first vernacular school of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust in the Hanuman Temple of Chincholi with 02 girl students in the year 1954. My elder sister Smt. Susheela R. Jasrapuria was one of the two students of the school. Gradually, students strength started increasing. To give this school greater dimension, great philanthropist late Shri Kudilalji Seksaria donated a spacious land of 4000 sq. yards and a small building was built on this land to start the primary section of the school. Hence from a very early age, I developed love for girls education and social work. Initially, I became a member of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust about 30 years ago and later became member of the Managing Committee. Hence under my father's inspiration, I became associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust.



# 2) Since when did you start playing active role in the Educational Endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

After becoming member of the Managing Committee of the Trust, I started playing active role in the educational activities of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust. The Managing Committee took decision of opening a junior college attached to Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) in the year 1975. This was followed by extending educational facilities to girls up to graduation by starting Ghanshyamdas Saraf College. In all these educational endeavours of early days of RSET, my father late Shri Vishwanathji Podar played an active role. Under his guidance and also other senior members like late Shri Prahladraiji Saraf, late Shri Satyanarayanji Kabra and Shri Banwarilalji Jhunjhunwala, I became involved in the educational activities of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust.

# 3) How did you contribute in the growth and development of the educational institutions of Rajasthani Sammelan?

In the year 2007, Shri Ashokji Saraf became the President of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust. Under his leadership, the Managing Committee took the decision of extending educational activities and total revamp of the campus by demolishing the old



school building and by constructing a modern building of 12 floors with state of art facilities to house Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies, Mainadevi Bajaj International School, Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School, Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School and Draupadidevi Sanwarmal Women's Hostel. The Management further constructed a building of 7 floors to house Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies and Ramniwas Bajaj English High School to run as ICSE school. All such decisions were taken at the meetings of Managing Committee and as a member of Managing Committee, I always supported these educational projects and contributed in whatever way it was possible on my part. In the year 2015, I donated a handsome amount to start RSCA Study Centre which is housed in the new building of 7 floors. The Study Centre proved to be a boon to those students who are pursuing the professional course of Chartered Accountancy. The students can study here in a peaceful and quiet atmosphere. Since it is also an extension centre of ICAI, the students can submit various documents pertaining to CA studies and also can obtain study material for CA course. The Study Centre was inaugurated in the year 2015.

# 4) Tell us some important incidents which you would like to mention in this context?

Although, there are many memorable incidents connected to the educational endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust, some incidents are very close to my heart. The first one is the Golden Jubilee celebrations of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School in the year 2010 in the month of January. It was a great occasion for me and my family as the school was started by my father late Shri Vishwanathji Podar. It was a grand two days function in which all the institutions of the Trust participated in the celebrations. The second incident was the inauguration of RSCA Study Centre and ICAI Extension Counter in RSET campus on 8th July, 2015 by CA Manoj Fadnis, President ICAI and in the presence of CA Sunil Patodia, Chairman, WIRC. This was also memorable for me as our family had given donation for this Study Centre and it was for the benefit of the students pursuing CA studies.

# 5) Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust initially started girls' school and college which are now co-educational. What is your view on this matter?

In my opinion, Management has taken a very wise decision by converting the junior college now known as Durgadevi Saraf Junior College and Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College of Commerce and Arts as co-educational colleges. In today's world girls are Competing with boys everywhere and therefore they should study in co-educational schools and colleges. We must recognize the fact that our lady members in the society are surpassing in all fields of national and international activities. Right from our Prime Minister Late Smt. Indira Gandhi, Hon'ble Minister for External Affairs Late Smt. Sushma Swaraj and present Finance Minister Hon'ble Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman are all women only who are superior in their achievements. Therefore, all institutions of RSET are now co-educational except KGSS and it is a welcome change for the future of our young generation.

## 6) What is your message to the present team of Managing Committee members of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

Since the past one decade and more, under the dynamic leadership of the President Shri Ashok M. Saraf and his team, Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust has witnessed Unprecedented growth and expansion. The Trust has started many endowment funds to sponsor education of needy students who cannot afford to pay for their education. Hence, I request the President to give more freeships and scholarships to deserving students so that they can get equal opportunities in the sphere of higher and professional education.

I wish a great future to Shri Ashok M. Saraf and his team in their journey of educational endeavours.






Budding Astrophysicist: Amandeep Basra, the budding astrophysicist from MBIS, photographed the moon using his telescope with remarkable results.

PTA: The first PTA meeting for the Academic year 20-21 was held on Wednesday 3rd July '20 via zoom meeting.




#### Webinars for Students







#### One-month online certification program on Retail Management



- To revisit and reinforce the knowledge, skills and abilities learners have gathered during graduation program.



Every session was finally concluded by an evaluation process. Each student will be getting a certificate after the successful completion of the SEP program.











PGDM Academic Activities - April / May / June - 2020

#### Lectures:

Academic session for PGDM for Batch 2019-20, TRIM IV and 2018-20, TRIM VI, commenced in third week of February - 2020. After certain classroom sessions of both the years, due to pandemic outbreak and lockdown announcement in second week of March 2020, online lectures were scheduled and conducted through Google meet from March; 19th March 2020. Approximately 55 sessions of 1.5 hours each of FYPGDM, and 25 sessions of SYPGDM were conducted online, along with the assignments and activities assigned by each faculty based on their subject. Few of the faculty members carried out viva, group as well as individual based on the topics assigned to them.

The syllabus was successfully completed through online lectures by 5th May 2020.

• **Mentoring:** A professional activity, where the aim is to provide career guidance for personal and professional development of the students. The activity of mentoring helps students to understand their behavior, attitudes, beliefs, and skills required to achieve their goals.

The students of FYPGDM students, Batch 2019-21, were mentored on one-to-one basis and were assisted through the selection process of their specialization stream viz. advertising and Communication and Media and entertainment before the commencement of Trimester IV. Keeping the above genesis in mind queries relating to career opportunities, expertise required, challenges ahead were addressed during the mentoring sessions. To guide and assist them in selecting specialization.

For SYPGDM students, the mentoring sessions addressed issues related to stress, coping with unprecedented and unforeseen challenges, shifts in career choice.

#### Dissertation projects:

The Capstone Project is designed to meet the learning needs and interests of the students. The student works/interns was carried out under the guidance of the mentor assigned to each student from the institution as well as form the Organization where he /she is interning.

Each student mentee was ably guided through Google Meet and over the phone during their Capstone Project. A report of each was then complied and submitted to the Placement officer.

The dissertation project evaluated by the mentor on parameters like;

- Number of meetings with the students.
- Feedback of the projects.
- Progress on the project and
- Evaluation of the report.

#### Internship:

It's one thing to learn concepts whilst sitting at a desk, in class and another to practically implement what one has learned. Internships in media were offered with opportunities to learn some practical skills.

Our SYPGDM students were offered opportunities in the Print media, Advertising agencies, Digital Marketing etc. To name a few agencies where our students where the students were interning were Hindustan Time, Oglivy, Saatchi and Saatchi, Alt Balaji, Endelmode, TBWA, MullenLowe Lintas, Leo Burnett, Wavemaker. This opportunity not only helped the students to gain confidence, but also developed and refined their skills and gained valuable experience while exploring a career path. It also helped them build a network with professionals in their respective fields.

#### Examination:

The Examination Department is a robust, responsive, fare and transparent, is a multi-faceted system geared to give quality assured and time-bound end to end service to students and stakeholders. For PGDM students the Institute held online examinations for their student the period of pandemic with the support from the Gold Academy- an inhouse Learning management System. Regular Examinations were scheduled from 22nd to 28th of May'20, results of which was declared on 3rd June'20 to the students. Results were declared on 3rd June 2020. ATKT Examination were scheduled on 15th and 16th June 2020.

- Specialization Selection Process: Trim IV allows the students to opt for either Advertising and Communication or Media and Entertainment as a stream of specialization. To guide them through the selection of their streams the following process was followed as a part of mentoring as under:
- **Phase I-** A Written Examination was administered comprising of questions from areas of Advertising, research, Branding, Production, Television and Films for 100 marks.
- **Phase II-** A Group Discussion was conducted by dividing the students into 6 groups and were given topics in their areas of interest to discuss.
- **Phase III-** A Personal Interview was also held for all the students to judge their subject knowledge as well as their awareness for the stream of their choice.

Significant emphasis was laid on training and placement program, with models of MEAM and Mindful Communication, facilitating the process of placement driven activities.

#### **CAREER LAB**



#### DGMC OBSERVES INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY 2020 held on 21st June, 2020 on Google Platform



#### Web Rendezvous

#### Webinar: WEB Rendezvous: Unlocking Young Minds: Gen Next"

Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies (DGMC) held a webinar, Unlocking Young Minds: Gen Next" on 27th May, 2020, from 3 pm to 5 pm with eminent panelists, faculty and students. The panelists for this webinar were Dr. Sumati Oza (Moderator) founder and director of 'Image-Eleganz', Dr. Harish Shetty a practicing psychiatrist and the founder of 'Maitri' an organisation that works with families affected with mental illness, Dr. Hanif Lakdawala, Director at Akbar Peerbhoy College of Commerce & Economics, advocate Sheetal Metkar, a parent of a student at DGMC, renowned Odissi dancer and the founder of 'UTKAL Nritya Niketan' since 2000.

The webinar was broadcast on YouTube via Zoom app which attracted 1K+ live viewers. During the webinar, various opinions were showcased regarding the impact of the lockdown on the student's lives and their career. These opinions came from different stakeholders, including international students, Indian students, psychiatrist, parents, as well as teachers and expert.

All the panelists agreed that the recent lockdown had both positive and negative side, and therefore the impact differed from person to person. For example, international students were complaining about being away from their families and mentioned how much they are struggling with food arrangements, and how much efforts they took to assure their families of their safety. Meanwhile, Indian students complained about staying home all the time and missing personal privacy and freedom.

The daily routine for both international students and Indian students changed as they started new activities such as cooking or helping their families.

Parents stated that the lockdown was a reason that they became close to their kids, as they spent more time with them and also complained of difficulties in trying to make this time easy for them.

Experts advised that, an individual's state of mind is more important than college or studies and that students along with parents should focus on their mental health. They cited some examples about the tricks to achieve that such as reading, practicing yoga, learning a new skill or hobby, keeping busy, praying and so on.

Panelists also discussed the matter of online learning. Students agreed that online lectures are a good method to study as they are more comfortable and easier .At the same time, both students and teachers confessed that they are missing their classrooms.

Overall, one has to deal with any disaster or crisis happening in our lives and sometimes the issue is not in the problem itself, but how we deal or handle it. Dr. Shetty advised the participants not to take tension and deal with the COVID 19 pandemic by taking care of our mental health and adjusting with whatever resources that is available.

#### ADD-ON Online Workshop Auroville Film Institute and DGMC Collaboration

The online documentary film-making workshop was held from 18th to 25th June 2020.

The month of July is usually a greatly engrossing month for Draupadidevi Sanwarmal Women's Hostel as admissions begin for the forthcoming tenure. This year, due to COVID -19 Pandemic, there was complete internment of academic establishments from the mid of March 2020. Due to this, several students departed for their hometown. New admissions have started currently for the tenure of July 2020 to June 2021. In June, we have been receiving renewal applications from most students and also the month of June was once more glorifying for the hostel. Due to the lockdown, the academic establishments have opted for on-line modes to resume classroom-based educational activities. The previous students are yet to resume their stay in our hostel. They have invigorated the renewal by making online payment. It was indeed very considerate of Management to waive off fees for July within the renewal period.

At present ten foreign students are residing in the hostel. They are served with hygienically prepared brunch along with dinner by the inhouse caterer of RSET. These students belong to the countries of Thailand, Madagascar, Mauritius, Sri Lanka and Namibia The Rector of the Hostel has been taking care of the comfort and safety of the students throughout the pandemic. A meeting was conducted with the Rector



and the Management in which the challenges and views of each the hostel employees and students were discussed in detail.

In order to maintain the cleanliness and hygiene of the hostel, the House-keeping staff has been cleaning all the areas at frequent intervals even when conveyance wasn't available for the employees throughout the lockdown due to COVID-19 pandemic. Various tasks associated with the Annual cleaning work was additionally disbursed throughout this period within the same means, security services were made available 24x7 by deputing security personnel within the hostel premises. Other facilities such as free Wi-Fi access to the whole building, provision of fire detection and fire-fighting system and CCTV were also provided to the hostel for convenience, safety & security of hostel students.. Some gym equipments have additionally been provided within the hostel so that students can lead a healthy routine as per their convenience.


The hostel staff have been ensuring to take every measure that has been mentioned by the government to protect the students from the pandemic. Weekly Sanitization and Pest Control procedures are carried out thoroughly under the supervision of the Rector. The Rector had been working closely with all the staff who were working in the hostel to ensure proper functioning of the hostel. The Rector was available round the clock for each and every student in order to ensure the welfare of all the inmates of the hostel by abiding to all the safety measures during this sudden outbreak of the pandemic.

Just like every year, half-yearly health check-up camp will, be conducted for the Hostel inmates by Ayaksha. All the rules and regulations were once again read out to the students to confirm that they abide by the rules that are laid out for them. Students were suggested to take care of the hostel property equally as they'd do in their homes. The students were suggested to use all the amenities properly followed by general directions such as:

- a. To keep the respective rooms in an orderly manner as there can be visitors who would be aspiring to seek admissions and would reflect an optimistic arena for them as well.
- b. Switching off the lights, fans, air-conditioners, plug points when not in use for conserving the energy.
- c. Conservation of water by closing taps of washrooms and basins when not in use.

The students who have been aspiring to take admission in our hostel have also given extremely encouraging feedback. New students are highly anxious about joining and settling in the new city of Mumbai.



During this difficult times, fitness plays an important part of every individuals life.

The more fit a person, the better immunity. If a person has better immunity, there are less chances of getting attacked by any virus or infection.

As our Summer Camps were near, the kids were looking forward to devote their time to their favourite sport after their examinations. However, due to COVID-19, there was complete lockdown & children had to stay at home and became frustrated as they could not engage themselves in their favourite activities.

We at PDSA came up with a solution for this and have been in constant touch with our students and their parents to help them make more fit and strong by preparing workout videos and sending them on a regular basis.

After every two weeks the workout schedule was changed and increased in intensity level with inclusions of proper warm-up, mobility and cool down stretches.

We focused on different components of fitness like

#### 1-Muscular strength

Muscular strength is the amount of force you can put out or the amount of weight you can lift.

#### 2-Muscular endurance

Muscular endurance refers to the ability of a given muscle to exert force, consistently and repetitively, over a period of time.

#### 3- Cardiovascular endurance

Cardiovascular endurance is the level at which your heart, lungs, and muscles work together when you're exercising for an extended period of time. This shows how efficiently your cardiorespiratory system functions, and is an indicator of how physically fit and healthy you are.

#### 4-Flexibility

Flexibility is the range of motion in a joint or group of joints or the ability to move joints effectively through a complete range of motion.

#### 5-Speed

Speed is the ability to move quickly across the ground or move limbs rapidly to grab or throw.

#### 6-Power

Power is the ability to exert a maximal force in as short a time as possible, as in accelerating, jumping and throwing implements.

#### 7-Agility

Agility is the ability to rapidly change body direction, accelerate, or decelerate.

#### 8-Coordination

The definition of coordination is the ability to execute smooth, accurate, controlled motor responses (optimal interaction of muscle function). Coordination is the ability to select the right muscle at the right time with proper intensity to achieve proper action.

#### 9-Balance


Balance as a component of physical fitness refers to the athlete's ability to stay in controls of their body's position.

#### 10-Reaction time

Many of the students and their parents started sharing their workout videos with us and requested to keep sharing the new workout videos after every two weeks as they could find difference and improvement in their health and lifestyle.

The month of July is always a very busy month for Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel as admissions commence for the new tenure. This year, due to COVID -19 Pandemic, there was complete lockdown of educational institutions from the middle of March 2020. Due to this, many students left for their home town. New admissions have started now for the new tenure of July 2020 to June 2021. Renewal process for old students has also started. Since the lockdown of class room educational activities is still continuing, old students are not yet back in the hostel. They are renewing for their stay by making online payment. It is indeed a kind consideration of the Management to waive off fees for the month of July in the renewal process.

At present 20 foreign students are staying in the hostel. They are provided with hygienic breakfast, lunch as well as dinner supplied by the in-house caterer of RSET. These students have come from Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Egypt, Madagascar, Tunisia, Tanzania, Ghana, Sudan, Fiji, Mauritius, Sri Lanka and Malawi and stayed in the hostel throughout the lockdown period. The Warden of the Hostel as well as other staff have been taking care of the comfort and safety of these students during the lockdown.

To keep the Hostel neat and clean, the House-keeping staff appointed by the Management have been cleaning all the areas at frequent intervals even when public transport was not available for the staff during the lockdown. In the same way security services were also made available 24x7 by deputing security personnel in the hostel premises. Other facilities include free wifi access to the entire building, provision of fire detection and fire-fighting system and CCTV. Gym facilities have been provided to students in an area in the ground floor. The Some gym equipments such as tread mill, cycle, bench & dumbbells have been provided in the hostel so that students can work -out as per their convenience. New washing machines have also been purchased to provide washing facility of clothes in the washing area.

As is done every year, this year too, half yearly health check-up camp will also be held for the Hostel inmates by Ayaksha, the agency running Vijay Pal Singh Health Centre of the Trust. The Hostel inmates have also been given a slot in the morning (twice a week) to use Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy ground for playing various games after the lockdown period is over.

Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel has a total capacity to accommodate 152 students. Last year, the hostel was full to it's capacity with 132 Indian students &. 20 students belonging to foreign countries. In JBBH, many students coming from other cities to pursue the professional course of Chartered Accountancy take admission . For proper interaction with each other pursuing the same course, these CA students are generally accommodated in the third floor of the Hostel. Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel is indeed becoming popular day by day and has proved to be a boon not only for Indian students but also foreign students coming from other countries.



# Impact of COVID 19 on Indian Education Sector

With Special Reference to Teaching – Learning Process

#### Abstract:

The world is battling COVID-19 and economies across the globe have declared a lockdown. Work from home (WFH) has become the norm, especially for service organizations. Following government instructions, even the academic institutions had to shut down temporarily, affecting academic delivery. Thus, they had to find new alternatives to academic delivery, and virtual classes were the way forward. The objective of the study is to assess the adoption rate for virtual classes and to determine the various opportunities, challenges, and reasons for non - adoption of virtual classes. Among those who adopted virtual mode, the mean of actual benefits was significantly less than the mean of expected benefits. Network issues, lack of training, and lack of awareness were stated to be the major challenges faced by them. Lack of awareness was stated to be the most important reason by those who did not adopt virtual classrooms followed by lack of interest and doubts regarding the usefulness of virtual classes. Less attendance, lack of personal touch, and lack of interaction due to connectivity issues were found to be the significant drawbacks of virtual classes. The paper also suggests the ways to overcome the above challenges, drawbacks, and reasons behind non-adoption of virtual classes. (204 words)

#### Introduction:

The COVID 19 pandemic, also known as the corona virus pandemic, is an ongoing global pandemic of corona virus disease 2019 (COVID 19), caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome corona virus 2 (SARS CoV 2). At the moment, many countries have taken measures — some of them stringent — to slow down the spread of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19. Dealing with the unforeseen challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic has taken a significant toll on people all across the world.

The petrifying and severe impact of COVID-19 has shaken the world to its core. Against the backdrop of such a pandemic, it is obvious that the education sector will suffer in all the countries like many other sectors. The Indian education system has been badly affected by the entry of the disease and also because of social distancing measures that were taken to prevent the spread of the disease. The ultimate act on the part of the Central government has been to impose a lockdown on the entire country. With the full lockdown being imposed in the country, the education sector initially came to a standstill. This is an unprecedented and unfamiliar situation for all. Nobody still knows when the situation will become normal. It is imperative that the lifting of lockdown should obviously not take place in one go, but gradually, as otherwise the very purpose of the imposition of lockdown will be defeated with the spreading of the disease again.





It is also true that unless the social distancing measures are removed, bringing back normalcy will be difficult. It is a known fact that the educational institutions are most vulnerable for the spread of the disease due to the mass gathering in the classrooms. Therefore unless, the infection is totally eradicated from the country, it is difficult to bring back the students to the schools, colleges and universities. Resuming normal classes in classrooms therefore seems a distant dream at present.

As we are aware that education is a dynamic force in the life of every individual influencing his physical, mental, emotional, social and ethical development. The Indian education system is quite an old education system that still exists. It has produced so many genius minds that are making India proud all over the world. The role of learning is extremely important in the preparation of adolescents and youth for citizenship in a democratic society. The learning process represents the channel through which the adolescents strive to acquire the habits, skills, knowledge, attitude, values and appreciation, which are necessary for effective participation in a democracy. Learning therefore becomes a process by which changes in behavioral patterns are produced through experience. Learning is brought about through teaching.

Teaching process is the arrangement of environment within which the students can interact and study how to learn. The process of teaching learning aims at transmission of knowledge, imparting skills and formation of attitudes, values and behavior. Teaching involves setting appropriate learning experiences for students, and for that purpose includes selection and sequencing of activities or kinds of interactions that would lead to expected learning. Teaching is intended to learning, without learning teaching is incomplete.

Most of the Governments around the world have temporarily closed educational institutions in an attempt to contain the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic. These nationwide closures are impacting over 91% of the worlds' student population. The UNESCO estimates that about 32 crore students are affected in India, including those in schools and colleges. Therefore, the government has come up with e-learning program.

E-Learning can be defined as is the combined use of computer hardware, software, and educational theory and practice to facilitate learning. In other words it is "the study and ethical practice of facilitating learning and improving performance by creating, using and managing appropriate technological processes and resources". Virtual classes, using various online platforms, have been started in many institutions. It is, however, difficult to say at this moment, how far it has been successful. India is a vast country with many complexities. Only a handful of private schools could adopt online teaching methods. Their low-income private and government school counterparts, on the other hand, have completely shut down for not having access to e-learning solutions. The economic divide, the rural-urban divide and the resulting digital divide all have played an important role. The overall response of the country to the pandemic has thus been very mixed in the education sector as far as e-learning is

concerned.

The situation is very different when one looks at rural colleges and universities. Many students in rural areas may not have access to smart phones or computers. Even if they do, the net connectivity may not be as high as in urban areas.

#### Objectives of E-Learning are:

- 1. The principal mission of e-learning is to enhance student access to the University's academic programs.
- E-learning is intended to help students acquire the technical skills and online learning strategies important to the pursuit of their academic and career goals.
- Teaching faculty also acquire new instructional skills to their professional growth and development.
- 4. Commitment to provide quality educational programs relevant to the student's future career of their desired courses.
- Commitment to provide supplementary videos, research papers, books, journals or articles and course modules to help the students in their endless pursuit of knowledge.
- Establishing an online platform encouraging effective communication between the professors and students.

The speed of the spread of the epidemic, the closure of higher education institutions and the transition to online teaching was so swift that it hardly gave any time to plan and to reflect on the potential risks or the potential opportunities that such a sudden change could bring.

Any change bring with it some new opportunities that will transform the higher education system worldwide and especially in a country like India which is planning to bring about a planned reform of e-learning in this sector. Universities and colleges will shift to a model of blended learning where both face to face deliveries along with an online model will become a norm. This will require all

technology savvy and go through some training to bring them to the level that would be required.

teachers to become more

New ways of delivery and assessments of learning outcomes will have to be adopted which opens immense opportunities for a major transformation in the area of curriculum development and pedagogy. There is a great opportunity for universities and colleges to start improving the quality of the learning material that is used in the teaching and learning process. Since blended learning will be the new format of learning, there will be a push to find new ways to design and deliver quality content.

The sudden shift to online learning without any planning -- especially in countries like India where the backbone for online learning was not ready and the curriculum was not designed for such a format -- has created the risk of most of our students becoming passive learners and they seem to be losing interest due to low levels of attention span. E-learning is a special kind of methodology and not all teachers are good at it or at least not all of them are ready for this sudden transition from face to face teaching- learning to e-learning. There is a risk that in such a situation, learning outcomes may not be achieved and it may be only resulting in engaging the students.

## Thus, we can summarize the opportunities in elearning:

- 1. Convenience and flexibility in both place and time.
- Increased opportunities for all learners to participate, including those who are shy or reticent in face-to-face communication.
- 3. Provide platform for spontaneous online interaction through question-answer sessions.
- 4. Take advantage of online materials/materials in different formats such as videos, assessments and simulations.
- 5. Online education can cost less due to a variety of reasons. For example, there is no cost for commuting.
- E-learning might give students access to specialized degree courses that may not be available in an easily accessible or local institution of learning.
- 7. Online courses can help students to study and understand the concepts from the global perspectives.

# Different ways in which Online Learning can be made effective in the COVID 19 Pandemic are:

- Use Good Face time apps like Zoom, WebEx Cisco and Microsoft Teams etc which have good features and can help to support the e-learning process.
- Collaboration with top nosh foreign universities which can help in guiding local professors to learn and be at ease while dealing with today's technology.
- 3. Set up an IT Team of experts who can manage the Logistics

- and other common problems like technical glitches or any unlawful acts committed by students associated with elearning so that professors can smoothly conduct their lectures
- 4. Always be prepared for an effective Plan B where you need to have a backup plan for all assignments and assessments that rely on technology.
- Evaluation process must be practical based on viva, interviews etc.
- It would be wise for a professor to take students in batches of 30-35 students for a specific subject to reduce his/her workload and engage in teaching effectively thus maintain the online session's decorum too

#### Challenges of Online Learning:

- 1. Requires self-discipline and time management skills.
- 2. Need to work to build on community connection.
- 3. Relies on technology being functional and accessible.
- Conducting open book examinations where a lot of copying or cheating can happen due to lack of proper exam supervision in general.
- Online Learning may create lot of isolation i.e. lack of social contact with friends
- 6. Lot of illegal activities like sending explicit messages, hacking and distraction may spoil the quality of online lectures.
- 7. Having online Exams might be a tough challenge because of open book test or other tests
- 8. Problem of bogus people entering via meeting links and creating chaos in the online classroom

India is not just going through a reform in the higher education sector, but now it will go through a major transformation in general.
