

Today, Covid-19 outbreak has affected all walks of life and education system is no exception. During this challenging times and new normal set up due to the pandemic, RSET has left no stone unturned to give quality education to the students. Despite continued lockdown for the entire quarter (July-September 2020) we at RSET functioned normally using online mode; both for academic and administrative activities. Technology has been an enabler in this moment of crisis. Resources like Zoom and G-suite for online learning has enabled our institutions to provide a seamless educational experience to all its students. We have slowly and steadily motivated our teaching staff to physically attend their schools and colleges on staggered basis for imparting enhanced learning experience to their students as better resources can be provided in the institutions. Similarly, most of the administrative staff attended the office by following Government of India and Maharashtra Government norms.

The Institutes have ensured that the students complete their homework, assignments and other tasks given to them online. Several MCQ type online test were also conducted successfully for internal exams on Gold Academy's Learning Management System (LMS) for our PG Students of Management.

For the first time we at RSET have carried out the entire Online Admission Process of all the students in various Institutes. Prospectus and Online Application forms were made available to the students. The online window for submission of online admission form was made open for few weeks. . Subsequently the verification of the documents and collection of fees too was done online. The Merit Lists were drawn and communicated to the students on their email and Whatsapp. Their classes commenced after all the completion of the admission procedure.

Message From Director of Schools

The 'back to school' season is here

As the pandemic wanes in some countries and rages on in others, academicians the world over are mulling over the issue of restarting educational institutions. This is going to be a slow process, often a process of trial and error, and it is likely to witness many ups and downs. This has already become apparent with the state government of Maharashtra allowing schools to reopen and the civic body, the BMC, taking a more cautious approach.

It has been a while since countries across the world began opening up their educational systems after the pandemic had settled in. While most countries across the world have been very cautious about reopening of schools, some have been quite brave about it. For example, Sweden has kept its schools open all along. Schools in countries such as China, Denmark, Japan and Norway opened as early as in April. In the United States, where the situation does seem to be under control, many states have decided to keep their schools shut for a prolonged period of time. As the process of unlock got under way in India, the Maharashtra government decided to allow schools to re-open from the 23rd of November 2020. However, given the continued gravity of the situation, this decision has been rescinded and now schools will reopen only in the newyear.

In this process the most important question that has challenged governments and school administrations has been the timing of opening schools. This has been determined by the progress of the pandemic, not only in different parts of a country but within a country itself. As we know Maharashtra was among the worst affected states in India and there were some states which suffered only a passing epidemic. With infections down to within hundreds the Maharashtra government decided that it is time for schools to reopen. However, the civic body felt that this should not be allowed and at present the decision to reopen schools hangs in the balance. At RSET, preparations for reopening of our schools and other institutes began in August itself when staff, who were working from home since March 15th, were urged to return to schools and work from the campus. Online teaching continued but this was facilitated from the institutes.

The second important question to consider is for whom to open the schools. It might seem like an obvious response to say that senior students should return to school and colleges first but this has not been a universal response. Looking at the serious mental health and attention challenges faced by the youngest of the children in online learning, some advanced countries took the decision of opening up schools for preprimary students first. Such a decision will not go down well in highly populated countries like India where many students live in joint family situations and may carry the infection back home asymptomatically. In Maharashtra the government has been influenced by a consideration of how a continued absence might affect the future prospects of students. Hence the decision to allow those who are likely to face board examinations in the near future – that is students from Grades 9 to 12 – to return to school.

The next consideration pertains to the pre-conditions that must be met when reopening schools. When schools reopen lakhs of students and thousands of teaching and non-teaching staff will make their way to these institutions and expose themselves and others to the virus. So



preventing this occurrence will be a major consideration on the minds of most governments and school administrations. Schools have been asked to ensure adequate social distancing in the classrooms as well as in other spaces. The entire school building has to be sanitised periodically and a doctor should be at hand. The government has also mandated that all staff who will come in contact with students have to mandatorily get themselves tested for Covid before resuming classes. This poses several challenges not only in terms of the magnitude of the task but also the knowledge that a Covid test is valid only for a limited period of time. So are school staff expected to get themselves tested on a weekly/monthly basis? Is the system ready to take on such a load? And what about the students? Are they not to be tested?

One of the biggest challenges is posed by the parent community of metropolises like Mumbai which had been deeply affected by the virus. Governments may announce school opening dates, but can parents be forced to send their children to school? Almost every family was affected by the virus and some have lost their family members to the pandemic. How willing will such parents be to send their children to school? What guarantees can educational institutions with a fixed amount of budget offer to such genuinely worried parents. One of the important considerations will be handling a mixed bag of students – some who will attend school physically and some who will continue to demand online learning. Running online and offline classes simultaneously will be technologically and physically challenging and if institutions decide to send pre-recorded lectures to students, parents are going to wonder if they are getting their money's worth.

Despite these challenges, a locked down state cannot be accepted as a semi-permanent state of affairs and solutions will have to be found. These will need to be effective and often innovative. How well they will work, only time will tell.

With Hope on the Horizon

Lockdown has become the word of the year 2020 as it has affected millions of people across the world. It has totally affected the way we work, travel, study, shop and socialize. It has brought with it words like 'social distancing', 'sanitizer', 'quarantine', 'mask' and some other words that we never used in our lives otherwise. All these words are bi-products of COVID-19 Pandemic that has taken lives of millions of people all over the world. Widespread job and income loss along with economic insecurity among families are increasing day by day. Many business houses have adapted (with varying levels of success) to work from home policies.

Festivals like 'Ganpati', 'Eid', 'Navratri' etc. were lack luster and the festive mood was lacking due to Government directives of social distancing to prevent spread of COVID-19. In market places and malls, the mood was subdued with few customers in the shops that generally remain overcrowded during festivals.

As regards sports, for the first time, the 2020 Indian Premiere League (IPL) cricket matches were played in empty stadiums without any audience in Dubai, Abu-Dhabi and Sharjah. Due to Corona Virus Pandemic, tournament was shifted out of India with many safety protocols in place. The matches were scheduled from 19th September to 10th November, 2020.

Education sector is the worst affected sector as more than 91% of the world's students are out of school due to school closures in at least 188 countries. For many pupils in our country, lockdown represents an interruption in their learning journey. Experts estimate that drop out of school children will double where in children from economically weak social groups will be affected at a large number. Girls will be affected even more.

Teachers across the country are trying their best to continue their teaching in a situation where physical presence is no longer possible. Teachers at the country's premier private schools are tech- savvy. Most of them have access to the internet at home as well as other digital infrastructure required to craft and share the course material with students. But what about



students of aided schools who do not have access to smart phones, internet, WIFI and similar other facilities to continue online learning? As per a notification of state government, all schools will remain closed till 31st December, 2020 in Mumbai. Parents have written to the education department that all assessments in the new academic year be conducted online and schools not be opened until it is safe for students.

With a semester lost, first year junior college (FYJC) aspirants and their parents are getting anxious with each passing day waiting for their classes to begin. The second merit list for FYJC aspirants was put on hold on 9th September following the Supreme Court's interim stay on Maratha quota, admissions were stalled for first year junior college. Recently Maharashtra Government has passed a resolution stating that all admissions for current academic year will be done without the Socially & Educationally Backward Classes quota. However admissions before the SC's order on 9th September will remain unaffected. State Education Department has also started free online classes for FYJC students but very few students are attending these classes.

As regards institutions of RSET, in the new academic year, all institutions have well adapted themselves right from online admission to conduct various academic and extra -curricular activities for their students through Zoom & Google Meet. Women Development Cell of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College along with Maharashtra State Commission for Women and Responsible Netism organized the launch of 'Digital Stree Shakti', and a webinar on Cyber Security, on 21st July 2020. Adv. Yashomati Thakur, Honourable Minister, Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Maharashtra presided as the Chief Guest for the launch. Faculty members of Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies attended many webinars on different topics during this period. All the institutions of RSET have regularly conducted statutory meetings of Governing Boards, School Sub-Committees etc. through Zoom platform.

In the words of Roy T. Bennett 'Never lose hope. Storms make people stronger and never last forever'. We hope that once the COVID vaccine is available to the medical fraternity, the pandemic will definitely be controlled. We sincerely hope that the year 2021 brings with it healthier world where we can live freely as we did earlier. Let our educational campuses and class rooms be full of students and our teachers and we can enjoy our lives to the fullest.






Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School




Mainadevi Bajaj International School






trained many celebrities of Bollywood & Hollywood.





Report of the E-Conference on NEP 2020: Impact on PGDM Education

Dated 29th August, 2020

· National Education policy

The New Education Policy 2020 as approved by the Union Cabinet aims at making "India a global knowledge superpower". One of the stated aims of the policy is to instill a "deep-rooted pride" in being Indian, not only in thought, but also in spirit, intellect, and deeds, as well as to develop knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions. The Government formulated the New Education Policy through the consultation process for an inclusive, participatory, and holistic approach, which takes into consideration expert opinions, field experiences, empirical research, stakeholder feedback, as well as lessons learned from best practices.

In pursuant to the objectives and goals of the NEP 2020, Education Promotion Society for India (EPSI) organised an E-Conference on 29 August 2020. The E Conference was attended by over 200 academic leadership of MBA/PGDM Universities and Institutes of the country including representation from overseas Think Tanks. Director, BIMTECH and Trustee and Executive President of EPSI, Dr Harivansh Chaturvedi chaired the proceedings of the Conference. Besides the inaugural keynote address delivered by Professor Anil Sahasrabudhe, Chairman, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the highlight of the E Conference was a set of two panel discussions led by three moderators of outstanding academic excellence.

· The distinct features of the NEP 2020 are:

(a) There would be a single regulator for all higher education institutions in India

(b) In a bid to ramp up digital learning, a National Educational Technology Forum (NETF) would be created. E-courses will be developed in eight regional languages initially and virtual labs will be developed.

(c) Top 100 foreign colleges will be allowed to set-up campuses in India. According to the NEP 2020, listing salient features of policy, "such (foreign) universities will be given special dispensation regarding regulatory, governance, and content norms on par with other autonomous institutions of India.

(d) Standalone Higher Education Institutes and professional education institutes will be evolved into multi-disciplinary education. There are over 45,000 affiliated colleges in our country. Under Graded Autonomy, Academic, Administrative and Financial Autonomy will be given to colleges, based on the status of their accreditation.

(e) Setting up of National Research Foundation (NRF).

Around 268 affiliating universities in India have 40,000 plus colleges attached to them. The policy endeavours to transform HEIs into centres of innovation and excellence by reducing their administrative burden. By granting graded autonomy and turning HEIs into degree-granting colleges, NEP intends to bring greater transparency and standardisation in the higher education landscape.

The policy also aims to transform educators by enhancing the professional standards among teachers. The National Education Technology Forum (NETF), for instance, will enable the exchange of ideas on the use of technology for enhanced learning, which will help in bridging the digital divide.

The E-Conference deliberated on the following aspects of NEP 2020:

- 1. The Impact of the NEP 2020 on management education in general, particularly over 500 PGDM granting B-schools.
- 2. Challenges and opportunities of NEP 2020 for B-schools.
- 3. Planning the future roadmap to align and benefit from this landmark policy.

The forum also has taken another decision to hire Mr. Raju Subramanian as Forum's advocate to file a suit, in case FRA declines Forum's appeal.



Academic Activities

Promotion and Admission Procedure

Extreme measures were taken in the Education Sector for the first time. These measures were taken keeping into account the pandemic caused by COVID 19. One of these steps was to promote all the students of First Year and Second Year BAFTNMP/BMM/BAMMC.

DGMC also followed the guidelines provide by the University of Mumbai for the promotion of students. For Semester II &IV the internal marks were carried forward, as the assessment for Internal Evaluation had already taken place

For external evaluation, the tabulation of marks was done on the basis of the internal marks and the average marks of Semester I & III as the case may be.

Guest Lecture: Neeraj Joshi was invited as a Guest Speaker for an interactive session on Movie Marketing Strategies on Saturday 29th August 2020





PAID Courses: Specialised Add-on courses

Course I - TV expert conducts add-on certificate course in Broadcast

The Broadcast Journalism course conducted at DGMC in July by veteran broadcast multilingual journalist and producer Samarjit Singh Bhandral was extremely informative and insightful for the students who attended the sessions online.

The 12 sessions, conducted over a month, included insights regarding a plethora of topics like Newsroom Departments, Input-Output desks,

Newslists, Rundowns, Scripting, etc. The afternoon sessions of the addon certificate course were engaging as the professor kept the students busy with fun assignments that were useful in the world of news. Not only this, but the students were also guided on this magnificent journey even beyond the lecture hours.

Narrowing down the elements of newsrooms, the media students learned how Input and Output Desks at any TV channel function and form a seamless transition for every story. Moving on the students understood how to avoid being monotony by using various elements like flashes, tickers, slugs, graphics, etc. while doing a story.

The concept of packaging a news story so that it ensures maximum viewership was also covered, many more such similar concepts were also taught. Scripting at all levels was simplified into designated sections and taught with ease. Surprisingly, the students also learned to plan an electrifying debate show. They even shot a news reporting capsule and analysed it. All of the assignments that were turned in were given constructive criticism and it truly helped elevate levels of learning.

Course II - Multimedia add-on course

This month-long course was conducted by Italy-based European Pressphotoagency's Mumbai's photojournalist Divyakant Solanki for the students of DGMC. Some of the topics covered by the renowned photographer were within the realm of photography and videography. He also instructed the students in editing both photos and videos. Some of the important topics that were address in the online class were basic introduction of Photography, what is Photography, History of Photography.

The students also learned the transition of the camera – from different types of camera (old to new) to different type of lenses and its uses and importance. Solanki also enlightened the students about what to keep in mind while shooting photographs - Shutter Speed, Aperture (F-Stop), ISO-infull detailed lectures with examples.

The class also got lessons on how to compose a frame, metering, knowing your camera settings, how to hold the camera in different positions, in different situations. Different types of Camera Modes (each mode from Auto, Program, Shutter Priority, Aperture, and Manual) were explained, along with the Rule of Third to understand the composition while shooting and how to implement techniques.

The students also got a sneak preview of photography tips and essential photography equipment in the class which took place thrice a week in two-hours-long sessions. Editing skills were also imparted in in Photoshop and Lightroom.

In Video, the class was taught understanding the camera, settings for the videos from the frame rate to shutter speed, Aperture, ISO, White Balance and basic Video editing in Kinemaster.





It also entailed activities which focused on practicing different skills that they learnt during the session so they know how to execute them too. These skills will assist them to be smart learners and ensure that their efforts produce results. The students thoroughly enjoyed the session and they mentioned that they would like to have such sessions even later as it was very helpful for them. A career guidance webinar was conducted by RMCC on 14th and 18th August for the students pursuing their graduation program from D. G. Tatkare Mahavidyalay in Mangaon, Maharashtra. Over 75 students, from different courses - B.A., B. Com, B.M.S., B. Sc. and B. Sc. (IT) attended the

session on 14th August. Students of Junior college attended the webinar on 18th August. The objective of the session was to help the students understand the importance of career assessments and guidance in making the right career choices. The webinar focused on understanding the importance of career counseling and how personality, interest and aptitude play a very important role in choosing a career. The counselor spoke to the students about what are the anticipated challenges in choosing a career and how deeper understanding of our strengths and areas of improvement helps us in making the right choice. The students thanked the facilitator for her inputs and mentioned that they obtained clarity in understanding the different options available for them.

RMCC conducted a career guidance webinar for **DSV School, Thane** on 15th August, 2020 for students in the 9th and 10th grade. Over 50 students attended the webinar conducted online owing to the pandemic.

RMCC took the initiative to organize a webinar for Fathers on 15th August, 2020 to assist them to balance their work and life challenges and be more emotionally resilient at the face of adversity. The webinar was attended by fathers who have been successful working professionals in different walks of life. The facilitator of RMCC discussed what various unhealthy emotions are and how unhealthy coping styles are leads them towards being more emotionally disturbed. Various strategies were discussed on how to cope with unhealthy negative emotions like working on the thought process, dispute irrational thoughts and letting go of the past.

The sudden lockdown in March and the pandemic were very overwhelming for everyone and adjusting to it took a toll on mental health. We all had to suddenly adapt to new ways of working and communicating and adapt ourselves to technological mediums. Work life balance became difficult to achieve because of no healthy boundaries. Educators especially found it difficult to adjust to the sudden changes and conduct online teaching sessions. Keeping this in account, RMCC conducted a webinar for teachers - Embracing online teaching and Self-care on 29th August, 2020. The objective of the session was to help teachers with online engagement strategies that can be useful for school and college students. In addition to this, it also focused on the importance of self-care during these unprecedented times. The session was fruitful and resourceful for the participants.

Self-care has different meanings for everyone but on a fundamental level, self-care means taking care of oneself physically, emotionally and mentally. There are multiple self-care strategies that have been used by individuals during the lockdown and the webinar Happy Journaling conducted by RMCC on 19th September specifically focused on journaling as a self-care strategy. The purpose of the webinar was to equip the participants with the skill of journaling by rationalizing their thoughts and understanding how thoughts play an important role in influencing our behaviours.

RMCC had organized a **webinar on Sports Psychology** on 26th September, 2020. A one of its kind webinar which was focused on "Unveiling the Unseen Hidden Opponents in Sports Performance" The webinar was facilitated by none other than **Mrs. Amruta Karkhanis Deshmukh**, a National level sports person who has bagged more than 13 medals in various sports events like cycling, swimming and track racing and is a record holder sea swimmer.

Ms. Amruta explained the participants of FOUR main Hidden Opponents that are left unseen and unattended while the participants largely focus on their physical fitness. Participants were explained how these opponents reflect in their performances and managing them well could enhance the performance considerably. RMCC has been conducting online career counseling sessions to assist students to choose their way forward. Continuous Remedial sessions have been conducted to bridge

grade gap for students with learning difficulties. Emotional well being sessions have helped many clients to stay focussed and sail through emotional challenges.






The Colours of the Olympic Rings are **Significant**

Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel has been started from the academic year 2018 and is presently occupied by Indian as well as Foreign students from Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Egypt, Madagascar, Tunisia, Tanzania, Ghana, Sudan, Fiji, Mauritius, Sri Lanka and Malawi. Recently, the Consul General of Afghanistan Ms. Zakia Wardak visited RSET Campus to meet the students from Afghanistan staying in Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel as well as Draupadidevi Sanwarmal women's hostel of RSET. A meeting was arranged of Ms. Zakia Wardak with students from Afghanistan at Nathmal Garodia Seminar Hall of Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies in which the students spoke highly about the facilities provided to them in both the hostels.

Throughout the lockdown period caused by COVID-19 Pandemic, the foreign students could not go back to their respective countries and had to stay in their respective hostels & the Management provided them hygienically prepared lunch also (which was not in their package) along with breakfast and dinner supplied by the in-house caterer of RSET. Renewal process for old students is also going on. Since the lockdown of class room educational activities is still continuing, old students are not yet back in the hostel. They are renewing for their stay by making online payment. Other facilities provided to the inmates of the hostel include free WiFi access to the entire building, provision of fire detection and firefighting system, CCTV and 24 X 7 Security. Each floor has been provided with a lounge and a television for recreational facility.

Presently, Gym facilities have been provided to students in an area in the ground floor. However a separate Gym is under construction on the seventh floor of the hostel. Some gym equipments such as tread mill, cycle , bench & dumbbells have been provided in the Gym so that students can work -out as per their convenience. Some recreational equipments such as Table Tennis, carom etc.have also been purchased Also provision of a separate washing area is being made on the seventh floor for the students. Washing machines have been provided to the students and new washing machines with dryers have been purchased for the convenience of the inmates of the hostel.

Warden of the Hostel as well as other staff are always alert to provide comfort and safety of the inmates. To keep the Hostel neat and clean, the professional House-keeping staff appointed by the Management clean all the areas at frequent intervals.

Some of the students staying in the hostel are pursuing the professional course of Chartered Accountancy . All the CA students are being accommodated in the third floor of the Hostel so that they can interact with each other as and when needed. Half yearly health check-up camp has also been planned for the Hostel inmates by Ayaksha, the agency running Vijay Pal Singh Health Centre of the Trust. The Hostel inmates have also been given a slot in the morning (twice a week) to use Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy ground for playing various games after the lockdown period is over.

Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel is indeed becoming popular day by day and has proved to be a boon not only for Indian students but also foreign students coming from other countries to complete their professional and higher education.

CAREER CHOICES & CAREER PLANNING THE WAY AHEAD ...



The younger generation of today are at crossroads about their pursuit of educational careers. They are seeing the traditional career options losing their sheen and at the same time, a plethora of new career options have come into being. Further, due to the global exposure that is available through the internet & world wide web, there is an information overdose. A direct consequence of this is conflicting views and opinions about career choices both in the minds of the students' & parents.

In the light of the above, here are some guidelines to make informed career choices:

- 1. Parents must discuss with their children about the career aspirations and not force their career desires onto the student as this can lead to a complete chaos in the education path of the child. This is best done when the child is in Standard X...
- 2. An aptitude test administered by a qualified career counselor can show the right path; further the counselor can also explain about various career choices to the aspiring student.
- 3. All parents must ensure that they are not victims of peer pressure or try to impose their career path onto the children. Many parents get into a competitive mode where career choices are determined by market trends or the herd mentality and the aptitude of the child is ignored.
- 4. Further students too must not fall prey to peer pressure amongst classmates. A normal tendency is to choose career options that childhood friends choose or the most in demand in the neighborhood. Such a short sighted approach would only lead to incorrect career choices and plenty of anxiety and confusion later on.
- 5. In earlier years, the teacher used to be a great influencer of the career choice of the student. However this trend in on the decline but the coaching class & its teachers have taken over this task. It is here where we see the peer pressure to a great extent.
- 6. The right approach would be to do an aptitude test, ascertain ones career choice based on potential and then work towards the same. A thorough research using the power of google can enlighten the family about the pros and cons of various institutions. This would also connect them with online groups such as alumni, researchers and provide a channel to get more information to make an informed choice. Besides, it would be great if the student and parent visit few institutions that their child wishes to join and understand about various courses they offer and review the infrastructure & facilities. Such a visit could also provide an opportunity to meet some of the faculty and get a realistic view from them.
- 7. Another factor to tackle diplomatically is the peer pressure from the extended family & relatives who tend to make career choices of children a TEA TIME topic for discussion. Further, each person tends to believe that they know best and are the ultimate career experts. This leads to lots of judgmental decisions which is not in





the interest of the child's career.

8. The younger generation of today is often called the fast food generation and always seem to be in a hurry. They wish to have faster tracks to complete their studies quickly, want jobs fast, then demand faster career successes and then also exit fast. Thus in this scenario an informed career choice made with a scientific approach could be a solid career foundation.

9. It is very critical for all parents and teachers to help students to transit from school to college in a seamless & smooth manner. Further the transition for a junior college to a professional institution should be handled with utmost care and caution.

10. Another important focus area for the younger generation is develop ones overall personality. In today's competitive world the person who succeeds is the one who has multiple skills under his belt. Specialization in an area is important but one should not be an over-specialist. It is useful to inculcate communication skills, inter-personal skills, teamwork skills to all children. These go a long way in boosting their confidence and also build better impressions on one and all around them. It is required that the parents encourage the child to actively participate in extracurricular and co-curricular activities at the school & college level. It is here that they learn valuable lessons of competitiveness and sportsmanship.

Career counseling is an extremely critical and useful activity in the life of a student .in a world that is full of choices and intensely competitive; it is important for one and all to plan their careers irrespective of social status. It is here that a career counselor could be most helpful as he/she could give expert guidance and also a dispassionate view of various career options.

To summarise, it is absolutely necessary for all schools to initiate in house career seminars for students at the beginning of std X. This would help students increase their awareness about various careers options and the requirements for the same. It is ideal that parents also attend these seminars as they can clarify their doubts and queries. I strongly advise that this is followed up with an aptitude test whose results need to be discussed on an individual basis with each student & their parents.
