The students aspiring for admission to MBBS this year have already applied for a single Eligibility cum Entrance Examination namely National Eligibility cum Entrance Test from this year.

HISTORY OF SARVODAYA BALIKA VIDYALAYA NOW KNOWN AS KUDILAL GOVINDRAM SEKSARIA SARVODAYA SCHOOL

Women comprise almost half of India's population. They have played an important role in the social development of our country. Educated women can strengthen the foundations of a country. It is said that if a woman is educated in a family then she can educate her full family. Understanding the significance of women's education, Rajasthani Sammelan had decided to start a girls school in Malad way back in 1958.

Almost 4 -5 years before, Sarvodaya Shikshan Samiti had already started in Govind Nagar, Malad, a school by the name of Sarvodaya Vidyalaya. Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar had started the school in the Hanuman Temple of Chincholi with two students on 6th November, 1954. Smt. Sushila R. Jasrapuria, daughter of late Shri Vishwanthji Podar was the first student of the school. Gradually the students strength started increasing and it turned to be a primary school. To give this school a greater dimensions, great philanthropist Late Shri Kudilalji Seksaria gave a spacious land of 4,000 sq.yards for the school. A small building was built on this land and the primary section of the school was inaugurated on February, 1956 by none other than great philanthropist Shri Kudilalji Seksaria who like his great father late Shri Govindramji Seksaria had always given handsome donations for the cause education. During this time, late Shri Brijmohan Laxminarayan Ruia donated Rs.50,000/- to start the construction. Encouraged by success of the starting of the project many philanthropists and others dedicated to the cause of education came forward and collected an amount of

Rs.1,24,000/- and the construction work of a proper school building was started. In January, 1959 all the property of Sarvodaya Vidyalaya run by Sarvodaya Shikshan Samiti was

handed over to Rajasthani Sammelan. In this way the dream of the members of Rajasthani Sammelan to open a girls school was realized.

Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) was inaugurated on 21st June, 1959 by the then Union Education Minister Dr. Kalulal Shreemali. The valuable contributions made by founder members Late Shri Durgaduttji Thard, Late Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan, Late Shri Satyanarayanji Ganeriwal, Late Shri Hariramji Saraf, Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar and many others will be remembered forever.


Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya started as primary school, gradually progressed to become a secondary school attached to S.S.C. State Board of Maharashtra to impart education in Thereafter in 1975, the trust received Hindi medium. recognition from the State Government to start a Junior College which was attached to the school. Later in the year 2006, the management decided to attach Junior College to Ghanshyamdas Saraf College.

In 1959, Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya started functioning under the efficient leadership of Smt Pratibha Patvardhan who was the first headmistress of the school. Very soon the school became famous for its teaching & extra-curricular achievements. She continued up to 1971 and after her Smt. Rajkumari Chaturvedi was appointed as the headmistress who continued up to 1980. She was succeeded by Smt. Shakuntala Mehra (1980-1992), Smt Pratibha Jeste (1992-1993), Smt. Urvashi Rohatgi (1993-2000), Smt. Krishna Chawla (2000-2002), Smt. Usha Pandit (2002-2003) and Smt. Shashi Prabha Shukla (2003-2007) as Headmistress of secondary section. While the Headmistresses of primary section were Smt. Urmila Mehra (1986-1988), Ms. Prafullata Seth (1988-1997), Smt. Padma Gautam (1997-2004) and Smt. Nisha Singh (2004-2012).

From 2007, Smt. Latha Venkat has been appointed as the Headmistress who is working efficiently along with her dedicated team of teaching and non-teaching staff. Under her leadership, the school is progressing to greater heights in terms of academic and extra-curricular activities. The present Headmistress of the primary section is Smt. Aarti Rai, who became Headmistress in 2012 and is working with full

dedication.

In all these years of successful existence, in the educational scenario of Mumbai, Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) has been well known for its academic excellence and outstanding contribution in the field of extra-curricular activities. The students have been regularly participating in science exhibition and have won many prizes. The results of the school at S.S.C. Board examination have been excellent ranging between 95% - 99% and more.

During the construction of the new building, Shri Rajkumar





Q. How did your father Late Shri Kudilalji Govindram Seksaria get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan.?

My father Late Shri Kudilalji Govindram Seksaria came in contact with Rajasthani Sammelan through Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar, an active member and trustee of Rajasthani Sammelan who was the main person and inspiration behind the starting of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya. He had already started Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya with 2 students in the Hanuman Temple of Chincholi, Malad. At that time, he was an active member of





Sarvodaya Shikshan Samiti. He approached my father and requested him to give land to construct the school building. He was a great philanthropist, so he readily agreed to provide a spacious piece of land of approx. 4000 sq. yards for this purpose in 1957. Later when Sarvodaya Shikshan Samiti transferred all the assets of Sarvodaya Vidyalaya to Rajasthani Sammelan, my father became a life trustee of Rajasthani Sammelan and remained the same throughout his life.

Q. What was the objective and vision of Late Shri Kudilalji Govindram Seksaria when he gave land for Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya School (now known as KGSSS)?

In those days there was no girls' school in Malad or in its nearby area. Therefore, girls from conservative families were not getting opportunity to get education. It was therefore very much required to start an all girls' Hindi medium school to empower girls' coming from conservative families with education. Therefore, the main objective of my father to provide land for Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) was to facilitate construction of school building so that a school can be run properly and girls from conservative family can receive proper education up to S.S.C. by attending the school. Girls education was very near to the heart of my father like my grandfather Late Seth Govindramji Seksaria who opened his first educational institution amongst many, the girls' school in the year 1927 at Nawalgarh, his hometown in Rajasthan.

Q. Do you feel that his objective has been realized?

I feel that his objective of providing opportunity to girl students to receive education has been definitely realized. Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya, now known as Kudilal Govidram Seksaria Sarvodaya School has educated thousands of students in all these years. Many of these students have been coming from under privileged strata of society. Since the fees for the school have been very low, all the students could afford to pay the fees and complete the education. The school was started in 1959 and celebrated its Golden Jubilee in the 2009. Presently it is running successfully in its 54th year. The school has rich alumni list to its credit who have made name and fame in different walks of life. This school was the beginning of the journey of the educational endeavour of Rajasthani Sammelan. Later on a Junior College was opened followed by a Degree College and now in due course many other institutions have been started by Rajasthani Sammelan.

Q. In what way are you associated with Rajasthani Sammelan in its mission of educational endeavour?

Our family has always been associated with Rajasthani Sammelan. My father was a life trustee and we all are permanent trustees of Rajasthani Sammelan. Our family members are also members in the school sub-committee as well as advisory

committee of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School. We have always been attending functions, meetings and other important happenings as and when required. In 2007, the old school building was demolished and a new building with state of art facilities was constructed to relocate the school. Our family then came forward to grant donation for this cause. The school was then renamed as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School. In the year 2010 an English medium school by the name of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School was also started by the trust and at that time also we extended our support in term of donations. Our family members are also members of school sub-committee and have taken great interest in the development of both the schools. In fact we have great attachment with Rajasthani Sammelan and all the institutions.

Q. Tell us something about your late father and his philanthropic activities?

My father was a noble hearted person, who lived a simple and disciplined life. He was deeply interested in spiritualism of which he read a lot. Philanthropic activities were started by my Grandfather Seth Govindramji Seksaria and my father carried the tradition forward.

Q. Did you get inspired by the philanthropic services of your late father? If yes, then in what way?

The inspiration of philanthropic services flowed down from my grandfather to my father and from them, to us. We endeavor to continue the tradition set by them to the best of our ability.

Q. In what way are you associated with Rajasthani Sammelan in its objective of 'Education for All'?

By doing whatever possible from my end to help the Sammelan achieve its objective.

Q. What is your vision for Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School in the next five years?

That, it continues to offer improved infra structure and quality education at affordable rates to the lower segment of society especially the girls, which it has been doing all along.

Q. Since when are you associated with Rajasthani Sammelan?

I am associated with Rajasthani Sammelan since 1960. In fact, late Shri Vishwanathji Podar introduced me to Rajasthani

Sammelan. At that time, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan was the President of Rajasthani Sammelan. Other important personalities associated with Rajasthani Sammelan were Shri Kishorilal Ruia, Shri Vishwanath Seksaria, Shri Shrikrushna Narsaria, Shri Murlidhar Jalan, Shri Ramgopal Ruia, Shri Durgadutt Thard, Shri Hariram Saraf, Shri Ratanlal Saraf, Shri Viswanath Podar, Shri Prahlad Rai Saraf, Shri Satyanarayan Kabra and many others who were actively involved in the activities of Rajasthani Sammelan as well as working of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School. Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar initially started the school in the Hanuman Temple of Chincholi with two students. Presently the school has more than 1,700 students in both primary and secondary sections.

Q. Tell us something about the early years of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya School?


Great Philanthropist Shri Kudilalji Seksaria had donated land to Sarvodaya Shikshan Samiti to start Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya. Later this samiti was merged with Rajasthan Sammelan. When I joined Rajasthani Sammelan, the school building with ground plus first floor was constructed. During the earlier years the first principal was Smt. Pratibha Patvardhan who worked between 1954 – 1971. She was a good administrator and a soft spoken lady. Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya became famous very soon as a good school in the area. Being the only girls school, all conservative family people preferred to send their daughters to study in this school. My sister Smt. Gomtidevi as well as my daughters Smt. Urmila and Smt. Seema have also studied in this school. The school celebrated its Silver Jubilee in a grand way in the year 1985.

Q. How did you contribute in the growth and development of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya School?

Inititally as member of Managing Committee and later in various capacities as Office Bearer, President and Trustee of Rajasthani Sammelan, I have always taken keen interest in the development of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya. In 2009, the school was named as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School. In all these years, we have always taken required steps for the betterment of the facilities in the school. We have always appointed good teachers provided computers, books as required by the students and teachers. Over the years, thousands of students of all communities and castes have passed out from this school and many of them are now distinguished personalities in different walks of life.

Q. How do you feel regarding the relocation of the school in the new building?

The school was shifted in the new building in June, 2010. The new building has state of art infrastructure with well ventilated classrooms, new furniture, cupboards, latest computers in computer lab, a spacious library and science lab which are more conducive to teaching learning. With all these facilities, I am sure that students will benefit more in the near future with all the facilities provided for teaching-learning. Though demand for Hindi medium schools is diminishing fast, we intend to continue with Kudilal Govindram Seksaria School to educate students from weaker economic background. I also feel that there should be more programmes in the school for the personality development of the students and also co-education may be introduced if permitted by the Government.



Kudilal Govindram Sarvodaya School over the years had some leading names from the academic world managing the school, overcoming all challenges and establishing a culture that encourages teacher to innovate new things to ensure that the teaching-learning experience at the school ensures a holistic development of the students. Their contribution is indeed noteworthy. We salute and commend their role and efforts in creating this institute of excellence.





was attended by Mr. Ashok Saraf, President of the Rajasthani Sammelan, Mr. Vinodkumar Bajaj, vice-chairman of Mainadevi Bajaj International School and many other dignitaries, principals and teachers from various schools and colleges from all over Mumbai.

In this session, Dr. Reimers put forth some utterly brilliant ideas to enhance and improve the education system. He enlightened the audience with many aspects of innovative education and also displayed the importance of global competency in today's world. Dr. Reimers said that it is extremely important for students to be able to communicate in different languages effectively. It is vital to go beyond just the facts-based bookish knowledge. Only knowledge is not enough in this competitive world. The ability to creatively think, to execute functioning, to be able to make decisions, to be able to take responsibility as leaders and communicate assertively are the key factors to achieve innovation and correct education.

Dr. Reimers spoke about machines and technology as friends of the human race which help us to do certain tasks better than humans giving us time to do those tasks which machines would fail to do as effectively. Dr. Reimers says that, "Facts can be easily available and need not be taught". He is of the opinion that knowledge is important but for that knowledge to become useful, there are other things that are important too and they are creativity and the ability to think. He also says that being able to put the thinking into a correct direction is also vital. Here comes the role of educators. When asked to comment upon how the relationship of a teacher and a student should be, Dr. Reimers said that the relationship should be very easy going and the teacher should be able to assess what the student is most interested in and make them excel in the same. Such interpersonal relationship between students and teachers needs a lot

of personalization and the teacher has to be responsible to motivate the students to work towards their interests and provide them with feedback on their work.

Understanding that the government plays an important role in the educational system and the syllabus formation and that

it wouldn't be easy to bring about changes in the educational pattern in our country in an easy fashion, Dr. Reimers suggests after school programme to bridge the gap between fixed syllabus and innovative ideas. He says that this can be done by educating the business leaders about new ideas in education and how they are important as the future of the nation and also the business industry lies in today's student class. The next step would be to talk these ideas to the government and presenting in front of them a new education system far more effective than the existing one. Dr. Reimers says. "We need to learn to accept change or else there won't be any future".

He also spoke about how global competence is of utmost importance. He suggests that the standards of subjects like Language, Math and Science need to have a higher standard and should match the global platforms. Knowledge and skills about world and globalization need to be imparted through education. Students need to know about how to co-operate and co-exist. They need to be taught to take responsibility and should be made aware of the problems the society is facing. Students have to be taught and made aware of what is going on in the world around them. Parents should be actively involved in their child's educational programme. They need to be shown the challenges that the world is facing are and how and why their child should know them.

Apart from all this Dr. Reimers stated that. "It is time we take our students seriously". He says that it is important for educators to make students feel like they are smart enough to do things, take responsibility and that they can bring about amazing transformations. He says that, the education needs to be more outcome and project based through which effective active learning is possible. The journey from understanding to putting knowledge into action is very important. Knowledge should be mixed with creativity and ability to think to make it useful and valuable. An out and out enlightening seminar for the educators present there, this seminar will surely be a step towards better education for students in our country.

The Pre Primary section came on stage next. They put up an act called, "Baby's Day Out". It dealt with the events in the day of a child



Engineering Admission Process

An Overview

Admission Process from Academic Year 2014-2015:

It is very much essential for the students those who will be studying in XII Science in A.Y. 2013-14 and aspiring for admission to professional courses viz. Engineering, Medicine and Pharmacy to know about the admission procedure to these courses from A.Y. 2014-15.

Government of Maharashtra is conducting MHT-CET, an entrance examination for admission to these professional courses from A.Y. 2004-05 and is continued till AY 2013-14 and admission are given on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate in MHT-CET in physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and as per the merit. There is no weightage for HSC total or PCM marks but only condition of 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics taken together was there as eligibility criteria for open category and 40% for backward class category candidates. Along with this, students were appearing IIT-JEE / AIEEE / MHT-CET and no. of other entrance examination conducted by Autonomous institutes, Deemed Universities and it was

like harassment of students. It was creating lot of confusion amongst students and their parents and also wastage of time and money. Because of this Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, have decided to conduct Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) at National level and give admission on JEE marks at all IIT's and central government aided institutes from A.Y. 2013-14.

Central Government have informed the state government to do admissions of first year Engineering based on JEE or continue with MHT-CET. Based on the feedback from stake holders and also the recommendation of taskforce committee, Govt. of Maharashtra decided to join the JEE conducted by central government from A.Y. 2014-15. The admissions to first year Engineering will be based on the JEE and XII or equivalent examination marks from A.Y. 2014-15, where in the weightage for each examination i.e. JEE (main) and XII will be 50%. The merit list shall be prepared based on the said criteria. Central government shall be conducting JEE in two parts viz. main and advanced. The students those who want

admission in any engineering college in Maharashtra should appear for main examination and it is not necessary for them to appear for advance examination. The student who wants to try admission at IIT, NIT shall appear for advanced examination. Student may appear for either or both the examination as per their

interest.

The 50% weightage for XII examination is for the marks obtained by them in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics (PCM) taken together and the he / she should have passed HSC examination. Hence there is 50 % weightage for PCM marks obtained in HSC along with the condition that candidate 45 % marks in PCM in HSC should have examination as eligibility criteria (40 % for backward class candidates). The candidate who will get less than 50% marks in PCM in HSC examination will not be eligible for admission to First year Engineering . The equivalence of marks obtained by the students passing out from various boards via CBSE / ICSE / STATE etc. shall be done as per the normalized percentile method of Indian Statistical Institute.

The syllabus for the HSC from A.Y.2014-15 will be revised and will be at par with the standard of National level. Hence with the revision of syllabus and having 50 % weightage to PCM marks of HSC, students will take HSC examination also seriously.

The JEE examination will be conducted by Central Government. However the Director of Technical Education is going to work as a competent authority and Nodal Officer, who will give guidance to the candidates and their parents, conduct examination and declare results.

Present Role of Director of Technical Education:

Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State publishes the Information brochure and also make information available on the website www.dte.org.in. The brochure gives the information regarding eligibility criteria for admission to engineering, the list of all the engineering colleges along with courses available with intake capacity, choice code, location of college and about its affiliation to University.





It also gives allocation of seats, reservation of seats for various categories, centralized admission process and counseling round, rules for admission at institute level and vacant seats, fees details etc. Every student must read the broacher very carefully and understand rules and regulations, admission process, eligibility criteria etc.

An Overview:

As the field of engineering incorporates new technologies, the appropriate scope of undergraduate education in engineering continues to grow.

In India, the Bachelor of Engineering isfour year degree program awarded by many universities. The entry to B.E is 10+2 years of schooling and also diploma holders in engineering by lateral entry at second year


level. It is a professional degree that involves a requirement for undertaking some engineering work.

GSC was accreditated by NAAC with A grade in the year 2004. This was valid for a period of five years. Therefore, in the year 2010, GSC a p p r o a c h e d NAAC for reaccreditation. This time the methodology was changed and the criteria on which assessment is based had also undergone quite a few changes.

The first stage therefore, was to submit self appraisal in the form of Reaccreditation Report (RAR). GSC prepared a detailed report consisting of self assessment on each parameter prescribed by NAAC. The peer team report was an excellent summary of the assessment by the team. In case of curricular aspects, the peer team appreciated the involvement of the college staff members in the syllabus revision through the respective Board of Studies. A

transparent admission process, a system of identifying slow learners and encouraging advanced learners were the highlights of the teaching, learning and evaluation process of the college. The Peer Team was particularly impressed with the quality of teaching staff. The team members were very happy about the extension activities of the college like NSS, NCC and Adult Education. The college probably scored the best on its excellent infrastructure which was well maintained. The library was a matter of special mention for its collection of books and DVDs. The college could highlight its progression rate, active alumni association and Mauj, the annual intercollegiate event. This was well appreciated. The Peer team made a special reference to the well knit organisational structure and effective internal coordinating and monitoring mechanism of the college.

In an overall analysis, the Peer Team identified institutional strengths like

committed management, participatory governance and excellent work attitude of teaching and non teaching staff. They expected to improve on research culture and publication output. Some very constructive suggestions like establishment of Women Studies Centre, establishing institution industry linkage and emphasis on IQAC activities were made by the team members.





ONLINE COURSES break language barrier

With its new certification initiative, the National Programme on

Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL) has come a long way from its humble beginnings as a repository of video lectures. On the cards are translations, sub-titling and original content in different languages so the courses reach more people.

NPTEL is moving to a massive open online course (MOOC) platform to host the content. While Google's Coursebuilder, an open source software platform, is the frontrunner, MIT's edX is also in the race. The content may appear on both platforms.

Google has put together a team in Bangalore and at its Mountain View office in US to work on Coursebuilder and coordinate with NPTEL, said a senior Google official. NTPEL course

videos are currently on YouTube and the channel has 1.5 lakh subscribers and 8.7 crore views. Moving to a platform like Coursebuilder will allow NPTEL to provide more students with a full course experience with personalised pages to track their progress.

While most international sites like Coursera and edX provide honour certificates with online-only exams, NPTEL will offer a proctored certificate with supervised exams at the end of the course which will be conducted across the country on weekends.

"The certification exam can be taken any time like the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT)," said IIT-Madras professor K Mangala Sunder, who is the national coordinator of NPTEL.

NPTEL's industry partners, which include IT majors TCS and Cognizant, are not only providing inputs for content but also mentoring groups of students. "The mentors will be company employees who are senior programmers," he said. Companies are providing their facilities for final certificate examinations for a fee to

be paid by NPTEL.

The inputs from IT companies and the certification are expected to improve the quality of graduates. "Although there is no written commitment, the understanding is that the companies will consider people who fare well in these courses for recruitment," said Andrew Thangaraj, IIT-M professor and head of the certification process. "The course will be free but we will charge a token fee for certification to meet some of the expenses," said Thangaraj.

Separate from certification initiative, NPTEL is planning 'Special Lectures'. Eminent academicians and industrialists will prepare a series of video lectures on topics ranging from mathematics to

Ayurveda. "It will be like a TED talk given by a learned and experienced personality, not one but a series of lectures on various topics," said Sunder.

NPTEL is transcribing all its video lectures and offering them as text and audio files. This will be launched on textofvideo@nptel.iitm. ac.in. Of the 20,000 courses on offer, 2,500 have been transcribed. Videos will also be sub-titled so that students from all language backgrounds can use the material. NPTEL is looking to develop speech-to-text for various Indian languages so that complete course material is available to all students.




