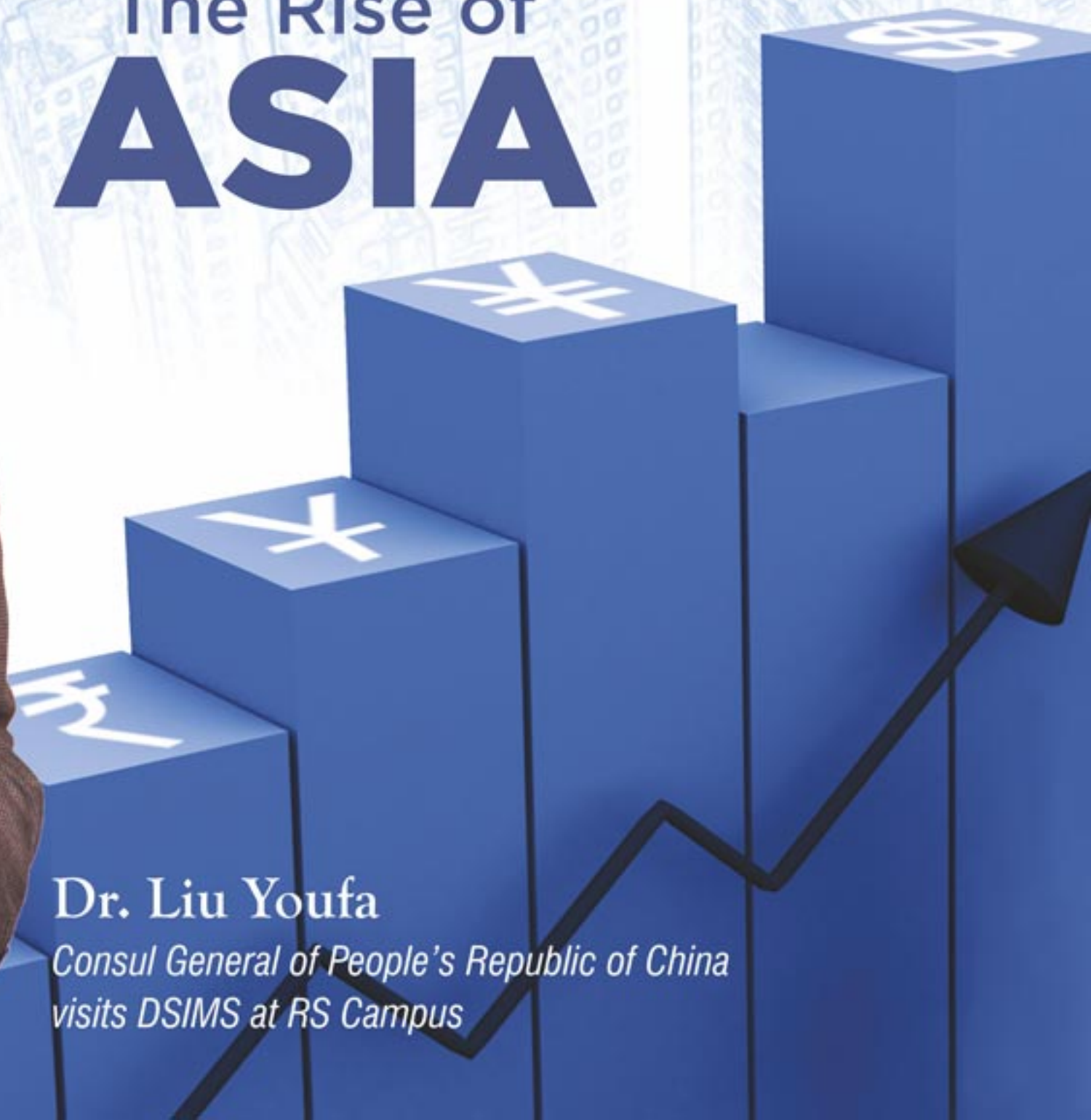

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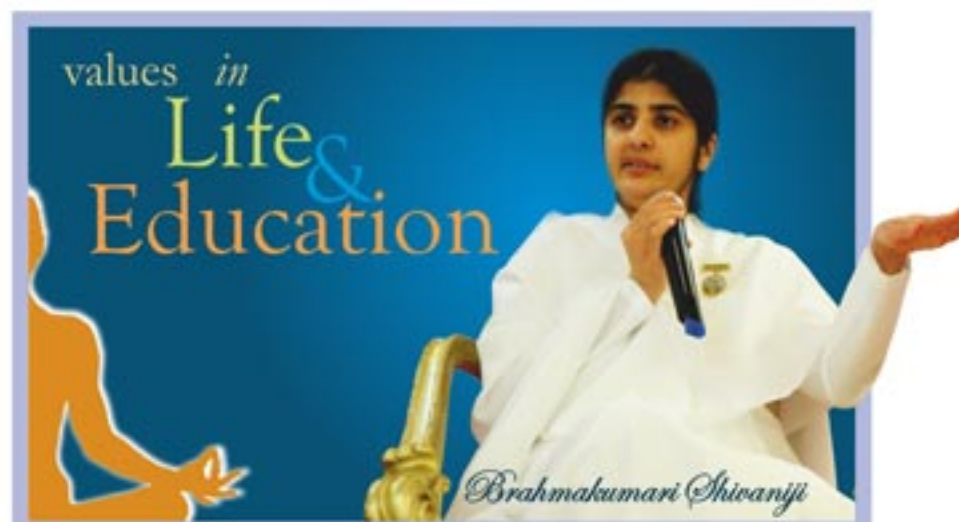

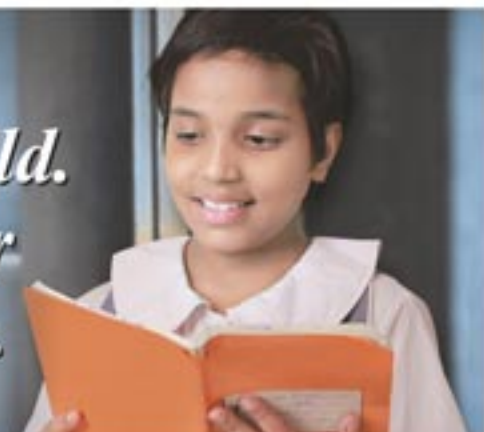
Here is a girl named Srishti. She lost her father eight years ago to cancer. Now, her mother is the bread-winner of the family. Srishti has a sister also. This family of three lives in a small room at Dombivali. Srishti is smart and has passed Xth standard exam with 90% marks. Her dream is to become a Chartered Accountant. There is another girl by the name Pooja. Her father had deserted her mother eleven years ago. Pooja's mother works as a domestic help to take care of her three children. Pooja has nurtured a dream to become an Architect. She leaves no stone unturned, studies hard and has got 91% marks in Xth std. exam.

There are many other children like Srishti and Pooja. When one hears such stories, one can't help but empathize with them. I was no exception. trustworthy & sustainable relationship with the community at large. One of the most significant indicators of social progress is education which also plays a decisive role for a society to achieve self sustainable and equal development. Therefore, education deserves a higher level of corporate involvement at all levels and especially at the level

Recently, Mumbai University had proposed 25% fee hike for all its courses from the next academic year, which was later stalled by the State Government for further review. Over the years, the method of teaching has changed drastically. The routine lecture in classroom is now supported by presentations through LCD projectors, air-conditioned computer labs, Wi-Fi, digital library, internet usage and such costly equipments that have made the method of teaching costlier day by day. Burden of all these expenditures comes on the Management of the colleges.

This reminds us of the recent laws related to Corporate Social Responsibility under the Companies Act 2013 that came into effect from 1st April, 2014 and whether these laws will help meritorious students from middle class families to obtain financial support from the corporates to complete their education. A brief report on the Proceedings of the International Conference held on

14 March 2014 at DSIMS

Consul General of People's Republic of China visits DSIMS at RS Campus

International Conference on the theme "The Rise of Asia - Opportunities and Challenges" was organized by Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies (DSIMS), Mumbai on 14th March, 2014 at the Institute premises.

The conference was attended by a large number of academicians, professionals, research scholars, policy makers and students.

The Conference was inaugurated by Dr. Liu Youfa (Consul General of People's Republic of China). Dr. Youfa delivered the insightful key note address on the theme of the conference. Dr. Youfa, who has been

Professor of Economics very frankly put forth his views on the strengths of Asia with special reference to China and India in world economy and commerce. He emphasized on the role of middle class population both as the producer and consumer. He was of the view that China and India will continue to play a dominant role in manufacturing and services sectors respectively and can complement each other in global economic development.

Nine research papers were presented in the conference in the broad theme areas as stated above.

Following the footsteps of Robert Mundell's classical work on OCA, C.D. Shreedharan and Mr. Arindam Bandyopadhyay's work 'Determining Feasibility of Optimal Currency Area for SAARC Region based on Political Variables' is an endeavor towards assessing the feasibility of OCA formation in the SAARC region. Authors have highlighted the political hurdles in adopting the common currency. They have also developed a regression model to demonstrate the impact of political variables on exchange value.

Sneha Srinivasan and Syed A A Farhan in their article on "A Roadmap to Regional Integration: Micro-financing Clean Energy for Sustainable Livelihood across Asia" discussed about the mutual reciprocity of energy and financial inclusion toward creation of sustainable livelihood. They have also emphasized the need for

financing clean energy for sustainable livelihood as a tool of economic development strategy.

The work of Dr. Sharad Kumar and Prof. Dinesh Rajput on "External Sector Developments in Select Asian Countries During 2008-12: A Comparative Study" highlighted that the impact of global crises of 2008 had a minimal impact on Asian countries compared to the western world. The analysis is based on the performance of Asian Countries included in BRIC and N11 (next 11) countries by empirically analyzing the critical parameters of external sector developments during post crisis period i.e. from 2008 to 2012.

Prof. Janardhana. A, in his work "China: A threat or opportunity for India," examines the country level competitiveness of China and India and flags important areas of competition and trade relations.

Prof. R. Kannan's article "Role of India and Asia in the Global Economy" brings forth the economic growth in Asia and possible synergies between India and China to sustain the growth momentum.

The research article on "Capital Markets

Development and Economic Growth - An Asian Perspective" authored by Prof. Sarat Kumar Malik & Prof. Akriti studies the development of capital markets in Asian countries and analyzes the quantum and direction of FII inflows in India.

Prof. Sharmila Bonnerjee, Prof. Rusha Das and Prof. Sumana Chaudhuri in their working paper on "Integrating India into ASEAN: An Infrastructural Perspective" analyze the role of cross border transport infrastructure in promoting economic growth through a case study of India - Myanmar - Thailand Trilateral Highway project.

Col. Mohinder Pal Singh in his work "Strategic and Economic Dimensions of Indo-Myanmar Relations" focuses on growing synergy between India and Myanmar toward strengthening of strategic, economic and cultural ties between these two nations.

Prof. Perna Goyal Ramuka & Prof. Kusum Pawar in their work "A review of Corporate Social Responsibility in Asia with special reference to China, India and Japan" review the evolution and importance of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) in Asian countries.

The Conference was convened by Dr. Sharad Kumar, Head, Remsons Center for Management Research and Officiating Director, DSIMS who was supported by Prof. Amit Srivastava, Prof. Nehal Joshipura and Ms. Sunita Pujar. Prof. Sharmila Bonnerjee offered the vote of thanks. The authors and delegates of the Conference were presented with Certificates of Paper Presentation. A unique endeavor on the part of the Institute to host a Conference on one of the most critical strategic dimensions of the Asian growth trajectories in times of uncertainty was appreciated by one and all. 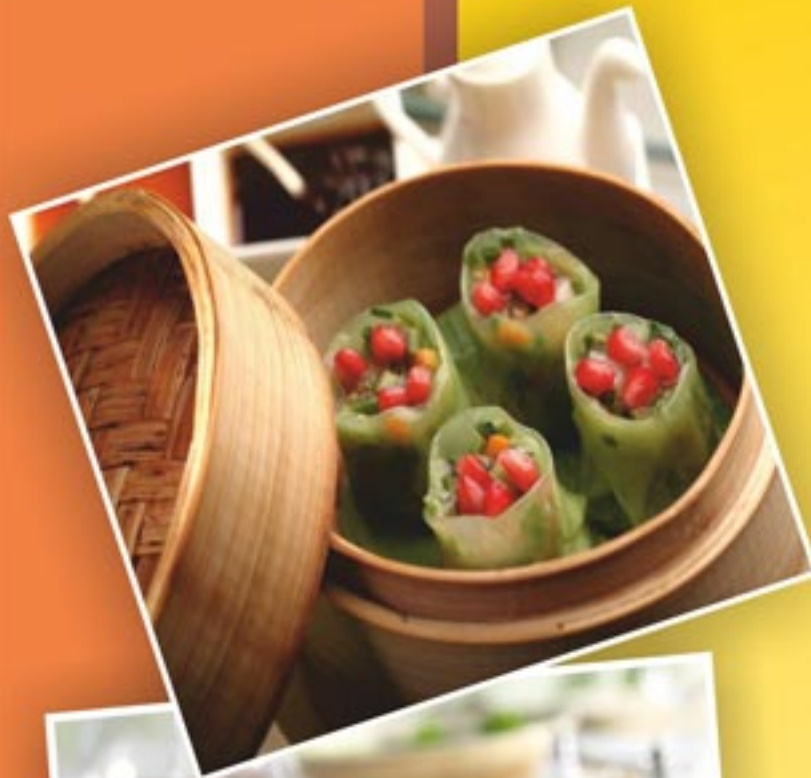
PTA MEETING:

views and the caterer also agreed to it.

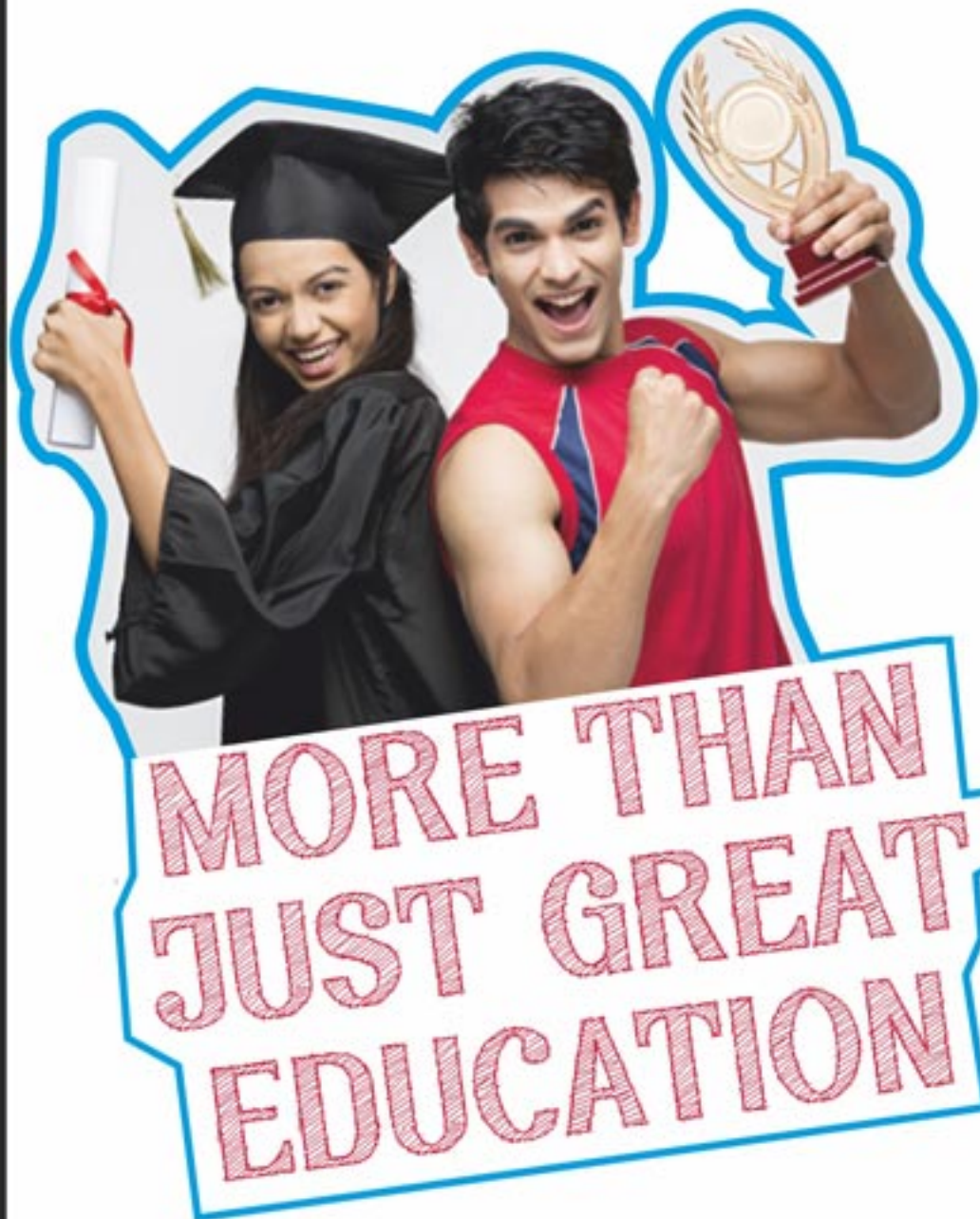

Ms. Shipra Agarwal student of the hostel delivering a speech on the occasion of Republic Day Celebrations

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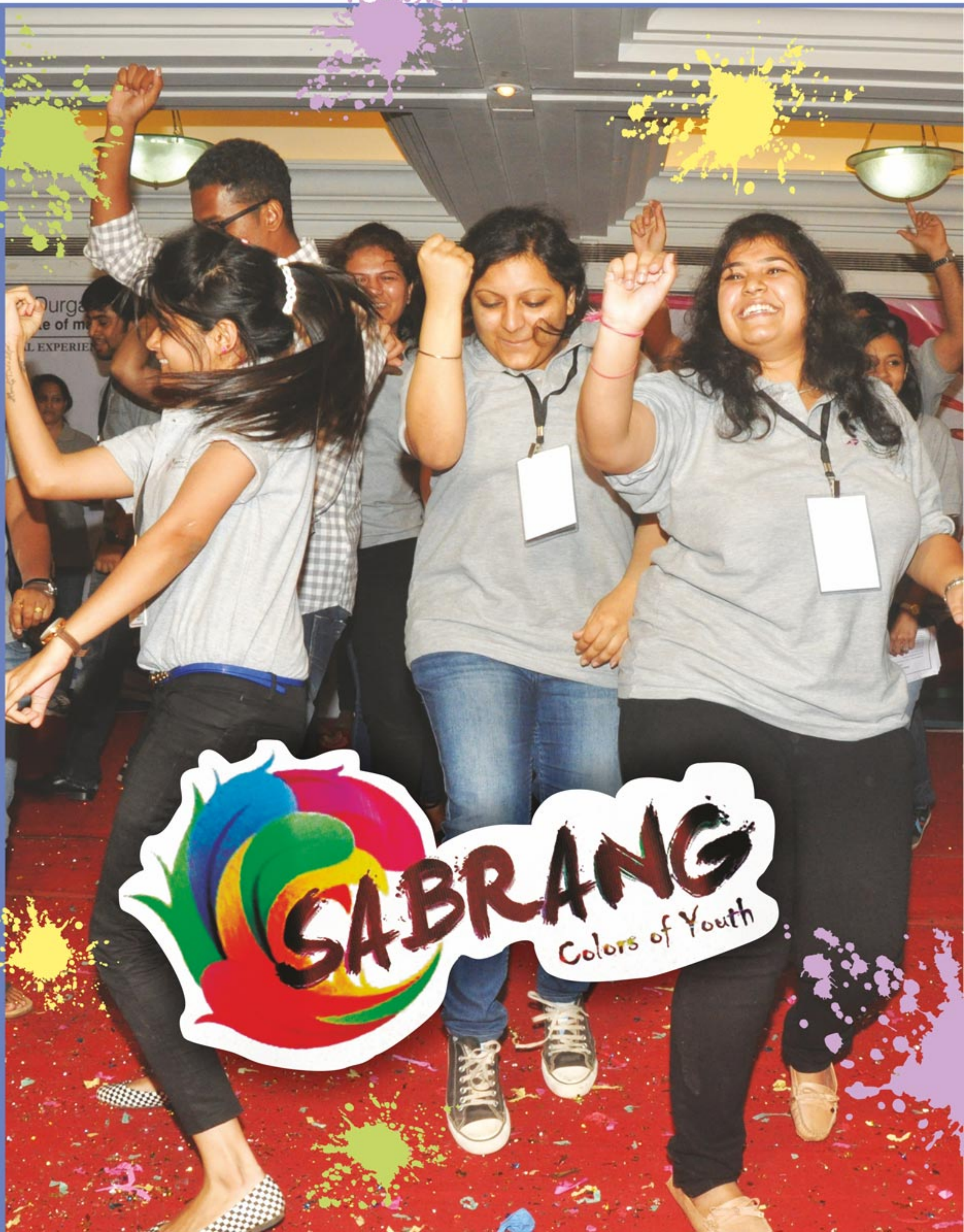

The 31st Annual Day of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College was celebrated at Prabodhankar Thackeray Natya Mandir, Borivali on 31st January 2014 in the morning session from 10 AM to 2 PM.

Prabodhankar Thackeray Natya Mandir is a renowned theatre and a landmark in Borivali and is used for performances by theater groups as well as education institutions. It has a capacity to seat more than 1000 people. It is also conveniently located for our students, several of whom stay in the northern suburbs of Western Mumbai.

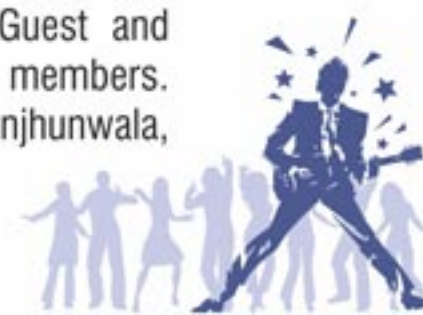

BK. Shivaniji started her talk by asking a question to the audience that whether in our daily schedule we give ourselves even five minutes to analyze our behavior. Parents spent a lot of time at their work place and come home very tired. At that time, slightest mischief of children or disobedience makes them angry and they become highly stressed. Thus they pass on their stress to their children in the form of expressing anger. Children also learn in the same way to express their stress by showing their anger. If parents are in stress then they cannot make their children happy. Due to this, children nowadays are in more stress and are in pain.

Parents fail to give their children the most expensive gift of values in life such as honesty, respect for others, love and care for others. All our energy to inculcate values in

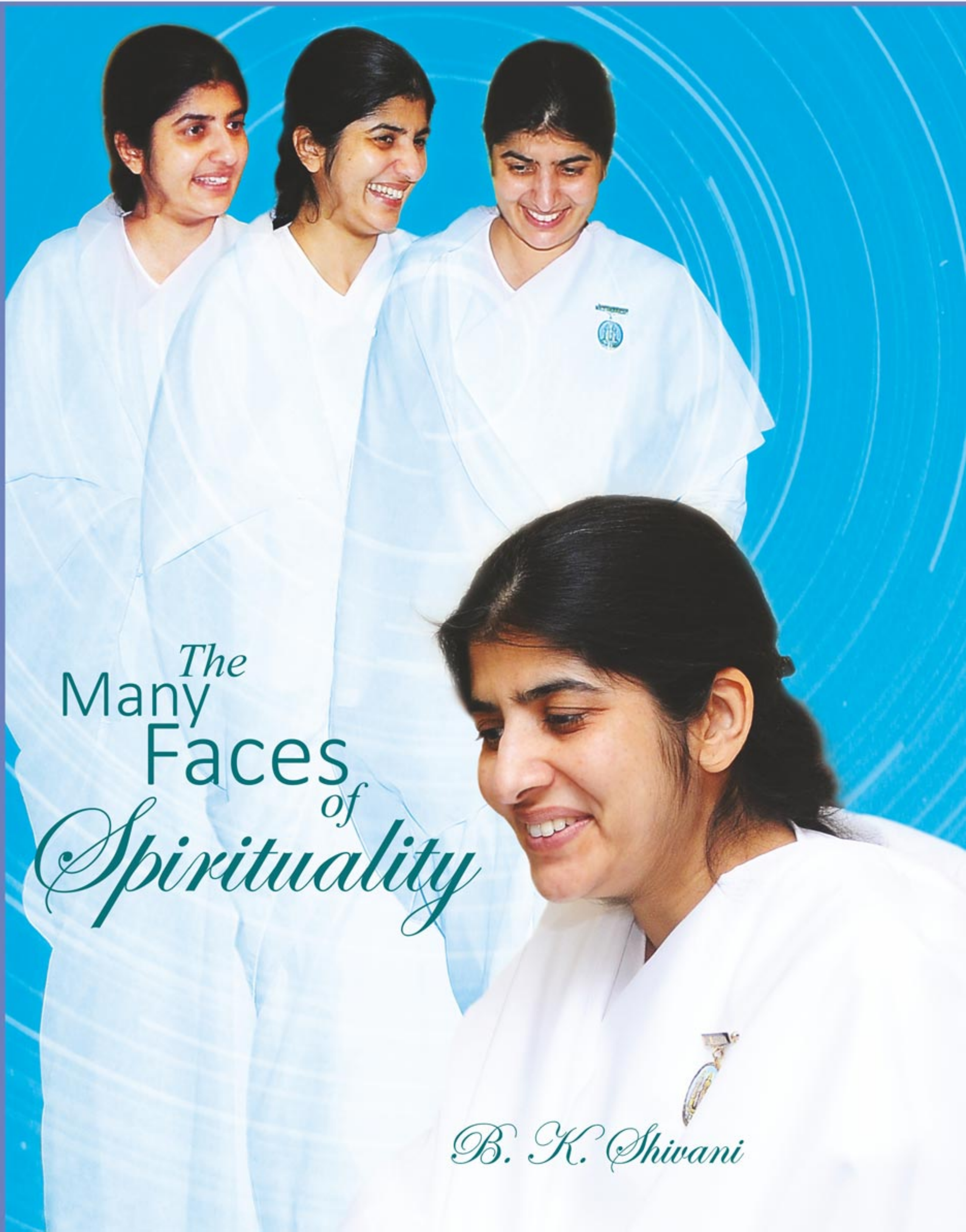
children go wasted due to our critical energy. We tend to compare our children with other children and always criticize our own children. We rate the performance of our children with reference to others.

BK. Shivaniji further pointed out that when a child is small he/she shares everything with his/her parents. As the child grows up, he/she stops sharing his/her feelings with parents due to fear of criticism. He/she then starts sharing life with friends as friends accept their feelings and secrets. Many times, teenagers commit mistakes due to peer pressure. If we want that our child should not be a victim of peer pressure then we have to deal with our child with love and patience. Parents need to develop Three 'As' i.e. Appreciation, Acceptance and Approval. Parents need to correct the mistakes of the child with patience and carefully handle their failures.

Today, in almost all schools, there are counselors and children open up in front of the counselors for their problems rather than telling their parents. If parents inculcate love and patience in their personality, then they

can play any role and improve not only their own quality of life but also of their family that includes their children.

BK. Shivaniji also pointed out the responsibility of the teachers. She said that educational institutions have bigger responsibility of inculcating values in children. Today's educational institutions are providing the best infrastructure, education and knowledge that will make a person best qualified. However, today's educators are unable to make students strong to face failures and challenges in life. Today, depression rate has increased immensely amongst students. They are unable to face even a small crisis in their lives. Therefore, teachers have to empower students emotionally and make them confident. Sometimes, some children are very mischievous and purposefully irritate the teacher. A teacher needs to give love and care to such a child and change his/her behavior into positive energy. Instead of criticizing children for small reasons, teachers should appreciate even one good quality found in a child.

BK Shivaniji further pointed out that often, teachers complain that some children do not concentrate in the class. However, to help such children to concentrate in the class, the teacher must concentrate in the class, make the teaching interesting rather than teaching mechanically. Moreover, when a teacher enters the class he/she should not shout to create silence. Teaching and learning has to be in a very calm environment. Therefore, at the beginning of the class, there should be 30 seconds of silence. BK. Shivaniji concluded with the advice that for creating the best environment at home and school/college, we should devote sometime everyday to ourselves and say within ourselves that "I am a peaceful being, my every thought is my creation, whatever be the situation, whosoever be with me or behave in whatever manner, I have to take care of myself by remaining calm, not being angry and by radiating positive energy.

The talk of BK Shivaniji motivated and energized the audience with positivity. It was followed by a brief interactive session. Many of us later went home and actually practiced what she taught. Some of us vowed not to criticize and compare our children with others, remain calm at our work place, to be happy within ourselves and in turn, make others happy. The programme was compered by Smt.
