









Vie therefore solicit co-operation and support of all Banars, Trustees, Members of Managing Committee and well wishers to come forward and be a part of our educational movement.

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
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


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Hon. Secretary's Message

EDITORIAL

The academic year has come to an end and students are enjoying their long awaited All summer yacation. the institutions have completed their examinations, declared results and are getting ready to begin the next academic year in June. However, the recent announcements by State Education Department that Unaided Non-Minority schools can cance! the admissions in the pre-primary section made under the Right to Education Act 2009 has created confusion and panic among the parents who belong to weaker economic section of society. Such parents are worried about their child's future if schools turn away the students or else they have to pay full fees. Since they belong to weaker economic section, such parents may not be able to afford the fees charged by unaided schools. Both the school managements and parents are anxiously awaiting for the State Government GR to decide their course of

Close to the admission process is the issue of school bug weight of children. The state had set up an eight member committee headed by Director of Primary Education to prepare a draft solution. The



committee felt that the weight of the school bag should not exceed 10% of the Student's weight. But generally it exceeds that by upto 20-30% of the students weight. It is found that due to the weight, students may face problems like back pain, mental stress, headache and spinal pain which can have adverse effect on child's growth. Hon'ble Education Minister Shri Vinod Tawde has announced that the new rules to reduce the weight of the school bag will be implemented from the academic year 2016-17, only hope for a better solution!

There are many students who do not have the luxury of enjoying summer vacation in these months. Students of Science stream who have appeared for XII Standard examination and aspiring for engineering and medical courses are busy preparing for their entrance examinations for admissions in their respective courses. It is the dream of every parent to make their son or doughter professionally

auglified. However, sometimes students select a course of professional studies due to family pressure or peer pressure that he / she is unable to cope up later on. Recent spate of suicides in reputed engineering institutes are examples of this fact, Often due to their poor score, students face depression and commit suiciae as they cannot withdraw from the course of to family or study due societal pressure and at the same time find it difficult to clear the copers.

According to a recent report in The Times of India, very less percentage of students use counseling services available for them in the campus, in such cases, when students face depression due to their inability to clear the backloas proper mentoring by senior faculty or arranging remedial classes for difficult subjects / papers may help the students along with proper counseling sessions to come out from the depression. & also to clear the backlegs.

At Rajasthani Sommelan, we have Romáhor Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre which is providing academic guidance to the students for choosing the correct stream, Aptitude and Psychometric tests are conducted to help students to identify their area of interest and strength and to decide proper future career for them. Students are also assisted in emotional management, effective study hobits, improving concentration, conflict resolution, classroom behaviour, discipline and many other areas of counseling. Students are also assisted for preparing for SAT, ILTES, GRE

and TOEFL examinations.

It is advisable for parents to take help of reputed counselors while choosing a professional course of study for their ward. Often they think that they know the best for their children but sometimes they may over estimate or under estimate their child while deciding the choice of their career. If a student chooses a proper course of study it will lead to his/her personal happiness in future life os he / she will find job satisfaction & at the same time will contribute to the society through his/her expertise.



EXCERPTS OF INTERVIEW OF SHRI BANWARILAL JI JHUN JHUN WALA

How and When did you get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan?

I became associated with Rajasthani Sammelan from the year 1960. In fact, late Shri Vishwahathji Podar introduced me to Rajasthani Sammelan. At that time, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan was the President of Rajasthani Sammelan. There were many other important personalities who were associated with Rajasthani Sammelan and worked very hard during the initial years. Late Shri Vishwahathji Podar Initially started the school in the Hanuman Temple of Chinchol with two students. Presently the school has more than 1,700 students in both primary and secondary sections.

What were the difficulties faced by Rajasthani Sammelan in the early years of its Inception?

It was a very difficult journey for the founding fathers in the early years of Rajasthani Sammelan. I came to know that gréat philanthropist Shri Kudilalji Seksaria had donated land to start Sarvodaya Balika Vidvalaya, Some more land adjacent to this land donated by Shri Kudilalii Seksaria was also purchased for future expansion, Late Shr Brijmohanji Ruia came forward and donated a handsome amount to start the construction. We also collected required funds in many phases to complete the school building. When I joined Rajasthani Sammelan, the school buildling with ground plus first floor was constructed. Later on many donors from the community supported the educational endeavours of Rajasthari Sammelan, Along with education, we also started working for the community. At that time, there was no community hall in Malad area so in 1975, Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan was constructed with

the help of handsome donations received from Shri Dhurmal Bajaj Charitable Trust. On 16th April. 1976 Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan was inaugurated by Shri Aditya Birta, the renowned industrialist at a glittering function organized by Rajasthani Sarmedan. Shri Romlvishna Bajajrenowned industrialist and philanthropist graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. This was also the year of Silver Jubilee celebrations of Rajasthani Sammetan. This function was attended by many industrialists, educationists and philanthropists.

Tell us about the educational endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan in the early years?

When Lipined Rajasthani Sammelan, the Trust had started Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya that was imparting education to the girl students up to S.S.C. During the early years, the first Principal was Smt. Pratiba Patvardhan who worked between 1954 -1971. She was a good administrator and a soft spoken lady. Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya became famous very soon as a good school in the area. Being the only girls school, all conservative family people preferred to send their daughters to study in this school. My sister 5mt, Gomtidevi as well as my daughters Smt. Urmita and Smt. Seema have also studied in this school. The school celebrated its Silver Jubilee in a grand way in the year 1985. I also remember Smt. Rekha Panchratan, Hindi Teacher of the school who taught very well, Smt. Krishna Chawla, Head Mistress and many others who have contributed to the growth of this school. However, we later decided to extend educational facilities up to HSC level. In 1975, Rajasthani Sammelan received recognition from the State Government to start a Junior College which was attached to the school. In the year 2006, the Management decided to attach Junior College to Ghanshyamdas Saraf College. The Junior College was also named as Durgadevi Saraf Junior College, Very soon the Management decided to start a Degree College for the girls. It was a great task to start a girls college affiliated to University of Mumbai. We had to work very hard and we were duty supported by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Shri Murli Deora, Member of Parliament, Justice D.R. Dhanuka (Retd.) and Adv. K.R. Dhanuka to get permission from the Government. 


· Holi:

As a part of the Global Quest nitiative, Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies (DSIMS) had organized atalk on 25th March, 2015 focusing on the Paracigm Shift in Middle Eastern Economies, Prof Nora Anni Cotton, Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic). University of East London delivered the session. At the very beginning Prof Nora introduced her key note address on the divergent economic scenario of different.

Middle Eastern economies, a geo – political area which is close to her heart. In her discourse she portrayed the Middle East and the social economic conditions there. She identified the basis of the growing discontent in this region. According to Professor Colton, conflict arises as a result of inappropriate allocation of finite resources, with the region experiencing skewed economic growth. She brought into

discussion the context of Arab Soring, which though started as a peaceful movement of socio - economic transformation, gradually cascaced to other geographies in the region, growing more violent as it gained critical mass of a fizenry support.

Economist John Williamson advocated Washington Consensus, though tried to edapt these Middle Eastern economies to western growth models, eventually created a lot of uneven growth with wealth dividend allocated to a tiny group of influential people. In her address, Prof. Colton reiterated that development was focused on exporting oil, but did not necessarily create. more jobs. Demographic dividend spells: that 65% of the population in the region is youth, but the region has 38% of the people impoverished and about 40% people unemployed. There was no correlation between jobs and education in these Bottom Billion States where 73% of the region has experienced a civil war, 29% of the region has resource traps, 30% of the region is and locked and 76% of the region suffers due to poor governance and policy paralysis.



Prof. Colton made the distinction between the fine dividing lines that separates greed with grievances. The regional conflicts have often spillover effects with rising poverty gap in the region, with the upper middle and upper crust nations like Gatar having a GDP per capita of \$29,803=00 and oil deficient nations like Yemen posting a meagre \$430=00 GDP per capita. The rising financial crunch prompted statesmen to increase the global aid programme. However, in this process what was overlooked that aid should be directed to sound institutions to facilitate development and economic growth, rather it resulted in just the opposite outcome. The Principal - Agent problem became more significant as more aid encourage more corruption as colltical elites continue not to feel accountable to their people, but to their donors exemplified by the case of Egypt, Syria and Jordan.

In conclusion, Prof. Colton expressed that oil revenues have been both a curse and blessing for this region. Although years of labor migration created employment opportunities for North Africans and other

Arab workers, they also led to structural chances in the economies. There were corruption and mismanagement of resources that prevailed. Oil and aid appear to substitute each other in the region in terms of the outcome in governance and transparency in the economies. Prof. Coltonaptly remarked that conflict is not about religion, ethnicity or race - it's about greed. She summarized her address by reflecting on effective governance, right education, social & financial inclusion which can be capable of channelizing resourcestoward productivity gains & the overall growth of these nations .



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
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

They feel taking Science, means letting people know that I'm very brilliant. Taking Science means, I fall into the intellectual category. Let me clarify once again that I get a number of students every year coming for damage control as they have opted for Science and now are finding it extremely difficult and boring. Finding it difficult does. not mean you are not intelligent, it means



you are not interested and therefore you find it boring and your grades drop.

Parents must respect if the child is showing inclination towards. Commerce or Arts. Parents must guide and help them get into good colleges. Today the percentage required for opting the field of Arts in good colleges is 92% Arts does not meanthat you are not intelligent, it means you are fond of reading, writing and thinking creatively. Commerce means you are excited about managing and working with numbers.

Once again observe, look, accept and give confidence to your children. Money will come easily if your children are happy. Take professional help. Go for career counselling and confirm the interest pattern of your child. Even if the child scores 95 and is interested in Economics or Political Science, or Psychology or Languages, let them pursue a career in the same. They will shine and be the best here rather than become a mediocre engineer of a doctor.

Mistake No3

Music, Dance and other careers which fall under Contemporary Arts can be hobbies and not be careers.

Every year our country loses many individuals who would have got laurets to the country in sports, dance, arts, music, yaga, because their parents have not allowed them to pursue it seriously right from the time they went to grade X.

They left what they were pest at and what excited them and what they breathed for appearing for IIT, and other careers. They settled for a managerial job rather than pursuing their passion. They kept their their first love as hobbies and took up something that would give them an average bread and butter and average level of comfort.

Once again, listen to your children, watch them, observe what is their first love, what makes them move instantly, what would put a spring in their feet and let them explore those possibilities with pride, encourage them to take the best training in that field, encourage them to talk about the field to others as well.

Be sure that the selection is apt by taking the


aptitude and interest test.

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



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
