Built on the foundational pillars of access, equity, quality affordability and accountability the new policy is aligned with the 2030 Agenda of United Nations for sustainable Development. It has not only thrown education around the world out of gear but also lead to the shutting of educational institutions including schools, colleges and universities. Bina Shah came forward to donate a handsome amount to purchase 250 tablets that were distributed to these students to continue with their online teaching-learning.

Consistent with our vision of empowering young generation with education, we at Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust impart education to students of all institutions quality education in a conducive, enabling and safe environment backed by a state-of-art infrastructure. A wide variety of teaching practices are used to empower students with knowledge, skills and techniques, so that they achieve their full potential and become academically sound, professionally competent and socially

In what is being seen as a positive step towards the internationalization of education in line with NEP 2020, the University Grants Commission has given the approval for regulations that will now entitle Indian Higher Educational Institutions to offer joint, dual or twinning programmes in collaboration with foreign educational institutions. Indian universities can collaborate with their foreign counterparts soon to offer dual degrees and twinning programmes very soon. To maintain quality of higher education, these regulations will apply only to conventional degrees offered in physical mode. The tie-ups have been restricted among institutions of higher education that are in the top 1000 of Times Higher Education or QS World University Ranking. Indian institutions that have a minimum score of 3.01 on a 4 point scale of NAAC Grading or in the top 100 in the University category of National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) are also eligible for the partnership.

In the past three months, along with teaching learning extra-curricular activities were also conducted by all our institutions through online platform. Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre conducted various webinars for the faculties to assist them to sail through the transition to normal. Side by side, RMCC also conducted webinars on career guidance for the in-house students as well as students of other schools and colleges.

To equip students proper knowledge to appear for professional and competitive examinations, Ghanshyamdas Saraf College has taken initiative to start Study Centre for Institute of Company Secretary of India,



coaching for IT / JEE, UPSC, Banking and Railway examinations by Phasor Academy. The college will also start very soon SAP Certified Courses in IT & Finance and Certified Financial Planning Course from Financial Planning Standards Board Limited.

During this period, Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies and Ghanshyamdas Saraf College hosted NAAC Peer Team and both the institutes have been accredited by NAAC. Ghanshyamdas Saraf College has been accredited for the third time by NAAC. Many faculty members of the institutions of higher education attended prestigious webinars and conferences and presented their research papers. Under Remsons Centre for Management Research, research papers of faculty members of DSIMS and DSGS were published in prestigious journals. Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies organized its International Conference REWA- Representation & Expression of Women in Art on 8th and 9th March, 2022 which was graced by Dr. Swaroop Sampat Rawal, the famous actress and educationist as the Chief Guest who also delivered the keynote address.

From the next academic year, Mainadevi Bajaj International School will be a full Cambridge School. IBDP of IB Board has been replaced by A levels of Cambridge. Fees have also been restructured to make it more competitive with similar schools. Schools of RSET have also made us proud by bagging many prizes. Mst. Shlok Rawtoo of KGES brought laurels with his commendable achievements with International English Olympiad. Many students of MBIS also bagged prizes in SOF General Knowledge and English Olympiads and have won gold medals.

We are confident that with the support received from Donors, well wishers, hard work of Managing Committee members, dedicated Principals and staff, the institutions run by RSET will achieve new landmarks in the field of education and will surely touch lives of students to create responsible citizens for the betterment of our country.





- 5. Look at an artist as an artist and not as a man
- 6. In art education there is intention and participatory engagement of art.
- And lastly, we need to look again at the representation of women, in India. Is it really ours or did we adapt from the west?

Following this, the vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Rajashri Trivedi, Principal, Maniben Nanavati Women's College provided a perfect conclusion to the inaugural ceremony by bringing to life, the theme of the conference correlating REWA the river to REWA the woman or life itself.

The first panel on Music kickstarted with Dr. DhanashreePandit Rai, Dr.Chetana Pathak



and Pandita Anuradha Pal as panelists and Ms. Nandini Trivedi as the moderator. Through this panel, it came to be known that nothing can be created or destroyed because everything is energy. Going by this, music is energy too. Further, the fact that when you enter the male dominated industry, your entry and performance by itself is a breakthrough given the challenges you face in terms of acceptance and approval, was reiterated. This panel brought on record interesting facts related to Thumbri and Vilambit.

The second panel on Theatre had Ms. Padmavati Rao, Ms. Lubna Salim, Ms. Deepa Gahlot, Mr. Pushkar Shrotri as the panelists and Mr Janak Toprani as the Moderator. This insightful panel walked the audience through how creativity and freedom of expression is limited in theatre, especially Hindi theatre. It also informed the audience how theatre and Agriculture brings to light the cohesiveness of the five elements of nature. The panel emphasized upon the necessity for young students to be made theatre literate so that they can learn and enjoy theatre.

The first day of REWA concluded with a panel on Dance with Kalashri. Lata Surendran, Guru. Jhelum Paranjape, Ms. Ja'don Christian aka "Enerjaee" and Dr.Subhalakshmi Rajrajeshwari Kumar as panel members and Dr. Jayashree Rajagopalan moderating the panel. All the panelists in this panel presented demonstrative videos which were a true treat to the eyes. The learnings from this exquisite panel discussion included the exposition of the truth that Dance is a journey Inside Out and a visual prayer, that Streetuvam i.e. the feminine was always pervasively present - the prefix sri was used to eulogise women for centuries, that expression of dance by using the face - an example being bharatnatyam or the use of body as in the case of bone breaking, that Art is one of the upacharas to the Lord among 16 upacharas, that experimentations have highlighted the use of dance in taking up of social issues to emancipate mankind and that sexual connotations and constructs in the notso-often discussed area of erotica and passion expressed through dance were also broadly covered.

The second day of REWA began with great enthusiasm and excitement. Day two of the conference began with the panel on Literature

where Dr. Shailendra Sharma delivered the Keynote address. The keynote speech delivered an analytical approach to representation of women in Hindi literature from the yester years to the current day. Later, Dr. Shailendra Sharma moderated the panel in which elaborate discussions on literature in India in the context of female representation and expression both by women and nonwomen writers. Dr. Suryabala, Dr. Madhuri Chheda, Dr. Pinakini Pandya and Dr. Shyamal M Garud contributed as panel members in this discussion.

Dr. Gillian Dooley from Australia explained how her interpretation of Jane Austen translated into musical compositions enjoyed world-wide. This was then followed by a panel on Films moderated by Ms. Anu Singh Choudhary with Ms. Renuka Shahane, Ms. Monisha Advani and Ms. Vibha Singh as panelists. Answers to crucial questions connecting society, the artists and the art form were discussed. A few questions that were addressed by the panel were:

- 1. We see that sexually suggestive and violent content ends up reaching the hands of children with or without the knowledge of parents. Does this lead to denigration of women in the eyes of children resulting in distorted understanding of the body of women?
- 2. Media ownership is bent towards oligopolistic way of life and this in a way impedes the true portrayal of society in its actual diverse form. I think even with women representation on screen this is true...How do we solve this?
- 3. Today what we are seeing in terms of relationship portrayal is that exception is becoming the norm and norm is becoming the exception...Is it happening in terms of women representation in films as well?
- 4. Under the guise of "cool", at times what we see is a celebration of vices that end up putting socially disadvantaged gender groups such as women in a further vulnerable position. Can it be resolved?
- 5. Is the acceptance level for women filmmakers the same as men filmmakers on the sets?
- Mr. Soumya Joshi, shared his journey as a writer for the national award winning Gujarati film Hellaro, Mr. Joshi's talk provided an immersive narration with film clippings on how the women's right to dance was in fact something that was fought for and won.

The two days of the international conference REWA felt as enriching as perennial river Reva the river Narmada, as per the audience. The flow of one session to another over the two days was no less than turning one more glorious page from the grand epic that stands tall and towering in celebrating womanhood.

The entire event was well anchored by our Teacher Mrs. Rekha Tiwari and Mrs. Hemlata Shukla.









### International Postcard Exchange 2022


MBIS and RSG Broklede, Netherlands collaborated for a postcard activity shared




- World Hindi Day (10th January, 2022)

Discussion on various matters like budget, institutional activities, research work, admissions, new academic courses, placements, etc., took place in the Governing Council Meeting and matters like Institutional Development Plan, Alumni, Awards, Accreditation, IQAC and various other issues were discussed in the College Development Committee meeting. Dr. C. Babu Director, DSIMS made the presentation.

### Financia 2022 - 5th February

The annual flag-ship event of the finance club FinDs, Financia was held online on 5th Feb 2022 by the members of the club FinDs of DSIMS & DSGS. Eminent speakers from outstanding industry background were invited to discuss and enlighten the students about the financial markets and share their experiences. The theme for this year was 'Financial Market in Post Covid Times'. The finance students of DSIMS-DSGS hosted and participated in the conclave wholeheartedly.

The event began by Dr. Nehal Joshipura's inaugural speech. She deliberated about how Covid-19 affected the markets globally. Inaugural speech was followed by the addresses of Director - DSIMS, Dr. C. Babu and Dr. Sarita Vichore, the director - DSGS.

The first speaker for the event was Dr. Paritosh Basu. He is a full-time senior professor at NMIMS, and has done his PhD from Calcutta university. During his tenure at industry, he has worked as Group Controller Essar, CFO RCOM. He deciphered the mega-trends in a post-Covid world and opened up perspectives on leveraging digital technology for business and leadership. He insisted that students take digital global transformation most earnestly.

The second speaker, Devesh Kumar is the Vice Chairman - Research and Capital Market at InCred Capital. He gave a lucid explanation of how technology is adapting to the requirement of the times and how Covid has helped us adapt to technology. He concluded by saying how Covid won't seem like a disrupter in the future, but a tool to make us and the markets transform.

The third speaker, Rohit Agrawal, is the head of Public Sector and Government Undertakings at RBL Bank Ltd. He gave practical insights into how industry and various sectors are coping with the challenges of the pandemic and elaborated on the steps taken by people to cope with the new normal. 



### Attendance Committee's Parents Teachers Meeting

The second half of the Academic Year 2021-2022 commenced for all the undergraduate courses from 3rd January, 2022. As per the notification received from the University of Mumbai, arrangements have been undertaken by Deviprasad Goenka Management College for Media Studies for students who were eligible to attend lectures by coming physically to the campus from 15th November, 2021. Thus, a blended Teaching Learning platform was available since the said date so that access to education for students is made available in an inclusive manner.

As per 0.6086 of University of Mumbai a learner has to record an overall average attendance of at least 75% and at least an average attendance of 50% in each subject to be eligible to appear in the Semester End Examinations.

The first attendance defaulters' notice for students of Semester IV and VI was put up for circulation on 4th January, 2022. The second attendance defaulters' notice for students of Semester IV and VI was circulated on 1st February, 2022. Semester-II commenced on

3rd January, 2022 and as per the attendance policy of the Attendance Committee, the first notice for attendance defaulters among students of FYBAMMC and FYBAFTNMP was put up for circulation on 4th January, 2022 and the second notice was put up on 1st February, 2022.

A Parents Teachers Meeting was held for students of semesters II, IV and VI. In this meeting, the parents and the defaulted students were counselled about the importance of maintaining their attendance scores in accordance with the mandate of the University of Mumbai prescribed under Ordinance 6086. They were advised about the academic consequences resulting from any failure in maintaining their respective attendance scores.

### 4. Training & Placement Cell

TAP for FY - BAMMC/BAFTNMP and Part 1 - MAFTNMP/MACJ started on 27th of Jan 2022, 80 students were registered wherein 11 were successfully placed. The Training and Placement Cell's (TAP) initiative has been conceived keeping in mind the need to train students as per industry expectations. This initiative has been taken in view of the fact that students need to be trained in a particular manner to make them industry ready. At the same time, a proper amount of internal rigorous drill needs to be maintained to ensure that the training process is not taken lightly. Hence TAP materialised in its current format.

TAP will see students across all batches get trained by internal and external faculty members. At the first year level, students will be trained in the 'Basic Course'; Second year -Intermediate Course and Third Year - Advanced Course. Each level will deal with different topics which are offered to students in the form of hands-on training. At the end of each level, the student is evaluated and only the ones who successfully pass are allowed to move to the next level. At the end of first year, the selected students are exposed to live projects; at the end of the second year, the selected students are exposed to internships and then at the end of the third year, the selected students are given placement opportunities.

The event was judged by a professional from Tape-A-Tale, Ms. Kopal Khanna. A large majority of the story-telling participants came up with excellent subject matter and style.


# 8. Organ Donation Drive was held on the 11th Feb 2022

which was published in 2006 and the Ashtakshari collection of poetry called Kavyangiwas published in 2021.





On 15th March, 2022 the Woman Development Cell organised an online Awareness regarding




### **Staff Achievements**

I am back to normal and enjoying life again

The beginning of the year brought more normalcy across Institutes with more and more students and faculties coming back to campus. Students found it challenging to adjust back in the classroom settings post a gap of more than a year due to pandemic. It was an equally challenging experience for the faculties.

RMCC conducted various webinars for the faculties to assist them to sail through the transition to normal. A webinar on Observing and Understanding Behaviour was conducted for the Secondary teachers of KGES on 13th January. The teachers of the secondary section were encouraged to share different challenges they face with the students. Different academic and behavioural concerns were discussed and the importance of early intervention was briefed. Self-care strategies to take care of their mental health were also discussed with the teachers. A similar webinar was conducted for the faculties of GSCC on the 15th of January.

A career quidance workshop was conducted with Sanskar Classes on 6th February, 2022 (Sunday) for parents and students who are currently studying in the 9th and 10th grade. The career guidance session focused on helping students and parents understand the importance of career quidance and counseling and understand the process of career guidance for their growth. The session focused on helping the students and parents break the myths around career counseling and learn about how career counselors and counseling can support their growth. The career counseling process at RMCC was discussed extensively with the participants and all their doubts were cleared. RMCC continued the career webinar series by conducting a webinar on Liberal Arts on 12th February, 2022. This webinar focused on assisting students understand about the various details the students need to know to pursue a career in the field of Liberal arts. The session started with an

understanding of liberal arts, what are the subjects, courses and eligibility criteria for admission to bachelors' programs. Top colleges and entrance exam details were given to the students and the entrance exam criterias were also briefly discussed. The counselor also gave them inputs on the academic syllabus and practical experience they can obtain during the course of their education to build up on their profile. Core personality traits and the various skills required by a future aspirant of the course were discussed to help students become more aware. The future career paths and postgraduate degrees were also discussed.

A career quidance workshop was conducted with Savitridevi Hariram Agarwal International School on 18th February, 2022 (Friday) for parents and students who are currently studying in the 8th grade. The objective of the session was to help the students understand the importance of career assessments and guidance in making the right subject choices. The session was conducted online and had over 40 participants. The career guidance session focused on helping students choose the right subjects and explain how RMCC can support them in this decision. The students were then given the space to ask any questions that they may have about the career counseling process/ about various careers. Career assessment and individualised counseling were conducted for the students. RMCC conducted a Reading and Spelling Camp for school students on 25th and 26th February, 2022. The test was conducted over the span of two days to evaluate the students reading and spelling age based on the standardized Psychometric Assessment. Students from different schools attended the camp and had their evaluations done by the counselors and special educators in the organization. Students were evaluated individually on their reading and spelling skill sets. The counselors and special educators made additional observations during the sessions. An individual session was conducted with the parent/s to understand the academic difficulties faced by the child. The reports were then explained in detail to the parent/s and they were given recommendations based on the age gaps identified. The parents thanked the RMCC team

for this initiative and provided positive feedback for the same. Building a professional profile session for students from GSCC- Self finance Students was conducted on 4th and 5th March. 2022. The session focussed on discussing the importance of Profile building and what does it inculcates. The students were informed about the different ways in which they can build and develop their profile for a promising job opportunity. On account of International Women's Day which is celebrated on 8th of March RMCC organized a webinar on "Treasuring Myself". The webinar focused on understanding how women can take care of themselves and strengthen their emotional health. The session began with highlighting the multiple roles played by women and failing to take care of them. The facilitator discussed different challenges faced by women and how they as women fail their individuality. Strategies like what mindfulness is and why practicing it would be helpful was discussed. Journaling as one of the self-care tool was discussed in detail.

A seminar on 'Developing Organizational Skills' was conducted by the RMCC Team for parents of children with Learning Difficulties and attention disorders on 5th March, Saturday , 2022 .The seminar focused on helping the parents understand the importance of organizational skills and the blocks that children face in developing these skills. Activities were held where the parents were divided into groups and they had to brainstorm how to organize a party and their backpack. The parents enjoyed the activities of putting their heads together for planning and organizing. Through the activities the parents were brought to realize how strategies like checklists, micro-planning or breaking into small steps were essential to develop organizational skills in their children. The importance of maintaining consistency and giving reinforcements for the same was also emphasized. The parents found the seminar helpful in making their children organized and self-independent in their lives. RMCC has been conducting Career assessments and counseling for students of Grade 8 and above and assist them with subject/stream selection. Working professionals have reached out to RMCC for guidance and evaluation for better career prospects.

Personal counseling sessions have been conducted for individuals to assist them in managing their stress/anxiety and enhance their Emotional Quotient. Parent and child counseling sessions have helped families to better their relationship. Students with Academic challenges have been provided with remedial solutions and have shown great progress in bridging their academic gaps. RMCC has been touching lives of various individuals by assisting them to ACE their Academic, Career and Emotional well being.

Foreign students are from Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Egypt, Madagascar, Tunisia, Tanzania, Ghana, Sudan, Fiji, Mauritius, Sri Lanka and Malawi. Most of the foreign students are studying in the institutions of higher education of RSET. Due to lockdown caused by COVID-19 Pandemic, the foreign students had to stay in the hostel & the Management provided all facilities to make them feel safe and secure in the hostel. 

Bollywood faculties for this course.





#### Abstract

Public transport is a backbone of transport system in Mumbai because many people are dependent on it. Since COVID19 pandemic started, public transport in Mumbai region has suffered a lot because passengers with limited capacity is allowed to travel from public transport and Mumbai metro rail is also not an exception to that. Continuous lockdown has affected metro rail service to a great extent. Mumbai is one of the highly populated city in the world. Rising commuters' movements in and out of Mumbai region has increased demand for transportation. As existing public transport system is overburdened, travelling has become bid on life for travelers. To improve transport services in Mumbai region, Master plan of 2004 described 146.50 km network of metro rail service in Mumbai region. Metro rail service is different from normal Indian rail service due to nature, quality and delivery of service. The study has been conducted to understand the perception of commuters towards certain services of metro rail in post lockdown period and also to understand which parameters influence metro rail over other modes of transport.

Keywords:-commuters' perception, metro rail, master plan, service quality.

#### Introduction

Novel Corona virus 19 has impacted the life of every person and business on the earth. All sectors have been affected including transportation. During lockdown metro service was halted for almost 6 months in Mumbai. Even today all passengers are not allowed to travel due to safety measures being adopted by Metro rail authorities. Since 2014, Mumbai metro line 1 has been in service as public transport. It's on board and platform services are unique in nature and trying to cater the expectations of commuters. Traffic congestion, road accidents, pollution are common transport issues being faced by commuters in Mumbai. National Urban Transport policy, 2014 of government of India has described that transportation should be convenient, accessible, eco-friendly and affordable. Service being intangible it should be developed with due conscience and need base of customers.

Satisfaction is the end result of consumption of service. It is nothing but emotions experienced before and after using the goods and services. Satisfaction of commuters may change according to cost, time, quality, etc. of service. This paper will be focusing on the satisfaction of commuters with respect to certain services of Mumbai metroline 1.

#### **Objectives**

- To understand the commuters satisfaction towards metro services.
- 2. To know the preference of transport service used by the commuters.

#### Research Methodology

The research paper is based on primary as well as secondary data. Primary data has been collected from different commuters like businessman, professional, servicemen etc. through structured questionnaire method. The sample size for the study is 51 respondents Secondary data has been collected through books, journals, government publications, reports of research agencies, newspapers, websites etc. The research is mainly descriptive





in nature and analysis is done based on percentage method and observation.

#### Hypothesis

- H0= Commuters are not satisfied with metro rail services.
- H1= Commuters are satisfied with metro services.
- H0= Metro is not better transport than other modes of public transport.
- H1= Metro is better transport than other modes of public transport.

#### Literature Review

#### Parsuraman et.al, (1985),

Service quality is difficult to evaluate because services are intangible. Service quality can be judged by comparison between consumer expectation and actual performance of service.

#### Vilakazi, a et al (2014).

Stated that, customer satisfaction is essential for customer retention and also to attract new customers. They have identified multiple factors affecting customers' satisfaction. Therefore, government authorities, transport planners and service providers must take cognizance of this.

#### Budiono, O. A. (2009),

Pointed that, once metro service starts, commuters' expectations change and demand more options and services which make the service provider responsible to provide reliable and consistent service.

#### Sanjay Singh (2005).

Mentioned that cars or private vehicles cannot be just future of Indian cities, there should be proper planning to boost public transport.

#### Mubbsher Khan and MarimaFasih (2014),

Service quality is a weapon which can differentiate the organization from its competitors and also to delight the customers. This improves customer satisfaction and loyalty towards the organization.

#### Limitation of research

The study has considered the commuters perception of Mumbai metro line 1 only because rest of the metro railway projects are undergoing or yet to start.

#### SOP for Commutes protection:-

- Trains and platform areas disinfection will be done at night and every trip by Accelerated Hydrogen Peroxide.
- High contact areas like lift, ticket windows, entry and exit gates will be cleaned after every 3 hours.
- All commuters to have ArogyaSetu App, Wearing of mask is compulsory
- All commuters' body temperature will be checked and cleaning hands with sanitizer is compulsory.
- 5. Alternate seating in metro trains,

- announcements will be done for physical distancing
- Reporting any untoward incidents to customer care center.
- 7. Public education and awareness campaign.
- 8. Metro rail staff have been made mandatory to follow COVID appropriate behavior.

#### Data analysis

For the purpose of the research, responses have been obtained from 51 commuters having different occupations, education, age and income by using random sampling. Responses were based on service quality of metro rail and comparison between metro rail and other modes of transport. These responses have been collected by using Likerts five scaling points. The analysis of the responses has been done by using percentage method.

#### **Hypothesis testing**

**Hypothesis 1:**- Responses of the commuters indicate satisfaction level is more than 75% in all services taken under study like display of information, ticketing service, staff behavior, assurance of no accidents and security checking.

Thus, null hypothesis is rejected and alternative hypothesis is accepted i.e. Commuters are satisfied with metro services.

Hypothesis 2:- Comparison between Metrorail and other modes of transports like Autorickshaw, Taxi, Bus and Local train on certain parameter indicate that more than 75% commuters are satisfied with Metrorail service except cost as it saves time, safe journey and comfortable journey.

Thus, null hypothesis is rejected and alternative hypothesis is accepted i.e. metro rail is a better mode of transport.

#### **Findings**

- Number of male and female commuters are almost equal in number. Commuters working in service are 69% followed by unemployed 16%, businessman 10% and self employed 6%.
- In case of commuters' education, 57% travelers are found having post graduate qualification followed by graduate and professional qualification.
- Commuters having income more than 60,000 rupees constitute 72%. Whereas,income with less than Rs. 30000 are only 16%. This seems that higher income people may only be able to afford cost of metro rail service.
- Around 92% passengers are satisfied with display of information like indicator information, signage, announcement etc. This makes commuters movement easy on

- the platform as well as boarding and alighting from train.
- 5. 76% passengers are satisfied with ticketing service. Whereas, 78% passengers are satisfied with staff behavior towards passengers, means staff seems to be taking care of passengers at different stages of travelling.
- Metro rail has no accident policy, this seem that 80 % passengers have agreed that they have not incurred in accident or theft.
- 83% commuters have expressed that security system of metro railway is satisfactory than other modes of transports.
- 47% commuters say that metro rail is saving cost whereas 35% passengers feel that Local train service is saving cost.

#### Recommendations

- Ticketing price of metro rail should be affordable to passengers, so as to attract those commuters who are not travelling from metro rail.
- A separate research needs to be undertaken to identify why self- employed commuters are less in numbers compared to other commuters.
- Metro rail routes should be connected with each other for better movements in Mumbai region.
- Local train service and metro rail service, if coordinated well, more people will get attracted.
- There should be common ticket for local and metro train so people can save time and energy.
- Happy hours can be declared on a certain day or time to attract the commuters and enjoy some incentives for travelling through metro.

#### Conclusion

Metro rail being a Mass Rapid Transport System is very useful mode of transport in a city like

Mumbai where lakhs of commuters are travelling every day to different part of Mumbai for different reasons. Existing public transport is proving inefficient due to rising transport demand. Metro rail being environment friendly, reliable and much comfortable transport will get huge success in near future. So far it seems that cost of ticketing is expensive than other mode of transport. Thus more attention needs to be given for fare ticketing charges then only it would be accepted as public transport intrue sense.


