DHURMAL BAJAJ BHAVAN

n Swami Vivekanand Road, opposite R.S. Campus stands Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan as a landmark to many people who are coming for the first time in Malad (West). Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan is a Community Hall having three floors that is owned, managed and run by Rajasthani Sammelan.

Rajasthani Sammelan has always cared for the need of the community along with its passion for educating the young generation. In early seventies, there was no community hall in the western side of Malad – Goregaon area of Mumbai. Hence an idea of constructing a community hall was born in the minds of the founding fathers of Rajasthani Sammelan - Shri Deviduttji Bajaj and Shri Vishwanathji Podar took the lead role in this direction. Other office bearers who supported in their mission were Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan, Shri Hariramji Saraf, Shri Kishorilalji Ruia and Shri Ramgopalji Ruia. Soon a piece of land opposite to R.S. Campus belonging to Shri Kudilal Govindram Seksariaji was purchased by Rajasthani Sammelan for construction of Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan. Shri Deviduttji Bajaj came forward and Shri Dhurmal Bajaj Charitable Trust gave the largest amount of donation to start the construction. The hall was named as 'Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan' in memory of late Shri Dhurmalji Bajaj.

Many other philanthropists also came forward with handsome donations while others worked hard to collect donations. Shri Mungtu Ramji Jhunjhunwala (father of Hon'ble Justice S. M. Jhunjhunwala (Retd) collected a large amount of donation for this noble cause. A cultural programme was also organized on the same plot where Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan stands today. A large number of like minded people from the community attended the cultural programme and contributed with open mind to serve the community.

The construction work started in 1973 when foundation stone was laid on 6th October, 1973 by Shri Vasudevji Somani. The Bhoomi Poojan ceremony was performed by Shri Deviduttji Bajaj on that occasion. Within two years, Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan having three floors was constructed. It consisted of three halls with rooms on the right side of the hall on each floor. The ground floor hall was named as Smt. Nanibai Bajaj Hall. Once the construction work was completed, it was the time for the inauguration. It was a dream come true for the residents of Malad when on 16th April, 1976 Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan was inaugurated by Shri Aditya Birla, the renowned industrialist at a glittering function organized by Rajasthani Sammelan. Shri Ramkrishna Bajaj renowned industrialist and philanthropist graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. This was also the year of Silver Jubilee celebrations of Rajasthani Sammelan. This function was attended by many industrialists, educationists and philanthropists.

Since then Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan is regularly used by the community for various purposes. It is also being used by our schools and colleges for organizing many co-curricular and cultural activities. In

the year 2008, it was felt by the Managing Committee of Rajasthani Sammelan that Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan needed renovation.

Accordingly renovation work started. The halls as well as adjacent rooms were air-conditioned and lift was also made available to go to higher floors. The lift was inaugurated by none other than Smt. Mainadeviji Bajaj. The renovation work was completed in 2009. After the renovation, 'Deepavali Sneha Sammelan' was held in newly renovated Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan.

For smooth running of day to day matters of Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan, there is a Sub-committee comprising of Managing Committee members. There are adequate staff to look after the booking as well maintaining cleanliness of the premises.

The story of Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan goes on and on. It reminds of the dedicated efforts of our founding fathers. It connects us to the next generation of Philanthropist of Bajaj family Shri Ramniwas Bajaj and his worthy sons Shri Vinodkumarji Bajaj and Shri Rajkamalji Bajaj who have taken lead role in philanthropy by giving handsome donations for Ramniwas Bajaj English School as well as Mainadevi Bajaj International School.

Excerpts of Interview of Shri Vinodkumarji Bajaj, Main Donor



Q. Tell us about Late Shri Dhurmal Bajajji and your relation with him.

Shri Dhurmalji Bajaj was my grandfather. He was true devotee of "Lord Venkatesh". He came from village Lachmangarh (near Sikar), Rajasthan to do business in Mumbai. He frequently travelled from Mumbai to his native place i.e.Lachmangarh. He was a very polite, gentle and kind hearted person. In Financial services business, he was held in a very high esteem in our community and also in the banking community. He was the first person to start the financial services business in our family.

Q. How did your family get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan?

My uncle Shri Deviduttji Bajaj and my father Shri Ramniwas Bajaj started our families association with Rajasthani Sammelan in 1970s. I













Was very young at that time. Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar and my uncle late Shri Deviduttji Bajaj & my father Late Shri Ramniwas Bajaj took great initiative for starting this project of constructing "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan".

Q. What was the objective and vision of your family for giving donation for Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan?

At that time, there was no Community Hall in Malad-Goregaon area to provide facilities for marriage and such other ceremonies. I still remember that a grand cultural programme was organized and my uncle Late Shri Devidutt Bajaj & my father late Shri Ramniwasji Bajaj also worked very hard for this project. Many people of the community came forward for giving donations. Of course, our family was the largest donor but many other members of the community also took great initiative to start this unique project of constructing a community hall in Malad (West) at that time. Shri Adityaji Birla was invited for the inauguration of "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan".

Q. Do you feel that the objective has been realized?

Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan is constructed in such a way that all the facilities are provided under one roof. It has three halls in each floor along with rooms on one side. It also has sufficient place on either side of the building. The fact that Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan is booked in advance by the community people throughout the year for marriage and such other ceremonies proves that the objective of providing marriage hall to cater to the needs of the community has been realized. Besides, the gound floor hall named after my grandmother late Smt. Nanibai Bajaj is also used by schools and colleges of Rajasthani Sammelan to conduct many activities in the morning. The days when marriage are not there, it is also used for Religious / Dharmik programme which also helps the Community in big way. In Malad "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan" has become a well known brand by itself.

Q. Are you directly or indirectly associated with Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan?

Our family is the Main Donor of not only "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan" built in memory of my Late Grandfather Shri Dhurmal Bajaj and my Late Grandmother Smt. Nanibai Bajaj but also main donor for "Ramniwas Bajaj English High School" built in the memory of my late father Shri Ramniwasji Bajaj. Our family is also the main donor of Mainadevi Bajaj International School named after my mother Smt. Mainadeviji Bajaj. Our family members are also trustees of Rajasthani Sammelan and we are always taking part in the working of Rajasthani Sammelan by attending meetings, functions and other activities. "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan" has its own Sub-committee which is looking after the day to day running of it. In this way we are indirectly associated with "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan" as all the important decisions regarding "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan" are taken at the meeting of Managing Committee and Board of Trustees.

Excerpts of Interview of Shri Rajkamalji Bajaj, Main Donor



Q. What is your vision for further improvement of facilities in Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan?

Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan was recently renovated in 2009. All the halls and some of the rooms have been air-conditioned. The Sub-committee is taking care for the improvement of facilities. I feel that

the present arrangement is quite satisfactory. As main donors, we strive our best to improve the facilities of "Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan" from time to time so that the Community at large is benefitted from the same.

Q. How are you associated with Rajasthani Sammelan?

My family is associated with Rajasthani Sammelan for the last more than 40 years. In fact the association started with the Rajasthani Sammelan approaching my uncle late Shri Deviduttji Bajaj for contributing for the construction of a marriage hall in Malad way back in 1970. The Bajaj Bhavan was built by Rajasthani Sammelan and named after my Grandfather Late Shri Dhurmalji Bajaj as our family was the Main Donor for the Bhavan. The Marriage Hall on the ground floor is named after my grandmother Late Smt Nani Bai Bajaj. My grandfather Late Shri Dhurmalji Bajaj was very soft spoken, generous and kind hearted person and enjoyed a very high reputation in the Marwari Community & the Banking Community. In fact when Shri Sorabji Pochkhanawalla founded Central Bank of India, my Grandfather Shri Dhurmalji Bajaj was one of the early underwriters to the shares of Central Bank of India. Over the years, the association with Rajasthani Sammelan has grown and become deeper and today we are associated with the Rajasthani Sammelan as Main Donor for Ramniwas Bajaj English High School which is named after my father, Late Shri Ramniwas Bajaj and Mainadevi Bajaj International School, which is in my mother's name.

Q. Tell us something about the role played by your family for the welfare of the community.

Bajaj family is associated with a number of philanthropic activities since the last more than 40 years for the welfare of the community in the field of education, medical and social development. One of the first such initiatives taken by the family as mentioned earlier was building the Marriage hall for the welfare of the community. Thereafter contribution to the Bombay Hospital and the Dhurmal Bajaj Orthopaedic Centre at the KEM Hospital were some of the initiatives taken in the field of medical. In the field of education the family contributed to setup the English Medium School and an International School to offer educational opportunities to children in association with Rajasthani Sammelan.

Q. Are you inspired by the philanthropic services rendered by your father? If yes, then in what way?

Yes, My father was our main source of inspiration. He believed in humility & charity for the welfare of the society & community. He was the one who taught us that one must give back to the Society a part of what one has earned from this Society. This inspired us to contribute in the field of education to set up the English Medium School in his name and thereafter contribute further for setting up the International School.

Q. Do you think that Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan is a boon to the community?


At the time when Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan was set up way back in the 1970's, there was no such Marriage Hall in the suburbs. People in those days could not find an affordable place for having marriage ceremonies. The whole idea to set up the Bajaj Bhavan was to provide all the facilities for marriage under one roof to the community in the suburbs at affordable prices. I still remember when I was very young that my uncle & my father had invited late Shri Aditya Vikram Birla to inaugurate the Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan and in those days even to mobilize the resources for constructing this hall was a big task. The fact that the Bajaj Bhavan has been seeing advance bookings from the community of a year is itself a testimony to the fact that it has been a big boon to the community in the suburbs over the last so many years

Q. What are your views for further growth and improvement of Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan in the near future?





. The Sports Day was held on 19th December 2012 at Goregaon Sports Club. The Chief Guest was Mr. Umesh



· Children requiring individual attention have been identified and are availing of sessions in the counselling centre even during the holidays.







A selfless man who walked the earth

Late Shri Deviprasad G. Goenka

Shri Deviprasad G. Goenka was born on 12th August 1924 to Smt. Ginni Devi wife of Shri Gangabux Phool Chand Goenka, in Nawalgarh, a town in Jhunjhunu District of Indian State Rajasthan known for the origin of many great business families of Marwari Community prominent amongst them being the Poddars, Seksarias, Morarkas, Mores etc.

The Shekhawati region is known for education in Rajasthan. Shri Deviprasad G. Goenka too pursued his education from this Educational Hub. After completing his education, post Independence he shifted to Mumbai to join his elder brother Shri Bhagwati Prasad Goenka who was in the Textiles. However, Shri Deviprasad G. Goenka chose to tread the path less travelled, particularly by Marwari Community and instead joined the stock market. This was a demonstration of his first streak of pursuing in what he believed as creating his own path and going by his belief. After working for few years as a sub-broker, he later became a member of the Bombay Stock Exchange in March 1953. Known as DG Goenka in the Shares & Stock Trading Community, he carved a niche for himself in the market.

Gifted with a unique quality of Caring, Sharing and Compassion, Philanthropy was a trait that he inculcated from his beloved parents. Shri Deviprasad G. Goenka believed in the idiom, "Charity begins at home". Always the one to lend a helping hand, he was at the forefront to help anyone when they were in need for it. Be it the domestic help or neighbours, Shri Deviprasad G. Goenka was always full of selfless love and care for others doing charity in different forms. To see others happy and contended gave him self-satisfaction.

- Established a hostel in the name of Shri Deviprasad Gangabux Goenka in Keshav Shrishti Complex, Uttan, Bhayender, Thane.
- Scholarships to needy people in Nawalgarh as well as children of the employees.

- Promotes Family Planning in association with Govt. Hospital by providing Gifts & Promotional Material for Family Planning Camps



Welcome at Mainadevi Bajaj International School:








(NEW INITIATIVE)

he human being is by instinct here to learn. In fact every living thing wants to learn including plants and animals. You must have observed very many animals learning, but if you observe you shall see that even a plant learns. Many plants learn to find support and climb up. They learn to prepare the photosynthesis. They learn to move towards the sunlight. So learning is by instinct in living being. However, we see that children today feel learning is more a burden and torture than fun and that is due to the pressure which may give rise to the existing difficulties in a child. The purpose of this article is that parents and teachers become aware that there are remedies and early and apt interventions can bring about a substantial effect in the child's approach towards learning and developing the skills required.

It would be necessary to understand some of the common difficulties that children face. These difficulties may not be visible handicaps on the surface however they do make a child unequipped for a lifetime and would always come as an obstacle whenever he or she has to perform a reading, writing, comprehending, calculating, reasoning, or learning a new task in the future.



Many children may take the easy route and discontinue learning and adapt a practical method of learning or work. However they lose out on the potential they have as they lose confidence in themselves in the process.

Some very common difficulties are as follows:

Learning Difficulties (LD)
Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder (ADHD)
Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD)
Oppositional Defiant Disorders (ODD)
Scholastic Backwardness

I shall focus more on the Learning difficulties as the percentage of children facing these difficulties is very high.

What are Learning Difficulty (LD)

Learning difficulties (LD) are neurological disorders that interfere with a person's ability to store, process or produce information, and create a 'gap' between one's ability and performance.



Struggling with Reading, Comprehension, Spelling or Writing?

Individuals with LDs generally have average or above average intelligence. LDs can affect one's ability to read, write, speak or compute math, and can impede social skills. Individuals with LDs can have marked difficulties on certain tasks while they may excel in other areas. Students with LD may have difficulty in all three areas or more than one, that is reading — dyslexia, writing — dysgraphia or arithmetic — dyscalculia. Dyspraxia can be defined as difficulty in visual motor coordination. Children are often termed at very clumsy.

We realized that many parents are still unaware that, there are many children who are otherwise normal are slow in their development or have some learning difficulties. Due to this unawareness, these difficulties go unrecognized. There is immense damage done to the self-esteem of the child who is suffering as he or she is labeled as lazy and careless and more often than not comparisons are made with the other children or immediate siblings and kin.

The visual motor coordination is weak and though they are trying hard they do not even realize when the spelling mistakes happen while writing. After trying a number of times, they give up completely and avoid situations where writing, reading or arithmetic is

involved. If the parent or teachers ask them to write the full page, they will barely manage two lines or leave a blank page. This is because they are highly threatened with words like complete, full page, finish all, do it in a limited time, etc.

Whenever parent (especially the mother) shouts and beats the child, the child does perform because of the fear or the negative attention that the child gets from the parents.

60% of the difficulties are due to a genetic predisposition. One of the parent or a close relative also would have been suffering from the same. The other 40% is due to birth trauma, epileptic seizure, head injury in infancy, vacuum or forceps delivery, asphyxia during birth, etc.

The common signs are:

- Delayed speech, or difficulty in listening and speaking.
- · Difficulty in reading, writing and spelling.
- Difficulty in understanding the basic concepts in arithmetic
- Difficulty in organizing the thoughts and maintaining a link while talking.
- Difficulty in application or recalling in written format
- Substituting of alphabets while reading and writing
- Reversal alphabets also known as mirror image.
- Difficulty in completing the work or incomplete books
- Shabby handwriting and slow work
- · Inability to focus on a topic or stay with one activity
- Inability to make judgment and often impulsive

These are few of the symptoms and it is not necessary that every child has all the symptoms. Some may be more common than others.

Also the symptoms do not necessarily mean that there is a difficulty as the next step would be to assess and evaluate with the appropriate tests. It is very essential to see a counselor if any of the symptoms match and get an IQ assessment. This would be followed by detailed assessments and therapy which would ensure a long term cure and benefit for the

What Parents can do.

child.

- Do not ignore the symptoms. They are as important to be treated as parents run to the doctor with slight cough and cold but often ignore the learning difficulties they see in the child.
- Sending children to tuition does not help as learning in a traditional method does not help. Remedial Education would be helpful.
- The child may need to strengthen his phonics, reading and writing skills, without pressurization. After the assessment the duration of the intervention would be set by the counselors.
- Try and understand the strengths of your child. Become good listeners
- Involve in one outdoor and one indoor game.
- Concentrate on treating the cause rather than focusing on the symptoms.

- In order for our children to turn out well, we need to spend twice the time and half the money.
- Keep at least one and half hour for playing.
- Schedule a game for improving motor co-ordination on a daily basis.
- Schedule Reading on a daily basis.
- Schedule clay or coloring activity at least thrice a week.
- Avoid comparison with other children.
- Always talk in pleasant & positive tone. Remember you are the role model.
- Never taunt or use sarcastic words. This will teach him to speak in the same manner.
- Improving relationships will also raise self esteem and confidence

How the school and the teachers can help

Teachers play a major role in identifying the difficulty as well as building the confidence of the children. Labeling the children as day dreamers or complaining to the parents that they are not completing their work and disturbing the class does not help the child nor does it help the parents to take appropriate steps.

Teachers could speak to the parents regarding the observation in confidence and give them a clear indication of the difficulty such as difficulty in comprehension, reading, writing, etc.

Teachers could also highlight the strength of the student and

recommend the parents to seek help to strengthen the areas of concern.

The confidence of the child if built and maintained helps everyone in the long run to overcome the difficulty or bring about improvements in written performance.

It is necessary to understand that with adequate support and timely intervention by getting the child assessed

and with appropriate remedial education, this difficulty can be dealt with and the children can be easily integrated into the further course of higher studies.

University goes online to curb paper leaks

Indian Express, Mumbai, November 16, 2012

fter a series of paper leaks in May, Mumbai University (MU) has decided to do away with, in a phase-wise manner, the practice of sending hard copies of questions papers to exam centres.

Colleges offering law, engineering, pharmacy and education degrees will have to download papers from a web portal for mid-terms starting November 19.

Twenty-seven law, 61 engineering, 18 pharmacy and 125 BEd colleges are affiliated to the university.

MU will send password-protected web links to the colleges. Principals will be provided user names and two passwords, one to access the portal and the other to open question papers.

"University officials held meetings with principals and senior faculty to explain the new system. We were told we can change the passwords. We will have to download the question papers and make photocopies," said N M Rajadhyaksha, dean of law faculty at MU and principal of New Law College, Matunga.

"As a pilot project, we will implement the system for four faculties. By next academic year, we will try to extend it to more colleges and by 2013-end, all 654 affiliated colleges will receive papers through web links. The technology involves security checks at various levels to curb malpractices. The initiative is part of our exam reforms," said Subhash Deo, director of examinations at MU.

However, many senior faculty members are not sure the system will be foolproof.

"MU cannot discontinue sending hard copies of question papers as many colleges in rural areas do not have the technology required for the new system. Colleges need high-speed internet and photocopy machines to download and print papers in scheduled time," said principal of an engineering college in Navi Mumbai.

"The initiative sounds systematic, but I am not sure how it will prevent leaks. It will cut transportation time, but paper leaks never happen during transportation. They happen during or before papers are dispatched," said Rajadhyaksha.

How the system will work: The 27 MU-affiliated colleges offering law, 61 engineering, 18 pharmacy and 125 education degrees will have to download papers from a web portal for mid-terms starting Nov 19

MU will send password-protected web links to the colleges. Principals will be provided user names and two passwords, one to access the portal and the other to open question papers. Colleges will have to download the papers and make photocopies by 2013-end, all 654 affiliated colleges will receive papers through web links.



CAT 2012 results: Ten candidates secure perfect scores

Times of India, January 9, 2013, Mumbai

en candidates have secured 100 percentile scores in the Common Admission Test, scores of which determine admission to the prestigious Indian Institutes of Management in the country. Results of the test were declared on Wednesday.

Nine of the 10 toppers are engineers, with eight of them from the Indian Institutes of Technology.

One candidate who secured the perfect score in the test studies science at Delhi University. Five of the 10 students are still in their final year of graduation. All the 100 percentilers are boys.

Four girls share the honour of scoring 99.99 percentile, all of them engineering students in their final year studying in different parts of the country, including Karnataka, Orissa, Delhi and UP. In all 255 girls and 1,640 boys scored more than 99 percentile in the test.

Many of the IIMs have awarded additional points for candidates from non-engineering backgrounds and for women to ensure diversity in the classroom.




