CEO's Message

Education system in India is geared towards teaching and testing knowledge at every level as opposed to teaching skills. "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day, teach him how to catch fishes and you feed him for a life time".

We, at Rajasthani Sammelan, believe that if we teach skills to students, we empower them for a lifetime. Knowledge is largely forgatten after exams are over, but if the focus is on enhancing skills then

we will be able to produce entrepreneurs, innovators, artists, scientists and thinkers who can establish the foundation of a knowledge based economy.

At Rajasthani Sammelan, we focus on continual improvement in order to provide the best facilities to the students, teachers, visitors and other stakeholders. Daily, a dedicated group inspects the campus and provides inputs to the senior management team on new ideas, scope for improvement and preventive actions in order to provide a seamless experience to its users.

Annual mock up evacuation drill was carried out on 26th November. The objective of the exercise was to provide scheduled opportunities for comprehensive fire emergency response for supervisory staff and to determine whether designated staff can competently respond in accordance with the emergency fire and evacuation procedures. Fire drill also helped us in assessing the ongoing effectiveness of emergency procedures under different fire scenarios. Entire evacuation exercise took seven minutes and all the students and staff were safely evacuated. Children of junior classes were explained the importance of such drills and it was heartening to know that the exercise left an impact on the students.

Fire experts from the industry were also called to impart training to the staff so that in case of any eventuality, staff can use fire extinguishers and provide initial aid. Computers have changed the way we work, be it in any field and our focus is on providing IT based systems. Computer technology has had a deep impact on education sector. Imparting education has become easier and more interesting than before. Use of computers in education primarily helps in storage of information, quick data processing, audio visual aids in teaching, better presentation of information, internet access and quick communication between students, teachers and parents.

RS campus has separate IT labs for each institute. These labs are well equipped with the latest hardware and other requirements as per the syllabus decided by respective boards. Separate data centre having 13 blade servers, 15 terabyte of NAS storage, firewall and high speed internet leased line has been established and all computers in the institutes are linked to this data centre.

It is our vision to have all student based activities and procedures online such as admissions, fee payment, attendance logs which can be accessed using student portal.

EDITORIAL

Education is a vital tool for the human resources development and empowerment of citizens of a country. As Mahatma Gandhi said 'Education not only moulds the new generation but reflects a so c i e ty's fund a mental assumptions about itself and the individuals which compose it'.

A recent statistics showed that India has the highest number of elementary as well as secondary schools and universities in the world. However, children from rural areas are still deprived of literacy. Our government is pursuing a variety of education related policies and programmes - all designed to improve education, its access to all and also to acquire excellence in improving quality of education. In urban areas also, children from under privileged class are deprived of quality education. The right of children to free and compulsory education or Right to Education Act (RTE) enacted by the Parliament of India instructs free compulsory education for children between 6 - 14 years in India. In the same way, Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) is Government of India's Flagship Programme for opening new schools in those habitations which do not have schooling facilities and strenathen existing school infrastructure, to provide quality elementary education and special focus on girls education and children with special needs.

In recent years, our country saw growth of large number of institutions of higher education, engineering as well as



management institutes. However such a growth will not serve the purpose unless it is supported by world class curriculum, modern infrastructure supported by suitable technical tools for teaching-learning. This requires a huge investment both by government as well as private trusts running educational institutions.

There has been a trend of growth of private unaided schools in Maharashtra. Many educationists attribute the shift to the quality of education offered in private unaided schools and also affordability of parents. Even those who are not so economically welloff send their children in private unaided schools as they believe that their children should get the best education.

The latest trend in education provided by many universities. Twelve leading universities in the U.S. and Europe joined an internet platform created by two Stanford University scientists which provides online access to classes designed by academics at elite institutions. Harvard University has produced online courses and other forms of digital learning for several decades with the goal of making educational

content available to a global audience.

Harvard University has collaborated with MIT and is providing learning content online. Some Indian Universities like Jaipur National University are also providing interdisciplinary online programmes. Recently, Rajasthani Sammelan has also started the endeavor in this direction by inaugurating Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy (GOLD Academy).

However, for providing quality education in schools and colleges by Private Trusts and Managements, it is necessary to provide state-of-art infrastructure, well qualified experienced teachers, technical support for learning and a rich library for an institution for which there should be continuous flow of funds. The Government of India has recently enacted laws related to Corporate Social Responsibility under the Companies Act 2013 that came into effect from 1st April 2014. The activities that can be undertaken by a company to fulfil its CSR obligations include promoting education, promoting preventive healthcare and promoting gender equality, eradicating hunger, poverty and malnutrition, setting up homes

for women, orphans and the senior citizens, ensuring environmental sustainability and ecological balance, animal welfare, protection of national heritage and art and culture. There are around 3000 Indian companies who are under the ambit of section 135 of the Companies Act 2013 making it mandatory for the companies to contribute 2% of their average netprofit.

Investment in education is the best investment that can lead to great changes in the socio-economic life of our country. Even before the laws pertaining to CSR were enacted, many corporates have been discharging their social responsibility voluntarily. Corporates like Tata Group, The Aditya Birla Group, Indian Oil Corporation and others have been serving the community ever since their inception.

At Rajasthani Sammelan, CSR activities are not new as Donors in the past as well as in recent years have always liberally donated to start new institutions as well as facilities in R.S. Campus. In recent years, IRB Infrastructure Developers Limited have donated for IRB Endowment Scholarship Fund to provide scholarship to meritorious students of all institutions of Rajasthani Sammelan. The latest donation has come from Balkrishna Industries Limited (BKT) for Freeship Endeavour Fund. We wish that in future, more Donors from corporate sector will come forward to invest in education.

WESALUTE OUR FOUNDING FATHERS

SHRI MURLIDHARJI JALAN

hri Murlidharji Jalan is one of the founder members of Rajasthani Sammelan. Under the guidance of his elder brother, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan, Murlidharji played a very important role in the establishment of Rajasthani Sammelan along with other stalwarts of Marwari Community, who were dedicated to various social causes as well as to the empowerment of girl students through education.

Shri Murlidharji Jalan rendered his valuable services to Rajasthani Sammelan for more than three decades (1948-1980), first as member and later on, as Office Bearer of the Managing Committee in different capacities such as Hon.Secretary, Treasurer, Vice-President and President.

During the early days of Rajasthani Sammelan, Shri Murlidharji Jalan as well as the other founder members faced many challenges. They had to work very hard to obtain land for the Trust, followed by the construction of the school building of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School).

Along with other Founding Fathers, Shri Murlidharji Jalan was instrumental in drafting the first constitution of Rajasthani Sammelan. The first constitution of Raiasthani Sammelan was signed on 20th September 1958 by Shri Ghanshvamdasii Jalan, Shri Murlidharji Jalan, Shri Kashiprasadii Adukia, Shri Hariramji Saraf, Shri Gaurishankarji Nangalia, Shri Mahavirprasadii Kaval,

Shri Ramgopalji Ruia, Shri Kishorilal ji Ruia, Shri Vishwanathji Seksaria.





Shri Ratanlalji Saraf, Shri Lalchandji Dalmia, Shri Shreekrishnaji Narsaria and Shri Vishwanathji Podar.

During the tenure of Shri Murlidharji Jalan as Office Bearer of the Managing Committee of Rajasthani Sammelan, educational institutions of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya and Durgadevi Saraf Junior College were established. During this time, Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan, the community hall, was also constructed by Rajasthani Sammelan. This was inaugurated on 16th April 1996 by Shri Aditya Birla, the renowned industrialist, at a glittering function attended by many eminent personalities.

In 1976, when Shri Murlidharji Jalan was the Vice-President of Rajasthani Sammelan, Silver Jubilee of the trust was celebrated on 3rd July at Birla Matoshree Sabhagrih at a glittering function with Dr. Ramnathji Podar, the famous industrialist and philanthropist, gracing the function as the Chief Guest. During these years, the Managing Committee of Rajasthani Sammelan decided to extend higher education facilities to girl students and the application for affiliation to Mumbai University was submitted to start a Degree College for girls which later came up by the name of Ghanshvamdas Saraf Girls' College of Arts & Commerce in the year 1983.

In the late seventies, the Jalan family shifted their residence from Malad to proper Mumbai. Due to this, Shri Murlidharji Jalan could not involve himself directly in the educational and social activities of Raiathani Sammelan, However,

he always remains a well wisher for Rajasthani Sammelan & is full of admiration for

educational endeavours undertaken by the present team of Managing Committee.

In his personal life, Shri Murlidharji Jalan belongs to a family of businessmen. He obtained his B. Com Degree from Podar College of Commerce & Economics at an early age of sixteen. He later became involved in his family business of textiles under the banner of Jagannath Kishanlal & Sons at Kalbadevi, Mumbai. Later on, their family also got involved in establishing flour mills at Aurangabad.

Shri Murlidharji Jalan has been associated with many trade, cultural and social organizations in various capacities. Following are some of the organizations with which he has been associated:

- 1) Former Vice-President of All India Manufacturers' Association.
- 2) Former President of Roller Flour Mills Federation of India, New Delhi.
- 3) Former member of Garment Committees of Labour Ministry, Government of India.

- 4) Represented India at the International Labour Conference at Geneva, twice in 1995 & 1996 as a delegate member from India.
- 5) Founder member of Rajasthani Vidyarthi Griha.
- 6) Member of Akhil Bharatiya Rajasthani Vidvarthi Kosh.
- 7) Donor Trustee of:
- a) Ghanshyamdas Jalan Junior College of Science & Commerce, Malad (East).
- b) Ghanshvamdas Jalan Degree College of Science Commerce & Arts, Malad (East)
- 8) Member, Rotary Club of Bombay Mid-Town since 1971 and having 100% attendance for the past 35 years.

Through this issue of Abacus, we recognize the dedicated services of Shri Murlidharji Jalan for the progress of Rajasthani Sammelan right from its inception and further, in the first three decades. We salute him for his dedication and hard work for various social causes and educational endeavours of Rajasthani Samemlan.

EXCERPTS OF INTERVIEW OF SHRI MURLIDHARJI JALAN



When and how did your association with Rajasthani Sammelan start?

We were the founders of Rajasthani Sammelan when it was formed in 1948. The first meeting of Raiasthani Sammelan was held at 'Krishna Kuti', the house of my elder brother, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan. At that time, we gave it the name 'Malad Rajasthani Sammelan'. My elder brother, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan, played a lead role in the formation of Rajasthani Sammelan. We used to meet during Holi or Diwali at a particular member's house. Later, we felt the need of a suitable place for our meetings. Also, we felt that we need to work for opening a girls' school through Rajasthani Sammelan. Hence, we started looking up for a suitable land in Malad. Later on, we dropped the word 'Malad' from Rajasthani Sammelan to give the organization a wider scope of inviting members from other areas of Mumbai.

What were the difficulties faced by you in the early years of Rajasthani Sammelan?

It was a real challenge for all of us when we thought of starting a girls' school in Malad. During that time, Shri Vishwanathji Podar was running Sarvodaya School in 3 -4 huts in Malad. He approached us with a request to take overthe school and run it properly. Shri Vishwanathji Podar had obtained from Shri Kudilalji

Seksaria, 4000 vards of land to construct a school building, which was then taken over by us. However, collecting funds for the construction of the school building was a real challenge. We approached Shri Brijmohanji Ruia for donation. He agreed to donate Rs. 51,000 provided, we collect the equal amount. We took the challenge and with extreme hard work, we collected more than the equal amount. We also purchased some more land adjacent to the land given by Shri Kudilalji Seksaria and gradually, the construction of the school building was completed. The school was later inaugurated in 1959 by the then Union Education Minister, Dr. Kalulal Shreemali.

Who were the people who contributed in the growth of Rajasthani Sammelan in the early years?

It is difficult to remember each and every name but to name a few, my elder brother, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan, Shri Satyanarayanji Ganeriwal, Shri Durgaduttji Thard, Shri Hariramji Saraf, Shri Ramgopalji Ruia, Shri Shreekrishnaji Narsaria, Shri Lalchandji Dalmia, Shri Vishwanathji Podar and many others will be remembered who worked very hard in the initial years for the cause of education and for various other social causes.

What was the objective of starting a girls' school in Malad?

In those days, there was no good girls' school in Malad. Due to this, girls from our community were deprived of education. Therefore, we decided to work for starting a girls' school in Malad. We went door to door and requested people to send their daughters to Sarvodaya Balika Vidvalava. The school was initially started upto Primary section and was gradually upgraded upto SSC. Thus, by constructing a proper building followed by obtaining proper permission from authorities and appointing qualified teachers, we were successful to educate girls in Malad area upto SSC level and in Hindi Medium. Within a few years, the school performed extremely well and progressed to greater heights day by day in terms of academics and extra curricular activities. Thereafter, in 1975, Rajasthani Sammelan received recognition from the State Government to start a Junior College for girls which was attached to the school. Thus, we could successfully provide education to girls upto H.S.C. level.

What role did you play as the Office Bearer of Rajasthani Sammelan in different capacities for two decades and more?

It was a joint effort of many persons who had come together for a social cause. We framed the first constitution of Rajasthani Sammelan and our trust was registered with the Charity Commissioner. In our constitution, we




prepared categories of different donors on the basis of donation and made people members and trustees accordingly. Initially, our ordinary membership was as low as Rs.5/- only. We used to go from one house to another to enroll people of our community as members of Rajasthani Sammelan. We also did some social work as per the need of the society. At that time, there was no proper shop in Malad to purchase funeral materials. People had to get things from different places. Besides, the shops remained closed on Sunday. So, we started a shop where all funeral materials were provided. Later on, this shop was closed when similar shops came up.

We also used to organize many functions and invite people from business community. They too, attended such functions to encourage us as well as our students. To mention a few names, in early 60s, we welcomed Shri Gurudasii Barelia, a renowned businessman, at a function organized by Rajasthani Sammelan. The function was also attended by Shri G.D. Somani, the eminent industrialist & philanthropist. As mentioned earlier, we successfully provided education to girl students upto HSC level by establishing a girls' school and a junior college and had started work of establishing a girls' degree college. We also completed construction of Dhurmal Baiai Bhavan followed by its inauguration. The construction work was started in 1973 when Shri Vasudev Somani, the leading industrialist, was invited in R.S. Campus to lay the foundation stone of the hall on 6th October 1973. However, it was a dream come true for the residents of Malad when Dhurmal Baiai Bhavan was completed and on 16th April

1976, it was inaugurated by Shri Aditya Birla, the renowned industrialist, at a scintillating function organized by the trust in the newly constructed Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan. Shri Ramkrishna Baiai, renowned industrialist and philanthropist, also graced the occasion as the Chief Guest.

We recruited well qualified Headmistresses. teachers and office staff to run the educational institutions smoothly. To give importance to the national language, we used to organize 'Kavi Sammelan' on 'Hindi Diwas' from time to time. We also used to organize 'Deepawali' and 'Holi' get togethers regularly for the members of Sammelan to encourage fellow feeling among the members.



He spoke on the growing importance of private institutes in the last few years and how coming up with more number of some of the best institutes of our country like the IIMs. IITs and IIITs can help accelerate its arowth.

To add, he said that in today's ever changing world, we need to keep up with the times and

online education or elearning, as it is called, is emerging as a very powerful tool today. He gave a special mention to EdX, Khan Academy and Udacity, offering online education successfully to millions of students from all corners of the world. Rajasthani Sammelan has also taken a step in this direction with the launch of Kunjbihari, S. Goyal Online Academy.

Towards the end, addressing the CAs as a very important and educated class of people who understand the dynamics of business and play a very important role as advisors and strategists, he urged them to advise their corporate clients to invest in education by actively participating in CSR and become the instruments of social change.

Summary of Keynote Address by Ashok M Saraf, President, Rajasthani Sammelan, at the 29th Regional Conference of Western India Regional Council on 5th & 6th December '2014 in Mumbai on "How Education can transform India?"

Education: Concept, Purpose & Importance

Imagine a world without schools and colleges! Impossible, right? No matter how much we hate waking up early for school/college or studying all night for those tests and exams, we all know that education is very important. An educated person gets better opportunities. Education can also bring a change in lifestyle. Education for the women brings in full time

or part time second income to families and contributes to better parenting of the next generation.

Education is a vital tool for the human resources development and empowerment of citizens of a country. Education plays a major role in imparting knowledge, values and developing skills and, in the process, increases the growth and productivity of the nation.

Education in India in the past:

From time immemorial, education in India has been considered as the most important wealth to be possessed by an individual. There is a well known saying in Sanskrit, vidua dhanam garva dhan prachanami.e. Education is the most important wealth amongst all. Albert Einstein says, "We owe a lot to the Indians, who taught us how to count, without which no worthwhile scientific discovery could have been made". India invented the Number System. Zero was invented by Aryabhatta. The World's first University was established in Takshashila in 700 BC. More than 10.500 students from all over the world studied more than 60 subjects. The University of Nalanda built in the 4th

Century BC was one of the greatest achievements of ancient India in the field of education. Renowned archaeologist, Sir Alexander Cunningham rediscovered the ruins of Takshashila in mid-19th century. In 1980, Takshashila was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Sanskrit is the mother of all the European languages. Sanskrit is the most suitable language for computer software reported in Forbes magazine 1987. Bhaskaracharya calculated the time taken by the earth to orbit the sun hundreds of years before the astronomer, Smart. Earliest Indian education followed the gurukul pattern with the learners staying in close vicinity of a powerful quru and his disciples.

Education in India at present: Spread and status

According to a recent statistics on demography, every third person in an Indian city today is a youth: that is, 67% of Indians are below 35 years of age and more than 50% below 25 years of age. It is said that by 2020, India is set to become the world's youngest country with 64% of its population in the working age group of 18 to 55 years.

With the West, Japan and even China ageing, this demographic



potential offers India and its growing economy an unprecedented edge that economists believe could add a significant 2 to 3% to the GDP growth rate.

Youth is a force if channelized or a disaster if not used well and not gainfully employed

Roots of militancy and communal behavior are associated with lack of economic future and gainful employment. Hence, skills-based learning is a must to make the youths gainfully engaged. Skills which are employable, applied: managerial, technical, creative, communicative and accounting based. This can be done only through education.

However, one third of the population continues to remain below the poverty line, deprived of basic needs like food, shelter, basic education, nutrition and sanitation. People believe that India's best can be compared with the best of the world and the worst is also comparable with the worst. Some of the Indian scientists, engineers, economists, doctors, entrepreneurs have been distinguishly acknowledged and recognized world over. The Harvard University Dean, Dr. Nitin Neoria, Microsoft

CEO, Satya Nadela, present RBI Governor, Dr. Raghuram Rajan are some of the such examples. Some of the best brains have migrated to the western countries due to lack of opportunities in India whereas some of the NRIS like Sam Pitroda (telecommunication revolution), Dr. Naresh Trehan (Cardiologist) have significantly contributed back to the motherland.

Challenges that India faces in Education: Liberal, Technical & Professional Education

It is alarming to note that 37% of adult illiterates in the world are residing in India. According to a report by United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation, India has the highest population of illiterate adults at 287 million. Unemployment has been an area of major concern. The youth today needs to understand the value of attributes that result in employability. Besides, the skills required to create an efficient skilled workforce is an essential element of every industry and profession.

The Right of Children to Free and



Compulsory Education Act or Right to Education Act (RTE), is an Act of the Parliament of India enacted on 4 August 2009, which describes the modalities of the importance of free and compulsory education for children between 6 and 14 in India. India became one of the 135 countries to make education a fundamental right of every child when the act came into force on 1st April 2010.

Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) is the Government of India's flagship programme for achievement of Universalization of Elementary Education (UEE). Its goals of 2015 are: To open new schools in areas which do not have them and to expand existing school infrastructures, maintenance & address inadequate teacher numbers and provide training and development for existing teachers.

India has seen an unprecedented growth of institutions of higher education in the recent past particularly in engineering and management education.

As per Ernst & Young - EDGE 2011 Report, there are 26,478 institutions providing higher education and accounting for the largest number in the world. In comparison, in 2010, the U.S. had only 6,706 higher education schools and China had around 4,000. According to a recent survey by FICII-ERNST & Young, 80% of Indian workforce does not possess identifiable marketable skills and only 25% of Indian professionals are considered employable. The plan outlay for the education sector has always been inadequate compared to its requirements resulting into shortage of educational institutions, inadequate and poor infrastructure, shortage of teachers, quality of curriculum, etc.





Good quality of education would lead to higher economic growth with per capita income comparable to developed countries to enhance prosperity of citizens without creating disparity; self reliant India with trade surplus and sufficient foreign exchange reserves; reasonable taxes with effective compliance and many other positive results.

Future of Education in India (Online/Digital Education)

Online Education or e-Learning as it is popularly known today is a boon to acquiring knowledge. Many great universities and educational institutions are working together to give e-learning its due importance.

A team of 28 people from Maharashtra was sent to Harvard University in August 2012, in a delegation to understand how to improve education in Maharashtra. I was one of the participants of this delegation and one of the things that I learnt and understood at Harvard was that On Line Education is the education of the future

EdX - MIT & Harvard : EdX was created for students and institutions that seek to transform themselves through cuttingedge technologies, innovative pedagogy, and rigorous courses. EdX is based in Cambridge, Massachusetts and is governed by MIT and Harvard. The Goals for such great institutes to come together are

Expand access to education for everyone, Enhance teaching and learning on campus and online &Advance teaching and learning through research. The principles on which EdX works are nonprofit, open source



platform, collaborative & financially sustainable. Both Harvard & MIT have come together and set up a portal where they teach online. The Head of this Institution is an Indian, Dr. Anant Agarwal.

There is Khan Academy founded by Salman Khan, a non-profit organization started in 2009, with a mission, a goal of changing education for the better by providing free world-class education for anyone anywhere through the website of Khan Academy, Bill Gates stressed the fact that Khan Academy is a great tool for one's learning adventure. saying that the "breath of stuff is incredible and the explanations are clear". He also pointed out that he uses Khan Academy to remind himself about certain concepts and with his kids "when things are complicated for them" - which makes us feel better about forgetting things, too!

Gates Foundation has contributed two Million to Khan Academy whereas Google has contributed Five Million to Khan Academy.

Khan Academy has received accolades for its innovative use of technology to educate millions of students across the world. Khan Academy received the Tech Award for education in 2009. Salman Khan has been featured on the The Colbert Report, PBS News Hour, CNN and National Public Radio. Like Khan Academy supporting online school education, there is Sebastian Thrun, Google's Vice- President and pioneer in artificial intelligence and robotics who launched Udacity, an independent online education company that provides high quality education at low cost to virtually everyone. Udacity offers 11 STEM courses like "Introduction to Physics," "Intro to Computer Science," and "Web Application Engineering" -- all free. By utilizing online videos and educational resources, Thrun's class is being accessed by students from all corners of the world.

GOLD Academy by Rajasthani Sammelan

Educational Trust -We, at Rajasthani Sammelan Educational Trust, have embarked on Online Education under the name of Kunibihari S. Goval Online Academy. We call it GOLD. We are in the process of building content for Commerce Stream and we also want this content on line for CA students, engineering students,

management students and other students..

In India, so far education is the constitutional responsibility of the state and is primarily delivered by the State. However, the role of the private sector has been growing in prominence and scope over the past few years. Many educationists attribute the shift to the quality of education offered in private unaided schools and also the increasing number of affordability of parents.

Establishment of Private Universities has been a major milestone in the field of higher education in India. A number of private universities have been established in various States as also the Central Govt. of India has granted Deemed University status to a number of educational institutions. It is the right time to develop and implement a progressive framework that provides for opportunities to deserving private institutions and educational promoters, with relevant and sufficient experience and exposure in the field of higher education, so as to contribute towards the expansion of higher education and research.

There is a need to foster public-private partnership for Development and upgrading of the skills. Government of India has set up National Skill Development Corporation. In many countries, there are community colleges that impart knowledge essential for a specific trade. These countries value the profession based skill sets. It is not necessary for every individual to get university level education. Vocational skills are as important as management skills.

One of the major objectives of the education is to prepare the students to earn their livelihood and contribute to the economic well-being of the nation by acquiring right knowledge, skills, values, behaviour and attitude. The business and industry thus need the job ready, professionally qualified and skilled human resource. In this pursuit, many engineering and management institutions were opened with private initiatives. Though these institutes have provided large number of skilled manpower particularly in the areas of Software and Services Sectors, the mushrooming growth of these institutions could not sustain the quality and ensure the employability of a large number of pass outs.

Chartered Accountancy - Vocational education has always been in demand. The internationally accredited certifications help the candidates to be the part of the global work force. The vocational education like Chartered Accountancy has always been assigned a premier value by business and the society. The CA qualification has maintained its high standard due to the coverage of its curriculum and rigour of passing norms. CAs have always been in

great demand in business and industries due to their specialised functional roles required anywhere and everywhere.

Pending Bills on Foreign University A total of 11 Bills were pending in Parliament, including the Foreign Educational Institutions (regulation of entry and operations) Bill, the Prohibition of Unfair Practices in Technical Educational Institutional, Medical Educational Institutions and Universities Bill, the Education Tribunals Bill and the Institutes of Technology Amendment Bill. These Bills have been pending for the past year and a half. According to experts, one of the impact that the Foreign Universities Bill will have once it is passed, would be on the quality of education in the country.

IIM - The Indian Institute of Management (IIMs) as you all know, are the best Management Schools run in our country. Presently, we have 16 IIMs and the Government is in the process of setting up 5 new IIMs. Our country requires many more such IIMs in every city and very corner of the country. This will positively help in the education segment & ultimately transform India.

IIT - Indian Institute of Technology- For Technical & Engineering Education, we all know that IITs are the best. Presently, we have 13 IITs and the Government is in the

process of setting up 6 new IITs. Our country requires many more such IITs in every city and every corner of the country. This will promote technical education and help transforming India.

IIIT - Indian Institute of Information Technology- Just as we have IIM for Management Education & IIT for Technical Education, the Government plans to set up an IIIT (Indian Institute of Information Technology) for Information Technical Education. Presently, there are 4 IIITs and the Government is proposing to set up new 20 IIITs out of which 8 are allocated with permissions to start, IIIT has been set up by PPP (Public Private Participation) mode and apart from the Government, private people will be allowed to participate.

Teachers Training Institute - Apart from Schools & Colleges, education for Teachers is what is required. While we build Institutions, if we do not have trained teachers, we will be lagging behind. Today,

our country requires Teachers Training Institutes to be set up. I strongly believe that education is one of the key factors that can help in transforming India. If all the people in our country are educated, we will be the most powerful nation in the world. Online Education, Teachers Training Institute, IIM, IIT, IIIT, etc. are the way forward.

What CAs can do to use Education to Transform India:

Chartered Accounts are an educated class of people. Any Businessman or Entrepreneur, small or large, will not take a major decision without consulting his CA. So, you all CAs here are important decision makers in the Business and Industry.

As you are aware, the Government has introduced compulsory CSR in the Indian Companies Act 2013, effective from April 2014. As a responsible corporate citizen, the management of corporates who benefit from society should pay back to the society by participating in any activities which help in the upliftment of people living around.

CSR is an initiative that can help transform India. We have done a study of 3,000 Indian companies. who are under the ambit of Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 making it mandatory for companies to contribute 2% of their average net profit of last 3 years.

The total amount that these 3000 companies need to spend as their contribution towards the society is about Rs.10,000 crore for the current financial year. Investment in Education is perhaps the best investment that can fetch rich dividends. As Chartered Accountants who manage the portfolio of India's Corporate houses, you can be the change agents for the society. I urge you to recommend to your clients to consider investment in the education sector. •


deal with technical education, ranging from diploma, engineering, pharmacy, management and hotel management.

submitted by the respective lecturers



Group dance, Cooking, Chess, Throw ball, Box cricket and Counter- strike. On the second day, 13 competitions were held and







(ii) Persuasion Skills ability to influence, convince, negotiate and sell. The most successful leaders in the world also had great persuasion skills. What are all of them doing:

3. A politician giving speeches to get votes

Aren't they all persuading?

There is a myth that we need to learn the tactics of selling.

Good professionals learn the principles of persuasion, not tactics because the principles are based on foundation of integrity whereas tactics are manipulative.

There is another myth that, to succeed, one needs to learn the tricks of the trade. Professionals learn the trade, they leave the tricks to the cheats and crooks. Either

get professional or get out.

Example, health is important. Exercising every day is important but if I skip it one day, it's not the end of the borld. But, if I ignore it long enough, guess what will happen? It will convert into urgent. Same thing is true with relationships.

2. What is NEGOTIABLE and what is NON-NEGOTIABLE and what we would STAND FOR and what we would STAND AGAINST. If we look at the life histories of some of the greatest leaders of the world, you find that they were never neutral on values. They either stood for something or against something.

3. We need to distinguish between pleasure and happiness in life. Pleasures have always come from outside and they are temporary, whereas happiness has always come from inside and is lasting.

4. We need to distinguish between MAKING MONEY vs. EARNING MONEY. Making money and earning money are two different things. Unfortunately, most people only want to make money, not earn it.

Remember this life is not a dress rehearsal, and the stakes are too high.
