Ghanshyamdas Saraf College celebrated its prestigious Annual Cultural Fest 'MAUJ' successfully with a participation of large number of students from other colleges.

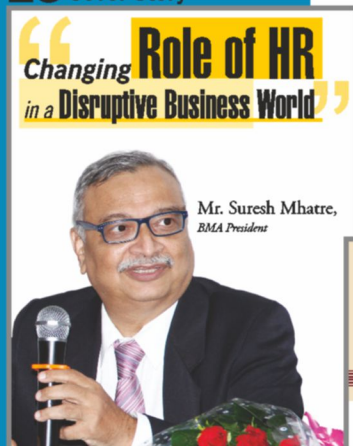

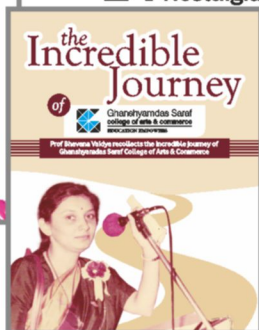

Rajasthan Sammelan Education Trust (RSET), in its journey towards excellence, has conceptualized the idea of establishing a Self Financed University in Mumbai, Maharashtra. The conceptualization to preparation of a Detailed Project Report has been an exciting journey with many punctuations, spread over a period of 6 months.

RSET is planning to establish the University in Maharashtra with focus on quality, relevance, equity and access.

As per 2011 census, Maharashtra with a population of 9.28 % of India's total population is the 2nd largest State in the country, with 50 Universities contributing to the growth of Higher Education in India. With the growth of Mumbai and Metropolitan Region, the city has expanded and created 3 mega Mumbai cities viz:

1. Mumbai
2. Navi Mumbai
3. The proposed Mira-Virar City (MV City): the 3rd Mumbai

Location of the Proposed University at MVC:

#### **Rationale**

The rationale for establishing the proposed RSET University, Mumbai at Mira-Virar City is that Mira-Virar City, being a high growth area, with a population of nearly 50 lacs in the next 8 to 10 years, is envisaged to provide newer growth opportunities in the new corridor spread over 380 sq. kms.

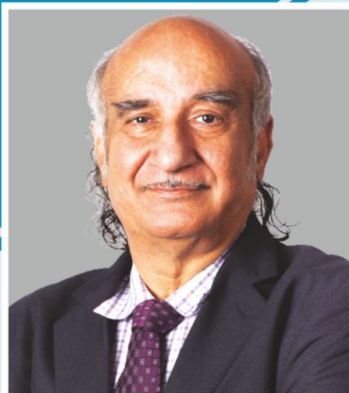
The MVC is christened as 3rd Mumbai and it comprises of Mira Road, Bhayander, Naigaon, Vasai Road, Nallasopara and Virar. With the growth of the corridor as well as inter and intra city connectivity, linking Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and MVC, the development of 3rd Mumbai will provide a range of opportunities in areas like Housing, Health, Infrastructure, Hospitality, Technology, Industrial Development and most importantly Education.

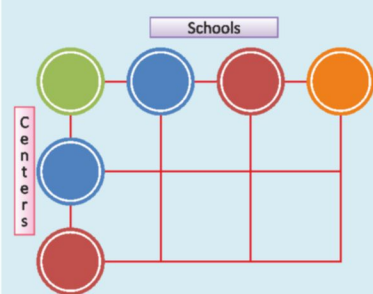

**5. Online learning:** The Technology Management Center will not only create the online curriculum but will also provide the learning support framework.

**6. '80:20':** The curriculum will be based on the 80:20 rule, wherein 80 % focus will be on Core Foundation Courses and 20 % curriculum based on Humanities and Social Sciences

**7. Holistic Development:** RSET believes in holistic development of the students. Care will be taken to ensure that every student (including the executive level students) are sensitized to the societal needs.

The Detailed Project Report takes into consideration some of the uniqueness mentioned above.

To conclude, the proposed RSET University, Mumbai will adopt innovative solutions that will change the way the students learn, communicate, produce, elaborate and study both on and off campus solutions. RSET University, Mumbai will be reinventing the spaces as 'innovation centers' so that faculty can integrate technology into curriculum or students can watch videos and work on projects.

Yale School of Management will name its deanship in honour of Ms. Indra Nooyi. With this gift, she becomes the most generous graduate of Yale School of Management in terms of life time giving to the school. She is the first woman to endow the deanship at a top Business School.

Shri Anand Mahindra, an MBA of 1981 batch has given the university \$10 million (Rs. 55.61 crores) to support the Humanities Center in honour of his mother Smt. Indira Mahindra. 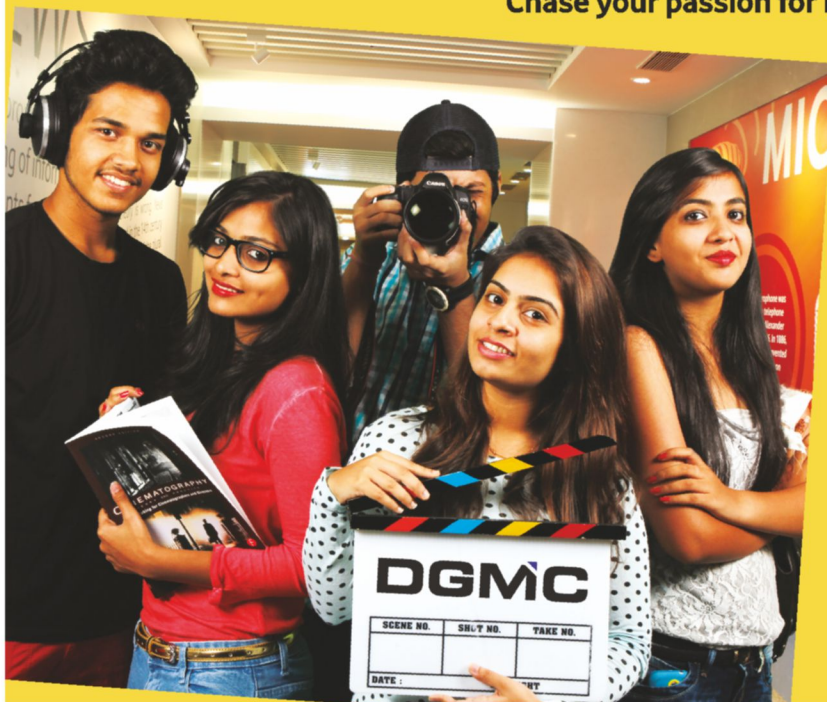

Ghanshyamdas Saraf College of Arts & Commerce**

**T**here is a saying : The journey is the destination. Well, the journey of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College has been eventful and note-worthy, by any standard. The innumerable milestones of achievements and recognition that this institution has seen has spanned a period of 32 years. This institution was the first Mumbai University - affiliated girls' college in the western suburbs. Its inception was the result of the keen social consciousness of a few individuals of Rajasthani Sammelan who were far - sighted enough to discern the need for a girls' college in their locality, at a time when conservative middle-class families were not very eager to let their daughters pursue higher education. Their untiring efforts achieved fruition on July 2, 1983 when the State Education Minister, Hon'ble Shri Sudhakarrao Naik inaugurated Ghanshyamdas Saraf College. Main Donor Shri Mahavirprasad Saraf, M.L.C. Shri Ram Manohar Tripathi and other Sammelan members attended the function. Thus began the journey of Saraf College, a grand journey which would see great achievements,

involving many activities and innumerable individuals who played a part in these activities which were like giant wheels constantly turning in their endless striving for excellence.

I joined Saraf College eleven months after it began - in June of 1984, aged 24 years, with barely three years of teaching experience; everything else unclear, uncertain and hazy but absolutely clear about my main objective: to be the best teacher that I was capable of being. There, in that old extension building of Sarvodaya Balika School (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) in the company of some ten colleagues under founder Principal Shri B.K. Acharya, I began my own journey - as a lecturer in the English Department, teaching Business Communication. Earlier, I had taught classes XI and XII in Ruia College. The students there were academically very good and teaching them was delightful. Here, there was a different picture. Students were mostly from Hindi medium schools - either Sarvodaya or others - and very self-conscious about their "weak English" and nervous about communicating in English. I now understood what my job here really was - I had to teach my students not just 'Business Communication', but mainly to instill in them a sense of fascination about the language, to make them take a natural interest in it. Above all, I had to awaken their self-confidence and self-belief. Here, I had the opportunity

to do this through the varied extra-curricular activities in the college. Principal Acharya gave me two main jobs, the Cultural Association and the college magazine editorship. These activities enabled me to interact with my students and build a rapport with them. My colleagues too were a part of these joint activities - I fondly remember Mrs. Swati Saraf, who would be present for every single Music audition; Mrs. Daksha Kapadia without whom we could not think of holding a Mehendi contest or a Prize distribution; and others. Acharya Sir, gave us encouragement and support, and so did our management. I remember our first Chairman, Shri D.R. Dhanukaji who was a leading lawyer in Mumbai High Court at the time. With all his eminence and erudition, he came across as such a gentle and unassuming person. When we heard him speak to us teachers and saw him encourage our students, I felt confident that we, as an institution were doing well. Be it Dhanukaji or Shri Banwarilal Jhunjhunwala, it is to their credit that they created a comfort level between the faculty and management which is a rare thing, anywhere. So much so, that Principal Acharya even asked the teachers to participate in the Annual Day function, along with the students! We put up a small skit and sang a few songs - I still remember some of the lines of dialogue I wrote for it! Another event was the Annual Staff vs. Students cricket match, where every teacher took part.

Principal Acharya's retirement in 1986 gave us a new Principal, Dr. Sunanda Kar. We can honestly say that the two decades we had under her leadership were a period when the college "came of age" so to say. The fledgling institution acquired a proper identity and character of its own - we received Government grants and got permanent affiliation to Mumbai University. Our extension activities like NSS, NCC, Adult Education flourished. Our cultural activities too, became a hallmark. We began our own Inter-collegiate festival. Our main donors the gracious Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf and his wife Smt. Kirandevisaji Saraf unfailingly attended every Annual Day function to personally crown the winner of the 'Miss Saraf' contest. Our academic achievements were also steadily increasing, both of our students and faculty. Every achievement brought personal notes of congratulations from Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf who always commended our every

effort. Saraf College celebrated its Decennial year in 1994. The then Pro-Vice Chancellor of Mumbai University Dr. V.N. Gupchup delivered the inaugural address on the first day of the celebration while Dr. Mehroo Bengalee, former Vice-Chancellor of Mumbai University also addressed the gathering on the same day. We organized our first major conference on this occasion, on the theme of the status of women. In 1997, Saraf College got its own new building - the one we are in today.

Here, in the new premises, we continued our onward march. We began a new chapter of development in 2001 by starting professional courses and increasing their number in steady succession - first BMS, BMM and M.Com followed by BCAF and BCBI. We also set up Kirandevisaji Saraf Centre of Excellence and Kirandevisaji Institute of Complete Learning. Our faculty members too improved their qualifications, acquired M.Phil and Ph.D degrees and attended Orientation and Refresher courses. We also organized workshops and conferences on themes such as "Quality Assurances in Education" and 'Laws and Indian Women'.

Saraf College was growing, and we were growing with it. Our identity as a reputed girls' college was firmly entrenched by now. It was time to go for the big goal. We applied for accreditation by NAAC. Dr. Kar constituted a Core Committee - with Dr. Pandey, Prof. K.S. Narayan and Prof. Jayant Apte, I was also a member. It was a very elaborate and painstaking affair and everyone was a part of it - from the management and faculty and non-teaching staff to the students and even parents. In 2004, we received accreditation by NAAC and an 'A' Grade! For all of us it was a stamp of recognition of our standing and worth as a leading educational institution. From now on, there was only one way to go - forward, to further laurels. At a grand function, Dr. V.S. Prasad, Director, NAAC and

Management members of Rajasthani Sammelan who played stellar roles in this achievement were all there: Shri Banwarilalji Jhunjhunwala, Shri Madhavprasadji Khemka, Shri Kailashji Parasrampur, Shri Kailashji Kejriwal and Shri Ashokji Saraf.

Dr. Kar retired in 2006 - as Principal, and was appointed Educational Director of Rajasthani Sammelan. The period 2006 to 2008 saw two Principals, Dr. S. Donde and Dr. R. Mirchandani who stayed for a short period and moved on.

At around the same time, in these conditions of

flux, we welcomed our new Chairman, Shri Ashokji Saraf, son of Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf. Ashokji's leadership brought in a phase of growth and development with a momentum never seen before by us, because although the college had seen many changes, it was the accelerated pace of change that characterized Ashokji's style of governance. He had huge plans for our college and a very hands-on way of dealing with everything. I was fortunate to be selected to play my little role here, because in 2009, I was given the In-charge Principal's responsibility until Dr. Sujata Karmarkar my colleague was appointed in August 2010. I then became Senior Vice Principal and my old colleague Dr. Jayant Apte was also appointed Vice-Principal. Our team of three, headed by Shri Ashokji Saraf did all

that we could to put the college machinery into gear for further expansion and growth. Student Strength increased, new divisions were added to existing courses, we introduced computerization of all our back-office work and even began Online admissions for First year students. Every department of the administration was streamlined and organized to deliver better results. Shri Ashokji Saraf encouraged us to apply for ISO certification and we did that. Academic programmes like workshops and a National conference on 'Inclusive Growth' were organized. However, the biggest change under our new Chairman was that we decided to expand our horizons and bring in male

students, considering the demands of our own Junior College boys. The social scene of 1983 was now a thing of the past and girls in higher education was no longer the rarity it had been. Co-education was an idea whose time had come and Saraf College officially became a co-educational institution in 2011.

Our next major challenge was to get re-accreditation by NAAC, which was becoming overdue. Having already got an 'A' Grade, our brief was of course to not only retain the grade but to better it somehow. Our team put all our efforts into the exercise—we organized an Alumni get-together and created a committee of ex-students who prepared a presentation for the visit of the NAAC Peer Team. We had a Parents' meet, and several meetings of teaching and non-teaching faculty, as also the I.T. department of Sammelan who provided great support. Our students, though were the real bed-rock of our project—they worked day and night with us with a spirit that only they could be capable of. Finally, it was time for the NAAC Peer Team's visit, which came in January, 2013. On the final day, in the exit meeting, the Convenor Dr. Sujit Basu began his speech by saying that he and his team members were "deeply impressed" by our college - he made special mention of two things - the dynamic leadership and involvement of the Management in the development of the college; and the quality of our teachers and teaching—a thing, he said, which was borne out by what our students said in their interactions with them. As the NAAC Convenor, I had the opportunity to speak on behalf of the college. I said that self-belief is the first requisite for any achievement, and as a college, our self-belief is strong that we are truly an A-grade institution, and we are committed to further excellence. Barely two months later, we received the news: that we were re-accredited with NAAC and moreover, our rating was 3.23, which was higher than most colleges in the Mumbai suburbs - this rating put us at number 8 in Mumbai's NAAC - accredited colleges. Our belief in ourselves

was vindicated, and our collective efforts had been rewarded.

We are now in 2016 and more water has flown under the bridge, so to say. We are in the process of obtaining the final letter of permission to begin Research Cells in Economics and in Commerce, headed by our own faculty who are Research guides. Dr. Apte, Dr. Srivastava and Dr. Joshi are all working as research guides, with several scholars. Our students are being groomed to apply and be selected for jobs in reputed firms, through our Placements committee. The response is increasing day by day, which itself tells us that we are making progress in our goal of not just giving education but also making our students more 'employable'. Every year we make further advances in making value additions in some form or other - be it appointing good faculty, or collaborating with agencies to bring new schemes and ideas for our students and so on. We just held a National Conference on the theme of 'New Governance' where 78 research papers were presented and published. Of course we have miles to go yet, and we are always aware of it, but we can honestly say that we have come a long way in the past three decades and we have quite a lot to show for it. The synergy of efforts put in by both management and staff, as well as the whole-hearted involvement of our students have brought us this far.

As I put it earlier, I have been a small cog in the huge wheel of this institution and I am humbled and grateful to have been allowed to contribute my little bit to this whole saga of progress - I cannot but admit that in the process, I have been personally enriched by all that I have learnt. It would not be an exaggeration to state that every day has brought experiences which have taught me something of value. Just as I have grown with this institution, many others have grown as well, and I am sure we all acknowledge this debt.

The journey is the destination. We cannot be certain how far we still have to go, but if we celebrate the journey itself at every step, that is all the reward we need. For Ghanashyamdas Saraf College, as for each one of us associated with it, it has been, and still is, one great journey. ♦

# “Changing Role of HR in a Disruptive Business World”

The BMA HR Convention in association with Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies (DSIMS) was organized at the DSIMS campus on the 4th and 5th of December 2015. This HR Convention was organized with a view to explore and understand the various forces that are going to disrupt the Business World. We are living in uncertain times and there is economic disruption, social disruption, political disruption and this disruption affects the working of business in one way or the other.

These forces are so powerful that they can change the landscape and future of business tomorrow. It is very difficult to predict, because the kind of technological changes which are emerging have raised number of questions on the working of leaders, as well as businesses.

Keeping the theme in mind, "Changing Role of HR in a Disruptive Business World", the Convention was organized from various angles and many Business Leaders were invited to address this burning issue. The

In the Inaugural Session on 4th December 2015, the welcome address was given by Dr. Dr. N. M. Kondap - Director General, Rajasthani Sammelan's DGMC & DSIMS, Chairman, Western Regional Committee, All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Former Vice Chancellor SVKM's, NMIMS University, Mumbai. He emphasized on what care should be taken to deal with these uncertainties and how do we overcome them. The other important point on which he stressed was "What are the learnings of the Last Decade where many disruptions have affected Industries". He emphasized on effectiveness of HR in terms of solving these issues. He ended by suggesting that we should come out with more solutions at the end of the day.

The Convention was inaugurated by Mr. R. Ramakrishnan - Vice Chairman, Jt. MD, Group CEO, Polycab. He started with describing few disruptions and manifestations in the business world. He touched upon global slowdown, declining Europe & China Market, a few business models, technology impact and consumers expectations.

Briefly he touched upon a new global reality in a VUCA World. He emphasized on the shift to India and China as emerging Powerful Economic Powers.

The second factor he talked about was Economic Impact of Technology on day to day life. He also talked about the new emerging Global Human Capital Trends for an organization and these are

1. Lead by example
2. Engage your workforce
3. Reinvent and reimagining your entire process and the strategic role which HR has to play in time to come.

He also touched upon the evolving role of HR and





the future function of HR like, to find out Business Solutions, Networking excellence, building upon a skilled Knowledge base workforce and be a part of continuous transformation.

Lastly he emphasized that it's the people who are going to make the real difference in tomorrow's world.

Post Mr. R. Ramakrishnan's address, Mr. N. S. Shenoy – President & Managing Director, PRS Permacel Pvt. Ltd. addressed on the subject, "The Future and how to Survive it".

He started with the famous sentence "The future belongs to those who believe in the beauty of their dreams". He also talked about the past trends of business growth. He also challenged certain basic assumptions of doing business in this ever changing world. He also suggested survival action and talked about long term thinking, building on international asset and talent wall.

The second panellist was Mr. Ashvin Parekh – Managing Partner, Ashvin Parekh Advisory Services LLP. He spoke on the challenges of tomorrow and concern on strategies. He talked about CEO agenda for future which includes Finance Management, Rethinking on Traditional Management and taking more millennials within organizations and their way of working.

Post lunch the Panel discussion consisted of Mr. Sudesh Shetty - CEO, Towers Watson Insurance Brokers India Pvt Ltd and Mr. Venkatesh R. - Executive Vice President & Head - Operations, Technology & HR, DCB Bank, Mumbai. They both spoke about changing the rules of the game, the challenges ahead from the customer's perspective. They delved on the various processes which organizations have adopted to serve customers better.

On the second day, the first panel discussion was between Mr. Suryanarayan Iyer – Vice-President (Group Human Resources) Aditya Birla Group and Ms. Sejal Modi – Senior Consultant, Accenture.

Mr. Suryanarayan Iyer spoke on the Recent Trends in Digital World. He talked about the diversion of change in workforce. In his introductory remarks he talked about



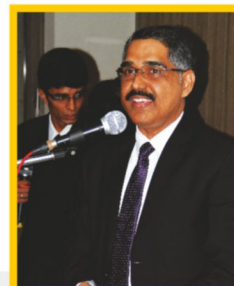

He spoke about the Role of CSR and how it is making a huge difference in Corporate World. He cited examples of Tatas, HCL, Wipro and other Companies, their role in terms of Community Development and Enhancement of Social Initiatives.

Over all the Conference was a great success. Apart from 100 Management Students from Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies and other institutes who participated in this Convention there were a few invitees also who participated in this Convention. The inputs provided by all the speakers were very informative and provided good solutions of dealing with various socio-economic disruptions in the current world. The convention also provided alternative ways of making HR more robust and empowered to face these disruptions. The convention concluded with the Vote of thanks delivered by Prof NM Kondap. ♦

The students have been working hard to prepare and equip themselves with skills and knowledge to confidently achieve their dream destinations.

Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre organised a seminar for the students of Mainadavi

Bajaj International School. The seminar conducted by **University of Victoria, Columbia** was initiated to guide the IB Diploma students for international studies. The representative introduced the University and various courses offered at the UVIC campus. Students were informed about the admission process and eligibility requirements. The representative also shared Co-op or the intern program that is being followed in various program and how it assist students to get corporate insight while pursuing their program in campus.

New students have registered for overseas counseling and coaching. Students appearing for their eligibility exams have scored well. Applications have been processed and students have received offer letters from the desired colleges.

Counselors observed students of Ramnivas Bajaj School and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School in the classroom setting and determined consistency of behaviour. They also noted down students experiencing specific difficulties.

Group sessions were conducted in KGES and RBHS. Students were made aware about importance of emotions and they were provided

Counselors of RMCC were present at the Career fair in CWC to address queries of students with regards to career counseling. Queries of students of Grade VIII to Grade XII were addressed.

Students facing difficulty in their articulation are not only clear in their speech but also more confident individuals.

**BATTOL** has been successfully conducted for the students of the centre. Parents have been very satisfied by the report and counseling sessions. The test based on Biometrics technology has high stability and is based on neuroscience, embryology, genetics and cognitive psychology. Some of the parents have gone ahead with self assessment and appreciated the counseling.

**Career Talk** workshop has been conducted for all the first year students of Durgadevi Saraf Junior College. The students have been taken through various courses and career options post S.S.C. 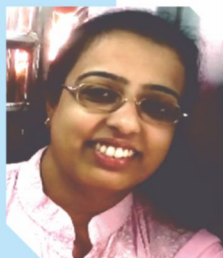

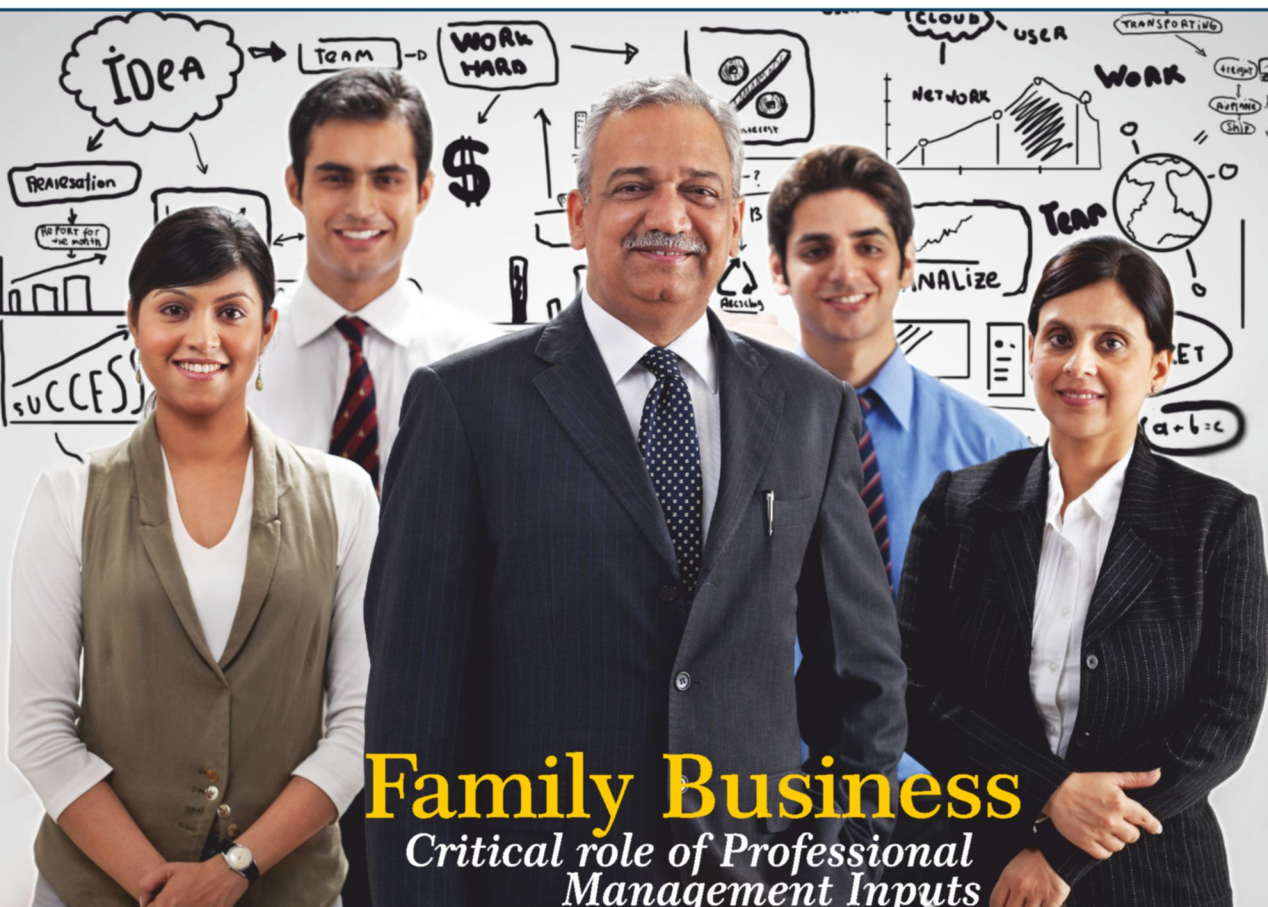
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## Family Business

### *Critical role of Professional Management Inputs*

Family Businesses occupy a very significant place in almost all economies of the world, including the U.S, Western Europe, all south-east Asian countries, China and Japan. In India about 90% of all registered firms are family-owned/managed—ranging from small businesses to huge corporations. Many Family Businesses have managed to survive for generations. Many also fell by the wayside as they could not quickly cope up with the changing business environment. The pace of change is now unprecedented. Survival and growth now depends on acquiring new knowledge and adopting new systems of managing old family businesses. Family Business is a unique identity because its ownership/management control is in the hands of members of a family who work and live together, especially in eastern countries. They influence all operating decisions & future courses of business. And the most Unique feature is – ownership of a family Business can be transferred to the next

generation. Going on from Generation to generation is the hall-mark of a family business. Since family members own, manage, control the business, live together as blood relations and also work together in businesses – Their interface has unique dynamics which become the source of strengths and also some weaknesses of family businesses – more so in societies with traditional cultures.

Some strengths and weaknesses:

#### • Strengths:

Great fund of experience & business net—working Can take a long-term approach. No pressure to somehow show good quarterly results. Communication faster and easier among family members. Hence quick response to changing market conditions.

#### • Weaknesses:

Past success may breed complacency and future-

orientation may remain weak. Unduly high dependence on past experience, less on knowledge, to face new challenges and grab future opportunities. Reluctance to change management style or mindset. Reluctance to discuss sensitive issues openly. Secretiveness (e.g.: less openness in reward system). Possible lack of internal capabilities, together with reluctance to bring in outsiders and share power with them.

#### • Difficult issues in managing Family Businesses

Dual role-play as family members and as business managers, could create emotional and functional issues. Generational gap in approach to various business and non-business issues. The rise of individualism and ego in recent times. Issues of transparency and accountability. Paternalistic approach to people may hamper their growth. Issues relating to succession planning in view of the new challenges Conflicts among family



members may take an ugly turn, if not handled in time and properly. Wealth sharing and management power issues.

- **Changing times-** The age of discontinuity Changing business environment in India – liberalization, Internationalization, Consumerism. Speedy growth in pharma, automobiles, construction, steel, cement and other industries. Also I.T, Education, communication & entertainment industries' and other service sector like finance, health care, hospitality, food, travel, fashion & beauty, publicity & event management, etc. Speed of change is ever accelerating, resulting in what Peter Drucker calls "The Age of Discontinuity" In this highly dynamic environment, dependence on past successes is no guarantee for future success of family businesses.

After liberalization & globalization, rise of first generation entrepreneurs who are not from "Business Communities" or Business families, is also making an impact on Indian Economy. Disconnect between generations or members of the same generation (brothers/cousins). The new world business, economic, technological, cultural & political scenario has given rise to issues which family business owners must now grapple with by:

- Developing a good understanding of the world economic, political & technological forces – constantly changing & impacting all businesses everywhere in a GLOBAL VILLAGE.
- Understanding the implications of changing social, cultural, educational forces which impact all interpersonal and family relations, more so in business families, where two or more generations

work as well as live together.

- Coming quickly out of the seller's market & trading mindset, which leads to complacency – result in SATISFACTORY UNDERPERFORMANCE (Dr. Sumantra Ghoshal's phrase).

- Developing human resources to meet new challenges – Family businesses depending solely on internal resources can grow only upto a certain stage. Great growth comes when they learn to acquire and retain talent from outside the family circle. They must learn not only to acquire but to retain talent by sharing power & decision making. In short, by "TURNING OUTSIDERS INTO INSIDERS" (Shri. Kumar Mangalam Birla's phrase)

- Developing internal resources by relevant business & technical education & by constant training & retraining for all. Encouraging qualified women in the family to participate in the family Business management is important too.

- Developing a keen appreciation of quality and technology.

- Learning to communicate effectively, making use of the new media tools & winning over customers, suppliers, business associates, juniors & seniors (in business and in family). Communication as a tool of success was never so vital as today.

- Learning to assess the strengths & weaknesses of one's family business by taking an objective look at each activity. An honest exercise like this becomes the first step towards change.

- Conceding more space to the younger family

members to contribute and thus seek a blend of experience & new ideas. Adopt new ideas, new systems, grab the emerging opportunities, take risks & ride the wave to growth.

- Tap new markets – nationally & internationally. Travel, learn foreign languages & learn to 'impress' as a great firm to do business with. These are some of the areas which call for attention of growth-seeking family businesses. They should take advantage of specialised courses in management of family businesses, conveniently positioned and specially designed for them. These courses help open up their minds and create a new vision for the future of their family businesses and help them understand the true meaning of "Professional Management". Research has shown that professionally-managed family businesses have performed better than many non-family managed (so-called professionally- managed) businesses.

DSIMS has launched a week-end diploma in family business Management (DFBM) to help family businesses get future-ready. We believe that with their great strengths, family businesses will quickly learn & adopt the new management skills, and benefit from the emerging business opportunities.

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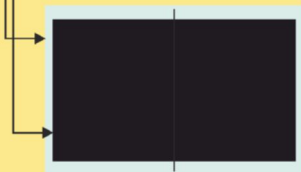
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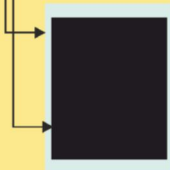
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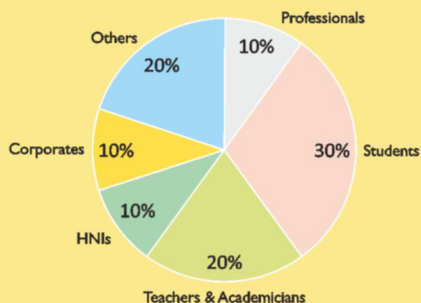


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
