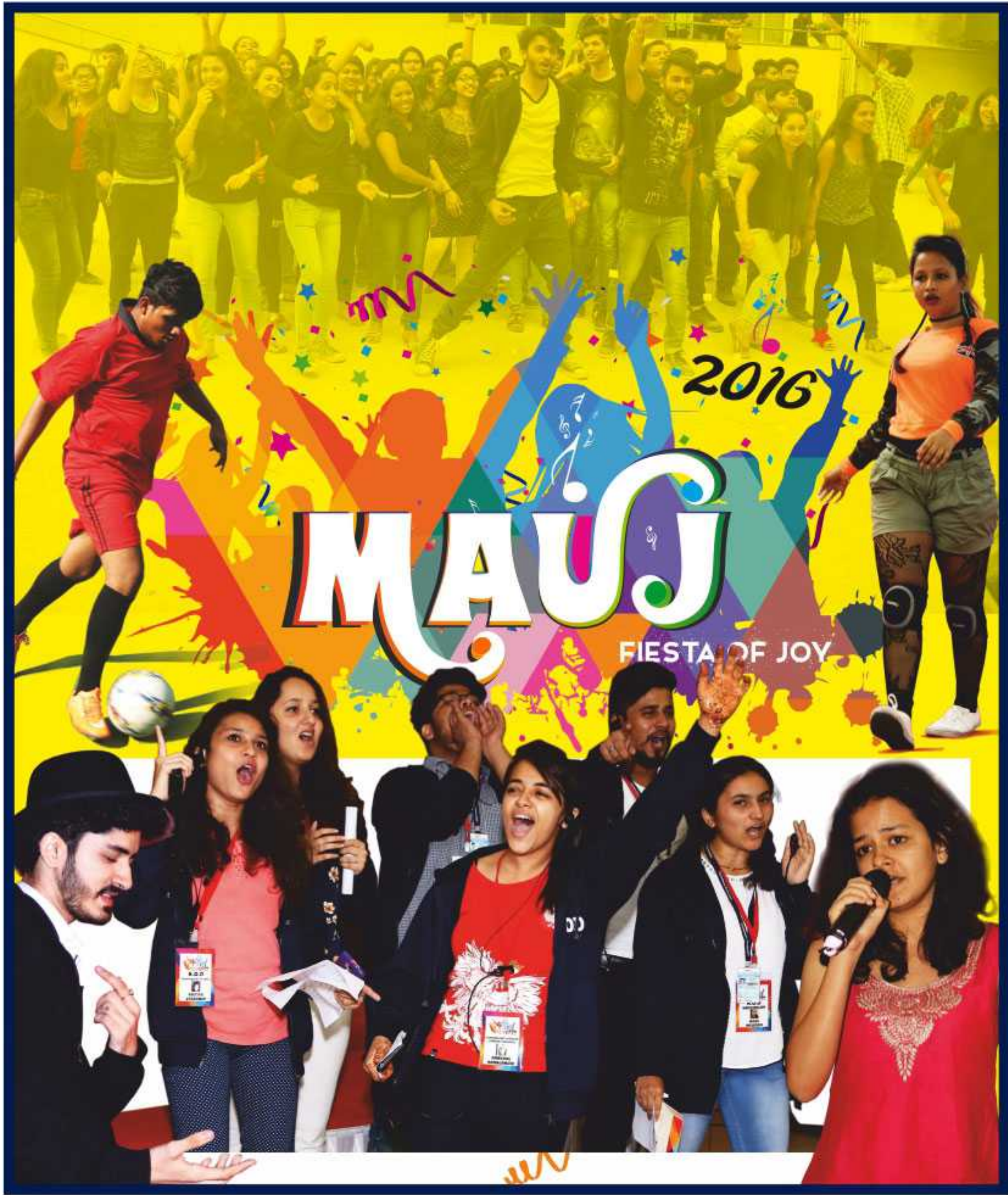

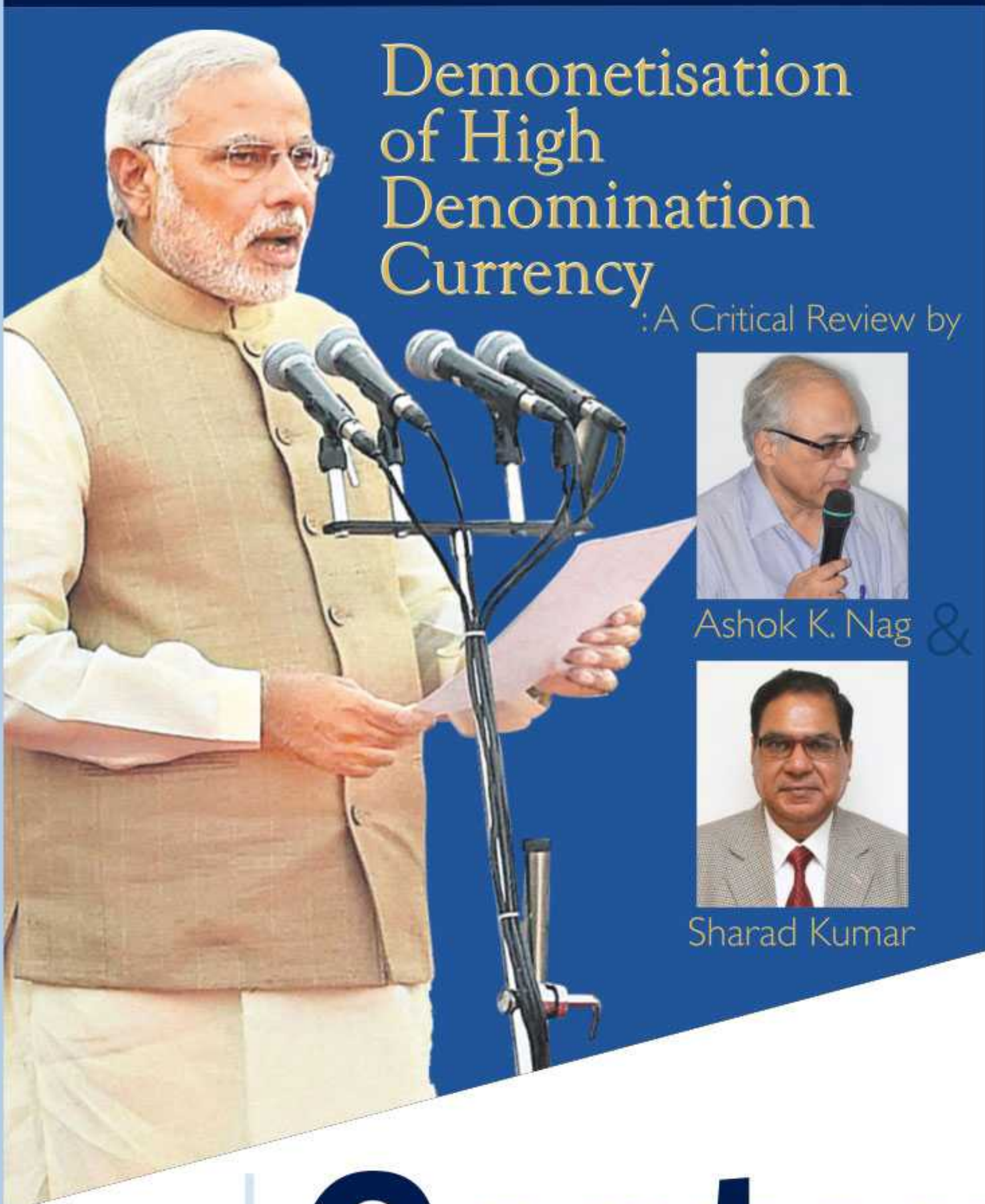


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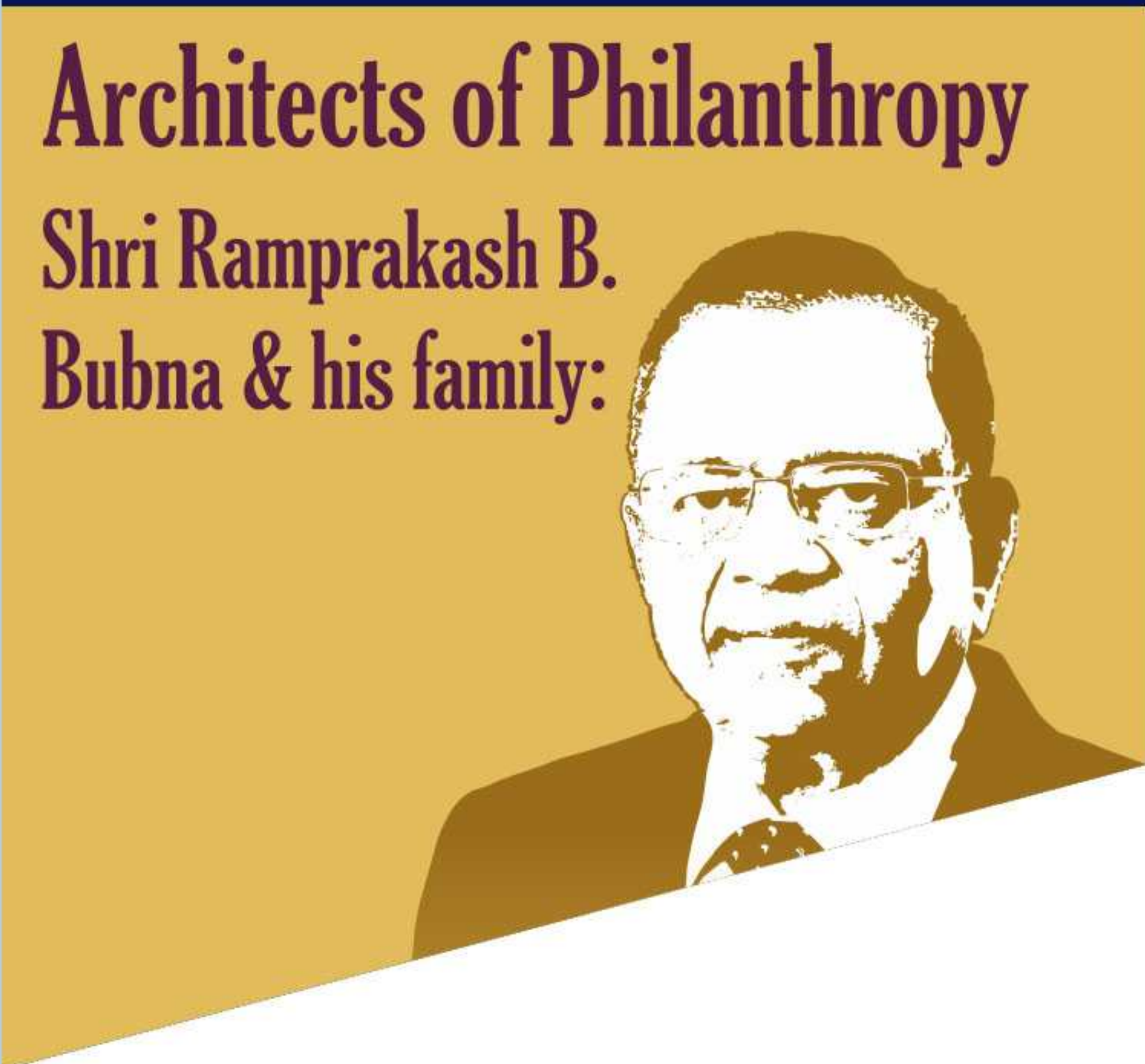

Hon. secretary's message

Dear Reader,

Warm Greetings of the New Year!

Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust has successfully completed 68 glorious years spreading the light of knowledge and information in all directions. The academic performance of the students of all institutions, the general atmosphere prevalent in our campus, the awards and accolades received by the students in extra-curricular activities and sports - all are the outcome of sincere efforts of Heads of Institutions, dedicated Staff and Students. From the side of Management, we have never lagged behind to provide latest technological support that include high-tech computer and science laboratories. We have also recruited well qualified teachers, purchased adequate books for libraries and also provided state of art infrastructure to support teaching learning as well as sports activities.

In recent times, there has been a trend of growth of private unaided schools affiliated to ICSE, CBSE as well as International Boards following CIE and IB curriculum. Many educationists attribute the shift to the quality of education offered by these schools and also the increasing number of affordability of parents. Besides, most of the national level entrance tests after XII standard are based on the syllabus of CBSE. To be par with the other boards, efforts are also taken by the Education Department of Maharashtra to revamp the syllabus and improve attendance of students in aided State Board Schools by innovative ways.

One of the important changes made by CBSE Board in the past few months is to re-introduce board examinations compulsorily after X standard from 2018 that was scrapped in 2010 replacing it with continuous evaluation. Since Board Examination after standard X is the practice in all state boards, the government's move to make board examinations compulsory by CBSE Board has been welcomed by academicians, parents and students so that educational standards can be maintained. This will also help students to face the tough plus two board examinations.

In the area of higher education, changes are taking place at a very fast pace. To maintain high standards, University of Mumbai has totally scrapped internal assessment marks for all degree examinations and now the examination paper is of 100 marks for both the semesters. To maintain uniform standard, Mumbai University has started setting common question paper for First Year Undergraduate Courses from this academic year which will be also in practice for Second Year examinations from the next year. With the aim of going digital, Mumbai University is all set to

introduce an online exam paper assessment project for all the faculties from April, 2017 which is already in practice for engineering faculty from 2014.

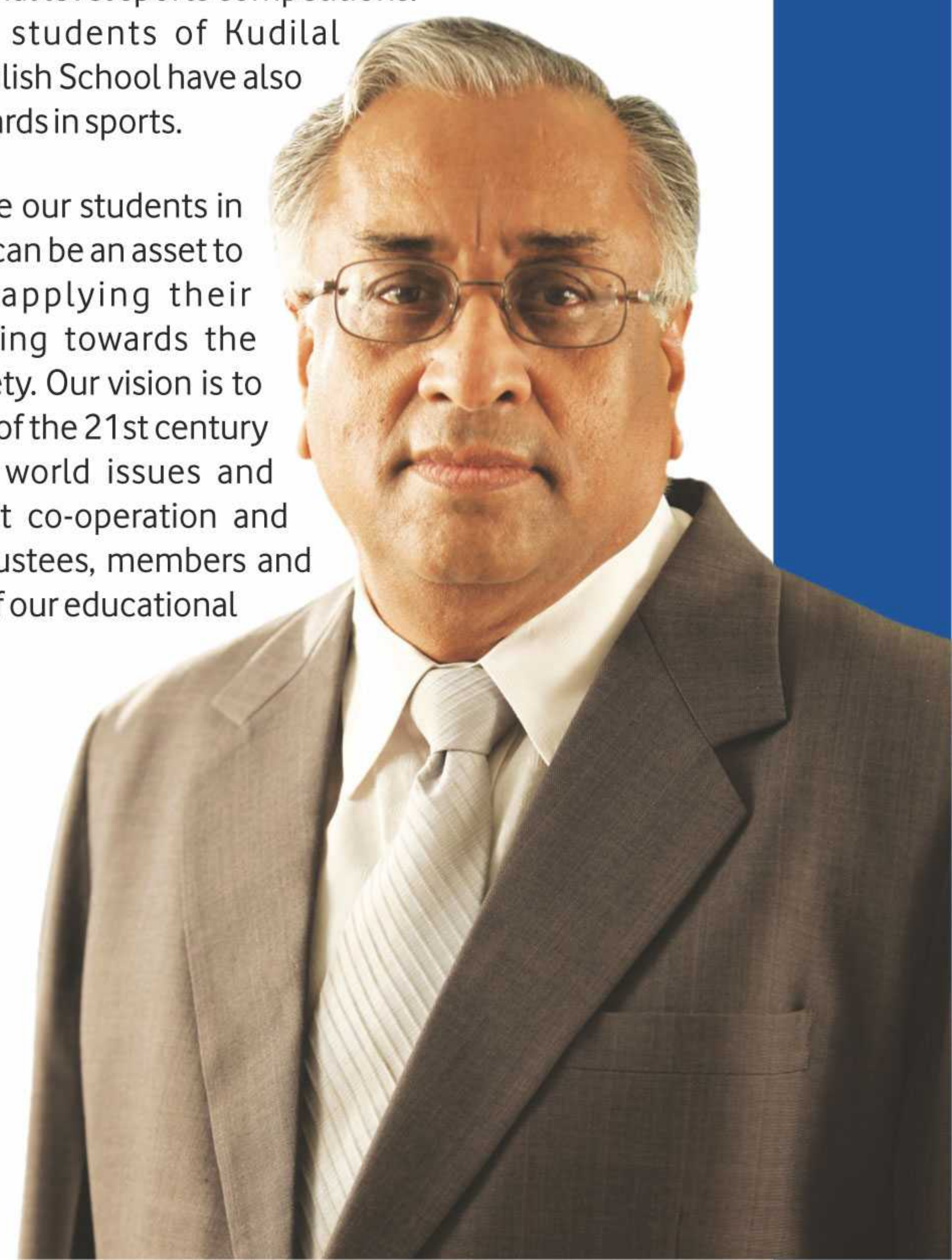
In RSET campus, we have also encouraged digitalization in all possible ways. Our Kunjibihari S. Goyal Online Academy (GOLD Academy) is trying its best to reach to thousands of B.Com students enrolled with Institute of Distance & Open Learning (IDOL), University of Mumbai. Message from Director of Schools

At the heart of our schools is a value-based education

At a workshop on choices of schools, curriculums and boards that I conducted earlier this year at the Durgadevi Saraf Hall for a large gathering of parents, grand parents and others associated with Mainadevi Bajaj International Play School, participants had many questions regarding the curricular and co-curricular dimensions of our schools as well as the boards and schools that would be most suitable for their children. It was heartening to note that there were at least two parents in the gathering who wanted to know what schools in general and those of the RSET were doing to promote good values among students.

As schools, boards and educators including teachers and heads of schools increasingly look to define success in terms of quantifiable outcomes such as passing rate, highest marks scored and filling of intake capacity, I decided to speak to the heads of schools at RSET regarding the manner in which they promote value based education.

It emerged that across the schools, while the focus on academics is maintained, each of the heads was involved in ensuring that education did not only mean mastering of subject content but making their students caring and holistic human beings. "Truth, honesty, self-discipline, commitment, love and empathy are the important aspects of a holistic education which we promote in our school," says Mini Nair, Principal of KGSES.

Laying down norms for student discipline and modes of behavior and ensuring that these are implemented so that it engenders a feeling of respect for the school community are important aspects of the value based education in all the four schools.

"Academic excellence, metacognitive skills, intercultural understanding, international mindedness and ability to socialise are the new age values that we attempt to foster among students," says Dr Sachin Sachdeva, Principal of MBIS. Students learn in a cosmopolitan environment as they come from different socio-economic backgrounds and begin to understand the true meaning of cultural diversity and that those with different opinions than their own can also be right. Students learn to reflect on their strengths and weaknesses and on their role as a community member.

"Moral intelligence is a virtue that can only be developed by giving a child the right environment. The feelings of empathy, kindness, responsibility, compassion and integrity – needs to be developed gradually as the child grows and it is during the formative years that this part of education makes the greatest impact," says Latha Venkat, Principal of KGSS.

In all our schools this development starts taking place at the pre-primary level itself. We celebrate festivals of several Indian and international cultures to enable children to know that there is a world outside their own space. They learn to respect elders. Boys and girls are made to play group games so that they cross gender barriers and learn to respect each other. Children learn to share and care. Addressing the departing students of Grade 10 during their

farewell party Urvi Pal, Headmistress of RBHS expressed her belief that in the years that the students had been with the school they had not only become strong academically but had also become good human beings who will be conscious of the community around them and will make a difference.

Showing sensitivity towards the environment and the less privileged people around us, students of our schools are part of many initiatives and work with NGOs like Green Sole, Goonj and Anant Vikas, animal shelter, an old age home, English languages session for the support staff of our schools, beach clean up, etc. NGOs like the Indian Development Foundation and Avanti Foundation help children in overall personality development, public speaking skills and leadership skills. Civic consciousness is built slowly and steadily starting from cleaning of classrooms, to awareness about saving energy and measures to reduce pollution like anti fireworks drive and making eco friendly Ganapatis.

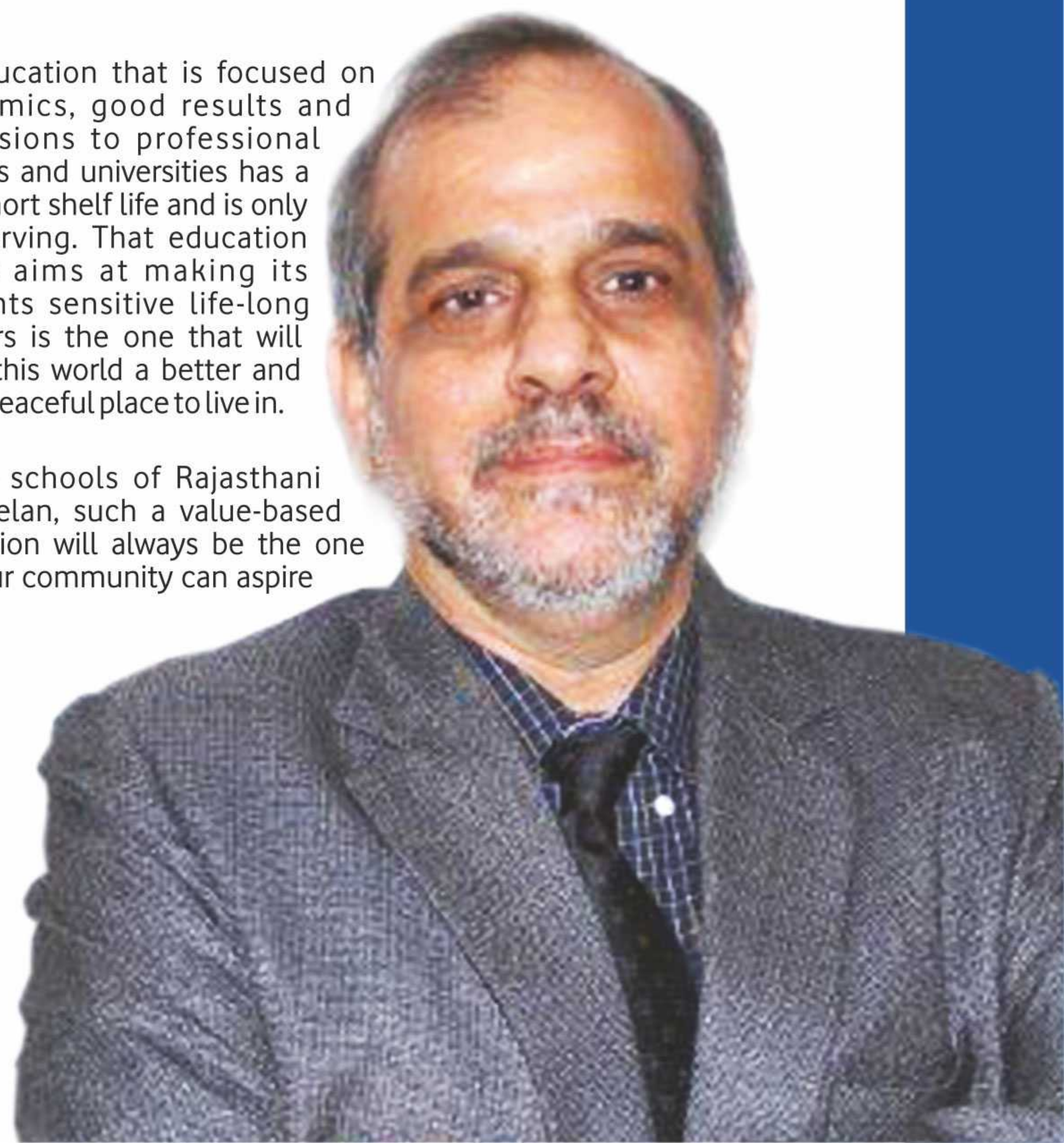
Firmly believing that values such as trust, leadership, collaboration, team work, sportsmanship and the importance of failure are not only learnt within the walls of a classroom, the four schools of RSET have a robust sporting programme. Students participate in inter and intra school sports as well as in innumerable other sporting activities. Love for sports is encouraged from the early years and special coaching is given to students who show inclination towards a particular sport, teaching them team spirit and keeping them fit and healthy.

Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School

The educational endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust started in early 50's. Understanding the significance of women's education, the Trust decided to start a girls school in Malad. Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar had started the school in the Hanuman Temple of Chincholi with two students on 6th November, 1954. Gradually the students strength started increasing and it turned to be a primary school. To give this school a greater dimensions, great philanthropists Late Shri Kudilalji Seksaria donated a spacious land of 4,000 sq. yards for the school. A small building was built on this land and the primary section of the school was inaugurated on February, 1956 by none other than great philanthropist Shri Kudilalji Seksaria who like his great father late Shri Govindramji Seksaria had always given handsome donations for the cause of education. During this time, late Shri Brijmohan Laxminarayan Ruia donated Rs. 50,000/- to start the construction. Encouraged by success of the starting of the project many philanthropists and others dedicated to the cause of education came forward and collected an amount of Rs. 1,24,000/- and the construction work of a proper school building was started. In this way the dream of the members of Rajasthani Sammelan to open a girls school was realized.



Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School

Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) was inaugurated on 21st June, 1959 by the then Union Education Minister Dr. Kalulal Shreemali. The valuable contributions made by founder members Late Shri Durgaduttji Thard, Late Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan, Late Shri Satyanarayanji Ganeriwal, Late Shri Hariramji Saraf, Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar and many others will be remembered forever. Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya started as primary school, gradually progressed to become a secondary school attached to S.S.C. State Board of Maharashtra to impart education in Hindi medium.

Thereafter in 1975, the trust received recognition from the State Government to start a Junior College which was attached to the school. Later the college was named as Durgadevi Saraf Junior College in memory of late mother of Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf, the main donor of the college. In the year 2006, the Management decided to attach Junior College to Ghanshyamdas Saraf College.

It was a dream of Trustees and Managing Committee members of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust to promote higher education for girls in the western suburbs of Mumbai. In June, 1983, after the continuous efforts of the Trust, the Government of Maharashtra gave its permission to the Trust to start a girls' degree college affiliated to University of Mumbai. Industrialist and Philanthropists Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf, the Managing Trustee of Ghanshyamdas Saraf Trust once again came forward and donated a generous amount in the memory of his father late Shri Ghanshyamdasji Saraf to set up the degree college.

Once the temporary affiliation was received from the University of Mumbai, the college was inaugurated on 2nd July, 1983 at the worthy hands of Hon'ble Shri Sudhakar Naik, the Education Minister of the Government of Maharashtra. The occasion was graced by Shri Ram Manohar Tripathi, M.L.C. and the Main Donor Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf along with other dignitaries. The college started as a girls' degree college in commerce & in due course

started many self-financed courses as well as post graduate courses and also opened its doors to boys in the year 2011 after receiving permission from University of Mumbai & State Government. Eminent legal luminary Hon'ble Justice D.R. Dhanuka became the first Chairman of the College Governing Council & provided valuable support & guidance for the development & progress of the college.

The college entered into a new phase in the year 1997. In this year a new college building was constructed with ground and five storied building. The new spacious college building was inaugurated by His Excellency Dr. P.C. Alexander, Governor of Maharashtra at a glittering function on 3rd July, 1997 and the college was shifted to the new building. Later another floor was constructed in the year 2006 to run self-financed courses of the college.

1985

Ramniwas Bajaj English High School

In the year 1985, the Management felt the need to start an English medium school as per the need of the neighbouring areas. The school was started with a generous donation from Shri Vinodkumar Bajaj and Shri Rajkamal Bajaj and was named after their father, Late Shri Ramniwasji Bajaj. With a gradual growth, co-education was adopted by the school in the year 2004-2005. The main focus of Ramniwas Bajaj English High School has been to provide best quality education to students. The school initially followed curriculum of SSC Board attached to Maharashtra State Education Board. However from academic year 2010-2011, the school took an important step to get affiliated to ICSE Board and received the affiliation in the year 2015.

Committee conceived the plan of massive expansion and modernization of the premises of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust along with expansion of educational facilities by starting new institutions. It was felt that the old school building facing S. V. Road needs reconstruction. It was therefore decided that by demolishing the two storied building, a new 12 storied building be constructed. 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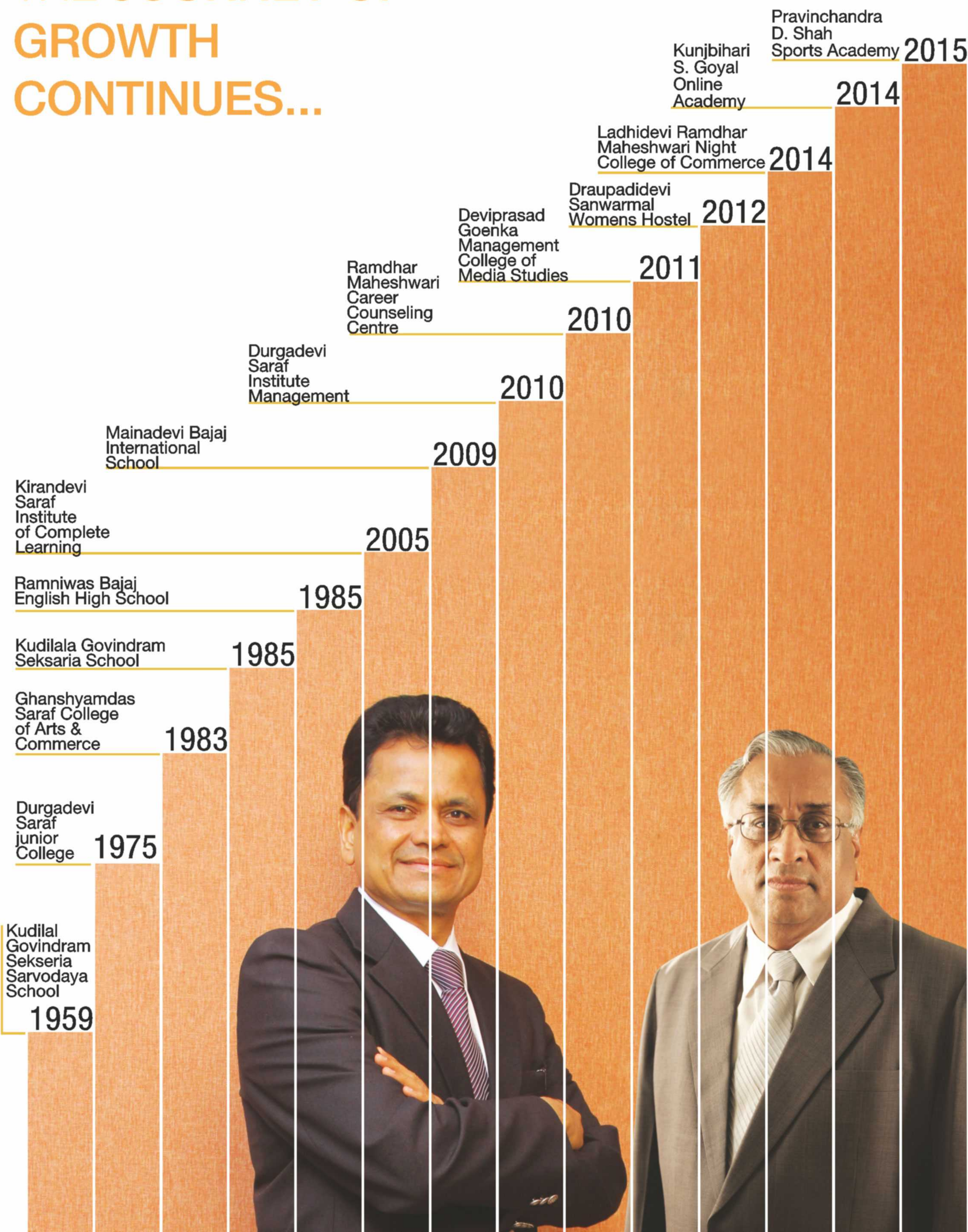

Q & A with Shri Ramprakashji Bubna

• **When & How did you get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust & Who inspired you to join the Trust?**

As I have said earlier, I was staying in Malad and I have noted that Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust started with a humble beginning of a Girls' school in Hindi medium and now they have 11 educational institutions, an Online Academy along with the facilities of a Women's Hostel, a Career Counseling Centre and many other facilities to facilitate teaching-learning in all the institutions. 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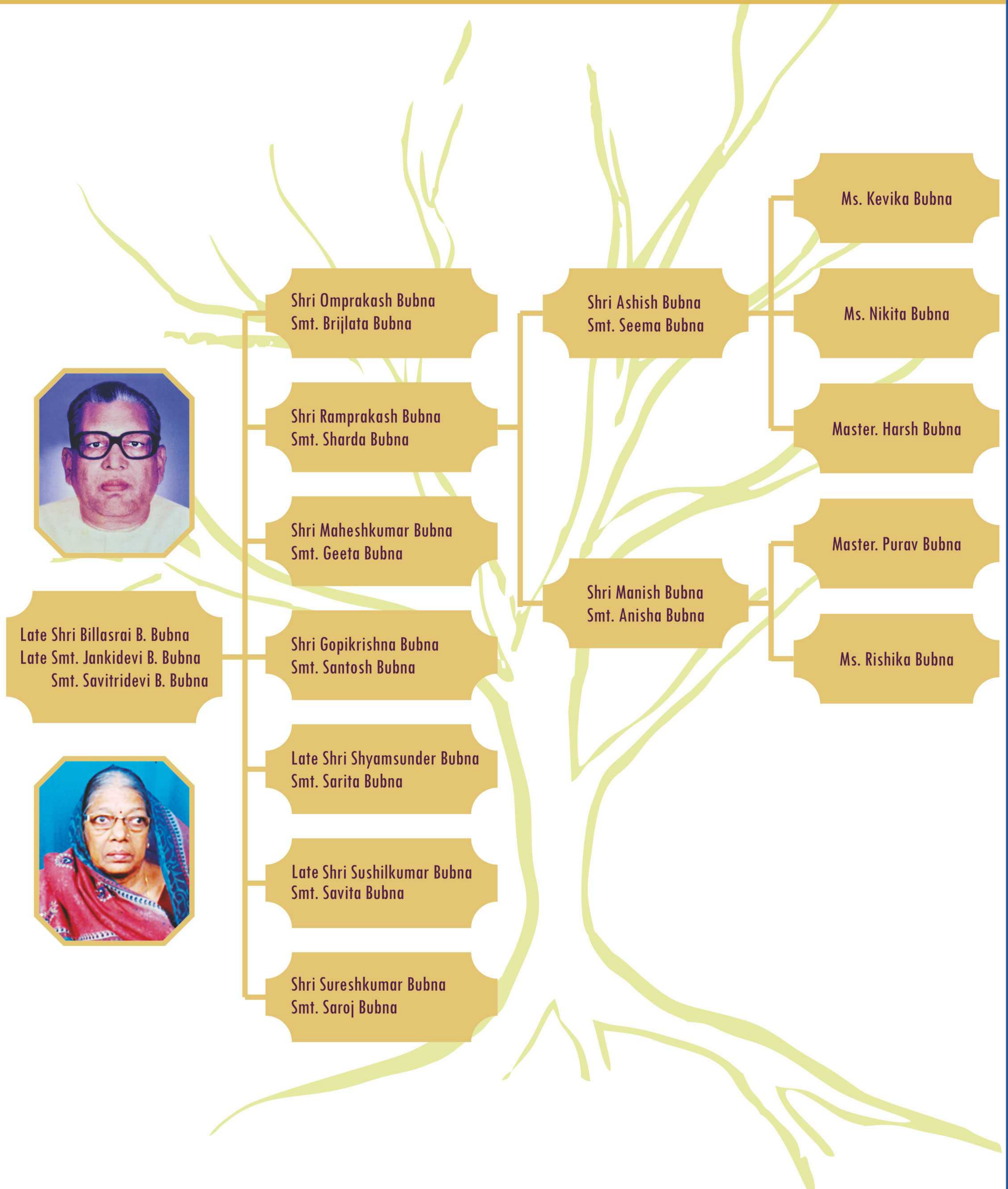

He emphasized how digitization has helped in better distribution of revenues among all stakeholders in the industry. He introduced 'Mediaconnect' a platform which helps in giving a break to budding talent, connects professionals in the industry and helps in collaboration and getting subsidies for the industry for shoots abroad. He emphasized the need for maintaining proper documentation and justifying the costs while seeking funds for a startup.

Mr. Ram Subramanian spoke on the power of social media in bringing like minded people together. His powerful films – Mute, Unmute, Pause and Soldier of Peace were an eye-opener and demonstrated the power of social media. They were also a lesson in how to stylize a film to convey a message effectively. Mr. Anand Mahesh spoke on 'Democratization of Media and the Power Distance in the Media World. His take on the power distance

between media, distance between producers and consumers, and how consumers have now become producers of media was an interesting lesson for media students.

The second session was a Panel Discussion, and we had a very knowledgeable and experienced panel of speakers comprising of Ms. Sangeeta Chako – Head, Corporate Communication Percept Pvt. Ltd, Mr. Arijit Ray, Co-founder, Paperboat Brand Works, Faridoon Shahryar, Head, Content, Broadband Bollywood Hungama, PMK Bala Director, MX Advertising, and Mr. Tejas Mehta, Senior Journalist and Former Bureau Chief, NDTV. Mr. Abhishek Tripathi, host for the evening introduced all the guests and opened up the discussion.

Ms. Sangita Chacko emphasized on the importance of the young population of India, and how this young population is the real strength of our country. She spoke on how other media forms are equally important along with digital media and how important stakeholder engagement was.

Mr. Arijit Ray elaborated on how digital immersion and explosion in media is taking a toll on our personal lives and relationships. He also spoke on how the young population is very savvy and how brands have to portray and persona to catch their attention.

Mr. Faridoon Shahryar was emphatic about the how media explosion has become a premise for

sensational headlines to attract viewership and in the process losing credibility. He was very critical of irresponsible and unethical content generated by the media.

Mr. Tejas Mehta spoke on the business of media and how the focus and revenues were being diverted more to online media. However, he made an important point by stating that even though online media, especially social media were attracting more advertisements, they may not necessarily attract more revenues. He also reiterated that the battle for TRP's and 24/7 format was taking a toll on journalistic and content quality.

Virtual Sets, especially in the film Jungle Book was the subject of Mr. Ranjit Thakur's discussion. He discussed how virtual sets could transform the future of film making. Mr. P.M.K Bala spoke about how media is segmented, and how consumers have more exposure, and how audience behavior is posing a problem for producers. He elaborated on an interesting concept of psychographic side and demographic side of audiences, and how this affects the media business.

The second topic for discussion was whether media should be regulated which led to a very lively discussion with several views. While some panel members supported regulation, others said that more regulation was not necessary as there are provisions already

present in law. An important conclusion was that media has to be regulated by the audiences rather than the producers.

In the last part of the discussion, Ms. Sangita Chacko emphasized on the need to connect with the consumers starting from emotional engagement, leading to intellectual engagement. Most panelists agreed that 'the next big thing' in media and communication sector would be Virtual Reality. VR is changing the very concept of the way we narrate stories, and could become the next 'game-changer' in consumer engagement.

The Dean, Dr. Mangesh Karandikar summarized the proceedings followed by a vote of thanks by the Director, Dr. Kumardatt Ganjre.

The 'Revolving Doors' 1st National media Conclave was a huge success with the audience thoroughly enjoying the proceedings. More importantly, students and faculty were able to connect and interact with media professionals and gain valuable insights on the latest developments in the industry.

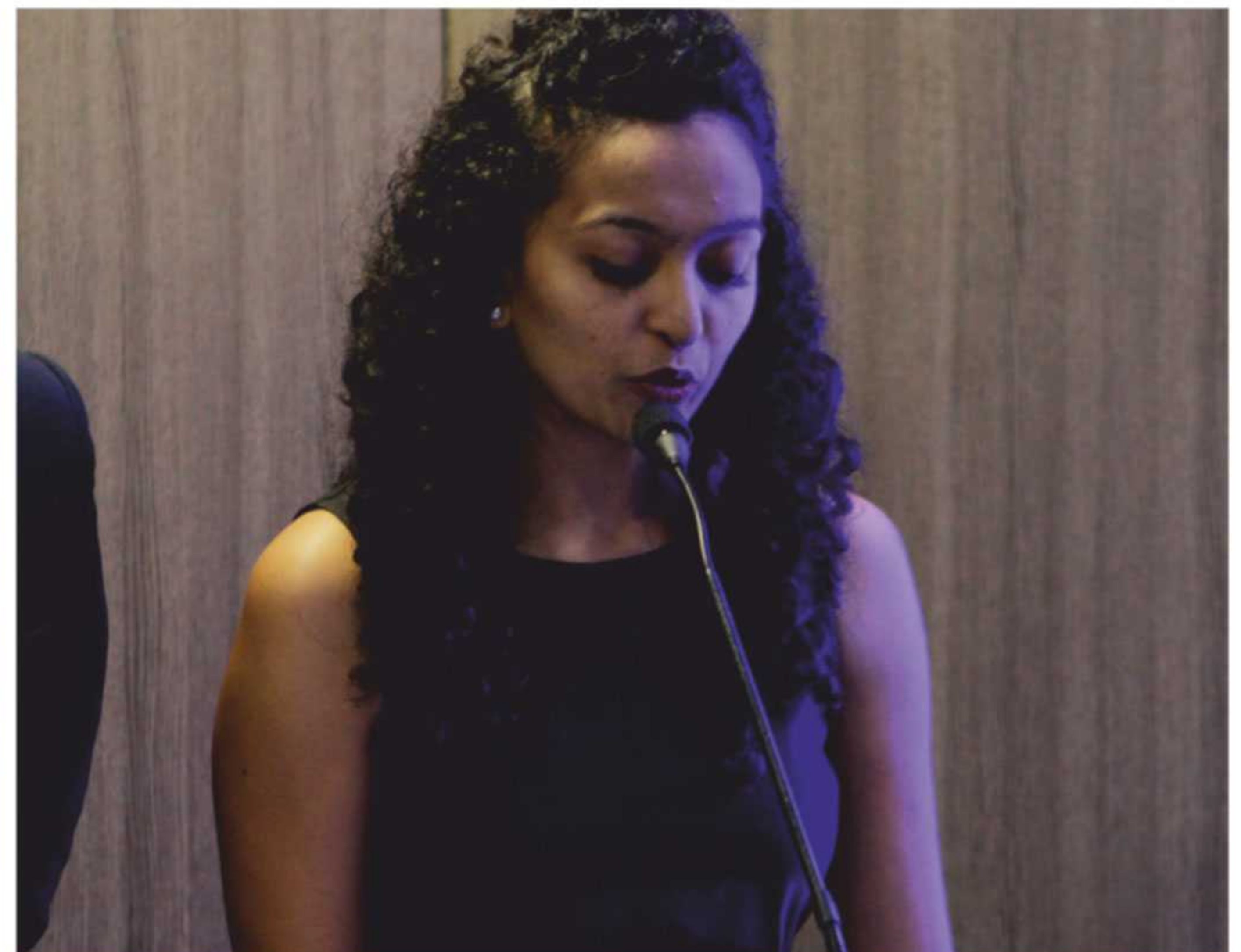

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International Collaboration Between DSIMS and Ottawa University



January 18, 2017 was one of the historic moments in the journey of DSIMS. The MOU was signed by Hon'ble President of RSET and (Chairman of DSIMS), Mr Ashok Saraf and Dr Marylou Dewald, Associate Dean and Director International Programs of Snyder School of Business of Ottawa University, Kansas, USA.

Ottawa University is an ACBSP (Accreditation Council for Business Schools & Programs) accredited Not for Profit University. It provides both on campus and online courses which focus on student centric learning. The university is truly International since students from more than 50 countries join the university to experience learning as a medium for their professional growth. The University was founded in 1865 and since then it is carrying the rich legacy of providing high quality professional education with innovative pedagogies to diverse student populations. Ottawa, currently serving more than 6000 students, prepare the young populations for lives of enlightened faith, exemplary service, inspired leadership and personal significance. On the other hand DSIMS is dedicated to create future business leaders who will ultimately be the ambassador of Brand India. Therefore in pursuit of common interests and joint endeavors between these two

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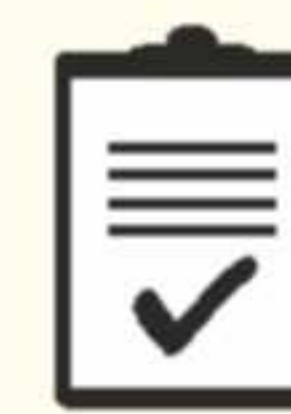

see the largest handmade balloon in the world.

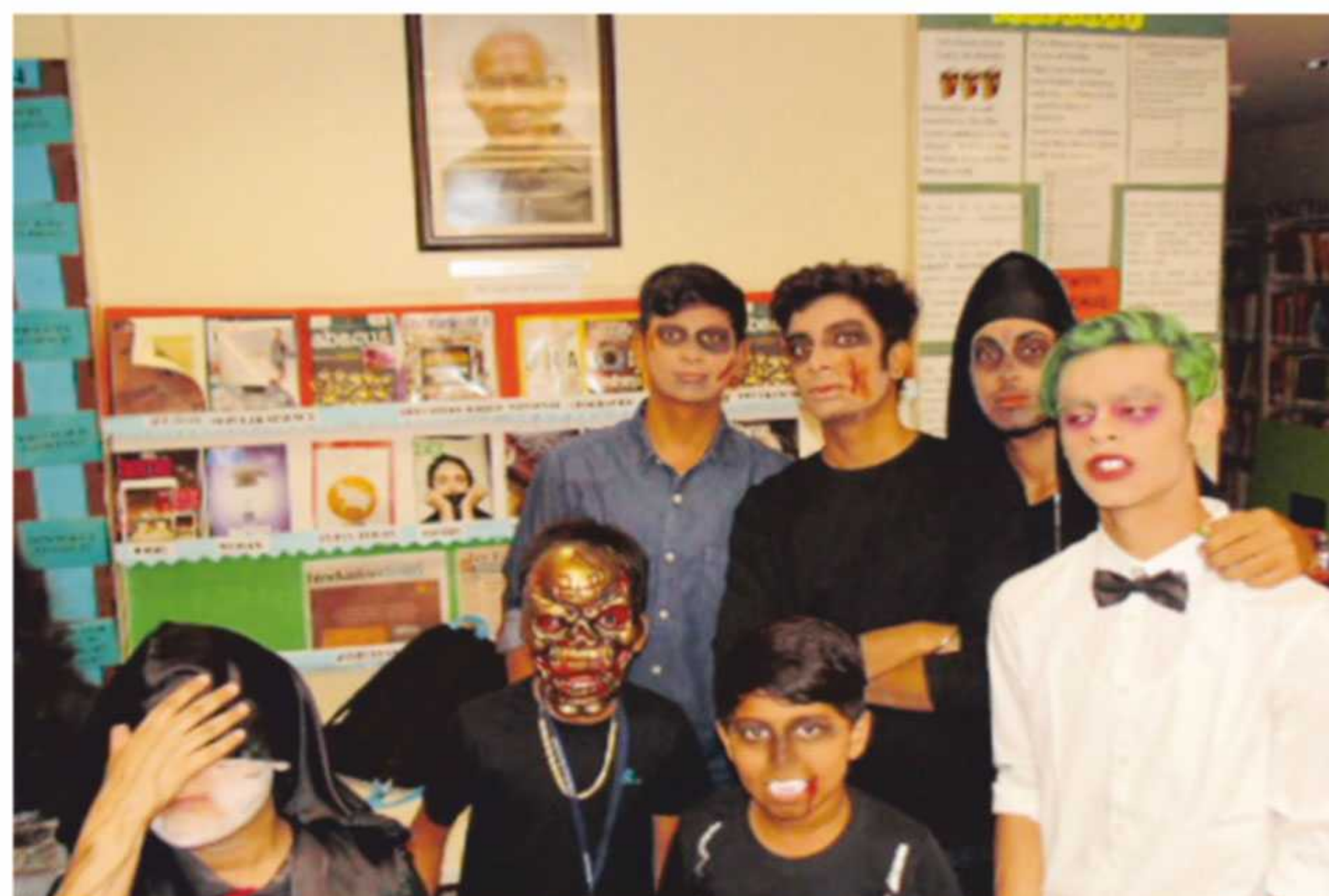

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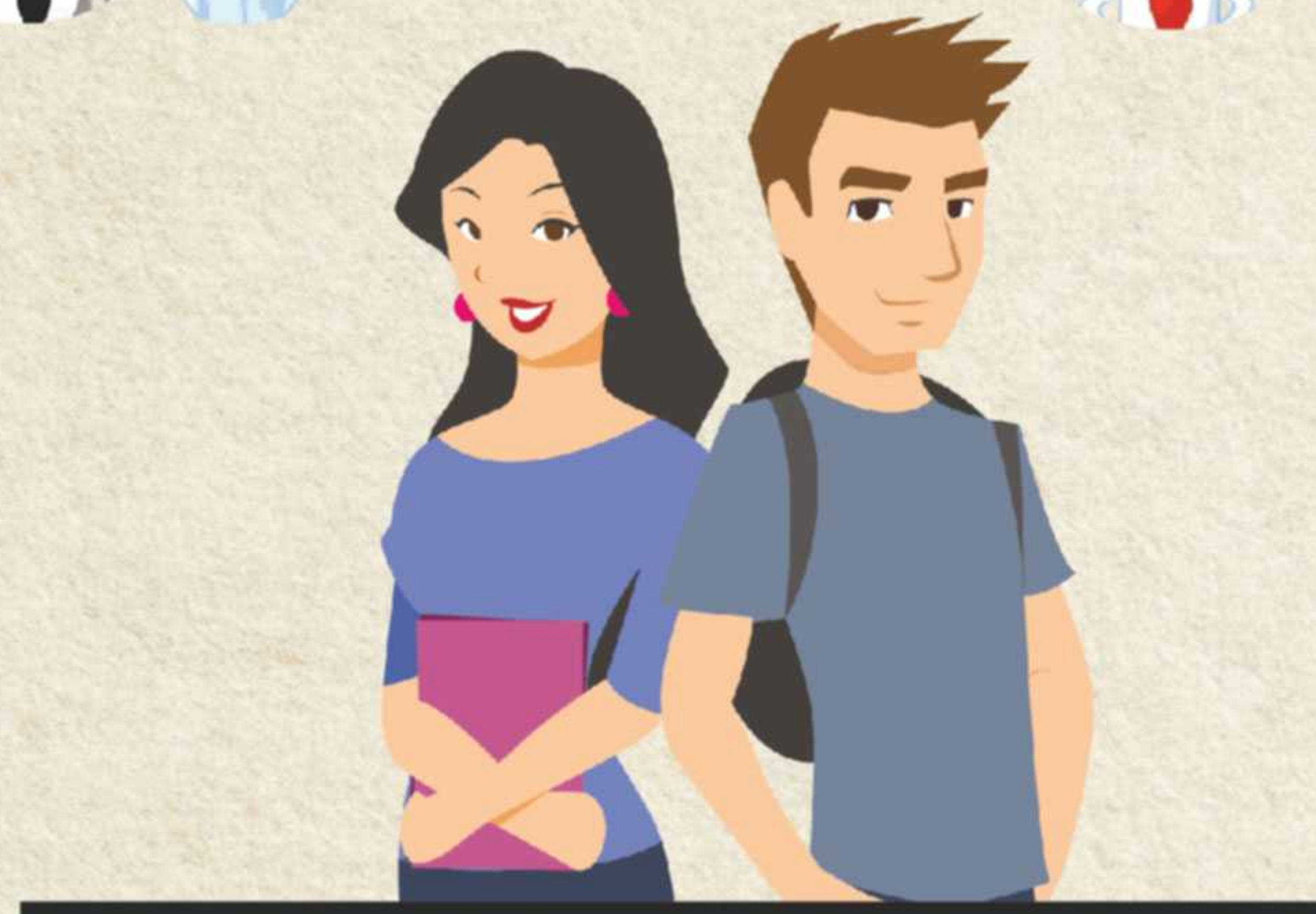

Demonetisation of High Denomination Currency

: A Critical Review by

Introduction

After the terrorist attack on the ARMY Brigade at Uri on 17th September 2016, the Indian army executed a surgical strike on 27th September across the Line of Control and destroyed many launch pads of such terrorist acts. In the wake of rising tensions between two neighbouring countries, on 8th November, 2016, the Prime Minister Mr Narendra Modi met three army chiefs and the national security adviser. Speculations were rife on social media that India was embarking upon another punishing move against our recalcitrant neighbour.

But the bolt from the blue came from a completely different angle. The Prime Minister came on national TV in an unscheduled live televised address at 20:00 to announce what has been called a "surgical strike" against black economy by announcing the demonetisation of high value currency notes of ₹500 and ₹1000 denominations resulting into ceasing of the usage of all ₹500 and ₹1,000 bank notes. India has one of the highest levels of currencies in circulation at over 12% of GDP and of this about 86% constituted in the form of ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes. The value of demonetised currency in the form of ₹500 and ₹1000 notes was ₹14.7 lakh crores.

The stated objective of this demonetisation of high value notes of denominations 500 and 1000 as per the Gazette notification (Ministry of Finance, 2016) are:

1. To curb the menace of fake currencies
 2. To wipe out unaccounted and tax evaded money stored in such high value notes
 3. To prevent use of high denomination notes for terror financing
- The government claimed that the demonetisation was an effort to stop counterfeiting of the current high value notes allegedly used for funding terrorism, as well as a crackdown on black money in the country. The move was also described as an effort to reduce corruption, drug trafficking and smuggling as all these activities

were largely cash based. But the broader objective was to bring to the main stream banking channel the unaccounted cash which is mainly used to support parallel economy or stacked in the houses which can be used to boost the economic activities.

Demonetization refers to discontinuing of current currency notes of certain denominations as legal tender and replacing them with new currency notes. It is a major decision and it impacts all the citizens of the country because all the money you have becomes a piece of paper overnight which has no value if you do not exchange it with new currency units or deposit it in the banks. Under Section 22 of Reserve Bank of India Act 1934, the Reserve Bank of India is the sole authority of issue of currency notes in India. RBI is therefore responsible to put currency into circulation, exchange it or withdraw it.

The Earlier Demonetisations

Demonetisation has two connotations. Many a times a country changes its unit of currency. This may or may not involve exchange of old notes with new notes. For example, introduced its new currency unit called Cruzeiro Novore placing its old Cruzeiros. To enable people having old notes use them as a legal tender, a stamp was applied to the notes in circulations to adapt them to the change in standard. Other form of demonetization involves change of legal tender status of an existing currency note. Examples of some demonetisations in history follow.

United States of America - The highest value of denomination currently in use is the \$100 bill, but in decades past, the Federal Reserve has issued \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000 and even \$100,000 bills. The use of the \$1,000 bill can be traced back to the beginning of USA when the Continental congress started issuing paper money. The U.S. stopped printing notes above hundred dollar bill in 1946 and they were finally withdrawn from circulation in 1969. Thus there was gradual elimination of high value dollar bills.

European Union - Introduction of Euro replacing domestic currency of member countries of European Union is one of the biggest exercise in demonetisation. 12 members of the European Union agreed on January 1, 2001 to phase out their individual national currencies and to allow use of Euro as the legal tender in their jurisdictions. In order to switch to the euro, authorities first fixed exchange rates for the varied national currencies into euros. When the euro was introduced, the old national currencies were demonetized. However, the old currencies remained convertible into euros for a while so that a smooth transition through demonetization would be assured.

India - The November 2016 was not the first demonetisation effort in India. The first demonetisation happened in India in January 1946, when ₹1,000, ₹5,000, and ₹10,000 notes were taken out of circulation. The higher denomination bank notes in ₹1,000, ₹5,000 & ₹10,000 were reintroduced in the year 1954 and these

bank notes (₹ 1,000, ₹ 5,000 and ₹ 10,000) were again demonetized in January 1978. Thus the current demonetisation is 3rd in row. In 1978, the GOI had legislated a specific act called High denomination Bank Notes (demonetisation) ACT, 1978. This act laid down procedures for exchange of demonetized notes with notes of other denominations and allowed refusal of exchange if the authority receiving the application for exchange is not satisfied with the declarations made by a person tendering a high denomination note for exchange. The earlier demonetisations had gone unnoticed as it affected a miniscule population. The real value of per high value note was very high in real terms. A thousand rupee note of 1978 vintage would not be less than 15 thousand in 2016 taking into consideration the consumer price indices of two periods. Moreover, the volume of such notes was very low due to which common people remained unaffected and the entire process remained just a news item for them.

The underlying common theme for the two episodes of demonetisations in Independent India is the respective government's effort to curb the menace of black money. In both the times, a new government has come to power riding a wave of popular anger against their predecessors who were perceived to be soft on corruption. In India, there is a common perception that black money is hard cash that corrupt officials, politicians and business people hoard till they are either used for purchase of luxury goods or conversion into other form of assets such as gold and real state.

The Process Adopted

For current demonetisation no such specific act has been legislated and there is no provision in the notification for refusal of exchange as long as the person tendering demonetised notes can provide proof of identity. However, a severe restriction has been placed on value of notes that can be exchanged over the counter. There is no such restriction if the de-notified notes are deposited in a depositor's bank account. Obviously, such deposits would be open to scrutiny by income tax authorities and enforcement directorate to identify sources of such funds. In order to maintain the secrecy before announcement of the decision no significant preparation was made to carry out this huge exercise of replacing the old currency with new. The new notes of ₹2,000 and ₹500 denominations were printed in very short span which were inadequate to replace the old currency in any significant proportion. The scale of operation was so huge that it affected each and every person, the preparation to handle the situation was totally inadequate. It created lot of commotions and anger among the people and confusion at the part of RBI, Government of India and banks. It resulted into change of policies on the day to day basis in respect of currency exchange, money withdrawal and deposit of old currency, etc. The anticipated period of 50 days as announced by the Prime Minister to bring the normalcy at the time of announcement of demonetisation was unrealistic which has exceeded significantly particularly in the context of removing the cash withdrawal limits. The Chairperson of State Bank of India Mrs. Arundati Bhattacharya admitted that it would take another couple of months to bring complete normalcy. Due to change of size of new ₹500 note and introduction of new ₹2,000 note, the ATMs were required to be recalibrated which involved huge task. Most of the ATMs were dysfunctional during majority of 50 day's period which has added to the people's agony. People seeking to exchange their notes had to stand in lengthy queues, and several deaths were linked to the inconveniences caused due to the rush to exchange cash. The limited surveys conducted by the media revealed that inspite of hardships faced by the public, most of them were happy about the Government's intention to demonetise the high value currency to deal with the menace of black money, though they were very unhappy the way the preparations were made and the limit for the withdrawals was fixed. Initially, the move received support from several bankers as well as from some international commentators. As the cash shortages grew in the weeks following the move, the demonetization was criticised by



prominent economists such as Kaushik Basu, Paul Krugman, Amartya Sen and Steve Forbes. It was heavily criticised by members of the opposition parties, leading to debates in both houses of parliament and triggering organised protests against the government in several places across India. Opposition parties have made lot of hue and cry the way the scheme was being implemented and the common man was put to such great inconvenience. They have even disrupted the functioning of Parliament for many days. They cited that the unorganized sector, rural population and farmers were most hit by the demonetisation as these activities are cash intensive. It had a detrimental effect on a number of small businesses, agriculture, and transportation. Many of the small manufacturing units which pay the workers daily wages suffered the most. A large number of marriages were adversely impacted because of cash crunch. The enhanced limit for cash withdrawal for marriages was considered inadequate, the formalities to withdraw the money were complicated and sometimes the adequate cash was not available in the concerned branches. This impact was felt more severe as the demonetisation period coincided with the peak marriage season. Some government representatives have justified that the timing this after the end of the tax amnesty scheme was logical. Due to confusion created at various stages and frequent changes in the policy and processes, the reputation of RBI has been impacted. Some past RBI Governors have criticised the way the situation has been handled and blamed that the autonomy of the Central Bank has been compromised to a great extent.

Analysis of Impact of Demonetisation

After reviewing the concepts, history and purpose of demonetisation and also how the demonetisation has been implemented, let us now analyse the impact of demonetisation in short and long run. In the following paragraphs we have done some sort of SWOT analysis of impact of demonetisation in the context of present demonetisation. We have therefore brought out the Strength (Advantages), Weaknesses (Disadvantages/ Pitfalls), Opportunities (Impact on various economic and social factors) and Threats (Challenges).

Advantages of Monetisation

I. The biggest achievement of this exercise is that more than 95% of the scrapped bank notes (as estimated by many experts) have come to the banking system, though the final figures of return of such notes are still being compiled by banks and RBI. Some banks have admitted that there is a possibility of double counting as the valid notes were also been deposited during that period though in a very insignificant number. With the result, banks are flush with cash. It can boost corporate lending which has been sluggish in recent times. It will also soften the interest rates for lending, which will help in boosting the economic activities in due course.

II. Since black money is also used for illegal activities like funding terrorism, gambling, money laundering and also inflating the price of major assets classes like real estate, gold, etc., and due to demonetization, all such activities will get reduced. It will take years for people to generate that amount of black money again and hence in a way it helps in putting an end to this circle of people doing illegal activities to earn black money and using that black money to indulge in illegal activities to the pre-demonetised level.

III. The other intended advantage of demonetization is that it will help the government/ enforcement agencies to track people who are having large sums of unaccounted cash or cash on which no income tax has been paid. A very large part of such money which was kept as cash in houses or in some secret places which was very difficult to find has either come to the banks, or became scrap or has come back by paying tax and penalty. Abnormally high deposits in cash with banks can be traced by running software supported analytical tools. Some of the major deposits have already been traced and the culprits have been identified and booked. Tracing and tracking such accounts are going on and tax



authorities working overtime to identify the culprits.

iv. The businessmen who have been hiding their income are ready to pay advance tax as current year's income. The GOI has given another chance to declare such undeclared money with high tax and penalty. It will substantially increase the tax receipts of the GOI. The money so collected will be used for the welfare of poor.

V. There is an incredible surge in tax collections for the past months after the demonetisation. Property tax, water tax and other corporation levies in all states have risen considerably. The income tax collections have also risen rapidly. This money can be utilised by the government towards the betterment of society by providing good infrastructure, hospitals, educational institutions, roads and many facilities for poor and needy sections of society.

VI. Fake currency which was in circulation has come to a halt in a single shot. Corrupt officers who had earned huge money through bribery and the money launderers are under threat as Income tax department is taking all the measures to track such people.

Disadvantages (Pitfalls)

I. India is basically a cash economy where the currency in circulation is almost 12% of GDP, which is extremely high compared to developed economies. The sudden cash crunch has put many economic activities to a standstill situation particularly the unorganized sector where the wages are paid on daily or weekly basis.

II. With these slowdowns in economic activities, the GDP for the 2016-17 is likely to get a big hit. Reserve Bank of India in its recent policy statement cut down growth forecast to 7.1 percent from 7.6 percent projected earlier for the current fiscal year based on July-September 2016 data i.e. prior to the commencement of demonetisation period. It may be further down if the impact of demonetisation is taken into consideration. Many experts and international agencies have predicted negative impact in the GDP growth upto 1%. The International Monetary Fund on 16th January 2016 has cut India's growth rate for the current fiscal year to 6.6 per cent from its previous estimate of 7.6 per cent due to the "temporary negative consumption shock" of demonetisation, days after the World Bank decelerated India's growth estimates.

III. Many experts have also opined that the impact would be very severe on agriculture, small business and unorganized manufacturing sector. The evidence suggests that it has resulted in a significant job loss in these sectors. Economist Pronob Sen has also warned that a virtual shutdown of India's informal sector could spell doom for employment.

IV. According to some expert committees, informal credit markets account for as much as 20% of total credit outstanding in many Indian markets they studied. They observed that credit worthiness

in such informal markets are assessed based on the "cash flow" of the borrowers and not their assets. This is quite logical as in India the prospect of any recovery by way attachment of properties is almost impossible. In such a relationship driven credit market, cascading effect of default by any one borrower would be severe, as social, political and economic inter relationship between borrowers and lenders are much more extensive and deeper for this market.

Opportunities (Impact on various economic and social factors)

i. The impact of one time cleaning of existing high denomination money is likely to be advantageous for various economic and social factors in long run. The currency which has not come back to the Reserve Bank of India, even if it is small in percentage of total, would ultimately reduce RBI's liability and hence will increase its profit.

ii. Government of India being the sole owner of the Reserve Bank of India, the profit earned by RBI can ultimately be transferred to Government of India in the form of dividend or additional reserves will be created with RBI. These windfall money can be used for various social sector schemes and creating infrastructure which require lot of investment from the Government.

iii. Similarly, the surge in tax collection including the penalties received by the Government of India on account of declaration of unaccounted money and extensive raids carried out will make the fiscal situation of Government comfortable which will boost its development plans.

iv. The entire demonetisation operation which resulted into currency crunch has created larger opportunities for use of plastic money, e-money and on-line transactions.

v. Since almost entire cash in high value currency has come to the banking system in one go, it will help the enforcement agencies to track the uses of these money when withdrawn in large sums. The use of technology will be quite handy for such surveillance.

Challenges

i. After the announcement of demonetisation on 8th November 2016, most of the banking activities were disrupted. The customer service has gone for a toss. Things have now improved significantly and the customers are able to enter into the branches without queues for their various banking services but the situation is far from the normal. It has to be brought to normal at the earliest.

ii. The supply of new currency to replace old currency which has been deposited in the banks is still not adequate, with the result that the weekly withdrawal limits are still not removed. The note printing presses are working beyond their capacities but the task is huge. It is a matter of concern that how quickly the intended currency is made available to the banks so that the restrictions in the withdrawals can be removed quickly. The Government of India and the RBI have given clear indications that the entire demonetised currency may not be replaced. They want to encourage non cash transactions particularly by using technology.

iii. As a onetime measure, vacuum cleaning of the system has been done by withdrawing demonetised currency through banking system. It is suspected that a significant proportion of black money has also come to the banking system. It has been observed that creation of black money has already started and in various raids carried out by the Income Tax, newly issued notes of ₹.2000 have been found in big numbers. The connivance of some bank officials has also been suspected in quickly regenerating this black money in large volume. The biggest challenge for the government is to block re-generation of black money. The task seems to be difficult which would require both will and extra efforts on the part of Government and tax authorities.

iv. The Government is propagating and encouraging the use of

plastic money, e-money, on-line transactions, etc. using technology to minimize the use of cash. It cannot be done overnight in a much diversified country like India. Many of the trades and businesses are traditionally cash based particularly where daily wage labours are employed. It would, therefore, be a big challenge to drastically reduce cash based transactions. It can be done gradually by equipping the people on the use of technology and changing their mind set. It needs to be understood that unless general public is convinced that their tax money is put to the best possible use for the general good of the people, people would always feel motivated to use cash and avoid paying tax.

v. In the process of withdrawing demonetised currency through bank deposits and exchange, banks have collected mountains of data of the depositors/ exchangers. Such data can be mined using latest technology for knowledge discovery. For example, one can analyse the nature of correlation between relatively high amounts of return of de-notified notes (say, in comparison to the level of deposits in a bank centre) with the major economic activities of that location (say, district or taluka) can give a clue to the kind of industry that generates maximum amount of untaxed income. It should be possible to identify areas wherefrom the amount of counterfeit notes have been received in comparison to the total notes received. A geospatial analysis of such data would be a gold mine to trace the possible source point of introduction of counterfeit notes. One can also analyse Pan Card and Adahar Card details to create a household level deposit of de-notified money. Using that data it should be possible to create an algorithm to create a network of households that as a group have deposited huge amount de-notified money. The possibilities are innumerable and we can only wait to see whether they are really acted upon or not.

vi. Finally, unless the Government of the day plugs loophole in our policy framework which facilitates generation of black money, the demon of black money cannot be said to have been slayed for ever. The discretionary power at various levels of government machinery needs to be reduced significantly so that corruption can be curtailed. At the same time to curb the demand for corruption, every industry must be opened up to competition unless it impinges upon national security. Another area that needs immediate look is the issue of transparency in the governance. Any data which can be opened up must be opened up at the lowest level of granularity. It is said the sunshine is the best vaccine for many environmental infection. We need to focus sunshine on government's tendering process, spending details, police transfer details etc.

The real impact of demonetisation will be felt in due course of time. Let us wait and watch and hope for the best.

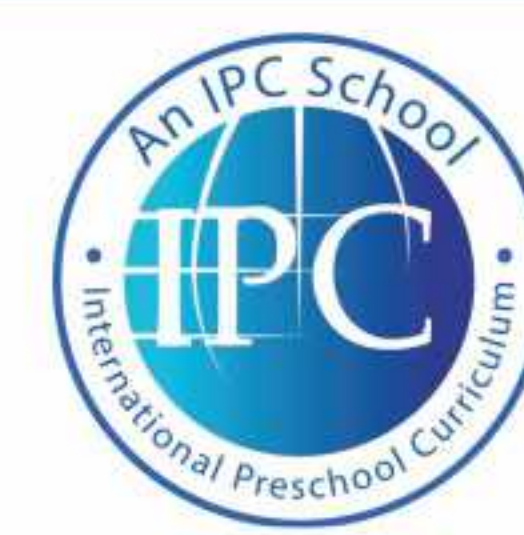

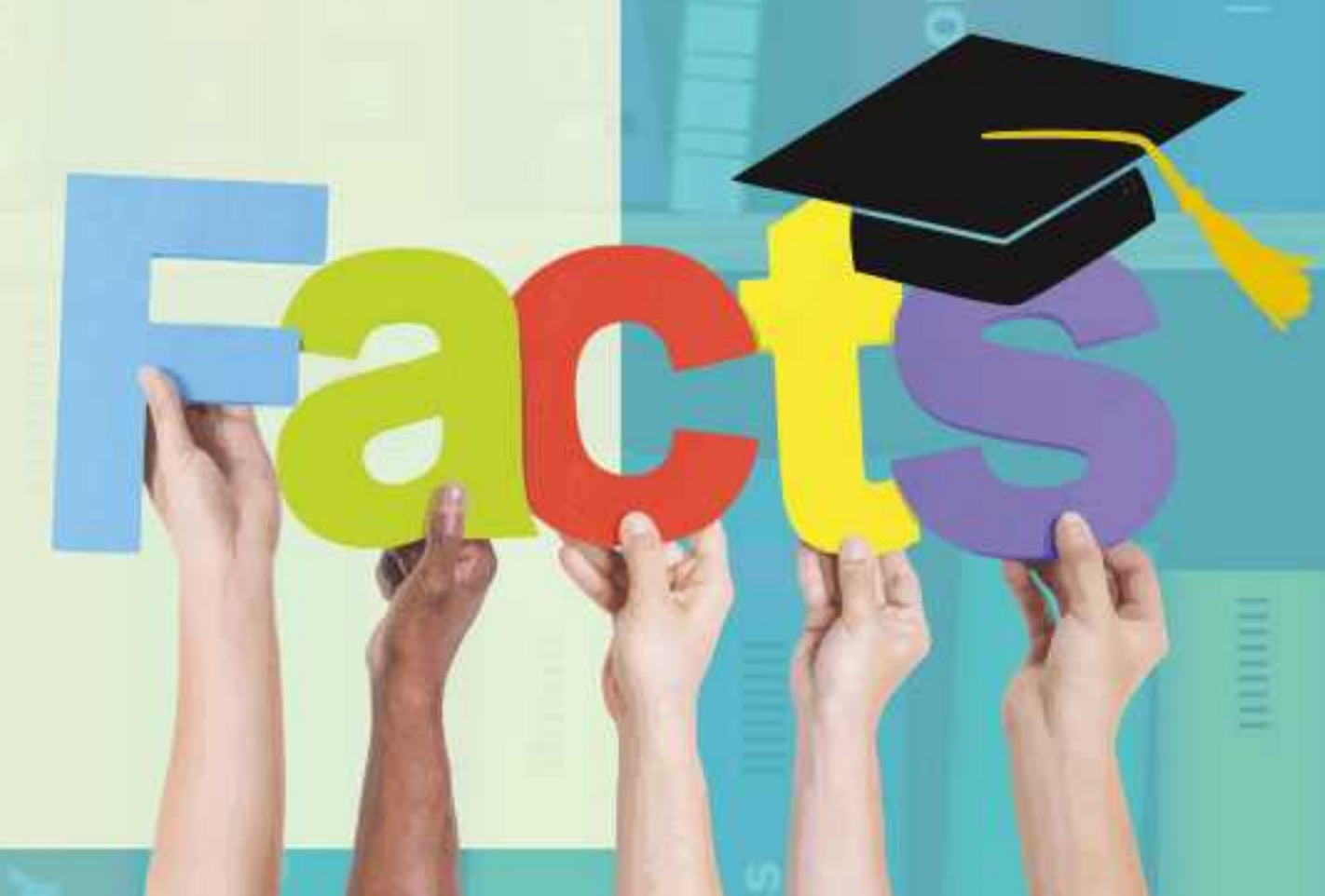
