
I am confident that with all such facilities that we offer, our institutions will continue to shape the future of the young minds of our country and transform their potential into successful careers resulting in national development.

We were lucky to have Deputy Commissioner of Police Mr Sangramsingh Nishandar who addressed the girls of Std X on sensitive issues like Self Defence, how to deal with an attempt of molestation, cyber security and patiently answered their queries.

Our PG students of Management and Media are getting an immense experience from the Rural and International Immersion experience. DSIMS students went for Rural Immersion to the cities of Anand (Gujrat) and its neighboring villages. Our DGMC students went to Phaltan Taluka, District Satara for Rural Immersion. Interacting with villagers and staying with them must have surely been a memorable experience for these students to understand the real "Bharat".

Finally, above mentioned activities are just the glimpses of our wide reach and coverage in all spheres of life of all our students in their growth and development. Message From Director of Schools

A Holistic and Balanced Education

These are the students of Grades 10 in all the four schools and Grade 12 students in the international school. All of them are approaching their board examinations.

Achieving a balance between academics and co-curricular activities is an important aspect of planning a school's holistic curriculum. There are many schools which will aim for excellence in academics, as represented by performance at competitions and board examinations, and there are others who seek to give their students an education that will focus on both

Living as we do in a competitive environment which demands that students produce good results in their HSC, IGCSE, IB, ISC and other examinations why do some schools feel it necessary to introduce a variety of programmes such as dance, drama, martial arts and many sports, apart from academics?

Some students and many parents worry that participating in extracurricular activities is inversely proportional to academic performance. They feel it takes away from time to be devoted to school work. However, evidence collected over the years suggests otherwise and indicates that extracurricular activities actually improve your grades and your outlook on schooling in general. It increases brain function and helps you concentrate and mange your time better. Studies also indicate that those participating in extra curricular activities have a positive attitude towards school and life in general.

Extracurricular activities allow you to explore a broad range of interests including some areas that you may never have thought of touching upon. It may be the way in which you discover new passions. If a science student joins a school's theatre or music programme she may find a hidden talent. Apart from that, the fact that you are doing something new in your life and are actually good at it increases your self-esteem which then envelops many areas of your life. One good thing about most extra curricular activities is that they are not graded and hence there is no fear of failure. This allows you to enjoy the activities without getting into a competitive mode.

Mired as we are in the world of academics, often our best friends are our books and tuition classes. Extra curricular activities open up a new world for social networking, allow you to discover new things to do and expand your opportunities. It also gives us an opportunity to make significant social contributions in the form of community service.

And there is no limit to the essential life skills that a student learns through her extra-curricular activities. In the first place you learn to prioritise between academics and other activites. Depending upon the



activity you choose you will acquire the relevant skills. A dancer, singer or theatre person will not only learn the skill appropriate to the discipline but will also learn how to present himself in the public and this is likely to benefit him in all realms of life. A sports person learns to discipline herself as well as become a leader, a team member and develop the high level of dedicated focus required to do well in the sport. Goal setting, time management and problem solving become essential to succeed in many extra-curricular activities and the spill-over effects are innumerable and touch upon every aspect of your life.

If one were to think in a very self-centered manner, apart from the joy, the skills and social networking beneftits that one gets from extra-curricular activities, these also look great on your resumes when you apply for university admissions. If a university is faced with a choice between a student who scored 90 per cent marks in a board examination with no extracurricular activities and another who has scored 85 per cent but also has passed level four of Trinitiy music exam, they are likely to choose the latter because of what he brings to the table.

Similarly, in later life, as you build your career, it is these activities that will not only count on your resumes but will also make you a more open minded, energetic and efficient human being.

Keeping this in mind the institutes of RSET celebrate a plethora of extracurricular activities with the management actively promoting and rewarding engagement in sports and cultural activities. Sports Days and Annual Days are only a culmination of this balanced education that is offered at the insitutues of RSET.

A Period of Noteworthy Events

The month of January started with many interesting events taking place in our country, in Mumbai as well as in our campus. On Saturday 12th January, 2019 Mumbai joined the nationwide celebrations to mark the 157th birth anniversary of Swami Vivekanand. This day is observed as National Youth Day in his memory. Born as Narendra Nath Dutta in 1863, the young sanyasi was instrumental in spreading the values of Vedanta and Yoga to the world. He passed away at the age of 39. It was felt that the philosophy of Swamiji and the ideals for which he lived and worked could be a great source of inspiration for the Indian Youth. That is why, every year his birthday is observed as National Youth Day. Swamiji's most unique contribution to the creation of new India was to open the minds of Indians to their duty to the downtrodden masses. He also stressed upon inculcating moral values in youth. . Hence all academicians, administrators and NGOs must unite together to work for strengthening the character of modern youth and also work for the downtrodden. Then only we can truly contribute in the celebration of the birthday of Swami Vivekanand.

Coming to academics, for the first time Mumbai University invited a Noble laureate Sir Richard John Roberts as the Chief Guest at the Convocation which was held on 11th January, 2019. Maharashtra Governor and Chancellor of Universities, CH. It was heartening to note that the varsity awarded 52 medals to 40 students out of which 33 were girls. Also, among the eight students who received two or more medals each, six were girls. Noble laureate Sir Richard John Roberts said "I am particularly surprised that the girls are doing so well. I hope one of you, like me, goes on to win the first Noble Prize for their university".



Month of January also witnessed beginning of Maha Kumbh Mela in Allahabad (Prayag Raj), one of the important cities in Uttar Pradesh. This religious gathering is held on the sacred spot on the banks of river Ganga and the devotees take a holy dip at the confluence of Ganga, Yamuna and mythical Saraswati river known as Sangam. This year 12 crore devotees are expected to attend Maha Kumbh Mela & 2 crore have already taken a holy dip on Makar Sankranti (first day of Royal Bath) on 15th January, 2019 according to the city planners. According to the expert committee of UNESCO, Kumbh Mela is the most abundant, peaceful religious gathering on earth, where people of different classes participate without any discrimination. The area of Kumbh Mela this time is spread to over 45 km and is an unique example of city planning, sanitation, heavy security, suitable accommodation, health services that is studied by many groups coming from foreign universities. U.P. Government has allocated Rs. 4200 crores for Kumbh Mela making it costliest till date.

It was really an exciting day for the students and teachers.


Annual Sports Day of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College



Rithvika Nair, Grade 2 participated in IKFW 2018 Season 6 Finale and was awarded the Audition and Participation Finale Certificate.


Overall, the months of October-December were filled with activities, interactive teaching-learning processes and celebrations with a socio-economic cause.



International Conference






Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Staff meeting



championship but KGES had a bit of extra effort and determination because of which they stood victorious.





rowth and development have always been

the key to the success whether it is an

individual, or an organisation or a nation. It is a continuous process but the speed differs from the individual to individual, organisation to organisation and nation to nation. The growth and development can be measured by the positive change taken place during a period of time from the previous stage. Due to highly competitive business environment, innovation of new technologies and challenges, the speed of development requires impetus for development and growth. Organisations can replicate each and every aspect of business input like capital, technology, infrastructure, systems and processes but not the people because every individual is different with different aptitude, abilities, personality traits, mental, emotional and temperamental frameworks, etc. Thus, the key to the competitive success for any business entity is its managerial workforce which requires continuous development to meet the business challenges. To grow at a desired speed, the managers are required to develop themselves on a continuous basis by learning knew knowledge and skills both technical and behavioural.

Self-development focuses on self-driven development initiatives. Before dwelling on the self-development process and approaches it is better to understand the concept of self. It has two components viz. Patent Self and Inner Self. The patent self is the characteristics of a person related to his/her identifying and physical features. The inner self refers to the entire aspects of one's personality and behavioural characteristics which also include the knowledge and skills acquired by him from time to time consciously, sub-consciously and even unconsciously with formal and informal efforts. It also includes his strengths, weaknesses, competencies, values, perceptions and attitudes. As far as the patent self is concerned, one has a limited scope to change and develop it through grooming. One can develop a pleasing personality by developing a good body shape with exercise, decent haircuts, dressing sense etc. but cannot alter his/ her height, the colour of skin or physical features. Thus, the main focus should be on development of inner self which has a tremendous and unrestricted scope for development. Therefore, the focus of self-development in this article is confined to development of innerself as defined above.

FACTORS SUPPORTING SELF-DEVELOPMENT

Each individual who strives for his development has to initiate and drive his/her own development process. A popular saying applies here "you can lead a horse to water, but you can't make him drink." Seeking self-improvement is an individual driven ongoing process aiming at

Improving Knowledge base, Developing Skills and Developing right Behaviour & Attitude. It is the process of discovering and utilizing the tremendous potential within the individual to develop competencies and matured personality.

Robert Katz identified three managerial skills essential for successful managers viz. technical, human-relations and conceptual skills. Technical skill involves processes or technical knowledge and proficiency, human-relations skill involves the ability to interact effectively with people and conceptual skill involves the conceptualization of ideas and issues, dealing with abstractions and viewing the solutions keeping in view the organisation as a whole. Thus, technical skill deals with processes, human skill concerns people, and conceptual skill has to do with ideas. At a junior level, the managers are required to use more of the technical skills and gradually they have to use more and more conceptual skills when they grow in their profession. The technical skills focus on 'Know How' whereas the conceptual skills focus more on 'Know Why'. The human-relations skills are required at all levels of managerial functions uniformly wherever one has to deal with people and work in an interdependent work environment. As emphasised earlier, the primary responsibility of self-development lies with the managers themselves. If they do not take timely steps for their development they will lose their relevance and can become obsolete in a highly competitive and dynamic business environment where learning, relearning and unlearning should take on an ongoing basis. The managers therefore should consider the following steps for their self-development:

(i) Define the goals for self-development

Defining the goals is the first step in self-development initiative. One should be clear what he should achieve. The goals depend upon individual mission i.e. what he wants to be and to do. Sense of mission gives the basic direction from which long-term and short-term goals should be set. Goals should keep harmony amongst his different roles. The manager has responsibility towards his organisation, his family and the society at large. All have justified demands from him and his time. He should therefore plan his development initiatives so that he does justice to all his expected roles.

(ii) Determination and self-development

Determination and the strong will power are the key drivers of self-development. Nothing can resist a determined will. Self-developer displays strong determination to overcome obstacles. He builds achievements on his strength and safeguards the same by minimising the adverse effects of his limitations. It becomes essential to correctly assess the strength, weakness, opportunities and threats (SWOT

analysis). The self-analysis through introspection is the key for realistic self-assessment which serves as the crucial factor to realistically decide the goals.

(iii) Self-development through co-operation

Everyone can learn something from others. Self-developer believes in getting along to go ahead. He tries to capitalize on mutual synergy and creates an environment for helping and sharing each other's strengths. He believes that there is plenty for everybody; one's success is not to be achieved at the cost of others. Relationships are nurtured in mutual trust, honesty, empathy and respect. He avoids the negative feelings caused by fear, anger, or jealousy which impede self-development.

(iv) Seeking and encouraging feedback

Getting an honest feedback helps in learning more about oneself. Positive feedback reinforces one's convictions and negative feedback makes one aware of his areas of improvement. Objective feedback prevents distortion of self-image. One should take the feedback sincerely and sportingly. If someone tries to defend against the feedback or unwilling to accept a genuine feedback, even the well-wishers will stop giving feedback in future. Feedback provides the inputs for self-analysis and introspection.

(v) Desire to excel & achievement motivation for self-development Desire to excel in whatever one does is the hallmark of self-development. Doing common thing uncommonly brings success. Excellence becomes a matter of habit, it can be achieved through knowledge and skills; knowing 'what to do' and 'how to do'. It is easier to do a job when well equipped to do it. Creative spirit of self-developer is manifest in his willingness to learn. He has the open, questioning mind and is ready to try new and innovative ways of doing things.

(vi) Positive attitude and self-development

The art of positive thinking lies in filling up mind with positive ideas of what one wants to achieve. Those who seem to be lucky are those who are optimistic and expect to win. "You can if you think you can". Managers with positive attitude are always learning from failures and do not give up easily.

(vii) Self-confidence and self-development

It is belief in oneself that enables a manager to draw from the reserves of tremendous strength within him. Lack of faith in oneself is a hindrance in self-growth. The escapist takes shelter behind excuses. The only way to get anywhere to start from where one is and to use what he has. Self-confidence and a relaxed mind bring out the best. Most of the extraordinary achievers succeed in their mission because of their tremendous self-confidence, determination and positive attitude. Lack of self-confidence creates fear of failure and one does not try his full potential to achieve the goals.

APPROACHES TO SELF-DEVELOPMENT

Based on the objectives and the factors for self-development discussed above, the following approaches for self-development can be adopted: Goal oriented approach: Any approach for development requires goal setting as a first step. The goals should be SMART i.e. Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant and Time-Bound. Goals provide the direction, efforts required, corrective actions needed and sense of achievement. Let us draw the analogy between national economic development and individual development. In economic development we plan, review and measure the achievement of 3 sectors viz. Agriculture (primary), Industry (secondary) and Services (tertiary) for a period of one year which can be reviewed and measured against the pre-set goals/targets. For an individual, self-development goals can be planned, reviewed and measured for development of 3 components viz. Knowledge, Skills and Attitude/ Behaviour. All the 3 are required in a significant proportion. One has to constantly develop his knowledge base about new concepts, developments and changes. The skill development is required to handle situations requiring practical solutions and applications. The right attitude/behaviour is required to handle inter-personal issues effectively. The positive attitude brings the positivity and problem-solving approach in the behaviour. The knowledge enhances the confidence, the skills improve the competence whereas the right behaviour and attitude inculcate the commitment.

Conscious-Competence approach of Noel Burch: Noel Burch developed Conscious Competence Ladder Approach in 1970 which encompass four stages of competence viz. Unconscious incompetence, Conscious incompetence, Conscious competence and Unconscious competence. This approach is also referred as "Conscious Competence Matrix," "Learning Matrix," and the "Four Stages of Learning." The model highlights two factors that affect our thinking as we learn a new skill: consciousness (awareness) and skill level (competence). According to this model, we move through the following levels as we build competence in a new skill:

Under Unconscious incompetence stage (we do not know what we do not know), the individual does not understand or know how to do something and does not necessarily recognize the deficit. At this level, he is blissfully ignorant: he has a complete lack of knowledge and skills in a specific area, and he is unaware of this. He does not know that he does not have a particular skill, or that he needs to learn it. He may deny the usefulness of the skill. It may also arise when someone is doing something wrong and does not know that he is doing it wrong. The individual must recognize his own incompetence, and the value of the new skill, before moving on to the next stage. The length of time an individual spends in this stage depends on the strength of the stimulus to learn. At this stage the realisation of importance of the skill and the awareness about incompetence should start.

The next stage of learning is the Conscious incompetence (we know what we do not know). Under this stage though the individual does not understand or know how to do something, he recognises the deficit, as



well as the value of a new skill. He knows that he does not have this skill when he is doing something wrong but he knows that he is doing it wrongly. The making of mistakes can be integral to the learning process at this stage. By this stage, the individual discovers that he needs to learn new skills. He realizes that others are much more competent than he is, and that they can easily do things that he is struggling with. Because of that it becomes demoralizing and sometimes the confidence comes down. It is therefore important to remain positive and take it as a challenge to learn at a high speed.

At the Conscious competence stage (we know what we know) the individual understands or knows how to do something. He knows that he has the required skill. When he is doing something right he has to consciously focus on doing it the right way. Thus, demonstrating the skill or knowledge requires concentration. The task is broken down into steps, and there is heavy conscious involvement in executing the new skill. At this level, one knows that he has acquired the skills and knowledge he needs. He is required to put his learning into practice regularly to gain more confidence to use new skills. He still needs to concentrate when he performs the activities more frequently and with practice and experience, these activities become increasingly automatic.





The Unconscious competence stage (we do not know what we know) is the final stage of learning. Under this stage the individual has so much practice with the skill that it has become part of his routine activity which he can perform easily at an unconscious or sub-conscious level. He therefore does not know that he has the skill. When he is doing something right and he does not even to think about it. As a result, the skill can be performed while executing other tasks also. The individual may be able to teach it to others without making any extra efforts. At this level, one is able to use the skills effortlessly, and can perform tasks without conscious effort. A good way to do this is to teach these new skills to others in the organization. This will keep information fresh in mind, deepen the understanding of the material, and give a rewarding way to pass this knowledge to others. One may go backwards down the ladder if he does not use the skill regularly.

To explain this conscious competence approach, let us take a practical example of car driving as a skill to explain the 4 stages of learning. A person may not know about the skills required in driving a car and about his own competency to drive. He may feel that many people drive the car so he will also be able to do it with some efforts, he is at unconscious incompetency level. When he actually tries to drive the car, he realises that it is not that easy and he becomes aware about his incompetency, he is at conscious incompetency level. When he follows the instructions of the instructor and is able to drive the car to some comfortable level he reaches to the stage of conscious competency level as he recalls the steps and instructions given by the instructor and his entire operations requires conscious behaviour. If someone does not further drive the car and leave the learning at this stage, there is a great chance that he may not be able to drive it after a gap and goes back to the previous stage of conscious incompetence. We have seen many persons learn the driving, obtain the driving license but not able to drive because of this phenomenon. When a person gets enough practice and experience of driving the car, he is able to drive it without conscious efforts, he reaches the ultimate stage of unconscious competence. Similar stages are faced by the managers when they learn some new skills. Unless they use them regularly it may be possible that they may not be able to use them at comfort level i.e. unconscious competence level. Thus, the Four Stages of the model for learning suggests that individuals are initially unaware of how little they know, or unconscious of their incompetence. As they recognize their incompetence, they consciously acquire a skill, then consciously use it. Eventually, the skill can be utilized without it being consciously thought through: the individual is said to have then acquired unconscious competence and becomes part of his routine function.

ORGANISATION'S ROLE TO FACILITATE SELF-DEVELOPMENT

Both, the organisations and managers are the beneficiary of development. Organisations are keen to create human capital in the form of strategic work force whereas the managers are interested in developing more and more competencies to grow faster and retain their relevance with the developments taking place all around. The Organisations should therefore provide opportunity to facilitate the growth of individual managers by providing a conducive learning and rewarding environment. The progressive organisations provide all out support to the managers for their development and invest in their development through formal and informal sources. At formal level, the organisations provide time to time training on new skills to bridge the gaps between competencies required and possessed. They also draw a comprehensive career plan for the managers to provide exposure to various organizational activities for the overall growth and development of managers to occupy higher positions.

At informal level the organisation should facilitate the growth of managers through following means:

(i) The organisation should provide effective Leadership and Mentoring to the managers by their seniors. The role of the seniors is to create conditions for facilitating learning process. They should encourage the managers to try new ways of doing the things and not to be averse of taking risks.

(ii) The seniors can also help the managers to identify and utilize their hidden potentials. Each individual has tremendous potential but is unable to identify the same. The seniors can always keep a watch on the

managers to identify any extraordinary talent and harness the same for achieving higher performance.

(iii) The success of a manager depends on his competencies, his motivation and the opportunities provided to use his competencies. Placing right person for the right job where the manager can use his competencies to enhance his productivity is beneficial to both i.e. organization and the manager. The organization will gain due to better quality and higher productivity whereas the manager will have satisfaction of using his competencies in a more productive way. The organizations should maintain an inventory of the competencies possessed by the managers so that right person is utilized for the right job at a right time. The use of information technology for developing intelligent Human Resource Information System (HRIS) can be useful for such matching.

(iv) The managers should have the big picture of the organisational activities and should be able to link his role with the overall objectives and goals of the organisation. The organisation should therefore share and emphasize its vision and also provide goal and role clarity so that his efforts are channelized towards organizational goals and strategy.

(v) Most of the organisations conduct employee appraisal once a year and hardly have time to discuss the organisational expectations. They also fail to provide timely feedback to the managers about their performance. It is therefore necessary to provide a timely and constructive feedback for improving the performance.

(vi) Another significant organizational factor causing low performance and low motivation for learning and development of the managers is the lack of conducive organizational culture which is mainly caused by interpersonal conflicts, lack of inter-personal cooperation, inter-personal distrust, grape wine and rumors, etc. The organizations should be sensitive to these developments and strive to create a healthy culture for the managerial development and growth.

To conclude, it has become absolutely essential that the managers should upgrade their competencies on a continuous basis to meet the new challenges because of fast obsolescence of knowledge and skills driven by innovations and technological disruptions. One should not live in his past glory and become complacent; past achievements do not ensure future success because of radical changes in business models. The managers should drive their development initiatives to remain updated and relevant in a fast-changing business environment though the organizations should support the self-development process for the mutual benefits. There is always a war for acquiring talent by the corporates and those who timely acquire right skills are always in great demand. Thus, to be a successful manager, one does not have a choice but to develop and grow through his own initiatives to achieve managerial excellence. It makes a swim or sink situation for the manager to survive and grow in a highly volatile and uncertain business environment.

The main aim of constructing the IT Hub is to make all course material available on line to our students, easy flow of interaction between student and teacher through electronic medium, to create alumni data and keep students attached to our organization life-long through web, to safe guard the campus using video vigilance and electronic access control, to control the entire admission process of all institutions centrally, to safe guard all available data and provide fast internet services within the campus.


