



Proposed University will develop its philosophical base with the belief in






cooperation and coordination.



hen and how did you get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust? I became associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust in the year 1980. Late Shri Vishwanathij Podar encouraged me to join the Trust. At that time, there was only one building of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya School (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) in which our Hindi medium school was running. The Junior College had also started and was attached to the school. The classes of Junior College were also held in the same school building. The Head Mistress of the school Smt. Shakuntala Mehra was looking after both the institutions. In the year 1985, the school celebrated its Silver Jubilee. A grand function was held with His Excellency the Governor of Maharashtra Shri Kona Prabhakar Rao

# Since when did you start playing active role in the Educational Endeavour of RajasthaniSammelanEducationTrust?

In the year 1981, I became the Secretary of the Trust. At that time, the Management decided to extend educational opportunities to girls to a further higher level. We applied to the University of Mumbai to start a girls' Degree College. Great Industrialist and Philanthropist Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf came forward with handsome donation to start the college in the name of his father Late Shri Ghanshyamdasji Saraf.

To get affiliation from Mumbai University was a difficult task and we had to struggle a lot. Time and again, we had to visit Mantralaya and meet the Officers of Higher Education Department for this purpose. Ultimately, we succeeded in getting temporary affiliation with the help of Hon'ble Chief Minister and Shri Murti Deora, Member of Parliament, interested in the cause of education. Our college was inaugurated on 2nd July, 1983 by Hon'ble Shri Sudhakar Naik, the then Hon'ble Education Minister, Government Of Maharashtra. The occasion was graced by eminent citizens and dignitaries. The Main Donor Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf was also present alongwith members of his family. I remember the contribution of Shri D.R. Dhanukaji, Shri Vishwanathji Podar, Shri Banwarilalji Jhunjhunwala, Shri Mohanlalji Dalmia, Shri Prahladraji Saraf, Shri Satyanarayanji Kabra, Shri Shrikantji Dalmia, Shri Kailashji Kejriwal and many other active members of the Managing Committee.

While starting the college, we had to abide by the rules and regulations of the Mumbai University as well as Education Department of Mantralaya. We formed the first Governing Council of the College with Shri D.R. Dhanukaji as the Chairman. Principal B.K. Acharya, was the first Principal of the college. After his superannuation, Dr. (Smt.) Sunanda Kar was appointed as the Principal of the college. During this time, the new building of the college was constructed and was inaugurated by Dr. P.C. Alexander, the then Governor of Maharashtra. I was at that time Vice-President of the Trust. Hence, I was a part of all the important decisions taken by the Managing Committee. During this time, the Managing Committee also took a decision to start an English medium school affiliated to SSC Board which was named later as Ramniwas Bajaj English High School. The school is presently affiliated to ICSE Board.

# How did you contribute in the growth and development of the educational institutions of Rajasthani Sammelan?

I was involved with Rajasthani Sammelan from 1980s. I actively participated in fund collection and also taking various important decisions in the educational endeavours of the Trust. In the year 2007, the decision of massive extension, renovation and starting of new institutions in R.S. Campus was taken by the Managing Committee under the leadership of Shri Ashokji Saraf, President of our Trust. Soon, a transit school was built and children of RGSS were shifted to that transit school. The school building was demolished and in that place a building with twelve floors was constructed. In the course of time, Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies, Mainadevi Bajaj International School, Draupadidevi Sanwarmal Women's Hostel,





Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre and Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies were started. All such decisions of starting these institutions were taken at the Managing Committee and the Board of Trustees. Being member of both the committees, I actively supported the projects and worked for the projects as and when required.

At present, I am the Secretary of the Governing Council of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College and I take active interest in the working of the college and introduction of new courses in the college from time to time. I am also taking keen interest in working of the Trust and completing all various formalities with the Charity Commissioner's Office from time to time.

# Tell us some important incidents which you would like to mention in this context?

There are many incidents and events which can be mentioned. But the most memorable event was the reaccreditation of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College by NAAC with 'A' Grade. This was an excellent achievement as the college occupied eleventh position among the NAAC reaccredited colleges in Mumbai and fifth position among the colleges in Western suburbs. This achievement received due publicity from Media. Being the Secretary of the Governing Council, I gave full support to the Principal and Vice Principals for this noteworthy achievement, It was celebrated at a glittering function alongwith Dr. Rajan Welukar, Vice Chancellor, University of Mumbai, as the Chief Guest, Dr. Naresh Chandra, Pro-Vice Chancellor, University of Mumbai, as the Guest of Honour alongwith many dignitaries, Senior Principals, Trustees and Members of Management.

# Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust initially started girls' school and college which are now coeducational. What is your view on this matter?

It is indeed a wise decision that have been taken by our Trust. In today's world it is necessary to run co-education

institutions right from the pre-school stage. At the college level, this gives an opportunity for healthy competition in studies as well as in extra curricular activities. Besides, when the girl students start working on completion of their studies, they do not feel awkward to work with male members and interact freely with them. Rajasthani Sammelan has always focussed on changes as per the need of the time and this is one of the changes needed in the present socio-economic circumstances.

# What is your message to the present team of Managing Committee members of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

I congratulate Shri Ashokji Saraf, his team of Office bearers, Managing Committee members and all the Trustees for the excellent work they are doing in the field of education. Along with imparting education. our Trust has provided various facilities such as a women's hostel, a career counseling centre, a health centre and an educational outlet in the campus. My message to them is that they should help the students who are financially weak and are eager to study. Besides, we must have placement scheme and establish contacts with corporates regularly so that our students get proper placement on completion of education.

In the month of May, our institution tied up partnership with Transform Fitness Training Academy. The promotional activities for the program are in full swing.





# CORE STABILITY By Dr. UTTAM KENDRE Director of Physical Education and Sports University of Mumbai

University of Mumbai

In recent years, core stability has become one of the popular trends in conditioning, fitness & rehabilitation. Fitness practitioners have increasingly recommended core stability exercises in sports conditioning programs. Greater core stability has many benefits for improve sports performance by providing a foundation for greater force production in the upper and lower extremities. Contrary to traditional methods, where the emphasis was put on strengthening the limbs, the focus of training is on the centre of the body the core. Why? Simply because good core stability helps to maximize performance, prevent Injury and protect the spine in sport as well as in everyday life, Biomechanical researches concluded that, power is derived from the trunk region of the body and a properly conditioned core helps to control that power, allowing for smoother, more efficient and better co-ordinated movement in the limbs

Medical evidence suggests that, decreased core stability may predispose injury and deteriorates the sports performances. While appropriate training may reduce the risk of injury and enhance the sports performances. Apart from that the muscles of the core help to protect the spine from

extreme ranges of movement and from the excessive or abnormal forces acting on the body. Improvement in performance, injury prevention and protection of the vertebral column are the benefits of core stability. In practice, the core serves as: A muscle corset, the centre of the kinetic chain, the powerhouse. In anatomical terms, core stability describes the muscular control required around the Lumbopelvic hip region to maintain functional stability.

Traditional resistance exercises have been modified to emphasize core stability Such modification have included performing exercises on unstable rather than stable surface, performing exercises while standing rather than seating, performing exercises with free weight rather than machines, and performing exercises unilaterally rather than bilaterally. During preseason and pre competition and competition season meso cycle, free weight exercises performed while standing on a stable surface are recommended for increase in core strength and power. Free weight exercises performed in this manner are specific to the core stability requirement of sports related skills due to moderate level of instability and high level of force production conversely, during post season and off season meso cycle; Swiss ball exercises involving isometric muscle action, small loads, and long tension time are recommended to improve proprioceptive and reactive capabilities which may reduce the like hood of lower extremity injuries.

### What is core stability?

Core stability is the ability to keep spine straight or elongated from your tail bone to the top of your head, while keeping shoulder and hips level in line. Core is the base of support, not just in workout but in every life to move body most effectively. Core strength, core stabilization and core support are buzz word that mean pretty much the same working abdomens and other postural muscles to help create & maintain ideal alignment, back, improve postural alignment. While giving core

training beware of crunches start activate

your deep muscle simple exercises for postural muscles then exercises for stabilization and deep stabilization that will help to improve balance and coordination.

> Core stability is the foundation for explosive movements and control agility. Balance and coordination qualities require in

competitive sports in nut shell, body can function more effectively. Developing of core stability helps to become more stable better control and become social while performing, improve posture greater capacity for speed generation, more effective use of muscle power, decrease injury risk, increased ability to change direction controlled body momentum improve balance and muscle coordination.

The core is where the most of the body's power is derived; it provides the foundation for all movements of the arms and legs. The core must be strong, have dynamic flexibility and function synergistically in its movements in order to achieve maximum performance. Motion of the human body is not isolated to one muscle or tissue moving in one specific direction. Rather it is a complex event involving agonistics and antagonistic structures that work together to create force to changes in position and for location and to stabilize the body in all three direction planes.

Core includes the throes chest rib case; abdomen spine, shoulder, pelvic girdle and act as base for all movement which is generally overlooked. Training the core area improve lumber stability and increase the speed of trunk rotation which leads to improve velocity and control of skills. Own body weight to perform may be the exercise use to the core training.

The main muscles involved in core stabilization can be divided into two categories: 1.Global (dynamic) muscles are the large muscle groups lying close to the surface. They link the pelvis to the rib cage and apart from providing general trunk stabilization, their main function is movement. These are: External Oblique's, Internal Oblique's, Rectus Abdominals, and Erector Spines.

2. Local (postural) muscles are smaller muscle groups lying deep in the abdomen. They attach directly to the lumbar vertebrae and are responsible for providing segmental stability by controlling the lumbar segments during movement. These are: Transverse Abdominals.



Multifidus, Iliopsoas, Quadratus Lumborum, Pelvic floor muscles.

Despite the popularity of core stability training, relatively little scientific research has been conducted to demonstrate the benefits for healthy athletes. The purpose of review is to critically examine core stability training and the health status of the athlete. Further it may provide insight in to what core stability actually is and how it can impact on training. Lots of efforts have been made in recent year on the concept of stability in musculoskeletal linkages and joints. Studies were conducted to explore methods to better assess the risk of injury due injuries among time fighter efforts; to develop and assess the effectiveness of interventions functional movement performance and reduce injury.

Anderson sergmark (1980) formalized stability in muscular system using a very simplistic model of the spine, and formalized mathematically the concept of energy wellness, stiffness stability and instability. His work did not see to go for at that time because the engineers who understand the mechanics did not have the clinical perspective while the clinicians were unable to interpret the engineer's mechanics.

Luck (2000) concluded after six week of core training to the athlete and base ball players, both the groups improve in functional performance, stability and proprioception. The addition of core stability exercise did not result in significantly different outcomes. It is possible that the core stability program may not have been functionally challenging to the core.

#### Core training

Core training is very popular philosophy sweeping over fitness program. At a quick glance core training appears to be simply abdominals exercise and lower back exercises, but core training is so much more. Core training is all about good segment, joint stability and efficient movement and core includes entire spine shoulder girdle and hip girdle. Relatively static exercise was used in the core training programme rather than Sports Specific Training. While performing core exercises one can focus on three things i.e. stability, strength, and power.

\*Stability refers to the ability of the muscle to maintain a joint position; posture and alignment. \*Strength refers to the ability of muscle to move a certain amount of resistance through the full range of motion.

\*And power refers to the ability of the muscle to move body with speed.

Basics of Core training Stability exercises are typically isometric in nature; it can be done with or without equipment. Pilates is an excellent way to work your entire body including the all important core. Yoga practitioners and professionals dancers

have long known the secret to getting a strong core, even before much focus was placed on maintaining this area of the body. The enviable posture of Pilates and yoga devotees, as well as long time dancers is a testament to what effective core also available for use of core training including item such as planks bridges, yoga arms and leg reaches. Straight crunch, crossover crunch, back extension, arm sweep, and plank or push up. There are number of exercises that can perform with or without equipment such as medicine ball, Swiss ball, Gym ball, stability ball, weight, heavy bars, rebook core band. There are other core stabilization exercises that are specific to Pilates or voga. Bicycle maneuver, captain chair. these exercises requires a pair of bar on which the exerciser can rest the fore arm while letting the feet stay of the ground.

Core stability exercises have been designed to develop torso strength balance and stability otherwise known as core stability. All the physical training should begin with a detailed assessment of movement patterns. Developing understanding of how your body is built, physical strength and weakness and postural consideration are key to developing fitness program.

-Conduct load test before intensity of exercise task

-Training process keep emphasis on stage of development.

 Focus of larger trunk muscle for postural development to built strong base of support.

-Decide time, proper rest and recovery for recovery and regeneration in order to grow and proper development.

 -Arrange alternate exercises for different parts of the body, change exercise frequently to avoid accumulated fatigue on any specific area.

-Technique and form are never compromised performance will suffer if you choose an exercise load which cannot be managed properly. Part of weight Lifting is learning how to load and unload your body.

 Proper distribution in the kinetic chain to helps deliver raw power.

-The principles of exercising the core is a selected summary, based on what the pioneers of conditioning such as yoga, Pilates and weight training experts laid down in the past. In fact, these points can be taken as an organized statement of what is required to perform any exercise programmed effectively these are:-Concentration, Proprioception, Control, Centre: Activating the core, Posture, Neutral spine Breathing, Lateral breathing Timing, Precision, exercise selection. The concept is to train the whole ranges of core muscles with exercises in different positions - on the back, on the stomach and on the side. Each exercise starts with using only the body and progresses through stages with simple equipment and resistance, in order to challenge the athlete further. It is advised to master the movement of the given stage and then move on to the next level only when the existing exercise is carried out perfectly with ease and no longer challenges the body and mind.

#### Core stability exercises:-

Core stability exercises are some of the more important exercises to perform during a workout. These exercises benefit everyone as they add strength to the core a strong and stable core can help to all aviates pain.

There are three levels of exercises, which begin at level one to ensure you have the correct isolation of the deep abdominal muscles and a feel for how they work before progressing to the next level. It cannot stress enough how important technique and activation of the right muscles are when doing these exercises so be mindful when performing these exercises. Start each exercise by finding neutral spine and drawing in your lower stomach. These exercises are working your postural, endurance muscles surrounding your trunk so this workout will not be anything like the intensity of your swimming, cycling or running workouts. Try to relax and enjoy this part of your program. Leave yourself 30-40 minutes to complete these exercises.

#### STAGES OF EXERCISING THE CORE

Stage I: Core Control: The most important objective of this stage is to achieve core activation and control. For building up confidence and for better control, it is advised to start the training with static exercises in a supported position, on the floor. At first, take the correct starting position with the appropriate joint alignment and neutral spine, then by pulling the navel into the spine and bracing the abdominals, activate the core. Then go through the whole range of movement with the right breathing technique and hold the position for approximately 30 seconds before returning to the starting position. Repeat the exercise 3-4 times with 30-second intervals. When you become confident and fluent with the technique, move from static training to dynamic repetitions, still maintaining the supported position. Go through the range of movement then return to the starting position in a 2 sec. /2 sec. ratio 10 times, without break.

### Stage II: Core Stabilization

This is the stage where proprioceptive training comes to the fore. By forcing the body and mind to adjust and compensate to the unstable position, fine proprioceptive sense will develop. For building up confidence again and for better control in the changed, unsupported position it is advised to start the training with static exercises again. Adjust your body position to the equipment, maintain the appropriate joint alignment and activate your core. Go through the whole range of movement with the right breathing technique, and then hold the position for approximately 20 seconds, before returning to the starting position. Repeat the exercise 5-4



times with 20-second intervals. When you become confident and fluent with the technique, once again move from static training to dynamic repetitions, while you are in an unsupported position. Go through the range of movement then return to the starting position in a 2 sec. / 2 sec. ratio 10 times without break.

#### Stage III: Core Strengthening

This is the stage to strengthen further the controlled and stabilized core. When introducing resistance training while your body is in an unsupported position, it is advised to start with static exercises again. Adjust your body position to the equipment / resistance, maintain the appropriate joint alignment and activate your core. Go through the whole range of movement with the right breathing technique; hold the position for approximately 10 sec., before returning to the starting position, Repeat the exercise 3-4 times with 10second intervals. When you become confident and fluent with the technique, once again move from static training to dynamic repetitions, still maintaining the unsupported position. Go through the range of movement then return to the starting position in a 2 sec. / 2 sec, ratio 10 times, without break, Repeat the exercise 3-4 times with 30-second intervals.




