advertising agencies also have approached us for shooting their advertisements.





At the outset, I convey my warm greetings to everyone at the beginning of this academic year ! According to a recent statistics on demography, every third person in an Indian city today is a youth. While India is undergoing demographic transition, educational opportunities must be available to the youth across the country. We are living in an ever changing world. New technologies keep coming up and we need to implement such technologies in education system. The latest trend is Online Education and in keeping with this trend, we at Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust have started Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy (GOLD) to provide education to students beyond the boundaries of our campus. GOLD has recently tied-up with Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL), Mumbai University to provide e-learning for B.Com students registered with IDOL. GOLD has undertaken the task of going through the B.Com syllabus of other six universities of Maharashtra to find out the additional topics to be covered in each of these universities so that they can create e-learning content for these universities also. At present, approximately 8307 students are registered on GOLD portal and total users registered on IDOL portal are 36,382 students.

The new academic year began with a great moment of pride with 100% results of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School at the SSC Board examination. Results of other institutions were also excellent ranging between 95% - 98%. With the declaration of results, admission process started in junior college, degree college, media college as well as management institute. All our colleges and other institutions became busy with admissions. The campus is buzzing with new students desirous of seeking admission in undergraduate and post graduate classes.

However, the most memorable and important event in the past few months was Naming & Inauaguration of Facilities and Endowment Fund which was held on 1st May, 2016. It was on this day that our RS International Playschool was named as Mainadevi Bajaj International Playschool. Other important events on that day included naming of the 6th floor, Seminar Hall of Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies as Madhoprasad Saraf Seminar Hall alongwith naming of Computer Lab of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School as Savitridevi Bilasrai Bubna Computer Lab and Computer Centre of Ramniwas Bajaj English High School as Omprakash Bilasrai Bubna Computer Centre. It was a special moment for all of us when Lalchand Dalmia Golf Cart donated by Dalmia family was inaugurated on the same day as Late Shri Lalchandji Dalmia was one of the founding fathers of our Trust and was one the signatories of the first constitution of RSET.

It has always been our mission to provide financial help to needy students for pursuing education. Shri Ramprakash Bubna and Smt. Sharda Bubna joined hands with us to create Janakidevi Bilasrai Bubna Endowment Freeship Fund. The manual of this freeship fund was inaugurated by Smt. Savitridevi B. Bubna at a scintillating function held at Durgadevi Saraf Hall on the same day. In the past few months, our institutions have invited many scholars from different universities in our campus. They have also organized prestigious seminars, conferences and faculty members presented research papers in National and International conferences that have been published in prestigious journals.

Our Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy ground is regularly utilized by students of our institutions. We have appointed many experienced coaches to train our students on

various games and sports. Today, we are imparting education to approximately 16,000 students in our institutions of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust. ## CEO'S MESSAGE

Dear Reader,

At the outset, hearty greetings to one and all at the beginning of the academic year. It is a great privilege to pen down my thoughts for this issue of Abacus. A new academic year has started and we have crossed some more milestones. At every step, we were strongly supported and motivated by the Management, supportive colleagues, heads of institutions, dedicated teachers and committed students. Today, institutions of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust are growing from strength to strength with ethical as well as professional practices and are recognized as reputed names amongst the educational institutes in Mumbai. In my years of experience as educational administrator, I have learnt a very simple and yet a very significant lesson i.e. the needs of an educational campus are like an ocean and the service we render are mere drops. Therefore, I am now determined to add as many drops I can and say to myself with contentment, I tried my best!

At present, Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust is running fourteen educational institutions from pre-school to post graduate college, management institute, night college, college of media studies & a counselling centre, Along with educational institutions, a women's hostel and a CA study centre and supported by many facilities provided to the institutions for smooth conduction of teaching-learning. Daily approximately 15,000 students are coming in our campus to study in different institutions. Besides parents and visitors also keep coming for various enquiries as well as to pick-up their children. To manage such a large crowd, we have made required arrangements of security, proper enquiry counters ,special directions at the entrance of each institution and various other facilities so that they do not face any inconvenience.

We have a pre-school as well as four schools and therefore for smooth flow of incoming and outgoing students, we have designated special gates for each school. School staff as well as security guards have been deputed so that there is no commotion when the morning shift students leave and the afternoon shift students enter the campus. We also have floor charts at the entrance of each institution so that the students and visitors do not face any inconvenience. With the beginning of this academic year, admissions started in junior and degree colleges as well as the management institute. Security personnel were therefore properly briefed to manage the influx of students and parents coming in the campus for admission purpose. The security personnel were indeed alert and worked efficiently to manage the crowd at the gate.

Due to lack of rains and inadequate water supply from B.M.C., we faced some water shortage in the campus. However, we gave prime importance and did detailed investigation and thereby we could augment the resources of adequate water supply. A big educational campus like ours, needs proper house-keeping and accordingly we have provided house-keeping services to each institution to keep the campus neat and clean. Very shortly, we are going to appoint a new house-keeping agency which has latest technology to deal with any kind of house-keeping issues and thereby expect further improved performance in the area of housekeeping. In the past few months, considerable improvement has been brought in, in the BMS (Building Maintenance Support) services by ensuring daily briefings to the BMS team, recording speedy services and taking action on any complaint lodged. The lead time in resolving any complaint has been considerably brought down. We also have fire fighting devices for the safety of our students and staff. We also have installed CCTV cameras in our campus. In the past few months, many interesting activities took place in our educational campus. As a part of Swachch Bharat Campaign by Bisleri India Pvt. Ltd. Students of KGSS collected large number of used Bisleri bottles and bagged 7th place in Mumbal. They were awarded the official Guinness Certificate, the Limca Record Certificate as well as Award of Appreciation. Three of our institutions gave us 100% results ie. Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School, Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School at SSC Board examination and Mainadevi Bajaj International School at IGCSE and IBDP examinations.

Our schools as well as colleges celebrated International Yoga Day in a grand manner by holding yoga sessions. Ghanshyamdas Saraf College organized a talk by celebrity nutritionist Ms. Rujuta Diwekar, Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies

organized the Convocation ceremony as well as an International Guest Session along with many other academic activities. Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies organized a series of seminars titled "Vision Media". Our Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy is progressing well and has tied-up with Institute of Distance and Open Learning, Mumbai University to conduct Online interactive lectures for B.Com syllabus. Through our Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy we are nurturing the talents of students in sports activities. I am sure that together with all my colleagues we will strive to achieve more in the coming

## Message from Director of Schools

Coming to Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust as the Director of its four schools seems like an apt culmination of a career that has spanned over two decades in some of the finest international schools in India. It is a culmination and an exciting challenge given the diverse nature of the four schools. As Head of Humanities and Social Studies first at Kodaikanal International School and then at the Mahindra United World College of India I strived to improve the teaching and learning experience in both the institutions by showcasing good practices in the classroom and in co-curricular areas. As Head of Secondary at Ecole Mondiale World School I initiated policies and processes that put the school on a firmer footing. As Principal at Don Bosco International School I led the move of the Salesian schools towards a global education. In each of these institutions, serving the needy communities around the schools has been an important aspect for me.

Throughout these two decades as an educator I have continued to contribute to the world of International Baccalaureate (IB) movement by playing many roles within the organization that have included being an examiner and moderator for Economics, a School Visiting Team Leader, an examination proctor, a Consultant and a Workshop leader. While there is much debating at present about the 'best school' and the 'best board' I have always believed that the school which aims at actualizing the potential of each and every one of its students, irrespective of their ability levels, is the one that offers the best education. With an excellent infrastructure and highly trained and dedicated staff the four schools of RSET which include Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya school for girls, Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School, Ramniwas Baja English High School and Mainadevi Bajaj International School offer an excellent learning environment for students from a variety of economic and social backgrounds. A child centric education is offered at every school. In this context I would like to particularly laud the effort made by teachers and head of our Sarvodaya Hindi medium school which caters to girls from economically marginalized backgrounds. Many of them join the school in the higher grades and come with very weak foundation in fundamentals of numeracy, literacy and inquiry. Despite this seemingly insurmountable challenge our teachers have extended themselves and managed to get a 100 per cent result in the SSC examination.

With 14 educational institutions and 15000 students on its campus, RSET is not only a hive of activity but also a repository of resources that cater to the academic and co-curricular needs of students in schools that offer education from four different boards (SSC, ICSE, CIE and IB) and institutions of higher learning that include a junior college, a college of commerce and arts, an institute of management studies, a college for media studies an

online academy and a teacher training institute among others. Giving co-curricular and guidance support to these students are the Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre, a study center, a sports hub and a skill development centre.

It will be my endeavour to encourage and facilitate the amalgamation of human and physical infrastructure of the RSET to maximize the potential of each of the institutes. In this regard we have already constituted a nodal committee of the four principals of our schools who have, at their first meeting, identified areas of cooperation and collaboration. These will include inter-school support for students appearing for board examinations, student exchanges, sporting and cultural ties as well as teacher exchanges that will include mutual lesson observations and feedback across the schools. Some initiatives that are immediately in the pipeline include the constitution of a common discipline policy across schools, a common inclusive education policy, coordinated events calendars and holidays, a common celebration of teachers' day and English language support for Hindi medium students by the Community, Activity and Service (CAS) team of MBIS students and teachers.

In order to become a community of learners it is important to make our parents an equal partner in our curricular and co-curricular programmes. In a unique step, in turn, one parent of pre-primary school at MBIS will remain present for the whole day in the classroom providing support to our teachers and learning along with our students. The parents have shown great appreciation for this initiative and are enthusiastic about it. Across all the four schools we have also launched a teacher





## Editorial

Welcome to the July issue of our quarterly bulletin Abacus giving you great news of the past three months of our educational campus. The months of April, May and June witnessed fast changes in the academic climate of the campus. April was the busiest month for all educational institutions. After the conduction of examinations followed by declaration of results, students and faculty members enjoyed summer vacation in the month of May. However, from the beginning of the month of June, admission process started in junior college, degree college as well as in professional institutes. All our institutions became busy with admissions. The college campus started buzzing with new students keen to take admission in undergraduate and postgraduate classes. In recent years, unaided job oriented programmes that are not supported by the Government aid have increased in large number in colleges and such courses are in great demand from the students. Colleges charge higher fees for these courses as they have to pay teachers from the fees collected as well as provide required technological support & other infrastructural requirements.. Many a times such courses are not affordable to middle class students and they have to take loan to pursue unaided professional courses.

Since the year 2000, the State Government has stopped giving approvals for aided divisions to colleges wanting to expand their students intake. Therefore in Mumbai, the growth of unaided seats in colleges has since been phenomenal. For professional courses like MMS in Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies in our campus, rounds of counseling took place leading to admission of students on the basis of the scores in MH-CET, CMAT etc. However, confusion prevailed for students desirous of obtaining admission in medical colleges to pursue MBBS and post graduate medical courses due to Supreme Court ruling that starting this academic session, students would have to appear for National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) to seek admission to any medical or dental colleges in the country. The major concern in this matter was the difference in State and Central syllabus. Finally the centre's ordinance was placed before the Hon'ble President which put on hold the common medical entrance exam NEET for a year for undergraduate courses and from December onwards postgraduate examinations to be held under NEET provisions.

The new academic year began with the happy note of excellent results in all the institutions of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust. Students of Kudilal Govindram Seksara Sarvodaya School and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School have made us proud by giving 100% results. Other institutions have also given us excellent results between 95% to 98%. Since last academic year, the schools are directed to conduct baseline examination twice in a year to check whether the concepts of students taught in the previous year are clear. The first baseline tests of this academic year was conducted in the month of July for the school children. Close to the heels of baseline tests comes the question of reducing the weight of school bags. According to a recent statistics, around 12% students in Maharashtra still carry overweight school bags. Mumbai has bettered its figures from 30.51% in April, 2016 to 10% in July, 2016. According to norms prescribed by the State School

Education Department, a bag should not weigh more than 10% of the student's body weight. We sincerely hope that the schools will try to find out ways to reduce the weight of the school bags which leads to adverse effects on a child's health.

On 1st May, 2016 our Trust organized Naming & Inauguration of Facilities and Endowment Fund at a dazzling function in the presence of Donors, Trustees, members of Managing Committee, dignitaries and staff of respective institutions. Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies organized a grand Convocation ceremony. Most of the institutions enthusiastically celebrated International Yoga Day on 21st June, 2016 with students participating in yoga sessions. Even as we impart education to match the advancement in technology and globalization, we need to teach our children moral values. We endeavour constantly to instill these qualities in our students so that they grow and develop into sensitive and responsible citizens of the next generation.

Each issue of Abacus is a milestone that marks our growth, unfolds our imagination and gives life to our thoughts and aspirations. 



## Dr. Sunanda Kar, Editor, Abacus in a **tête-à-tête** With Shri Shrikant Dalmia

#### When did you join Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust and who inspired you to join the Trust?

I became associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust in the year 1983. There were four great persons who inspired me to join the Trust and actively participate in the activities carried out by the Trust. First and the most important was my father Late Shri Lalchandji Dalmia who was one of the founder members of the Trust. He rendered valuable services to the Trust. The first constitution of the Trust was signed on 20th September, 1958 after the registration of the Trust and my father was one of the signatories of the constitution. Other important persons were Shri Mahavirprasadji Deora, Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf, Justice D. R. Dhanuka, Justice S. N. Jhunjhunwala and Late Shri Ramnarayanji Saraf. All of them had played very important role in the educational endeavours of RSET in the initial years of the Trust and in subsequent years in seventies and eighties.

 Since when did you start playing active role in the educational activities of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

I became involved in the activities of the Trust immediately after joining. Very soon I became Joint Secretary and thereafter Secretary, Vice President and President in the subsequent years. When I joined Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust there were only two educational institutions run by the Trust namely Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) & Durgadevi Saraf Junior College. In the year 1983, after the continuous efforts of the Trust, the Government gave its permission to start a girls' degree college affiliated to University of Mumbai. It was not an easy task and we all worked together as a team to obtain the permission from the Government and from University of Mumbai, Industrialist

and Philanthropist Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf, the Managing Trustee of Ghanshyamdas Saraf Trust came forward and donated a generous amount in the memory of his father Late Shri Ghanshyamdasji Saraf to start the degree college named as Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College (now known as Ghanshyamdas Saraf College). The college received temporary affiliation from Mumbai University and was inaugurated on 2nd July, 1983 at the worthy hands of Hon'ble Shri Sudhakar Naik, the Education Minister of the Government of Maharashtra.

Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School (formerly known as Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya) celebrated its Silver Jubilee on 11th October, 1985 at a grand function held at Rangbhavan, Dhobi Talao. His Excellency Shri Kona Prabhakar Rao, the Governor of Maharashtra, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. Shri Murli Deora, M.P. and Major Ramprasadji Podar also graced the function





as the Guests of Honour. We worked hard to make the function a great success.

#### What important activities took place when you held position as Hon. Secretary/Vice-President / President of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

During my tenure as the Secretary of RSET, the naming ceremony of Ramniwas Bajaj English High School was performed at a grand function held in RSET Campus. Shri Vinodkumar R. Bajaj and Shri Rajkamal R. Bajaj came forward with handsome donations and the school was named after their father Late Shri Ramniwasji Bajaj. The State Minister Shri Kripashankar Singh graced the occasion as the Chief Guest while Justice D.R. Dhanuka presided over the function. Many eminent personalities like Shri Dhara Prasadji Podar and members of the Management were present at the naming ceremony which was performed by Smt. Mainadeviji Bajaj.

Ghanshyamdas Saraf College completed ten years of its existence in the year 1993 and celebrated its decennial year in January, 1994. I was holding the post of Secretary of the Trust at that time. The decennial year was celebrated in a grand manner for two consecutive days in which famous industrialist and philanthropist Shri Kanti Kumar Podar and Dr. V.N. Gupchup, Pro Vice-Chancellor, Mumbai University graced the occasion as the Chief Guest and the Guest of Honour at the inaugural function held on 8th January, 1994 at Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan. Dr. M.D. Bengali, Former Vice-Chancellor, Mumbai University was also invited to deliver a talk on the occasion.

The college entered into a new phase in the year 1997. In this year a new college building was constructed with ground plus five storied building. The new spacious college building was inaugurated by His Excellency Dr. P.C. Alexander, Governor of Maharashtra at a glittering function on 3rd July, 1997 and with Dr. Snehalata Deshmukh, Vice Chancellor, University of Mumbai, as the Guest of Honour. Many other dignitaries such as Justice D.R. Dhanuka, Judge, Mumbai High Court, Dr. Naresh Chandra Pro Vice-chancellor, Mumbai University were also present on that memorable function. The college was then shifted to the new building. During this time, I was holding the position of Treasurer in the Trust.

The college achieved a noteworthy standard of excellence by obtaining 'A' Grade from National Assessment & Accreditation Council, Bangalore, in the year 2004. This was followed by a grand celebration at which the certificate was awarded to the Principal and Vice-Principal by Dr. V.S. Prasad, Director, NAAC, Bangalore and Dr. V.N. Rajsekaran Pillai, Vice-Chairman UGC, New Delhi. Dr. Sunanda Kar was specially felicitated by the Management at a separate function along with Dr. N. N. Pandey, Vice-Principal for this unique achievement by Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf and Justice Shri D.R. Dhanukaji. At that time I was holding the post Vice-President of the Trust.

We also celebrated Golden Jubilee of Rajasthani Sammelan in the year 1999. A grand celebration of four days from 16th December to 19th December, 1999 was organized in R.S. Campus in which

famous industrialist and philanthropist Shri Mahavirprasadji Tapadia graced the occasion as the Chief Guest while Shri Satyanarayanji Jhunjhunwala, eminent legal luminary and Shri Mahavirprasad G. Saraf, famous industrialist and philanthropist were invited as Guests of Honour for the Golden Jubilee celebrations. Famous bhajan singer Shri Anoop Jalota was also invited on the last day of the function, who gave a beautiful rendering of bhajans. Eminent persons like Shri Mahavirprasadji Deora, other Trustees of RSET, Managing Committee members and Staff attended the function. We also felicitated the Principals, Staff, Teaching and Non-teaching staff of all the institutions. Being one of the Office bearer of the Trust, I was involved in all the planning & other activities to make the function a grand success.

During the years 2003-2005, I was the Vice-President of the Trust. At that time, the members of the Trust felt the need of technical support for education and therefore Kirandevi Saraf Learning Centre was constructed on the second floor of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College with high tech learning resources having audio visual equipments, internet facility, overhead projector, microphone system and many other modern equipments to facilitate teaching learning of students. Kirandevi Saraf Learning Centre was inaugurated on 7th September, 2003 by Prof. Rupa B. Shah, Vice Chancellor, S.N.D.T. University, Mumbai. On the same day, newly renovated Durgadevi Saraf Hall was inaugurated by Shri Kripashankar Singh, Minister for Urban Development, State of Maharashtra followed by naming ceremony of Durgadevi Saraf Junior College by Smt. Jaywantiben Mehta, Minister of Power, Govt. of Maharashtra.

Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha) and National Treasurer BJP, inauguration of Draupadidevi Sanwarmal Women's Hostel (January, 2010) by H.E. Shri K. We at Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust have felicitated distinguished personalities from time to time. On 24th March, 2012 we felicitated Hon'ble Justice Ramesh D. I had played an important role for the smooth conduction of the function and was in regular contact with Justice Ramesh Dhanuka, Shri D.R. Dhanuka and other family members to make the function a grand success.



#### Tell us about your role in the recent educational endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

In the year 2007, the Managing Committee of RSET decided to embark upon a mega plan of a total revamp of our campus by constructing a building with 12 floors by demolishing our old school building of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School. It was also decided to extend educational facilities in our campus by starting a Management Institute, an International School, a Women's Hostel, relocate the school in a new building with all modern amenities. All such decisions were taken at the Managing Committee meetings and I regularly attended the meetings and also actively participated in taking such decisions. We also took decision of providing various facilities to the students in the campus that included Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Couseling Centre, a branch of Bank of Baroda, Ramnarayan Saraf Educational Outlet, Vijay Pal Singh Health Centre & Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy. As a member of Managing Committee & Board of Trustees, I always participated in taking such decisions followed by execution of our projects.

Recently, our family donated Golf Carts for internal transportation in memory of our father Late Shri Lalchandji Dalmia at a grand function held in the campus.

#### Can you recollect some important events which you would like to mention in this context?

There are many important events that I can recollect in the last 33 years. However, one of the most important event was getting permission from Education Department to start Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College in 1983. It was a difficult task and we had to work very hard for the same. It was necessary to start a girls' college affiliated to University of Mumbai as most of the conservative families did not send their daughters in co-education colleges at that time. Hence, it was a great occasion when the college was inaugurated in July 1983. There are other memorable events such as the Bhoomi Poojan of the new building held on 26th April, 2009 which totally gave a newlook to the infrastructure in RSET Campus.

#### What is your message to the present team of Office Bearers and Managing Committee members of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

Under the leadership of Shri Ashokji Saraf, President, RSET, the present team of Office Bearers and Managing Committee members have been working very hard for revamp and expansion of infrastructural facilities in the campus. They have not only worked for infrastructure but at the same time extended educational facilities in the form of a Management Institute, an International School, a Media College, a Night College, an International Playschool and an Online Academy. A Women's Hostel has also been started within the campus. Other facilities like



Summing, our motto Coming together is a Beginning, Keeping together is progress, Working together is success.








Admission in progress for FYJC.






The college was the centre for T.Y.B.Com. and third year self finance courses exams during the month of April.

- 29th April, 2016- As a part of Global Quest initiative, DSIMS organised an International Guest Session on 29 April, 2016. A distinguished Professor and a prolific Researcher Dr David Zepeda of D'AmoreMcKim School of Business, Northeastern University, Boston, Massachusetts delivered a session on Supply Chain Management in Health Care Industry. Dr Zepeda highlighted the criticality of managing technology & resources across health care supply chain. Empirical data reveals that health care sector lags behind in supply chain performance in comparison to other industries. He summarized his address by reflecting on effective management of supply chain risk through horizontal inter organisational arrangements among hospitals on their inventory costs. He compared Indian health care with their global peers and showed a few relatively new Indian hospitals have devised ways of providing world class health care at ultra low cost with quality comparable to best in class USA & EU hospitals. ### **IDOL Lecture Series:**

In conjunction with the massive undertaking of creating eLearning content for B. Com subjects of Mumbai University, GOLD has conducted a Preparatory Lecture Series for the students of IDOL which is the distance learning initiative of Mumbai University. In this series we conducted live, online, interactive lectures in every subject for B. com subjects of all three years. GOLD also conducted sessions for discussion on paper pattern and query resolution to clear students' doubts. Each session was attended by almost a hundred students and was very well received. The Faculty members who took these sessions were very excited to use this new platform to reach students and have pledged their support for our future endeavors.

GOLD also set up an online notice board which gave daily updates to students about their exam time table, hall tickets, Exam centres etc., and students were thankful to get all the information at one place. We established a student helpline and online support, where students could send their queries and doubts not only about the study material but also about administrative issues. Each and every query or message was answered within 36 hours and students were very happy with this system.

### Gap Analysis:

GOLD has undertaken the task of doing a gap analysis between the B. Com. Syllabus of Mumbai University and that of 6 other universities, to find out what are the additional topics covered in each of these universities. When we finish creating the eLearning,

multimedia content for these remaining topics, we will have a superset of content which will cover the syllabus of all 7 universities. This also means that if we want to approach more universities, then more than 95% of the content should already be ready with us and we will just need to tweak it up a little bit to cover the B. com Syllabus content of almost every university in India! Using this Super-content, we aim to approach other universities to conduct similar activities for their students as we did for the Mumbai University/IDOL students.

### IDOL Distance Education:

We have submitted the closure report for all the activities conducted for IDOL in the last one year, and the Director of IDOL, Dr. Ambuja Salgaonkar is happy with what we have been able to accomplish this year. We have also indicated to IDOL and Mumbai University, our interest is recruiting students for their B. Com and M. Com. courses through the digital marketing space.

The Director IDOL had invited about 90 vendors from the eLearning field to present their capability of conducting online courses suitable for the university students. GOLD was represented by Mrs. Vandana Dandeker and Mr. Ravindra Kale and we were pleased to see that two of the courses which we had sent details about, were designated against our name.





(Founder, CMD — Nrityanjali) is a practicing Psychologist, Counselor, Corporate Trainer & Consultant, Performing Artist and Educationist. Born on 12th September, 1947, Dr. Tushar Guha received Ph.D in Personality Development from U.S.A. He is Master of Arts in Economics and an Honours Graduate in English Literature.

His name is included in the 'International Who's Who of Intellectuals' by the International Biographical Centre, Cambridge, England.

Dr. Tushar Guha is the Personality Development pioneer in India and member of the Syllabus Committee, Maharashtra Board.

Art Education relates to the performing arts - dance, music and drama and also the fine arts as is drawing/painting /sculpting etc. It so happens that my doctorate thesis on this very subject with special reference to the performing arts is "Utilizing the elements of performing arts into day to day life to make a complete personality".

I have always believed that those who are not performing artistes could always imbibe the benefits of the performing art forms if they are exposed to the elements that enhance these arts and the artiste. Throughout my 40 years in education and performing arts, I have experienced that performing arts enthuses and encourages the development of - Self Confidence, Strength of Mind and Logic, which can rightly be called the building blocks of an effective personality.

These three aspects, in fact are the core essence of good education. An individual who is highly qualified academically, but does not possess the above three qualities will find it difficult to attain success in it's true sense. Education in it's true spirit should enable an all round development in every child. Innovations and changes as per the changing times therefore are mandatory to achieve this. Art education therefore should be integrated with the regular curriculum for everyone to enjoy the benefits of the same. When we say ART EDUCATION, we mean the performing arts as well as the fine arts. Integrating this into the education system would mean UTILISING THE ELEMENTS OF PERFORMING ARTS IN DAY TO DAY LIFE TO ENHANCE A PERSONALITY (My PhD thesis).

Let me now elaborate on the role of performing arts in education. I remember, in 1993 at the seven days National Conference of Fine Arts, Education & Personality Development held in Mumbai where I was the Chairperson, I had stressed on the need of utilizing the elements of performing arts in education and training. There is a difference in what I have stressed and the regular performing arts classes. Way back in 1993, as well as now, almost every educational institution conducts dance, drama, singing or music classes as their initiative towards extra curricular activities and all round development of a child. But I am not talking about these classes, as, these classes naturally tend to be selective, i.e., only those who desire to pursue performing arts continue to learn here.

On the other hand, classes for utilizing the elements of performing arts are different. No individual is directed towards becoming a dancer, singer, actor or musician, but in a very subtle, participatory and enjoyable method, the individual gains the advantages enjoyed by the performing artistes.

Now, what are these elements? They are both psychological and physical. These elements teach:

 Appreciation of Self - Body and Mind. When we are able to appreciate ourselves, we are in a happy state of mind and we tend to become less critical of others.

2] Science of Mirror as evolved by me is the tool to achieve Appreciation of self. The explanation:

a) Every Individual experiences different emotions and expresses them in different ways While the people around him have complete knowledge about the same, is he aware of his expressions?

b) The science is: The brain is like a memory card. Once we see our different expressions in the mirror and get comfortable with the same, it naturally registers in our mind and we are able to retrieve it as and when required. It is like a camera or a computer output that is got after feeding data.

c) Since expressions (Navarasas) are a predominant feature of performing arts and every artiste is adept at these, this element is one of the important aspects developed through the science of mirror in an individual who is not a performing artiste. It also helps in breaking down inhibitions thereby making an individual more confident.

3] The afore mentioned points build up Self Confidence through a natural process namely accepting oneself as one is and not seeing self as one wishes to be.

4] Self Confidence, appreciation and comfort level due to acceptance of the self develop a positive attitude in an individual.

5] The various poses and foot and hand movements of any dance form can be taught as simple physical exercises to develop physical agility, grace, and poise as well as a good gait.

6] The various expressions compel us to be analytical as they are the integral part of our non-verbal communication. This Analysis is related both to self and understanding of others. In my paper of practical dimension to Transactional Analysis, I have elaborated on the relationship between the sender and the receiver. For perfect communication, it is important that the sender understands the capacity of the receiver to receive and communicates accordingly.

7] The knowledge of self (body and mind), coupled with a valid analytical intellect, develops strength of mind.

8] Through a very natural process, performing arts imparts mental discipline and values.

The performing arts can be used effectively to teach subjects ranging from Math to Science to History and Geography. This would help in children enjoying the benefits of the performing art forms and become effective communicators without the pressure of having to become excellent artistes. When a child is forced to sing or dance or act when he does not have the basic inclination, not only does he develop a distaste for the art, he also suffers from an inferiority complex, a sense of failure which can well be avoided if Art Education can be made a fun learning experience thereby having dual benefits of making learning lessons a fun experience too. Apart from the performing arts, fine arts such as drawing and painting also form an integral part of education. Through drawing and painting children can be introduced to the concepts of space, colors, design, and the human anatomy. Space and design are important lessons for budding architects and designers whether fashion, industrial or mechanical. Drawing and painting also bring out the creativity and imagination in every child and also help in making an individual sensitive and empathetic. They become an important medium for self expression. Apart from the benefits to the soul, it also makes a lucrative career to those who want to pursue it seriously.

Above all, the greatest contribution of performing arts and fine arts is the development of a sense for AESTHETICS - an eye for beauty, refinement and elegance, which in turn brings in humility and enhances one's personality.
