





We received donation from Shri Vinodkumar R. Bajaj and Shri Rajkamal R. Bajaj in this educational endeavour of starting International Playschool.

In the area of infrastructural development, we constructed a state of art building having seven floors to house Ramniwas Baiai English High School and Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies. The Media College was inaugurated with great fanfare by Dr. Subhash Chandra, Zee Essel Group Chairman on 29th August, 2014. The event was graced by Shri Sajjan D. Goenka, Main Donor, his family members and other dignitaries. We also received affiliation from University of Mumbai and permission from the State Government to start the courses of Mumbai University in our Media College. Meanwhile, process of affiliation of Ramniwas Bajaj English High School with ICSE Board went hand in hand & the same was received in the year 2015. Eminent Industrialist and Philanthropist Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf gave us a handsome donation for starting Kirandevi Saraf Library and Reading Room which was inaugurated on 29th August, 2014 by Shri Jairaj C. Thacker, Chairman, Jamnabai Narsee School and President of Dr. Balabhai Nanavati Hospital. We also provided facility of an educational outlet & a health centre in the campus that were named as Ramnarayan Saraf Educational Outlet & Vijaypal Singh Health Centre respectively with the donations received from Shri Vinay Saraf, Smt Sushma Jhunjhunwala & family (for educational outlet) & Shri Ram Manohar Singh (for health centre).

Meanwhile, we felt a strong desire to extend our educational facilities beyond the boundaries of our campus by starting Online education so that we can reach to the remotest villages in Maharashtra and other places in India. Shri Badrinarain K. Goyal and Shri Ravi B. Goyal came forward to realize our dream of starting an Online Academy




(GOLD Academy) by giving handsome donation. Thus, we established Kunibihari S. Goyal Online Academy which was inaugurated on 16th January, 2015 at a glittering function by Shri Vinod Tawde, Hon'ble Minister of Education, Maharashtra, in the presence of the Donor family and other dignitaries. At present, GOLD Academy has more than 45,000 students enrolled with its portal. Soon, we started the construction work of Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy, covering an area of 29,000 sq. ft. which was inaugurated on 18th April, 2015 at a glittering function by Shri Sujay Jairaj, Trustee, Jamnabai Narsee School at Rajasthani Sammelan Education Campus. PDSA offers sports facilities like Tennis, Basketball, Box Cricket, Football, Volleyball etc. The turfs imported from New Zealand, are made to international standards. We also started RS CA Study Centre and ICAI Extension Counter for the benefit of CA students. We not only extended educational facilities to the students but also created various endowment funds with strong support received from Shri Virendra Mhaiskar (IRB Scholarship Endowment Fund), Shri Arvind Poddar (BKT Endowment Freeship Fund) and Shri Ramprakash Bubna (Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Endowment Freeship Fund) that helped many meritorious and needy students to pursue education from school to college and up to professional level.

As we Office Bearers of RSET take charge for the third term, we rededicate ourselves to the cause of education. We have many projects that are lined ahead to be completed in the near future. 

In our first term as Office Bearers of RSET (2007-2012), we all worked zealously with a unified spirit of dedication to complete successfully a building with twelve floors in the campus and to start Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies, Mainadevi Bajaj International School, Draupadidevi Sanwarmal Women's Hostel, Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre and also to house Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School in new building. In our second term, construction of the building of Ramniwas Bajaj English High School and Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies was completed at a fast speed. The affiliation of Ramniwas Bajaj English High School from ICSE Board and Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies from University of Mumbai and permission from State Government was also received. DGMC was inaugurated on 29th August, 2014 by Dr. Subhash Chandra, Zee Essel Group Chairman, at a glittering function on the auspicious Ganesh Chaturthi Day. The event was also graced by Shri Sajjan Goenka, Main Donor, along with family members, other dignitaries, members of Management, Staff and Students. We felt the need of proper sports facilities for healthy physical growth of our students. Therefore, with the donations received from Shri Harish P. Shah and Smt. Bina H. Shah, Trustees of Signet Foundation, we started the construction of our Sports Academy which was named as Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy in the name of his father.

The Sports Academy was inaugurated on 18th April, 2015 at a grand function by Shri Sujay Jairaj, Trustee, Jamnabai Narsee School at RSET Campus. On the same day, naming ceremony of the library of Mainadevi Bajaj International School as Amratlal Premchand Shah Library was performed by Smt. Ramaben A. Shah in the presence of the Donors of the library Shri Pravinchandra D. Shah, Shri Harish Shah, Smt. Bina Shah and other Dignitaries.

During this term, we also decided to work on launching an Online Academy with the aim of providing free or affordable education to all students in urban and rural areas. With the kind donation received



from Shri Badrinarain Goval and Shri Ravi Goval, we were successful in establishing Kunibihari S. Goval Online Academy (GOLD Academy) which was inaugurated on 16th January, 2015 by Shri Vinod Tawde, Hon'ble Minister of Education, Maharashtra, in the presence of other dignitaries. At present, GOLD Academy has more than 45,000 students enrolled with its portal to take benefit of online lectures for B.Com syllabus of Mumbai University. RSET has always given due emphasis to extra-curricular activities along with academics. All the institutions have been celebrating together Republic Day and Independence Day in RSET Campus every year with great enthusiasm. We have appointed well qualified teachers in all the institutions and have provided latest technology support, library books, journals, newspapers as well as e-books and journals. It is a matter of great pleasure that results of all our institutions have been excellent especially of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School which has given 100% result at SSC Board examination for twelve successive years.

In all these years, many scholars and academician of international repute visited our educational campus. Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies and Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies signed a MOU with the prestigious University of East London. DSIMS also recently signed a MOU with Ottawa University, Kansas, USA for academic collaboration followed by visit of PGDM students in Ottawa University for eight weeks, where they completed two certificate courses. Mainadevi Bajaj International School also conducted Student Exchange Programme with Scheffel Gymnasium School, Germany and is planning a Student Exchange Programme with Walburg College Zwiindrecht, Nederlands in the near future. In the present term, we have many challenges ahead. With substantial donation received from Shri Ramprakash B. Bubna, we are starting a Boys' Hostel very soon near our campus. We have also received permission from the State Government to start an autonomous Self-Financed University which will be another milestone for RSET and a step further towards attaining our objective of 'Education for All'.

We solicit co-operation and support from all our Donors, Trustees, Members and well wishers to be part of our educational endeavour.

To cite an example, our first batch of 10th Standard students of RBHS (ICSE Board) passed out with outstanding results and all 05 students passed out with distinction. The first and second toppers scored 95.8% and 95.20 % respectively. With the new Principal joining RBHS School, we are rest assured that the future of all the Board bound students is in safe hands to ensure this kind of success in future too. All the other Schools have done equally good well in this Key Result Area (KRA). To sum up with aquote "Centuries ago, battles were fought with swords and shields. Today, battles are fought with knowledge and degrees". Congratulations to all hard working teachers and students for empowering yourself.

During the month of May, many institutions had summer break for the teaching faculty. However, the platter was full for the Principals and their non-teaching staff as this was the crucial time for getting all the repair and maintenance schedules completed so that they are ready for the new session in June for the smooth conduct of academic activities. Thus the Principals and the concerned non-teaching staff with the help of service agencies like Project Team, BMS and Housekeeping have ensured that all the planned vacation work was completed in time. Construction of the seventh floor of DGMC was taken up and is in full swing which is likely to be completed very soon. Painting of the entire RBHS (the school building is shining and looking very bright), repairs of benches, making a revised property inventories, removing of the scrap items, repairs of non-working fans, necessary plumbing work, getting the area inside and outside the buildings neat and clean,

etc was completed before the reopening of the schools.

For administrative activities this period was very crucial for getting the AMCs and repairs done up wherever it was required. Thus we have thoroughly gone in to this exercise and renewed the various AMCS like the AC maintenance, Transformer AMC, major repairs of PDSA toilets. Load testing of 600 KV DG, Terraces Cleaning, Aqua Guard Machines, maintenance of Coolers, Entrance Glass Doors, Nullah cleaning and the Drainage cleaning, Chair repairs, Planning and implementing the Gates opening/closing timings, Adhering to all the Pre monsoon BMC Notices and getting all the work as per the Govt, rules and regulations, Erecting the Monsoon shed so as to protect the staff and students during monsoon, Elevator Maintenance, procurement of Fire Extinguishers and so many other routine civil works periodicals and maintenance was undertaken. To get all these work done, regular coordination meetings were required and glad to share that the staff at RSET offered full cooperation and the outcome of all the meetings was very successful and it became easy to implement the agenda of all the meetings held.

A major achievement at the RSET was that we have recently bought a seven storied building which will be converted in to a state of art Boys' Hostel very soon. Here, the inmates will be provided with all the kinds of facilities like the meals, AC Rooms, laundry, a specially designed study area and the entertainment area separately, 24×7 security and the entire area under CCTV coverage(already done). Needless to say that the aesthetics and interiors will be designed and implemented by the top architect(s).

Recently, we have hired a large number of sports coaches for the games of Football, Basket Ball, Lawn Tennis, Cricket and many other games, so that our students get professionally trained in these games and hope they represent our schools and college at National level and bring laurels to them and the Institutions to which they belong. This initiative will alsoensure greater utilization of our state of art world class turf at PDSA. The other activities like placement, corporate interactions with galaxy of industry stalwarts and professionals, workshops/seminars/events like the International Yoga Day on 21st June 2017, Tree Plantation, SarvaShikshaAbhiyan, Alumni meet, Outreach Programs ,NSS, NCC, Faculty Development Programmes were conducted successfully to justify the quote that "Exams and grades are temporary but the education is permanent".

At RSET we take the pride in stating that we have a state—of-the-art Women's Hostel which is always in demand from the Girls from all over India and few students from foreign countries too would like to stay here in Mumbai for their studies. Hence charting out the comprehensive Hostel Policy becomes that much important. This activity was undertaken during this period under review and the same has been shared with all the concerned for its effective and smooth implementation.

Message from Director of Schools

April, May and June, the months of anxiety for schools, parents and students have come and gone and we are already in the midst of a new academic year. Students from all our schools appeared for their board examinations in March, April and May and the results have been declared.

All the schools have produced results on expected lines but the cherry on the cake has been the performance of our first batch of ICSE students of Ramniwas Bajaj High School. Leading up to the examination a concerted effort was put in by the teachers and the students. They were called for many extra sessions, subject-wise individual strengths and weaknesses were identified and appropriate support was given. The results surpassed all our expectations. Not only did the school secure a 100 per cent result, all the students scored over 75 per cent marks. Two of our toppers scored 95 per cent marks and there was an atmosphere of jubilation among staff, students and parents. It was also a moment for sober thinking since the first batch had set a benchmark which others would have to emulate in the years to come.

While the two schools affiliated to the state board – KGES and KGSS – and MBIS, our international school, also produced good results we have decided not to sit back on our laurels and have taken many steps to support students in improving their achievements. Recognising that good results are an outcome of good learning experiences throughout a student's stay with a school, all the four schools have undertaken an exercise to identify the strengths and weaknesses of its students across all classes and begin the process of additional support. Many schools tend to pay additional attention to the slow learner but we have begun a process of devising teaching techniques and approaches to learning that will challenge the advanced learners appropriately.

The principals of our schools have clearly demonstrated during meetings that they are not satisfied with producing a 100 per cent result but will aspire to produce students who will stand out as toppers in their respective boards. With this in mind they have drawn up merit lists of students in the higher classes and within these they are in the process of identifying students who could be given extra support to achieve highest merit.

Institutions of RSET have always been focused on giving their students a holistic educational experience. This means that while academics plays an important role in the lives of our students, it is




also important to participate in and excel in co-curricular areas. Keeping this in mind we have taken steps to make fuller use of our infrastructure that supports the sporting activities in our schools.

PDSA, the large sporting complex that is the pride of RSET, will not only be fully utilized by the institutes but will also host many interschool tournaments. The year has already begun with the hosting of a basketball tournament in which nine schools, including three of RSET, participated. This issue brings with it many noteworthy events taking place in our country and city as well as in RSET Campus. On Tuesday 25th July, 2017 Shri Ram Nath Kovind was sworn in as India's 14th President in an impressive ceremony in Parliament's Central Hall, New Delhi, marking a change in guard. The swearing in was followed by Hon'ble President's address to the gathering in which he stressed on - Diversity as the Key to India's success. He further expressed his pride in the cultural heritage and spirituality of our country and emphasized that 'India of the 21st century must combine tradition and technology'. The month of July also saw women in blue, our own women's cricket team giving a tough time to that of England's team. Although Indian team was defeated by England's team by a low margins of nine runs in ICC Women's World Cup 2017 final at Lord's Cricket ground in London, we are happy that women's cricket team is finally making the headlines. Coming to the academic scenario, past three months of April, May and June witnessed fast changes in the academic climate of our campus. April was the busiest month for all educational institutions. After the conduction of examinations followed by declaration of results, students and faculty members enjoyed summer vacation in the month of May.

However, students of science stream who appeared for HSC examination and have been aspiring for Engineering and

This year Mumbai University had taken decision for onscreen evaluation of answer books of all examinations conducted for the first half of the year 2017. Therefore many faculty members remained busy evaluating answer books of final year examinations throughout the vacation. After the declaration of SSC and HSC results admission process started in Junior and Degree colleges as well as in professional institutes. As per the recent trends, Self Financed job oriented undergraduate courses are in great demand from the students inspite of the higher fee structure for these courses. With the beginning of new academic year, we are receiving many circulars from school education department. Under the provisions of RTE Act 2009, students are promoted automatically to higher classes till class VIII. The Union Cabinet has recently scrapped off the no detention policy. Now the schools will be able to detain students in Std V and Std VIII fit hey fail in the year end examination. However students will have to be given a second chance to improve by appearing for an additional examination before they are detained. Starting from this academic year class IX students will not have internal examinations for languages and social sciences. Similarly class XI students will have a new paper pattern for chemistry, biology and mathematics. The patterns has been changed so that students from State Board junior colleges can fare better in entrance exams like NEET & JEE.

Back to our campus, students of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School and Ramniwas Bajaj English High School made us proud by 100% result at SSC and ICSE Board examinations respectively. Students of Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School presented a demonstration in Netball at Mumbai University grounds in the presence of Australian Prime Minister Mr. Malcolm Turnbull, Hon'ble Sports Minister of State Shri Vijay Goel, Cricketer Shri Sachin Tendulkar and other dignitaries. All the institutions celebrated International Yoga Day by organizing yoga workshops and techniques of meditation. In the institution of higher education, many important events took place. Ghanshyamdas Saraf College received permission from University of Mumbai to enroll students for Ph.D in Commerce and Economics. Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies successfully held the Fifth Annual Convocation Ceremony on May 6, 2017 to present Diplomas to PGDM students and Degrees conferred by the University of Mumbai to the MMS students and Part Time Masters batch. Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies also arranged their Convocation Ceremony for PGDM students on May 13, 2017 at a glittering function. PGDM students of Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies visited Ottawa University, Kansas, USA for 8 weeks and completed two short term certificate courses during that period. Three of the PGDM students also received an opportunity to pursue Summer Internship Programme at Ottawa University.

In the month of June, election of the Managing Committee of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust was held. All the previous elected Trustees and members of Managing Committee were elected unopposed for further five years term of 2017-2022. This was followed by the election of Office Bearers. Shri Ashok M. Saraf as the President and Shri Kailash Kejriwalas the Secretary of the Trust were elected unanimously for the third time. In the same way, other Office Bearers namely Shri Vinod Kumar Bajaj as Vice-President, Shri Banwarilal Jhunjhunwala as Treasurer, Shri Jagdish Prasad Khemka as Jt. Treasurer, Shri Sunil S. Kabra and Shri Lalit S. Saraf as Jt.

Through this issue of Abacus, we acquaint our readers to Shri Ashok Mody, the architect behind the planning of this infrastructure of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust.

About Shri Ashok Mody

Shri Ashok Mody is a senior architect, practicing since the last 50 years. He has been a vital voice in growth of our city, especially in the real estate sector. After graduating from Sir J.J. College of Architecture in 1971, he joined KaraniAndSanghoi, Architects as a Senior Architect.Karani and Sanghoi were very well reputed architects with a string of successful residential projects in South Mumbai.

In the year 1975, when Karani and Sanghoi decided to open an office in U.A.E., Shri Ashok moved to Sharjah and started Architectural Consultancy with local partner Abdul Rehman Bukhatir. Over the 5 years that he was based in U.A.E., the firm designed many prestigious projects for the Ruler of Sharjah which included Township development of Dibba, 1000 Villasat Sharjah. Holiday Inn Hotel at Khor Fakkan, etc. Owing to his success and recognition in the fast developing Middle East, Shri Ashok Mody was selected and appeared in Biographical Record "WHO'S WHO IN THE WORLD" Fourth Edition, 1978.

Upon returning to India in 1980, Shri Ashok Mody rejoined Karani and Sanghoi Associates as a partner and then later formed Architectural Consultants with his cousin, Mr. Jagdish Shah. Shri Ashok Mody and his partners were Shri **Ashok Mody** and his **Architectural** with **Endeavours** Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust





instrumental in changing the face of suburban development in Mumbai through several well-designed townships like Gokuldham and Yashodham at Goregaon, Anand Nagar at Dahisar, Srishti at Mira Road etc. Besides Township projects, their portfolio included many residential, commercial and educational buildings in Mumbai and beyond. In 2011, takingheed to the changing face of design practice, Shri Ashok Mody started ConnectfourDesign Studio LLP with Rujuta Mody and Manoj Patel. This firm offers total design solutions, from Project Strategy, Architecture, Interior Design and Branding. The firm has many projects ongoing currently in Mumbai, Bhayander, Nagpur, Bangalore etc.

Besides Architecture, Shri Ashok Mody has developed a keen interest in art and has had several exhibitions in the past few years. His style is colourful, abstract and graphic. His work revolves around themes like Mahatma Gandhi and his principles of non violence, people of India, architectural wonders etc.

Shri Ashok Mody became associated with RSET way back in the early eighties when the Management of the Trust planned to construct a separate building for Ghanshyamdas Saraf College. Under his able planning, the building was constructed and was inaugurated in the year 1997 by Dr.P.C. Alexander, the then Governor of Maharashtra.

In the year 2007, the Management under the leadership of Shri Ashok M. Saraf, President, RSET, planned to revamp the campus and also extend educational facilities by starting a Management Institute, an International School, an English Medium School, a Media College and many other facilities. The Management once again contacted Shri Ashok Mody who planned a structure of twelve floors to house most of these new institutions.

His work initially started by planning construction of a transit school in the sports ground of the campus to shift the schools housed in the old school buildings. At the same time the planning and the construction of new building commenced . This building with twelve floors presently houses Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies, Mainadevi Bajaj International School, Mainadevi Bajaj International Playschool, Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School, Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School and Draupadidevi Sanwarmal Women's Hostel. Along with him, his daughter Ms. Rujuta Mody became equally involved in the projects of RSET.



His office staff have also been equally supportive and polite and have been helping us whenever we require help regarding infrastructural queries.

Through this issue of Abacus we acknowledge the contributions of Shri Ashok Mody for proper planning of the campus and also helping in the construction of the buildings in the campus and thereby realizing the vision of the Management.





Excerpts of interview of Shri Ashok Mody



1. How did you get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

I got associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust due to my professional relationship with Shri Ramnarayan Saraf. He introduced me to his brother, Shri Mahavirprasad Saraf, when the Trust wanted to construct Ghanshyamdas Saraf College in 1980s. We worked together with these two gentlemen for this good cause and donated our services as Architects free of cost.

2. During your association with RSET you had the opportunity to work with various Office bearers and Managing Committee members like Shri Vishwanathji Podar, Shri Ramnarayanji Saraf, Shri Ashokji Saraf. Could you briefly share with us your experience in working with these different visionaries?

The Office bearers and Managing Committee members of RSET have all been dynamic men, passionate about the Trust and working selflessly towards its betterment. I have had very good personal rapport with all the members of the Managing Committee. Ours has been a relationship full of mutual trust and respect.

3. How would you compare the architectural façade that typical educational institutes had in early 50's with the modern structures that are being built today. What do you think has necessitated this change?

In earlier times, institutions were looked upon quite differently from today. There was a certain hierarchy within the workings of institutions that necessitated their designs to be designed as imposing structures, where a student felt in awe or humbled while entering and when inside. Traditional forms of architecture, like capitals, grand porches and domes were used to create such imposing built forms. Institutions today are more democratic in their approach, and hence the building design is reflective of this. Modernism in architecture was basically a democratic movement, and it has inspired change in many traditional

typologies-educational institutes are also responding to this change.

4. The concept of multiple institutions with its own separate identities being housed in a common structure must have posed an architectural challenge for you. How did you manage to bring in a common identity for RSET yet maintain the individual identities of the institutions?

Early in the design process for the project, we were given two key requirements by Shri Ashok Saraf. Firstly, each of the many institutions had to have its separate entry directly off the main S.V. Road, and secondly, each institute had to have some frontage on the main façade. We devised as system of staircases and elevators that would feed all the various institutes from the ground floor to the hostel floor-while maintaining a unique entry at the ground level for each institute. The entire building was based upon a grid derived from the size of one classroom. As per requirements of each institute, this grid was modified on various floors. A similargrid system was designed for the main street facing elevation. Then within this grid, we played with the materials to highlight different institutes. Thus we created diversity in the design.

5. How has this project been unique and different from the other architectural projects that you have worked on?

The complexity of the programme for this building, with the various institutes, coupled with a tight site, made this a very challenging project. We were involved in all aspects of this project, right from Architectural and Interior Design to the vision and branding. We designed the Logo too.

6. You were also mandated to design the logo of RSET and the logos of various institutions of the umbrella brand. Could you give us some insights about the evolution of the logo?

Connect Four is a firm that believes in total design solutions. We offer Branding and Strategy along with Architecture and Interior Design. After long discussions with various stakeholders, we came up with the concept of a constellation. RSET was the Sun that energized the





system and around which the various other institutes orbited. Graphically, we chose the ancient Indian depiction of the Mandala to represent this. The main logo is thus a modernized Mandala, and the various institutes are fragments of the same, designed cleverly to represent the first letter of each Institute.

7. You have worked on a wide spectrum of projects ranging from educational institutions to commercial and residential projects. Which did you find the most interesting to work on?

Connect Four has a wide ranging practice. We enjoy the challenge that each type of project brings to the table, whatever the typology. Educational institutes hold a pride of place in our portfolio as we believe very strongly in the need for an interesting and responsive environment for the complete development of a student.

8. According to you which is the best architecturally designed educational campus in Mumbai? And why?

I would have to say that the original design of Jamnabai Narsee School, Juhu was very innovative and modern in its outlook.

9. With Mumbai going vertical as a consequence of very small land parcels available, what architectural challenges do you foresee in designing educational institutions?


There is a huge challenge for educational institutes in a city like Mumbai. On the one hand, the state grants extra area to institutes (FSI of upto 4.0). But the height that any educational institute can now go up to is 30 m, or 7 floors. Thus it becomes challenging to build up the entire area within the tight site. Also when an educational institute is taller than 4 floors, vertical circulation becomes a major factor in the design, as does fire safety.







Dr Anil Sahasrabudhe, Chairman All India Council for Technical





eing in teaching and consulting since last 30 odd years in Management institutes and in Intellectual Thought Forum for Medical Education, my orientation is not from academics alone but I look at the students who would pass out and make their careers.

As the times are changing fast and employability is being an issue, as an outsider. I have stated my perspective in this article.

Do we prepare our students for future with old methods, values, decisions, or do we orient them for living in future?

What values do we wish to imbibe and if so are we ready or are we going to stick to our old paradigm?

This is a major question which can be deliberated before we start looking at education. Are we providing enough knowledge and skills for students for the future?

Education is all a matter of building bridges. The nation's progress lies in providing the highly developed skills and knowledge to the youth. India has one of the largest higher education systems in the world like policy making, Regulation and Accreditation. However, there is still a lot of potential for further development in the education system. The Indian education system recognizes the role of education in instilling the values of secularism, constitutional and respect for democratic traditions and civil liberties and pursuit for justice. We need to put these basics in our syllabus.

This article is focusing on New Pathways in Higher Education - Management and Medical In India, Educational progress is fundamental – but building a skilled workforce for nation and improving their live hoods is the critical task as a country grows. However, the quality of education – basically the Indian education system – is a long faced issue in India as our system is one-dimensional and lays emphasis only on scoring marks, rote learning and on memorizing the facts rather than thoroughly understanding the concepts. The absence of learning and low quality of teaching has its impact on the students. Dropouts are even higher among our most vulnerable communities – schedule castes and tribes and minorities higher than the national average and that could become stumbling blocks in our developing country. Questions on whether the children are really learning -

still go unanswered.

MANAGEMENT EDUCATION OVERVIEW

Changing business landscape has resulted in major shift from manufacturing to service economy in India. Many believe that India should now by pass manufacturing and focus on service and knowledge economy alone. Knowledge would include science, bioscience and also environmental and agricultural science.

Some business schools are also undermining, manufacturing and operations curriculum. It's a grave mistake, as that would still become executional focus for bigger educational thought process. Efficiency, productivity in all aspects of business and economy along with management will always remain critical for growth of national economy.

In a rapidly globalizing economy, the demands on the skills of Indian managers are changing. Concurrently, there is a mushrooming of B-schools in the country leading to issues of quality.

Technology would add speed, accuracy in operational and thinking capabilities, and provide excellent facilitation to all operations as well as data mining.

While management education has made a rapid growth because of private initiatives in India, government has reserved its role, as





regulators in terms of norms, standards, approving launch of new schools, colleges, accreditation and other physical aspects of any management institute. Recent attempt on the part of government to control fees structure may cut both ways, as the cost is escalating and economic standards are increasing.

As a result of continuous criticism of the strategy and unplanned growth of management education in the country, where our focus were on demand and supply management of education.

It has established standards for regulating business schools but its implementation is still in question. Faculty with Ph.D. qualification required by AICTE as well as required infrastructure and other physical aspects are still inadequate, when it comes to implementation.

Ranking of business schools has created awareness amongst potential participants to differentiate between schools of various qualities and shades.

Dr. Dharni Sinha says that it's amazing to notice that, hardly 15 schools management graduates who could be accepted worldwide and only 50 schools out of 900 have 25 or more members of faculty and rest of them are struggling to be in good schools.

The cost of courses has increased— even in the lowest-quality schools—while the salary graduates can expect to earn is falling. "There a lot of people graduating from business schools that don't get jobs in metro cities or big corporations," says Dr. Rajan Saxena, the vice chancellor of the Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Studies, a private university in Mumbai, and chairman of the board of studies at AIMA.

Such problems have the potential to hold back a country that will need ever-more good-quality managers. So as 2015 turned into 2016, AIMA published a strategy paper, seven months in the making, from a committee tasked with finding a way to improve management education in the country. The goal is bold: "By 2025 [the] Indian management education system should clearly emerge as the second best in the world, second only to that of [the] USA."

Dr. Ranjan Saxena, says, there is a vast gap between India's best business schools (Ahmedabad's Indian Institute of Management (IIM-A) tops The Economist's global ranking of business schools' when it comes to opening new career opportunities) and its more mundane colleges. Yet they both teach the same theory and techniques. That is wrong-headed. An MBA graduating from a business school in Kapurthala (population: 99,000) is much less likely to reach the board of a multinational firm than one coming out of a management institute in Mumbai (population: 12m). The skills needed to handle a smaller company—in Indian heavy industry, for example—are different to global corporations.

EIGHT CHALLENGES:

There are eight challenges in the system

1. Physical aspects: The main focus is on the infrastructure and the amenities offered by colleges and the physical facilities, equipment, support services and attraction of campus. Since students do not receive only education service, but also a large



component of support service, they undoubtedly depend on other cues in the absence of physical aspects evidence by which to assess service quality.

- Reliability: Initiative by the college to perform the services to students they have promised to deliver accurately and dependably.
- 3. Competence: Faculties play the very important role, they are the intrinsic characters which are formed by the accumulation in long teaching history and learning and construct from working base of a good teacher.
- 4. Industry Institute Interaction: Building up the bridge between student's expectation and getting outcome from colleges, there should be collaboration &interaction between the level of student and institute with the industry through industrial visits, interaction with industry experts, executive interaction and industrial exposure etc.
- 5. Course structure: planning and execution of agenda i.e. what will be taught to the students and the detailed requirements of it as the industry demand, report making of summary.
- 6. Internship output: Involving students in an internship program, and their interaction with the working group. It also concerns to the expertise gained and possibility of getting employed in the organization of internship.
- 7. Inculcation of Entrepreneurial Spirit: Helping the students to encourage forstarting/ establishing business venture among management graduates. Innovation and risk taking ability and converting risk into profit.
- 8. Employability: Developing High skills, knowledge, competence etc. that is required to be employed in an organization of repute.

In order to address these challenges we need to go beyond Brick & Mortar model and ensure that education becomes a game changer as well as life changer for students. Besides, what we impart should be reliable and should be done by competent teachers who have perspectives.

Good interaction with industry and also keeping ongoing projects with industry would enormously benefit students to check reality which they will face tomorrow.



Similarly, I felt the following four new pathways would also evolve a well-rounded student who would be ready for industry or selfemployment.

4 New Pathways for Management Education

Besides, Curriculum Institute should look at these new pathway to implement those who are already on the path is really commendable.

1. Problem Based Education System (PBS)

This is an instructional approach wherein students can learn by solving challenging, open-ended problems. The problems are authentic tasks and are solved in socially and contextually based teams of students.

2. Entrepreneurial Management

B-schools involvement: A number of B-schools are offering the programs to improve entrepreneurial management. They are including it as into their curriculum.

Many entrepreneurship centers have been set up to coordinate the broad array of activities. Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Kharagpur, is one of the few technical institutes in India running a separate program on entrepreneurship. IIT Kharagpur's Science & Technology Entrepreneurs' Park (STEP) functions as an incubator for student ventures.

3. Incubation centers for management, Business and training:

On-campus incubation programs: All four IIT campuses and the Vellore Institute Technology (VIT) run Incubators. Can all major Management colleges not venture into business incubation centers based on technology and new knowledge as well as new ideas of business?

4. Employability Centers

In the current education system, the entire focus is knowledge based rather than practical based. The student's skills have to be developed in a way so that they get simultaneously trained to meet the industry needs once they graduate, short term courses can be designed.

MEDICAL EDUCATION OVERVIEW

World is changing dynamically in the internet era, but not our medical schools, I think they are still in the old books and are not profiting by the recent trends. Promoting acquisitiveness and research is another area where the medical educators should take

the lead. The results clearly questions about the lot of resentment amongst the medical community regarding the current education system that needs stringent changes.

It has made a point for policy makers to restructure and to review the education system, to fill the gap between the students demand and supply of the employable graduates. Since the time students starts preparing for PMT till they becomes a specialist or a super specialist they are in a blind rat race. And it doesn't matter who the winner or loser is because everyone ends up being a rat. The whole system is exam oriented, either at the exit or at the entry. Where is the joy of studying medicine in that? Moreover this does not prepare the students to face the real world. The whole system is flawed from the beginning and needs to be changed. We have adopted mediocrity, and it will destroy us as well as the Indian Education System.

4 CHALLENGES:

1. Defective Selection of Doctors-To-Be

India is one of the countries where there is high demand for medical seats. More than six lakh students write the pre-medical entrance tests every year. Only about 45000 turn out to be fortunate enough to secure a seat. Aspirants are screened on the basis of the answers they give to multiple choice questions. These tests often turn out to be mere tests of memory. True knowledge is seldom assessed through these MCQs. The medical education system in India presently focusing on rote learning pattern and it allows anyone who can memorize and store a large amount of information to be a doctor rather than creating socially committed compassionate healers.

2. Flawed Assessment System:

While most foreign countries use OSCEs (objective structured clinical exams) to test the competency of medical students, the examination system in India gives more importance to theoretical knowledge whereas, clinical skills are often overlooked. The change that is needed is more clinical experience.

3. Outdated Syllabus:

Another serious handicap of the Indian medical education system lies within the syllabus. A young student who steps into a medical college after completing school education encounters a huge and growing body of knowledge. The present syllabus doesn't distinguish between the less important and more important facts. Moreover, students are seldom provided opportunities to explore





new and exciting domains in medical science. There is no integration of sciences as the subjects are taught isolated from one another. Most of the students attain inadequate clinical exposure. While foreign countries have made use of cutting edge technology to impart knowledge to their students, Indian class rooms are still teacher-centered and encourage passive learning of facts.

4. Price of privatization:

Though privatization has broadened the scope of health care, it has resulted in the commercialization of education. India is the only country which authorizes the sale of medical seats. Many colleges take illegal capitation fees which ranges anywhere between twenty five lakhs to one crore.

While addressing these 4 challenges it's really a difficult task to move towards affordability of medical education and also for those who deserve and select right profession, as skills and attitudes of would be doctors need to be oriented towards masking them better healthcare providers, they need to undergo a very different regimen right from syllabus to service orientation.

Considering this I have the following seven new pathways for medical education

NEW PATHWAYS:

The 7 New pathways to build a complete New Medical Education system are as follows:

1. Primary Healthcare Providers- Primary issue:

Low Doctor-Patient ratio, Effectiveness of PHCs.

Steps for primary healthcare providers-As there are already established PHC centers all over India, proper inventory management of medicines, follow-up and administration of these PHC centers for its effective use needs to be regularized. Special education program for PHC providers can be designed for their growth and higher responsibilities in healthcare hierarchy on the basis of contribution, growth of PHC centers.

2. Primary Healthcare Centers-Ayurvedic Doctors-

Primary issue: Low Doctor-Patient ratio

Steps for Ayurvedic doctors-As there are already practicing Ayurvedic doctors in rural areas, a special education program can be designed for those chosen by selection amongst Ayurvedic practitioners and the number of PHC providers can be improved substantially. There is a conflict between modern medicine system and Ayurvedic medicine system, resolution can be solved for benefit of Indian patients and the course can be decided. Appropriate syllabus, evaluation mechanism, practical training can be developed to deliver excellent PHC.

3. Secondary Healthcare: Steps

Patient and Doctor Community education- Awareness and patient education along with awareness of doctor community is essential to make distinction between PHC & SHC as it should not be only urban rural divide. There should be accessibility & competency of providers along with medical infrastructure inclusive of diagnostics.

4. Tertiary Healthcare

Develop Syllabus-Structure of the syllabus should encompass different knowledge and skills areas from different disciplines such

as biology, psychology, sociology, nutrition and traditional medicines along with other related disciplines.

 Harvard Medical Pathway - A role model: The New Pathway curriculum integrates the biological, social, behavioral, and clinical sciences over a four-year period.

Conclusion

Although, I have no expertise and cannot claim as guide but, contributing to syllabus-making to Mumbai University, paper setting, evaluator position in Mumbai University, taking up special courses for management, pharmacy, healthcare and hospital sector. From my perspective I have focused this article on reforms in the current education system.

Established in 1975

Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan is a community hall which was constructed in the year 1975-76 with the handsome donations received from Shri Dhurmal Bajaj Charity Trust & other philanthropists of the community. It is situated on S.V. Road, on the opposite side of the Educational Complex of Rajasthani Sammelan. It has a spacious, air conditioned hall on the ground floor with a seating capacity of 350 persons. The building has two more halls on the first & second floors. There are air conditioned rooms adjacent to the hall on all the floors. Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan caters to the needs of the community, as it is rented out to the people for mariage & other social & business purposes. Many cultural activities of the schools & colleges of the trust are also conducted in Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan.

Rajasthani Sammelan has set up Trivenidevi Deora Chikitsa Sahayta Kosh to provide medical help to needy people. It is managed by Trivenidevi Deora Chikitsa Sahayta Kosh Committee. The committee receives applications for medical help from needy people and on scrutiny of the applications, sanctions and disburses medical aid to the concerned persons who have applied for the same. Many people including the staff of all the institutions have availed of this facility from time to time.

Durgadevi Saraf Hall is constructed in the educational complex of Rajasthani Sammelan & is an air conditioned, sound proof hall with state of the art facilities. It has a seating capacity of approximately 300 persons & is mainly used for organizing seminars, conferences & cultural activities of the educational institutions of the trust. Besides, it is sometimes also given to the members of the community for marriage & other social needs. The hall has all the facilities to cater to business meetings. It has 2 air conditioned rooms adjacent to the hall.

To maintain universally accepted IT Standards in security, availability and data management, Rajasthani Sammelan has decided to have an IT Hub as proper data centre which is supported and managed 24 x 7. The IT Hub is constructed on the 10th floor of the new building, in a built-up area of 3800 sq.ft. It is fully air conditioned and is operational. The main aim of constructing the IT Hub is to make all course material available on line to our students, easy flow of interaction between student and teacher through electronic medium, to create alumni data and keep students attached to our organization life-long through web, to safe guard the campus using video vigilance and electronic access control, to control the entire admission process of all institutions centrally, to safe guard all available data and provide fast internet services within the campus.



Established in 2013

Rajasthani Sammelan has started a cafeteria in its premises to provide snacks of large varieties to students. The cafeteria is situated on the ground floor on the south side of Durgadevi Saraf Hall in a total built-up area of approximately 4500 sq.tt. It is used by staff and students of all institutions. Various food items of different price range are supplied by the cafeteria to the deutents & staff of all our institutions. The cafeteria supplies all kinds of snacks and beverages to the canteens of all the institutions of Rajasthani Sammelan.

The library is manned by staff of Raiasthani Sammelan and the students are enrolled on payment of nominal fees to access the facilities.
