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Editorial

Education system all over the world is undergoing radical changes. There was a time when in the classroom only the teacher taught and the students listened. There was no scope of independent thinking, self-study or research. Everything was spoon fed. But now in the present day world the concept of teaching learning is undergoing a sea change. The concept that learning is acquired by the learner and not delivered by teacher is developing at a faster rate.

The role of the teacher is being elevated to that of a scholar who engages in a continuing interaction with the students to stimulate learning while learning himself/herself. Teacher has become our facilitator in the teaching learning process. Projects have become an integral part of teaching learning in school as well as college education. Since the student is involved in acquiring his/her knowledge, the gap between the school learning and learning from life is being narrowed down. This is helping to create creativity in students. Some of the educational boards have developed national curriculum frame work for school level education. Some boards like CBSE are venturing for other options. According to news, CBSE will try out an international curriculum in 100 schools across the country from the next academic year. The curriculum will encourage community service by students in association with an NGO from Class I and focus on research from Class IV.

At higher secondary level, from the academic year 2011-12 many educational boards all over India have developed common syllabus for Science and Mathematics. The common syllabi were developed in collaboration with the National Council of Education Research and Training (NCERT) and the Council of Boards of School Education in India (COBSE) and was first offered to Class XI students from 2011 in physics, chemistry, biology and mathematics. Initially migration to the changed syllabus is proving a bit difficult for students, however ultimately the aim of the HRD Ministry is to have Common Entrance Test for aspirants of engineering and medical professions. While National Eligibility Entrance Test (NEET) has already been introduced for Medical Entrance Examination, it will be introduced for the engineering entrance from the next year.

With a view to reduce the physical mental and financial stress on students by writing multiple entrance examination for management courses, the

AICTE has introduced Common Management Admission Test (CMAT) for all management programmes from 2012-2013.

The higher education at the University level is also undergoing important changes. The one time annual examinations for under graduates courses at the end of the academic year is now giving way to semester system, credit system and is also encouraging preparation of projects by students in each subject. This will ultimately develop a keen sense of research in students.

The latest trend in education is online education provided by many universities that is proving beneficial to millions of students. There are about 10 universities that are providing online education. Harvard University has produced online courses and other forms of digital learning for several decades with the goal of making educational content available to a global audience. Harvard University has collaborated with MIT and is providing learning content online.

We at Rajasthani Sammelan have always been sensitive to changes in the education system. At the school as well as college level, students are encouraged to make projects and are provided all technological support in their teaching learning process. In some of our libraries we have facility of e-library that gives access to students to many valuable books, journals and magazines in libraries of any part of the world. Rajasthani Sammelan also intends to start online academy to provide education at under graduate as well as post graduate level to all who are unable to attend the regular classes.

Many educators around the world are re-thinking about changes in education system so that education crosses the geographical boundaries and becomes more creative. We at Rajasthani Sammelan are also involved in a continuous process of welcoming the changes that are taking place in the education system of our country. In our campus education is fun, teachers are friendly and at the same time they maintain discipline with the learners. We give enough opportunity to students to enjoy by participating in extra-curricular activities as well as take part in sports for their physical well-being. It is our long and continuous journey to attain excellence in the educational endeavours. *

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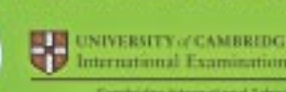

Small towns fuel online education boom

Market set to double in five years

A growing demand for education from smaller towns is giving a big impetus to the domestic online education market.

With access to computers increasing day by day, people from smaller towns such as Ranaghat, Sardar Sahar, Tonk and Talipramba that have populations from some thousands to a few lakh are looking for online tools to update themselves and get access to certificate courses and degrees.

This is set to double India's online education market to \$40 billion by 2017 from the present \$20 billion, according to industry estimates. Take an example of Manju, a 22-year-old history graduate from Gulbarga, Karnataka who is a history graduate is currently undergoing an online course in retail management and would even take her exams online. A dearth of institutes offering diverse courses in her region has prompted her to take up the e-course, which will fetch her a certificate from the Retailers Association of India. Her school-going sister, too, regularly uses online tools to understand concepts in physics and math. Experts say like the metros, the demand for online education is galloping each day in places such as Chiplun (Maharashtra), Hissar (Haryana), Kannur (Kerala) and Churu (Rajasthan).



(Haryana), Kannur (Kerala) and Churu (Rajasthan). The proliferation of computers is also fuelling the trend. The sale of personal computers rose 16% in financial year 2011-12, compared to the previous year, as per data by the Manufacturers Association for Information Technology (MAIT). About 10.8 million units of desktop computers, notebooks and netbooks were sold during April 2011-March 2012. Pavan Chauhan, MD of online education firm Meritnation, said the demand comes not just for higher education, but also from school students. "Students from kindergarten to class 12 (K-12) express a need for assessment modules and animation videos to understand concepts in various subjects. They see online education as something which supplements formal education," said Chauhan. Meritnation has about 33-34 lakh students registered from ICSE and CBSE boards in the K-12 domain, with nearly half hailing from small towns. Edukart, which operates in the higher education space of e-learning, has tapped about 7,000 people since its inception November last year. "There is a strong demand from working professionals, house-

wives and people who could not attend formal institutes," said Ishan Gupta, CEO of Edukart. Edukart currently offers courses in retail, computers, etc, through its tie-ups with the RAI and Computer Society of India. Gupta said the firm would branch out into areas such as hospitality, telecom and energy soon. "We are looking at tapping 30,000-40,000 people in the next two years," said Gupta. While Meritnation would restrict its focus to K-12 in the near future, Chauhan said Edukart aims to reach out to one crore school children in the next few years.

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State technical edu system to be overhauled

Mumbai: Students might soon be able to have an entry/exit into technical education courses through multiple channels. This means that students could get into engineering courses at any level after completing diplomas or BSc in different subjects, besides getting in through entrance exams after class XII.

Cross-discipline learning will also be encouraged, meaning that students majoring in electronics can also study subjects like metallurgy or even

humanities subjects. Innovative techniques like open-book exams, case studies, and project-based exams might be adopted in technical colleges. Curriculum will also focus on developing soft skills, leadership qualities, etc. to make students employable.

The much-awaited state government perspective plan in technical education covering engineering, management, polytechnic, pharmacy and architecture education was finally made public on Monday. Opinions and suggestions are being invited from stakeholders from across the state by September 21.

"We are expecting a major

contribution from the industry as technical education is totally focused on industry requirements. Students, teachers, principals, industrialists, journalists, etc. can all play an effective role in finalizing the draft of the perspective plan," said an official from the directorate of technical education (DTE), which has designed the plan. The draft is available on their website, dte.org.in.

Compulsory internships to ensure job exposure will soon be made part of the engineering/management curriculum. Academicians have often complained about the curriculum not being tailor-made for industry. Experts believe that this change will take care of the lacuna. With regards to research in the technical field, the document observes that there is a need to improve women's representation in research and the state should look at giving them incentives. To improve the quality of technical education, the plan has suggested that institutes maintain a teacher-student ratio of 1:15 rather than the current 1:19.

The document also says there is a huge gender disparity in enrolment for technical education. In 2011-12, only 29% students enrolled in engineering courses and 25% in diploma courses are girls.

What is the demand for International Baccalaureate schools in India?

Data demonstrates that there has and continues to be a huge demand for International Baccalaureate (IB)-authorised schools in India. Approximately 40% of applications we receive across the Asia Pacific come from India. While not all of these pass through the rigorous authorisation process to become IB World Schools, it does demonstrate a high level of demand.

Are schools interested in shifting boards?

With PYP and MYP, it is worth noting that Indian national and state boards and the IB are not mutually exclusive. National and state boards are taught through the IB curriculum frameworks at these levels. Therefore, there is not really a question of 'shifting' boards per se. In fact, the IB believes that our programmes should be inclusive and include

the entire school. The exception is at IB Diploma (equivalent to Plus 2) where curriculum is more subscribed with external assessments - here students tend to choose between the IB and their local board as to do both would be too much workload.

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What is the significance of Mumbai for the IB board?

Historically, Mumbai is the centre of international education in India, mainly because of the city's attributes: interna-

Some panel members have expressed their dissent over the report.

US univs to open centre in city to clear pupils' doubts

Mumbai: Over 200 US universities have got together to start a centre in Mumbai to redress queries of students. The centre will be inaugurated at Jamnabai Narsee school, JVPD on Friday.

The increasing number of complaints by students and parents about touts seems to have prompted the move. Narsee Monjee Educational Trust (NMET) has joined hands with the City of Philadelphia and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to set up Narsee Monjee Centre for Excellence (NMCE). "The aim behind setting up the centre was to eliminate the role of agents who dupe people and misguide about universities and other procedures," said Kanika Choudhary, honorary ambassador of Philadelphia to India. The NMCE will function from an office set up at Jamnabai Narsee school.

Education Matters The centre will offer students information about hostels, apartments, rentals and transportation.

"Students can also check the best location to stay, while completing their education," said Kanika Choudhary, ambassador of Philadelphia. Log on www.nmce.ac.in for details.

Apart from information about various courses offered by over 200 universities in the state of Pennsylvania, students will also get a chance to interact with the head's of institutes to clear their doubts.

"We have hired a counsellor who will help students at our centre. Students can apply for an appointment and all their queries will be addressed," said Sujay Jairaj, NMET trustee.

"The centre has been set up on a no-profit-no-loss basis and students will get all the information for a minimum fee. Agents have their own vested interests but we have no such bias," he added.

Soon, certificate courses for interested applicants will commence. "We will also look at various programmes to improve the education system," he said.

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Engg aspirants this year likely to take state entrance test

Mumbai: Students aspiring to seek admission to the state's engineering colleges can heave a sigh of relief. For 2013, admissions to state colleges will be based on the state common entrance test (MHT-CET) as every year and not on the basis of the Centre's Joint Entrance Examination (JEE).

While the state had earlier planned to adopt JEE even for 2013's admissions, in a recent meeting, it was decided that this year, the state will continue with their own CET like every year and give admissions on the basis of CET scores only. However, a proposal to this effect is yet to be placed before the state cabinet for its final approval. The proposal might come up for discussion in the state cabinet by next week. The state will adopt the Centre's JEE from the 2014-15 academic session.

Confirming about the proposal which will be presented in the cabinet, D P Sawant, minister of state for higher and technical education, said, "A committee was formed to take a call on the state's decision about implementation of the single national level entrance test for engineering courses mooted by the centre. The committee has recommended that the state should adopt the test from 2014. The committee has also recommended giving 50-50% weightage to board and the test scores."

The state government is also yet to take a decision on whether the weightage to board scores should be given on the aggregate marks or the scores in PCM (physics, chemistry and mathematics) and English from 2014.

Till now, students were under the impression that the state government will adopt the Centre's exam pattern from 2013. However, the latest decision will bring relief to many students who were preparing for this year's entrance exam.

My Learnings at Harvard on Future Education

In early July, I received an invitation from Dr. Naresh Chandra, Pro Vice-Chancellor, University of Mumbai requesting me to join a delegation from the State of Maharashtra and Mumbai University to participate in a workshop at Harvard on University Leader Development - South Asia Initiative Workshop for understanding the scope of improvements in higher education in Maharashtra. Just as the world views Asia as the fastest growing region in the world, so also people at Harvard's see South Asia as one of the area where they want to be present and with this in their mind they have started - The South Asia Initiative at Harvard University.

Initially hesitant, I later accepted the invitation. It was indeed an honour to be a part of this team as it had Dr. Naresh Chandra, Pro Vice-Chancellor, University of Mumbai, Principals and eminent academicians. Before we proceeded to Harvard, we all team members were asked to be ready with our presentation on one topic on which we have to speak at the workshop. My expertise being donation, I gave a presentation on 'Donation'.

In between, at the request of Dr. Naresh Chandra, Prof. Vinay Dhumale and his team

of World College School of Media Studies prepared a short documentary film on Mumbai University which was later shown at Harvard Workshop and was appreciated by one and all. I developed great respect

for Mumbai University when I came to know that it is a 155 years old university with 653 colleges, 5,49,432 students and the fort campus of the university is a World Heritage Monument.

Five days before, reading material came to me and we were expected to read and be prepared for the workshop extending from 30th July to 3rd August, 2012. In my journey from London to Boston, I could read two day's matter. However, later I learnt that every day we have to study extensively. We were picked up early in the morning from our venue of residence and were relieved after dinner with next day's programme. I felt like I am going to school again. However after attending the workshop, I felt extremely enriched and it had a great impact on my concept on Future Education.

Established in 1636, Harvard is the oldest institution of higher education in the United States. The University, which is based in Cambridge and Boston, Massachusetts, has an enrolment of over 20,000 degree candidates, including undergraduate, graduate, and professional students.

The admissions at Harvard University are no

longer granted on the basis of academic credits only. The team of experts scrutinize the student's application for various talents besides academics and give maximum emphasis to Leadership quality. Students across the world are encouraged and welcomed to be the part of spectrum of University programs. Its rich alumni included seven US Presidents, over forty Noble Laureates and many Heads of States of other countries.

My first learning at Harvard was about Funding of Education. It was amazing to know that Harvard has one of the largest funds in the form of Endowment Funds. One of the reasons for the growth of Harvard is because of these large funds. Harvard has collected one of the largest funds from their Alumni. Harvard has a team of more than 350 people just to collect funds and manage the funds. I learnt that Mr. Anand Mahindra and MBA of 1981 batch has given the university \$ 10 million (Rs.55.61 crores) to support the humanities center in honour of his mother Indira Mahindra. It is the largest gift for the study of humanities in Harvard's history, the centre will be named 'Mahindra Humanities Center'.

The workshop included sessions on key topics such as University Leadership, Knowledge Transfer, Global Studies in K-12 and Universities Admission to name a few. These sessions were being conducted by experienced senior faculties from Harvard. However the fourth day i.e. Thursday 2nd August was of great importance that gave an insight to the model of online learning and to the fact that how internet connectivity can help students to self learning. There was a talk on Khan Academy and how it is changing the rules of education. Salman Khan is the Executive Director and founder of Khan Academy that was founded as a non-profit organization in 2009 to provide free online education.

Khan Academy aims at providing a platform to students across the world to learn lessons at their convenience and pace. It facilitates students to excel in their area of interest and take up subjects/courses as per their choice. It serves as a boon to slow learners and allows other to move ahead at their pace. The interactive lessons available on the site can be viewed repetitively by the students. It also provides better understanding to the teachers about their students' progress and areas of concern.

Khan Academy has received accolades for their innovative use of technology to educate millions of students across the world. Khan Academy received theTech Award for education in 2009. Salman Khan has been featured on the The Colbert Report, PBS News Hour, CNN and National Public Radio. Though a non-profit organization, Khan Academy has received significant backing from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (\$ 1.5 million) and Google (\$ 2 million). A few Indian schools are already using Khan Academy which offers lessons on numerous subjects through online videos on Maths and Science. All videos of Khan Academy are available through Khan Academy's own website hosted via YouTube.

Like Khan Academy supporting online school education, we learnt about Sebastian Thrun, Google's Vice-President and pioneer in artificial intelligence and robotics who launched Udacity, an independent online education company that provides high quality education at low cost to virtually everyone. Udacity offers 11 STEM courses like "Introduction to Physics," "Intro to

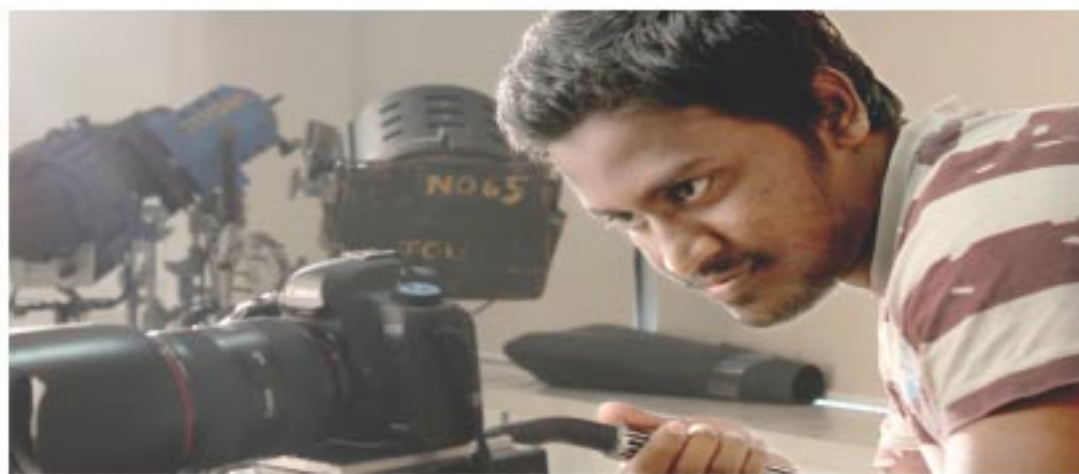

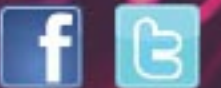


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
