









Education is the best tool to bring positive change in society, to develop generation of responsible individuals and contribute to the development of good human beings. It is said that by 2020, India is set to become the world's youngest country with 64% of its population in the working age group. It is therefore necessary to provide educational opportunities to all our children right from the beginning so that they grow up as educated youth and a rich human resource for our country.

We, at Rajasthani Sammelan started our journey of educational endeavours as early as 1959 when our founding fathers started Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya, the first girls' school, now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School. At present, we have eleven educational institutions in R.S. Campus along with a women's hostel, a counseling centre and many other facilities to support teaching-learning of our students.

Past few months witnessed many important activities in the R.S. Campus. At the beginning of the academic year, we received permission from the Government of Maharashtra and University of Mumbai to start Ladhidevi Ramdhar Maheshwari Night College of Commerce. This college was started with a generous donation of the Main Donors, Shri Balkrishnaji Lakhotia and Shri Madhusudanji Maheshwari. At the same

time, we started a new Post Graduate course of M.A. in Film, TV & New Media Production in Ghanshyamdas Saraf College affiliated to Mumbai University. Results of all our institutions were declared during this time and each institution fared excellently at their respective Board / University examinations.

We also took the initiative of entering into a new venture by starting R.S. International Playschool, the first IPC (International Pre-school Curriculum, U.S.A.) accredited Playschool in Mumbai. We started the Play Group with the mission of developing self-confidence in toddlers in a joyful and stimulating environment. Our International Playschool has a Play Group as well as Mother-Toddler Programme which has met with great success.

In the past few months, we felt to reach out to students beyond the boundaries of our campus. Therefore, we started our Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy with generous donation received from Shri Raviji Goyal, the Main Donor of the Online Academy. Our Online Academy popularly known as GOLD Academy had a soft launch and at present, approximately 3,000 students of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College are using our portal. In future, we plan to modify and strengthen our portal so that we can reach out to students of other

institutions for various courses.

We also felt the need of providing a library and reading room to the students to study in the evening in a peaceful atmosphere. Eminent Industrialist and Philanthropist, Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf gave us a handsome donation for starting Kirandevi Saraf Library and Reading Room which was inaugurated on 29th August, 2014 by Shri Jairaj C. Thacker, Chairman, Jamnabai Narsee School and President of Dr. Balabhai Nanavati Hospital.

However, the most important event during this time was inauguration of Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies by Dr. Subhash Chandra, Zee Essel Group Chairman on 29th August, 2014 at a glittering function on the auspicious Ganesh Chaturthi Day. The event was graced by Shri Sajjanji Goenka, Main Donor and his family members, Shri Kalyan Banerjee, Pujyashree Bhupendrabhai Pandyaji, Shri Jairaj C. Thacker, dignitaries, members of Management, staff and students.



Rajasthani Sammelan, under the dynamic leadership of Shri Ashok Saraf, President and Shri Kailash Kejriwal, Honorary Secretary along with a dedicated team of various office bearers and trustees, continues its trail blazing journey of growth in imparting quality education to students across all communities and strata of the society. Today, we have over 15,000 students coming to our campus for pursuing various courses from KG to PG.

The entire Rajasthani Sammelan Campus is spread across 3,25,000 square feet and 12 storeys. It is an onerous task to ensure that the facilities and the upkeep of the infrastructure operates to clockwork precision and is immaculately maintained to ensure a seamless operation and a memorable teaching-learning experience. In this endeavour, we, at Rajasthani Sammelan, have ensured that we have professionals to manage the day-to-day activities of the campus. Reputed agencies in the areas of Security, Housekeeping, and Building Maintenance have been deployed to ensure a safe, secure and a congenial learning atmosphere.

The latest addition to the list of amenities has been the opening of a Cafetaria managed by a reputed catering agency, a Health Centre for regular health check ups of students and to attend to any medical emergencies. Health Centre also organizes seminars on parenting and burn control, good touch bad touch, child psychology and other programs which are conducted by industry experts on regular basis. We also have an Educational Outlet to provide books and stationery all within the campus.

Security and safety of our students is uppermost on our mind, and as the CEO of Rajasthani Sammelan, this is one area that that I personally ensure is not compromised in any way. With the large number of students coming to our campus and the 133 bedded women's hostel, safety of our students is of paramount concern. Our women's hostel is CCTV controlled with a 24x7 female security guard and a biometric access system to ensure that only bonafide students access the hostel. Our school buses compulsorily have a female attendant and a CCTV to ensure that the students and the parents' feel secure.

We identified need for traffic management at curb side, traffic wardens are deputed during peak hours to guide children to buses and vice-versa. Continual improvement is our operating philosophy at Rajasthani Sammelan and we have also lined up various initiatives for future which include electronic surveillances, commissioning of common control room for BMS and CCTV, managing entry of visitors in campus electronically, automated parking management.

Rajasthani Sammelan team creates a

positive environment and provides effective leadership by modelling integrity, vision and ethical behavior. It is our endeavor that education is imparted to maximum number of children and with the commencement of Goyal Online Learning Academy, we are targeting graduate, management and post graduate students. The big story in future is Media Management. With this in mind, we inaugurated the Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies on 29th August 2014, offering AICTE and Mumbai University approved graduate and post graduate courses. 
Dear Reader,







SHRI SATYANARAYANJI KABRA

He is associated with Rajasthani Sammelan as one of the Founder Member of the Trust from 1950s, right from the starting of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya School (Hindi Medium girls' school) now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School . Since then, he has been fully involved with Rajasthani Sammelan and the various other institutions run by the trust for the progress of education and also for uplifting girls' education.

Shri Satyanarayanji Kabra is the Trustee of Rajasthani Sammelan. He is associated with Rajasthani Sammelan as one of the Founder Member of the Trust from 1950s, right from the starting of Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya School (Hindi Medium girls' school) now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School . Since then, he has been fully involved with Rajasthani Sammelan and the various other institutions run by the trust for the progress of education and also for uplifting girls' education.


Shri Satyanarayanji Kabra, came from Lachmangarh, Rajasthan and resided in Malad, next to the School. He was involved with his business in textile industry. At the same time he was a dedicated social worker inclined towards empowering girls with education in Malad and in its vicinity. He also actively participated in the construction work of Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan, the community hall of Rajasthani Sammelan and worked hard for raising fund for the same. He used to supervise daily the construction work of the school building as well as Bajaj Bhavan.

Shri Satyanarayanji Kabra, also became involved in the construction work of the building of Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls College which was at that time, the only college in Mumbai affiliated to the University of Mumbai, imparting Commerce Education only for Girls. He was one of the key persons to approach Bajaj Family and Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf who donated a huge amount for the idea and cause behind Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan and Ghanshyamdas Girls College respectively. He has worked along with all the Past Presidents from Shri Murlidharji Jalan & the present President, Shri Ashokji Saraf.

Some of his colleagues were Late Shri Vishwanathji Poddar, Late Shri Ramnarayanji Saraf, Late Shri Prahladraiji Saraf, Late Shri Sitaramji Singhania, Shri D.R. Dhanukaji, Shri Mahabirprasadji Deora, Shri Balkishanji Lakhotia, Shri Banwarilalji Jhunjhunwala and Shri Kailashji Kejriwal. He was a firm believer to do the social work and hence, he never took any prime post. He was always a part of Fund Raising Committee and he worked hard and was always successful in collecting huge amounts of donation as and when required for the growth and development of the institute.

He has always been an open-minded person to welcome changes in education pattern. He was the first person to support for co-education in the institutes of Rajasthani Sammelan. He ensured that all his four daughters studied in Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya School and Saraf College and now following the same precedent, even both his grand daughters are studying in respective institutions of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College and Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management studies. His son Shri Sunil Kabra, who is presently the Joint Secretary is actively participating and taking interest in the activities of the organization.





When did you first get associated with Rajasthani Sammelan?

I became associated with Rajasthani Sammelan right from 1954 or earlier when Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya (now Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School) was started by Late Shri Vishwanthji Podar in the

Hanuman Temple of Chincholi with 02 students on 6th November, 1954. Smt. Sushila R. Jaspuria, daughter of Late Shri Vishwanathji Podar was the first student of the school. Gradually, the student strength started increasing and it became a Primary School. Late Shri Kudilalji Seksaria gave a spacious land of 4,000 sq.yds. for the school. A small building was built on this land and the primary section of the school was inaugurated on February 1956 by none other than the great philanthropist, Late Shri Kudilalji Seksaria. Later, we also purchased a piece of land adjacent to this land. Late Shri

Brijmohanji Ruia also donated Rs. 51,000/- for the construction of the school building. After collecting the required amount, the school building was constructed. It was then inaugurated in 1959 by the then Union Education Minister, Dr. Kalulal Shreemali. The stalwarts who made valuable contributions in the earlier years and were founder members such as Shri Durgaduttji Thard, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan, Shri Kishorilalji Ruia, Shri Krishnaji Narsaria, Shri Biswanathji Seksaria, Shri Murlidharji Jalan, Shri Ratanlalji Saraf, Shri Hariramji Saraf, Shri Vishwanathji Podar, Shri Lalchandji Dalmia, Shri Gaurishankerji Nangalia, Shri Kashiprasadji Adukia, Shri Mahavirprasadji Kayal and many others.

Tell us something about the educational endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan in the early years?

In early 1950s, there was no girls school in Malad area. Therefore it was the endeavour of members of Rajasthani Sammelan to start a girls' school in Malad. This was possible because of the generous donations received from the philanthropists as well as hard work of members who faced great hardship to collect donations by approaching donors from the community. Thus we started Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya with a social cause i.e. empowering girl students with education. Sarvodaya Balika Vidyalaya started as a Primary school and gradually became a Secondary School attached to the State Board of Maharashtra to impart education in Hindi medium. Very soon the school became famous for its teaching and extra- curricular achievements.

However, the Managing Committee of Rajasthani Sammelan felt the need of extending educational opportunities to the girls to a further higher level. In 1975, our trust received recognition from the State Government to start a Junior College which was attached to the school. Later, it was named as Durgadevi Saraf Junior College named after the late mother of Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf, the Main Donor of the college. Initially, the college imparted education in commerce stream to girl students and became famous in the western suburbs for excellent results, discipline and extra-curricular activities. In later years with the changing time, the Management decided to provide co-education in the Junior College which now became attached to the Degree College.

It now became the dream of the Trustees and Managing Committee members to promote higher education for girls in western suburbs of

Mumbai. Therefore, the Management members worked hard to obtain permission from State Government to start a Girls College. In June 1983, after the continuous efforts of the Trust members, the Government of Maharashtra gave permission to start a Girls' Degree College affiliated to the University of Mumbai. Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf, the great Philanthropist and Industrialist, came forward and donated a handsome amount in the memory of his late father, Late Shri Ghanshyamdasji Saraf to start the college. Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls College was inaugurated on 2nd June, 1983 at the

worthy hands of Hon'ble Shri Sudhakar Naik, the then Education Minister of the Government of Maharashtra.

Along with the educational endeavours, our Trust also cared for the need of the Community. In early seventies, there was no Community Hall in the western side of Malad /Goregaon area of Mumbai. Hence, the idea of constructing a community hall was born in the minds of the founding fathers. . Soon, a piece of land opposite R.S. Campus belonging to Late Shri Kudilalji Seksaria was purchased by Rajasthani Sammelan for construction of Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan. Shri Deviduttji Bajaj came forward and Shri Dhurmal Bajaj Charitable Trust gave the largest amount of donation to start the construction. The Hall was named as Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan in the

memory of Late Shri Dhurmalji Bajaj. The construction work started in 1973 and was completed in 1976. On 16th April 1976, Dhurmal Bajaj Bhavan was inaugurated by Shri Adityaji Birla with Shri Ramkrishnaji Bajaj as the Chief Guest -both being renowned industrialists & philanthropists, at a glittering function organized by our Trust.

Who were the people who contributed in the growth of Rajasthani Sammelan in the early years?

There were many people dedicated to the cause of education and love for the community who are remembered in the early years of Rajasthani Sammelan. All of them worked together. 5) Tell us some important incidents which you would like to mention in this context?







DGMC is a part of the 14-institute KG to PG educational group, named Rajasthani Sammelan, operating for 65 years now, with 15000 students today, and currently headed by its President, Ashok Saraf, an educationist known for his vision, precision, sharp decision and efficient resource management. 


Statewise Display:




a dramatization based on colours, performed by the children with help from the teachers.


20th September 2014 : "Thought Leadership Forum"





audio/visual case study titled 'Looking for New Horizon-Solapur Cotton Industries' authored by him.


Infrastructure:

- Navratri Celebration was organised on Friday, 26th September 2014 when the children came dressed in traditional outfits and took part in Dandia Raas.









The academic session began with new energies to improvise the services offered at the centre and ensuring good experience for our students and parents.

The school counseling services for the RS group of schools have been revised with more counsellors to provide more focussed attention to the students. The teachers were strengthened in their skills through workshops by Mrs. Salma Prabhu to guide them on how to identify and understand the needs of students with Visual, Academic and behavioural difficulties. Workshops were conducted to inculcate more creative ways to appreciate and motivate students in the class.

School Counselors observed students of Ramniwas Bajaj School and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School in the classroom setting and determined

consistency of behavior. Teachers were approached to get relevant information about students. They were consulted to determine whether any students needed personal assistance to overcome academic,

behavioral or emotional issues encountered at home or in school.

Mrs. Salma Prabhu conducted workshop with parents of Primary and Secondary section of Ramniwas Bajaj High School. Parents were made aware about various behavioural difficulties observed in students. They were also provided with Checklist to help them identify difficulties. They were also suggested techniques to deal effectively with these difficulties.



The will to win, the desire to succeed, the urge to reach your full potential... these are the keys that will unlock the door to personal excellence.










Kunjbihari S. Goyal online academy

As always our President Mr. Ashok Saraf has been providing unstinted guidance, advice and support and also helping in creating and modifying the Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy vision.

The Content, the LMS, the enrolled students and the GOLD team become the four pillars of Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy. From the Saraf College, Dr. Jayant Apte, Prof. Bhavna Vaidya have been very helpful and resourceful. Many other professors and teaching faculty members also are helping continuously.

The release of multi-media content with audio-visuals and animations, with objective assessment tools, has a lot of similarity to that of making films. Currently the challenge is to find established content publishing companies, which can deliver to the stringent specifications provided by the GOLD Content Management team. The content creation involves use of software tools like the Smoothdraw, the Adobe Premier, the Camtasia and the Wacom (digital slate and the digital pen/ stylus). Currently content is being created for the B.F.M. and B.Com courses of Mumbai University.

The portal or the Learning Management System (LMS) is yet another important component in Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy. There is a dedicated portal design and development team continuously busy for past few months. This team is preparing Microsoft MVC (Version 4) based LMS, which will also be deployed under Cloud methodology. Currently the live LMS is also deployed (hosted) on the MS Windows Azure platform, which provides close to 100% redundancy and also the platform has not shown even a single instance of downtime.

Initially, about 2500 students from the Ghanshyamdas Saraf Commerce College have been enrolled on the GOLD LMS. A unique login id and password has been generated for each student and

communicated to her/ him by SMSs and emails. As a starter kit, eBooks were provided so as to acclimatize with the learning management system. The Kunjbihari S. 

"GLOBALIZATION AND ISSUES OF CORE AND PERIPHERY IN INDIA"

India has initiated wide ranging economic reforms covering all sectors of the economy-agriculture, trade, industry, finance and even social sectors such as education, health and housing—since July, 1991. The globalization, liberalization and privatization (LPG) is the main slogan of this reform. The globalization is primarily understood today as the free movement of goods, services, people and information across national boundaries. Now we have to agree with the view that

management is known to produce pro-rich regime controlling world's knowledge; property rights and patent rules, thereby, pushing poor people and poor countries to the margin of the knowledge—driven global economy. Spread of inequality — making rich richer and poor poorer, marginalization of those who fail to compete in marketplace resulting into growing unemployment, underemployment, exclusion and poverty.

Globalization, with its ideological orientation,

process of globalization. It is they who believe that globalization is the agenda for humanity which can work for the poor. It is not merely an economic phenomena rather it covers all spaces of modern life. It refers to culture, polity, economy and the state. It is being said that 'you may not be interested in globalization but globalization is very much interested in you'. No political governance but

globalization is now a fact, not an option. We have to live with it though globalization has not been a democratic choice of people anywhere. The imperatives of globalization have been business driven, by business strategies and for business ends. The manner in which globalization was introduced in India, as in several other countries, in the garb of economic reforms, without any discussion in the parliament or with people. The anti democratic content of globalization thus surfaces right from its birth.

The basic framework of globalization can be seen as comprising three tenets: (1) social Darwinist conception of competition, (2) panacea of free market and (3) extreme individualism. It believes that only the winners in competition have right to survive. Globalization prescribes free market as panacea. The market serves as a playground for individuals to compete – fight to finish. Market is represented as optimal and self-regulating social structure. Market centric

is inherently elitist and hence, naturally produces inequality. Globalization thrives on uncertainties and therefore demolishes all established correlations transforming the world into a risk society. Globalization, an agenda of capitalism in crisis, driven by imperialist institutions like IMF, World Bank, and WTO has essentially a pro rich bias. It has been a social disaster, environmental disaster and a threat to stability of the world. It has both its winners and losers. The gainers include people with assets, profits and people with high skills, educated, professional, technical people, large firms, global markets, global elites and firms with market access and branding. The losers include people without assets, uneducated workers, those dependent on public services, small firms, the poor, local communities etc. Now, in case of poor we can say that without any doubt that as it stands today, they are the losers of globalization. Now the people are talking about second generation reforms. Still the government and professional economists are optimistic about the positive results of the

existed in many forms: there have been trade, services, flow of goods and capital and labour across nations. However, in the last twenty years, globalization has become a major force controlling economic, political, social and cultural spheres of the world. The new significant aspect of globalization is the attempt to creat new rules and regulations for free trade of goods, capital and services and to enforce and monitor this new agenda through international instruments such as WTO, IMF and the World Bank. On the international front, India has provided market access and liberalized flow in the case of around 760 commodities. Similar access is allowed in capital investment and flow. International companies are allowed in insurance and many other service areas.

Structural Adjustment Programme (SAP) has been introduced in the domestic economy. It includes (a) Privatization of the public sector





and services, (b) Removal of restrictions on private sector participation in the economy, (c) Withdrawal of the government from many development and basic welfare sectors, (d) Wage freeze and cuts in subsidies. Further services such as banking, insurance health and education are now open for private sector investment. The main focus of globalization has been to reduce the role of the state in the social and economic governance of the country and move towards the privatization.

Right from its inception, the process of globalization has generated a good amount of debate both in favour and against it. A large section of industrialist and

capitalist class whole-heartedly

welcomes this process. No doubt that many changes have happened in our society since inception of NEP. Among other things, India has become one of the fastest economies in the world and a leading country in Information Technology. But on the human development index (HDI), India is ranked as one of the lowest in the world. This means there is a contradiction in our development paradigm. As the government itself has admitted in different ways, the fruit of

Elaborating this point, the report adds, "the balance sheet of gainers and losers in the globalization process shows the uneven burden borne by the poor within and among nations". What is more, on the front of social development, particularly education and health, the report notes decline in expenditure in South Asian countries, falling to levels lower than those in the pre-globalization period. The poor have been expressing their dissatisfaction and anguish against new economic reforms.

Issues of Core and Periphery Core-periphery models are based on the observation that within many spatial systems, sharp territorial contrasts exist in wealth, economic development between economic heartlands and outlying subordinate zones. Coreperiphery models have been used in many different situations. The industrialized countries are identified as the core and the developing countries are the periphery. It is argued that the core has continued to develop and industrialize by drawing resources from the periphery leaving the developing countries without the means or the resources to develop. The development gap between developed and least developed countries widened instead of narrowing. This cycle is known as dependency theory which believes that the resources flow from the less developed periphery to the industrialized core. Further, core-periphery theory is based on the nation that as one region or state expands in economic prosperity, it must engulf regions nearby to ensure ongoing economic and political success. The area of high growth becomes known as the core and the neighboring area is the periphery. Cores and peripheries may be towns, cities, states or nations. It so happens that resources drain away towards the core. Core and peripheries are everywhere and on every level. The core regions benefited the most and the periphery zones relied on coercive labour practices.

Dependency theory and World system theory (Paul Baran, Andre Gunder Frank, Wallerstein and Cardoso) provide vital grounding for the issue under reference. Dependency theory rested on the notion that resources flow from a 'periphery' of poor and underdeveloped states to a 'core' of wealthy states, enriching the latter at the expense of the former. It is a central contention of dependency theory that poor states are integrated into the 'world system'. Dependency and World system theory hold that poverty and backwardness in poor countries are caused by the peripheral position. There is distinction between the nations of the centre and the nations of the

periphery.

Using the core-periphery argument, the rich and privileged class who constitutes the core, is the most benefited even after the arrival of LPG in India. And the poor are poverty stricken due to their peripheral position in Indian society. The resources drain away towards core and the periphery relies on coercive labour practices. As a result, a gap widens between the rich and the poor. The impact of globalization on poverty is noted by many scholars. The evidence shows that globalization has been accompanied by a significant rise in poverty. Since the entire argument of globalization with respect to poor is based on the 'trickle down' effect, it is admittedly not oriented to benefit the poor. The premise behind this argument is that globalization entails growth of economy which will slowly trickle down to the lowest layers of the society. This premise, however, is not held out by the empirical evidence. Contrary to its claims about boosting economic growth, during its operation over the last two decades there has been economic decline in about 100 countries. consequently reducing incomes of about 2 million people.

Indeed, globalization has led to impoverishment of millions of poor in rural areas. The alarming phenomenon of farmers' suicides during the last five years may be taken as an illustration of the devastation caused by globalization. Globalization has unleashed policies like downsizing, outsourcing, to bring down labour cost. The trends towards casualisation, informalisation, feminization, subcontracting has further aggravated the situation of the poor. The increasing incidence of part-time workers, shikshan sevak, seasonal workers, home workers and subcontracted workers are working by leaps and bounds in the country. The Exposure of the small sector not being able to face global competition has led to closures throwing scores of workers on roads. Increasing incidence of industrial sickness and closures in both traditional and modern industries has resulted in a massive loss o employment. The much flouted job creation in the sectors like IT, telecom, Biotech etc. are intrinsically elitist and have meant little to the poor. The pro-rich bias of globalization has aggravated existing inequality world over and has reached vulgar limits. Globalization is producing billionaires at the rate unprecedented in history, which is being cited as the enrichment of people by its protagonists; (core) but it is purely at the cost of those at the bottom of the pyramid (periphery).
