In recent years, government is taking strong steps to improve standard of school as well as higher education. As far as institutions run by our Trust are concerned, two of our schools i.e. Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School are affiliated to Maharashtra State Board, Ramniwas Bajaj English High School to ICSE Board and Mainadevi Bajaj International School to IBO Geneva and IGCSE Board, Cambridge University. All our institutions of higher education are affiliated to University of Mumbai while Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies and Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies are also approved by AICTE as well as DTE. In the past few months, many of our institutions have made us proud by winning awards and accolades. Mainadevi Bajaj International School has been ranked 6th in Mumbai and 1st in North zone with International Curriculum as per Times International School Survey 2017. Ghanshyamdas Saraf College is in the process of starting Bloomberg Research Lab having twelve terminals in the college. The PGDM students of Durgdevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies recently visited Germany and Switzerland for International Immersion. DSIMS also hosted IIT Kharagpur's Entrepreneurship Awareness Drive (EAD) in which keynote address was delivered by Shri Dilip Chhabria, DGMC organized a panel discussion on Gender Stereotypes in Films in

Shah Sports Academy has been selected for FIFA Selfi Point organized by DSO, Government of Maharashtra, as one of the 15 centres in Mumbai to support FIFA U-17 World Cup. To promote FIFA World Cup, PDSA organized a football tournament in which 06 schools participated and the winner of the boys tournament was Mainadevi Bajaj International School. The winner of the girls team was Ramniwas Bajaj English High School. The girls Kabaddi team of Durgadevi Saraf Junior College won final match at Regional level and has been selected for State level. 





## MESSAGE FROM DIRECTOR OF SCHOOLS

We live in a day and age when education in our country has been obsessively defined by numeric performance indicators such as marks and percentages scored, ranks within a school, ranking in the state and the country, rating at competitive examinations and Olympiads. In such an age a breath of fresh air is a 90 year old educationist and philosopher, Dr Vasanti Padte. When she was 80 years old she managed to convince the board of governors of a very successful state board private school in Goa to ban all forms of competitions and testing till Grade 5. She believed, as many other educationists such as myself do, that competition is contraindicated in a good educational environment.

The parents of these young students, who would not do ANY testing till Grade 6 were a worried lot as they thought that the learning process of their children would come to a halt and that they would perform poorly compared to students from other schools. They were also worried about how they would perform in competitive examinations later in life. In meetings conducted in small and large groups parents of these children were explained the destructive role that competition plays in good education and how removing this burden would free them up.

Within days parents realized that a huge burden had been removed from their lives as well as the lives of their children who now learnt without fear of examinations, ranking and competition. Learning became a joyous process and they learnt for the love of learning rather than to stand first in a class or to pass an examination. When these children subsequently joined the mainstream it was discovered that most of them had become independent learners and clearly stood out when compared to students who had gone through the competitive environment.

So then what are the alternative systems of education that exist in our country and across the world and what are the lessons we can learn from such systems? The IB programme that is offered at our international school in Grades 11 and 12 is a highly progressive one. The learning is entirely concept based in all the subjects and students are encouraged to take onus for their own learning and become independent young adults who can understand what is going on in the world around them and respond sensitively. In its Diploma Programme, while the IB prescribes a curriculum, it leaves many teaching and learning approaches open and does not prescribe or recognize any text books.

In its Primary Years as well as Middle Years programme the IB merely gives an outline of course objective giving the teachers full freedom to chalk out their own paths for their students to achieve these objectives. What is radical about the IB programmes is that they are progressive, their curriculum is concept and skill based and they cater to the needs of all kinds of students. Recognising the harm that competitive assessments can do the IB encourages schools not to give pointless homework to the young children studying in the Primary section and even in the DP they do not have international or national `toppers'. This keeps students from trying to do better than

each other and focus on doing the best they can.


Even more radical than the IB Schools are the Waldorf Schools. Waldorf education, also known as Steiner education, is based on the educational philosophy of Rudolf Steiner. Its pedagogy emphasizes the role of imagination in learning, striving to integrate holistically the intellectual, practical and artistic development of pupils.

Steiner divides child development into three major stages. Early childhood education, an equivalent of our pre-primary, focuses on practical, hands-on activities and creative play. The elementary education, equivalent of our education up to Grade 5, focuses on developing artistic expression. The secondary education focuses on developing critical reasoning. This is where it aligns with the goals of the IB which also emphasises on developing critical reasoning skills among its students. The main goal of Steiner education is to develop free, morally responsible, and integrated young adults. The emphasis is on formative assessment where students' daily learning process is assessed regularly rather than summative assessment which takes the forms of tests and examinations in our schools. Quantitative testing plays a very minor role in this system and standardised testing is mainly undertaken to fulfil university requirements.

There are even more radical educational systems where learning is driven by what a student wants to learn. In such systems the school provides all the learning infrastructure, including highly qualified teachers, and when a student shows an interest in a particular field the school encourages inquiry in that direction.

Caught up as we are in this world of competition which demands that we train our students to fit into this world and do better than others, it is important to keep in mind that there are systems that truly emphasize a good education for its own sake and to understand our world better rather than to be materially successful.




Late Shri Pavankumar Sanwarmal

College. He provided invaluable guidance to the first principal of the college Shri B.K. Acharya and later to Dr. Sunanda Kar. His wife Smt Pannabai Dhanuka also took great interest in the activities of the institutions of RSET & attended functions organized by schools & colleges. His younger brother Adv. During the Chairmanship of Shri D.R. Dhanukaji, Ghanshyamdas Saraf College came under the State Government's salary and non-salary grant w.e.f. 1985. After becoming the judge of Hon'ble High Court of Bombay, Shri Dhanukaji had to resign from the Chairmanship of Governing Council of GSCC as per the norms. However, he always took active interest in the activities of the Trust and took out time from his busy schedule to grace various occasions as the Chief Guest, participated in seminars and conferences as and when invited by Ghanshyamdas Saraf College and the Trust.

As a student Shri Dhanukaji has an exceptionally brilliant record to his credit. He passed L.L.B. examination from Government Law College in first division and also received scholarship in the year 1955. Shri Dhanukaji topped in Maharashtra at the Advocate's examination conducted by Bar Council of Maharashtra in the year 1956 and enrolled himself as Advocate , High Court of Bombay. Later in 1959, he also enrolled himself as Advocate , Supreme Court of India.

Shri Dhanukaji was elected as member of Bar Council of Maharashtra and worked as member of various committees and also as the Chairman of Bar Council of Maharashtra. He was later

designated as Senior Counsel by the Hon'ble Chief Justice and other Hon'ble Judges of the High Court of Bombay. Shri Dhanukaji was also appointed as Senior Counsel for Central Government, State Government and Income Tax Department. He also appeared as Counsel for four Prime Ministers and two Chief Ministers. He also appeared for Chief Justice of Bombay to defend establishment of Bench of High Court of Bombay at Aurangabad before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay and the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. On July, 1990 he was elevated as Justice of Hon'ble High Court of Bombay and later retired in the year 1996 as a Judge.

Along with his legal profession, Shri D.R. Dhanukaji loved teaching and was appointed as part time professor in Government Law College in the early days of his career. He has been also delivering many lectures on law in Ghanshyamdas Saraf College as well as in other institutes and organizations from time to time.

Shri Dhanukaji is keenly interested in educational activities and social work relating to legal, education and social activities. He is running Honorary Legal Aid and Advice Centre for more than 13 years. Through this issue of Abacus, we acknowledge contributions of Shri Dhanukaji in the educational endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust. We hope that in future too we will continue to get his guidance and support from time to time.

# EXCERPTS OF INTERVIEW OF HON'BLE JUSTICE D. R. DHANUKA (RETD.)



Justice Shri D.R. Dhanuka (Retd.)

#### How and when you became associated with Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust?

In 1950, I came to Bombay at the age of 16 year after passing my matriculation examination from Ramgrah, a small beautiful town in Shekawati. Thereafter, I joined Ruia College, Matunga as 1st Year Arts Student. I was also employed as a Typist-cum-Clerk and for miscellaneous jobs by an employer with whom my father were already working. After obtaining my Inter Arts degree, I joined Government Law College for study of law. And I passed my law studies in first division and stood First Class First throughout Maharashtra in Advocates' Examination. I was awarded several prizes and scholarships in view of my performance in law examination. By this time, I developed interest in social work and became associated with educational activities of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust and Marwadi Sammelan. I also took keen interest in activities of 'Lions Club' and Prahladrai Dalmia Lions College.

2) Could you say a few words about your involvement with the educational endeavours of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust and how did you manage it with your busy schedule as a Senior Counsel in Hon'ble Bombay High Court and Hon'ble Supreme Court?

I shall narrate my experiences in brief when I was involved in the

educational activities of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust. I was elected twice as the President of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust by overwhelming majority of the members of Sammelan presumably because of my simplicity and popularity. This is what I presume. I was also appointed as a Trustee of Rajasthani Sammelan by overwhelming majority. I was Trustee of Prahladrai Dalmia Lions College of Commerce. I became Deputy District Governor of Lions District 323. At RSET, I have memories of working with Shri Vishwanathii Podar, Shri Sitaramii Singhania, Shri Banwarilalji Jhunjhunwala, Shri Kailashji Parasrampuria, Shri Shrikantji Dalmia, Shri Kailashji Kejriwal, and several others. Amongst elders, I cannot forget the names of Shri Devidattji Bajaj, Shri Ghanshyamdasji Jalan and members of his family, Shri Durgadattji Thard, Shri Gauri Shankarji Nangalia and several others who always treated me with special love and affection. I must specially mention names of Shri Mahavirprasadji Saraf and his family members as well as Shri Hariramji Saraf for helping in the cause of education. Ultimately Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls College was formed and I took keen interest in doing my best in getting all necessary permissions for starting of the said college. We worked as a team. It shall be unfair to give me credit individually.

I was appointed as the Chairman of Governing Council of Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College from inception i.e. from the year 1984 till 1990 when I was appointed as Justice of High Court of Bombay by the Hon'ble President of India. I was also taking keen interest in activities of Sarvodaya Vidyalaya Vidyalaya now known as Kudilal Govindram Seksaria Sarvodaya School.. I am happy to remember that young students both boys and girls were trained at







the school level to form Parliament and familiarize themselves with working of our Parliament. In those days, most of the girls were shy and many were from conservative families. Rajasthani Sammelan encouraged them to come up and develop their personalities in best possible manner. I remember that whenever the girl students went for picnic and they were late, the parents of conservative girls used to have some sort of anxiety. Those were not the days of 'free movement' for girls students of our community. Shri Vishwanathji saw to it that every such girl from conservative families reached home duly escorted by a responsible person. Shri Vishwanathji and others took parental care of students. Now times have changed. Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust has established a girls hostel and has established several institutions providing higher & professional education in different streams.

I must say that even though I was Chairman of Governing Council of the College, I was basically a teacher and never a 'boss' in any sense of the term. I took pleasure in delivering lectures in the classrooms of Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College. I used to host annual dinner in honour of Professors and their spouses every year. It was a great pleasure to do so. I remember that Shri Satyanarayanji Kabra, Shri Prahladraiji Saraf and Shri Banwarilalji Jhunjhunwala and others were extremely helpful. I loved teaching and studying. I used to remember my school and college days. My first love was to assist youngsters in having best education and develop scholarship, integrity and character. I loved cause of education as well as rendering justice as an Advocate. I loved teaching in Government Law College as a part time Professor for 4 years. If one has first love for a subject like education and social work, he can easily manage with his schedule as a Senior Counsel in the High Court and Supreme Court and I could find time for Law Practice as well as working as Chairman of Governing Council of the College. I am aware of the fact that large number of excellent lawyers spent time for the cause of education as well. I may mention the names of great lawyers Shri N.A. Palkhivala, Shri Y.V. Chandrachud and Sir D.F. Mulla illustratively who spent their valuable time in teaching in Government Law College.

3) What was your experience as the President of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust and the first Chairman of Governing Council of Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' college?

I had excellent experience as the President of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust by coming in contact with dedicated social workers and particularly disciplined students and dedicated teachers. I was happy to observe the progress of the students who came from middle class families but were extremely talented and brilliant on merits although they lacked desirable financial assistance.

As the Chairman of Governing Council of Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College, we were inspired by the career of great Pandit Madanmohan Malavia who was the founder of Banaras Hindu University. We always appointed teachers on the basis of their academic qualifications. No recommendation from any one was accepted by us for appointing a professor. I have memories of dedicated work by Principal B.K. Acharya, Prin. Dr. Sunanda Kar, Prof. Mrs. Bhavana Vaidya and several other Professors. Professors of our college were dedicated and polite. I do not remember the names of all but I have pleasant memories of being in the classroom in company of students and the teachers. I never tried to be their Boss although I had key status in the management. I was from ordinary middle class family and I considered them as my family members.

4) What is your opinion about Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College becoming a co-educational college?

In my opinion, the Management has taken a very wise decision by converting Ghanshyamdas Saraf Girls' College into a coeducational college. There were problems of getting affiliation with Bombay University when we started the college. On one hand, there was moral pressure that our college being Girls College should be affiliated to SNDT Women's University. On the other hand, the Management wanted the college to be affiliated to Bombay University. We tried our best and studied all relevant facts indicating that even some of the girls colleges were affiliated to Bombay University and we cannot be forced to affiliate to our college with SNDT Women University. The SNDT University is also a great University. I have equal respect for both the Universities. It was the decision of the management and we were successful in

getting the college affiliated to Bombay University. The Vice Chancellor of Bombay University was helpful so was the Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Vasant Dada Patil. I am happy with the college becoming a co-educational college. In a co-educational college, girls can develop their personalities much better & can also have a healthy competition with boys.

ii) We should always see to it that teachers and professors are not treated merely as employees but are respected and treated as 'Guru' in spirit which they were so treated in the past even by the richest and even by the kings and emperors as obvious from mythological classics.

I must request the President to involve the ordinary middle class persons from the teaching community and also from, amongst social workers and see to it that the higher education does not become almost monopoly of the rich but is also available to each and every one for which the constitution has granted equal opportunity under Article 21A of the Constitution of India. I am not criticizing any one. I should not be misunderstood. I wish that after my retirement as a Judge of the High Court, I could take more interest in the activities of Sammelan but I have not being able to



do so for no fault of anybody. Even now at the age of 84,1 am invited sometimes to deliver lectures to law students in some of the great Law Colleges. It is my dream that we should have an excellent Law College with best faculty and excellent infrastructures and library. I am sure that Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust will one day realize my dream.







To conclude, I did my best as a middle class person who got an opportunity from Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust to associate with great persons. I was not alone as I was the part of a great team and many of my colleagues did more and worked day and night for the cause of education but our Trust has to still do a lot. The future belongs to youngsters who will be the torch bearers of the nation . All the persons in present management deserve congratulations. We must recognize the fact that our lady members in the society are surpassing in all fields of National and International activities. Our Hon'ble Minister for External Affair and Hon'ble Defence Minister are great ladies i.e. Hon'ble Smt. Sushma Swaraj and Hon'ble Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman. We have most eminent Judges, Chief Justices in High Courts and Hon'ble Judges in Supreme Court of India amongst ladies on merit and rightly so. In the field of education and sports, our lady members have made excellent progress and are superior in their achievements. Rajasthani Sammelan


Day was delivered by Dr. Sachin Sachdeva, Principal, Mainadevi Bajaj International School.

### SHOWANDTELL







Kondap, Director General, RSET Higher Education, the panel discussion commenced with a short screening of videos that exhibited the issue of women empowerment in foreign films compared to the cliched depiction of women as sexual objects in Indian films.

The screening was followed by a talk by Mr James Farrell, Cultural Affairs Officer, United States, who spoke on gender & racial discrimination in Hollywood films. He punctuated his speech with statistics about the leading roles in Hollywood films that underscored the racial prejudices present there.



New academic sessions begin at Junior and Degree colleges. Post graduation students commenced their session as well. School students settled in their new grades and were all geared up for the new academic year.

RMCC team along with Institute heads planned to provide required. guidance and support to the students to bring out the best in every child. A series of workshops have been scheduled for the Grade IX and X students of KGES which would help them train and sharpen their academic skills. Parent meetings were conducted for the students who showed signs of learning difficulty. In the workshop on 'Social Networking' the students were made aware of the ill effects of constant engagement with technology. The aim of the

workshop was to redirect the students away from involvement in social networking sites and towards their academics. This was also done as a preventive measure keeping in mind the fatalities that have been taking place in recent times due to online gaming and social networking.

A workshop was conducted for the 9th and 10th grade students of KGES, on Effective Study Skills. This was done keeping in mind the upcoming board exams of the students and the difficulty they are facing with respect to their academics. The workshop comprised of teaching the students the effective ways to study, so as to make their study sessions more productive; also so that they can remember and recall better during the exams.

Informal assessments have been conducted for Grade IV KGES students to identify slow learners and thereafter assist them with Remediation sessions to integrate them to mainstream.

An adjustment inventory and learning style assessment was conducted for all grade X students of KGSS. This was done to identify students who were facing emotional, personal and academic issues. Post these assessments students were grouped according to their learning style and effective study skill workshop were conducted according In this workshop the students were taught various techniques that they can apply to study more effectively. Time management and Stress Management as a module were also covered in these workshops. Individualise Personal counseling sessions were done with the students which were found very helpful by the students to come up with their individual challenges.

Parent meetings have been conducted with the students having learning difficulty in RBHS. Complete LD assessments have been conducted for grade IX and X students and concessions being granted by board accordingly.

Career counseling sessions have been conducted at the centre not only for students but also post graduates and working

> professionals. Students have been taking services for professional guidance and skill building sessions. Individualised sessions for goal setting, stress and anxiety management have been successfully conducted. Remedial sessions for students identified with learning difficulty are being held regularly.

> RMCC is conducting Career Development program for the students of Junior college and









Degree College which is aimed at assisting students in areas of academics and career growth. It will help in enhancing their professional as well as interpersonal skills.

The program include a detailed career assessment intending to assess student's aptitude, interest and personality, which is very essential for them to have an in-depth understanding of themselves for personal and professional growth. # Quality Assurance, Accreditation & Ranking: Approach to Stakeholder Satisfaction

Dr. N. M. Kondap, Director General, RSET Higher Education

#### Rationale:

Education in General and Higher Education in particular is expanding rapidly around the Globe to satisfy the greater needs and demands of the stakeholders.

Internationalization is becoming significant worldwide with Economic, Political and Social changes driving an increasingly global knowledge Economy. Internationalization within universities continues to develop apace as institutions move from equating international strategy with international student recruitment to developing mature internationalization agendas that incorporate recruitment, research collaborations, and capacity-building. This has resulted in increased access to higher education providing both individual opportunity and national economic development and competitiveness in an increasingly globalized world. There is unprecedented growth in the number of students attending Institutes and Universities around the world and in the number of public and private institutions that serve the swelling ranks of students.

Over a period of time, the mobility of students has changed the pattern with countries like USA and UK loosing the market share while other Asians countries attracting the students. The key



drivers for International student's reference and enrollments are:

- · Brand and reputation
- Work opportunities while studying and post graduate employment opportunities, what we call as return on investment
- Global Rankings
- Technology
- Accreditation of the programs and institutions
- · Fee structure, Scholarships, residency opportunities
- · Political stability

It is quite evident that increasing attention is paid by the policy makers and higher educationists, educators for ranking, accreditation and the international quest for quality.

#### Transparency Instruments:

The transparency instruments play major role for attracting the students and giving stakeholder satisfaction. Institutes and Universities are required to pay attention to these instruments to make a mark for themselves in the competitive environment. Added to these instruments is technology.

Technology continues to shape the internationalization of higher education. Some of the expected main stream technologies which will draw the attention of the higher education institutions are:

- Adaptive learning technologies: software and online platforms that adjust to an individual learner's needs and progress.
- Mobile learning: smart devices that make learning portable, such as educational apps.
- Internet of things: the physical world we live in, including classrooms can be connected to the internet through chips, sensors and thry processors.
- Next-generation learning management systems (LMS): software and web applications that create a flexible and personalized online community for course materials, faculty engagement and student participation.
- Artificial intelligence (AI): AI has the potential to further personalize the student learning experience by enhancing online learning and adaptive learning technologies "in ways that more intuitively respond to and engage with students". Ashok Goel, a professor of computer science and cognitive science at the Georgia Institute of Technology, explains in a TEDx Talk how he





introduced a virtual assistant to help answer students' questions in an online graduate course.

 Natural user interfaces: allow users to interact with technology by using natural physical gestures such as taps, swipes, body movements, facial expressions, etc.



#### Ingredients:

For the institutes and universities in higher education, it is essential that a mark is made in the competitive environment across the globe. The competitive environment comprises of internal and external parameters and forces which determine what strategy needs to be followed.

While the transparency instrument has various subsets, the article covers three major subsets namely:

- a. Quality
- b. Accreditation
- c. Ranking

#### a) Quality:

Quality is a much more complicated term than it appears. Dictionary definitions are usually inadequate in helping a quality professional understand the concept. It seems that every quality expert defines quality is a somewhat different way. There are a variety of perspectives that can be taken in defining quality (e.g. customer's perspective, specification-based perspective). Are there commonalities among these definitions? Is anyone definition "more correct" than the others? Is one quality expert "right" and the others "wrong"? Quality professionals constantly debate this question. The editors of Quality Digest say that defining the word "quality" is "no simple endeavor." They asked, in their December 1999 issue, for readers to send them their definitions of quality to be gathered and posted on Quality Digest Online.

A modern definition of quality derives from Juran's "fitness for intended use." This definition basically says that quality is "meeting or exceeding customer expectations." Deming states that the customer's definition of quality is the only one that matters. So, who is the customer?

#### Who views the quality?

Usually the answer is external customers and they decide what quality is all about. It is the combination of quantitative measurement and qualitative perception.

It is not just the external customer that matters, what really important is internal customer, who plays a major role in deciding the quality since he has the experience and expertise of the product, process and services.

Developing a list of quality dimensions in higher education requires understanding stakeholder's expectations and majorly the dimensions that are important to them.

#### A Few Definitions:

Quality assurance (QA) is a broad concept that focuses on the entire quality system including suppliers and ultimate consumers of the product or service. It includes all activities designed to produce products and services of appropriate quality.

According to ASQ, QA includes all those planned or systematic actions necessary to provide adequate confidence that a product or service will satisfy given needs. [Source: ASQ Statistics Division, Glossary & Tables for Statistical Quality Control, 1983].

Quality control (QC) has a narrower focus than quality assurance. Quality control focuses on the process of producing the product or service with the intent of eliminating problems that might result in defects.

According to ASQ, QC includes the operational techniques and the activities which sustain a quality of product or service that will satisfy given needs; also the use of such techniques and activities. [Source: ASQ Statistics Division, Glossary & Tables for Statistical Quality Control, 1983].

Quality management is the totality of functions involved in the determination and achievement of quality (includes quality assurance and quality control). [Source: ASQ Statistics Division, Glossary & Tables for Statistical Quality Control, 1983].





Quality and Quality assurance have become very popular words in higher education and are used interchangeably. Quality in higher education has different definitions perceived by different stakeholders. It has to address in the context of educational model within a given system, institution, program or discipline, There is need to define and develop quality in higher education taking into consideration teaching learning process, expected outcome, stakeholder satisfaction, processes involved and the inputs that are provided. It is also influenced by both internal and external factors.

Luckett (2006) has provided the definition of quality assurance which is: A systematic internal and external management procedures and mechanisms by which an institution of higher education assures its stakeholders of the quality of its systems, processes, products and outcomes and of its ability to manage the maintenance and enhancement of the quality. This term usually subsumes the meanings of quality assessment, quality management and quality enhancements (Luckett, 2016:14).

Internal and external quality assurance models are important aspects of the governance and management of higher education institutions. External quality assurance processes address both governance and management issues through policies and regulation, documents as prepared by regulatory authorities. Cheng's (2003), definition of internal quality assurance focuses on efforts for improving the internal environment and processes, with the purpose of achieving the academic goals.

#### b) Accreditation:

Accreditation is the process of validation of the Institutes, institutes and universities on well defined parameters by the recognized accreditation agencies. It is a voluntary activity initiated by the institution that desires to have a rigorous evaluation based on accreditation process and parameters. Accreditation emphasizes quality assurance and a commitment to continuous quality enhancement.

#### Importance of Accreditation:

Accreditation has gained importance over a period of time at

national and international level. Accreditation has its own benefits

- Attending an accredited institution of higher learning ensures that the educational programs and outcomes offered meet the highest standards.
- The institute meets or exceeds the standards of quality.
- Helps the employers determine the validity of the program of study.
- Enables Graduates to appear for certification examinations.
- Helps develop system and procedures for self improvement.
- It is a self regulatory mechanism for bench marking with some of the best institutes.
- It helps students to make a proper choice of the institute.
- The accreditation process is also known in terms of its ability to drive effectively student performance and continuous improvement in education.

The accreditation process examines the whole institution—the programs, the cultural context, the community of stakeholders, academics, financials, technology and host of other parameters to determine how well the parts work together to meet the needs of students and the stakeholders.

#### Kinds of Accreditation:

Only one kind of accreditation would not be sufficient to address the accrediting needs of the various institutions that require accreditation status. This is why accreditation organizations provide two major types of accreditation. They are:

- 1. Institutional accreditation
- 2. Program accreditation

These two major kinds of accreditation are used for quality review, assessment, and assurance of institutions all over the world.

#### 1. Institutional Accreditation:

Institutional accreditation status is achieved by a Institute or university that meets the quality standards and fulfills the requirements designated by the accreditation organization.

In order to meet the requirements for institutional accreditation status, all aspects of the Institute or University, including academic quality, administrative effectiveness, and all other related services of the Institution, are reviewed by the accreditation organization.

Institutional accreditation affirms that the Institute or University operates with a high level of quality in all its aspects. This type of accreditation is comprehensive and indicates that the institution has achieved quality standards in areas such as faculty, administration, curriculum, student services, and overall financial well-being. This type of accreditation is held in high regard in the world of education.

#### 2. Program Accreditation:

Program accreditation is a type of accreditation status that is designated for a program within an Institute or a university. The



program accreditation focuses on the particular aspects of the program covering all the parameters.

#### Management Accreditation Bodies:

There are three main International Accreditation bodies for management institutes namely AACSB, EQUIS and AMBA.

AACSB: The AACSB accreditation focuses on how a school utilizes its resources for continuing educational improvements and encompasses broad aspects regarding the schools quality. The key factors that influence the quality of a business school such as their mission, operations, faculty, facilities and other critical areas.

**EQUIS:** European Quality Improvement System: EQUIS is an accrediting institution under the European foundation for management development. EQUIS accredits schools based on general quality and school's level of internationalization.

AMBA: Association Of MBAs: It offers accreditation for the programs and not the schools.

South Asian Quality System (SAQS): SAQS accredits school in the SAARC region based on parameters like context and mission, programs, students, alumni, placement, research and development, faculty and staff, infrastructure etc.

#### Indian Accreditation System:

Indian Accreditation System of higher education falls under two categories:

NBA (National Board of Accreditation): NBA accredits programs based on well defined parameters. The accreditation system has undergone a change with effect from July, 2017. Some of the parameters are: Vision and Mission statements, Governance and leadership and financial resources, Program outcomes and Course outcomes, Curriculum and learning process, Student quality and performance, Faculty attributes and contributions, Industry and International connect, Infrastructure, Alumni performance and connect, Continuous improvement.

NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council): NAAC undertakes accreditation of the institutes and the universities based on well defined parameters. The accreditation system has undergone a change with effect from July, 2017. Some of the parameters are: Curricular Aspects, Teaching-Learning and Evaluation, Research, Innovations and Extension, Infrastructure and Learning Resources, Student Support and Progression, Governance, Leadership and Management, Institutional Values and Best Practices.

#### c) Ranking:

Rankings have become a widespread phenomenon in an increasingly competitive world of higher education. They differ with regard to their aims, objectives, target groups, and with regard to their relationship to quality and quality assessment. Generally, rankings are an external assessment of the performance of higher education institutions; they enable transparency about systems of higher education.

Ranking is done for a variety of reasons, the most frequent being:

- To provide the public with information (whatever the specifics of the ranking format) on the standing of higher education institutions for individual or group decision-making (potential students, parents, politicians, foundations, funding agencies, research councils, employers, international organizations, etc);
- To foster healthy competition among higher education institutions.
- To provide additional evidence about performance of particular higher education institutions and / or study programs.
- To stimulate the evolution of centers of excellence.
   To provide additional rationale for allocation of funds.
   Rankings can be important starting points to identify institutions with which to collaborate and partner. This includes the degree to which rankings and an emphasis on developing world-class universities.

Globally, rankings have been a recent phenomenon with universities. It started with Shanghai Jiao Tong University's effort to have a global ranking system in their Center for World-Class Universities (CWCU). The first Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU) was published in 2003. This initiative caught worldwide attention and many more such global ranking systems came into existence such as Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) and the



Times Higher Education (THE) rankings.

The global rankings broadly look at academic excellence, faculty strength, research orientation, international outlook and placement. The weightings for different ranking systems vary based on the objective of the format and characteristics of the genre taken up for ranking.

#### Ranking of institutions in India:

Ranking of institutions in India is happening for quite some time with various magazines and newspapers on a set of parameters designed and developed by them. This has resulted into skewed information about the institutions on various parameters.

In order to bring transparency and competitiveness Ministry of HRD has approved and launched The National Institutional Ranking Framework by Honorable Minister of Human Resource Development on 29th September 2015.

This framework outlines a methodology to rank institutions across the country. The methodology draws from the overall recommendations; broad understanding arrived at by a Core Committee set up by MHRD, to identify the broad parameters for ranking various universities and institutions. The parameters broadly cover "Teaching, Learning and Resources," "Research and Professional Practices," "Graduation Outcomes," "Outreach and Inclusivity," & "Perception" (https://www.nirfindia.org/Docs/Ranking\_Methodology\_And\_Metrics\_2017.pdf)
The NIRF gives the ranking of institutions of higher education.

Integration: The review and analysis of all the three ingredients namely quality, accreditation and ranking brings out the parameters which we are focusing broadly on teaching, learning, research, academics, infrastructure, processes, competitiveness, faculty development and stakeholders satisfaction (indicative).

All the three ingredients are exclusive in terms of their own identity and complimenting each other in terms of performance parameters.



#### Quality Assurance, Accreditation and Ranking: Approach to stakeholder satisfaction:

The suggested model is based on stakeholder expectations, which is the expected outcome with well defined processes. The inputs are defined taking into the consideration the processes that are involved for stakeholder satisfaction. If the entire system is in place and is operated systematically, the benefits are quite evident. The institutional mechanism is influenced by management policy, regulatory framework, corporate expectations and the society in which we operate.



Conclusion: For the institution to succeed in a globally competitive world, it is essential that the institute understands the fundamental requirements of growth and sustainability. The suggested model is dynamic in nature and needs to be executed systematically.

#### Recommendations:

It is observed from the above that the parameters of quality assurance, accreditation and ranking has commonality covering major parameters related to academics, curriculum enrichment, research culture, stakeholders satisfaction (indicative).

One can have 60% to 70% parameters which are common for accreditation, ranking and Quality as applicable and balance percentage to individual ingredients. With the implementation of the suggested model, institutes and universities will be in a position to follow a systems approach with focus on continuous development and improvement.

The entire approach will raise the standard and help institutes and universities to benchmark themselves globally.

It is suggested to develop a framework which will be applicable for ranking, accreditation and quality with variation to meet individual requirement.
