EDITORIAL

Scientists have recently discovered the existence of a brand new phobia: Nomophobia. Simply put, nomophobia is the extreme fear of being without a mobile phone! The fear includes losing reception, running out battery and not being able to see your phone. A 2012 survey said that 66% people admit to such a phobia and confessed that losing the use of their phones made them feel disconnected, isolated and neglected. Like all phobias, nomophobia is a mental condition which can have adverse physical and mental effects, like extreme anxiety, depression, and panic attacks. Perhaps it is time to consider this issue before it becomes completely overwhelming.

35th ANNUAL REPORT OF GHANSHYAMDAS SARAF COLLEGE

Ghanshyamdas Saraf College was established in 1983 as one of the major educational endeavors of our parent body Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust. During our journey of more than three decades, it has achieved many milestones as far as number of students, quality of education and infrastructure development is concerned. The college has been re-accredited with 'A' Grade with CGPA of 3.23 in the year January 2013. The college is also ISO 9001-2008 certified. In order to cater to the diversified needs of the students, the college is imparting value based education through seven undergraduate and three Post Graduate programmes. It has also started New Age Programmes such as BA and MA with Film,

Television and New Media Production. In order to inculcate a research culture, the college has started a Research Cell in Commerce and Economics. The student strength today stands at 4951. The college has the privilege of having state of the art Draupadidevi Sanwormal Women's Hostel which accommodates 130 girl students.

I have great pleasure to present her some of the significant activities conducted during the academic year.

Activities of the year:

- **NCC:** The NCC unit of the college celebrated International Yoga day on 21st June at the 100 year old yoga institute in Santacruz, Mumbai. Major Deepika Chatterjee represented Maharashtra Directorate along with our cadets at the National Integration Camp held at Tejpur, University of Assam. We are happy and proud to report that our cadet Manali Bhandari was selected for the prestigious Republic Day Camp at New Delhi. She was the only cadet from 8th Maharashtra Girls' Battalion to be thus selected.
- **NSS:** Our NSS volunteers have participated in Tree Plantation Drives, Flag collection rallies on 15th August and organized a Blood Donation & Thalessemia checkup camp in our college. They have participated in the HIV – AIDS Awareness rally and performed a streetplay on HIV-AIDS awareness. A special 7 days Residential Camp was conducted at Palghar's 'Aastha Trust' under the theme of 'Swachata Abhiyan'.
- **DLLE:** The Department of Life Long Learning and Extension, organized poster making and slogan writing competition on socially relevant topics. They celebrated Senior Citizens Day and spent quality time with senior citizens. Independence Day was spent with people in the slums of the suburbs where food and flags were distributed. DLLE students also participated in a Literacy Drive for students in Bangur Nagar and a Cleanliness Drive at Versova Beach. Our students have won several prizes at the Annual Udaan festival of DLLE.
- **Rotaract Club:** Our Rotaract Club has organized numerous competitions and programmes and each year the participation of its volunteers have increased. Its activities include a drive to increase awareness about organ donation, a seminar on career opportunities in travel and tourism, a programme on the Swach Bharat Abhiyan, free Diabetes camp, a function organized to celebrate Diwali with residents of an old age home in Gorai. Our rotaract members have also conducted a business school workshop to give participants information about novel business ideas and opportunities. The Rotaract club of GSC got the 'Best Charter Club for the year (2016-17)' award at the Annual Rotaract Award Ceremony held in July.
- **Cultural Association:** Our Cultural Association has always been extremely active with various functions such as Talent Contest, Antakshari and its annual intercollegiate festival 'Mauj' which has acquired a reputation of its own. This academic year we will see Mauj celebrated on the 6th and 7th February. Last year this festival had a record 2000 footfalls, from 95 colleges from all over Mumbai.
- **Sports:** Saraf College is steadily making great strides in the field of sports. This year however is very special. Pratiksha Mandavkar won the Silver Medal in the Maharashtra State Kabaddi Championship held at Ahmadnagar last



December and Sayali Jadhav from TYBCBI played for the Indian Kabaddi Team which won the International Asia Kabaddi Championship held in Iran in November 2017. She was the only other player from Maharashtra selected to represent India along with the Captain Pratiksha. Sayali and Pratiksha both have a long track record of several victories at the university district and state level.

- **Career and Placement Cell:** At Saraf College we believe that we have a duty to make efforts not only to educate our students but also to prepare them for employment opportunities. With this in mind our Career Guidance and Placement Cell has undertaken multiple initiatives with several well known corporate to provide students with placements jobs and internship. Some notable names are Infosys, WNS Global, Tech Mahindra Business Services, Harjai Computers, Star Health Insurance Ltd, Birla Sunlife Insurance Co. Ltd and Tata String and Sling App. Students also appeared in the GET test conducted by NIIT for jobs in Banking and Finance Sector. More than 200 students appeared for the test.
- **Bloomberg:** Ghanshyamdas Saraf College has recently established Bloomberg terminals in the college. Bloomberg Professional Service – Bloomberg’s core offering – is a global software platform that provides transparent and reliable financial, economic and government information across all market sectors. Bloomberg helps universities and colleges incorporate this system into academic programs to better prepare students for the global job market. Using Bloomberg’s service, Saraf College students can perform historical market analysis, compare different investment strategies, evaluate complex financial instruments, and analyze specific companies and industries. Bloomberg can also be a powerful tool for our Faculty for Pedagogy and Research. GSC is the first undergraduate college in University of Mumbai to have such a facility.
- **Skill Development Academy:** Saraf College has established an arrangement with the Skill Development and Vocational Training Institute of India with the aim of providing students with additional skills to upgrade and improve their employability. We have provided certificate courses in varied subjects such as E-Taxation and Direct Tax, English Speaking and Personality Development, Software Testing and Accounts Assistance.
- **Research Cell:** Our college has recently launched a Research Cell of the Mumbai University in the subjects of Commerce and Economics and five research scholars have begun the process of registration under the guidance of our faculty members, Dr Shripad Joshi and Dr Shagun Srivastava.
- **Staff Achievements:** Faculty development and achievements have always been one of our top priorities and this year has been no different. Dr Seema Agarwal attended a Refresher Course in Computational Mathematics in month of November 2017. Dr Jayant Apte was invited as a Resource Person in the Students Research National Conclave to speak on recent reforms in Taxation. Dr Apte was also appointed as Member of Board of Studies in Accountancy in the University of Mumbai. Prof Prasanna Choudhary, Dr Lipi Mukherjee, Prof Prajna Shetty and Prof Mamta Chajjer have authored textbooks for students of Self Finance courses. CA Prof Ameya Tanawade and Prof Rupa Shah took part in the inter university Avishkar Research Convention for research scholars and won the gold medal. Prof Rupa Shah went on to the state level where she won the silver medal. Two of our faculty members have obtained their Ph.D. Prof Ashwat Desai has obtained his Ph.D in ‘Forensic Accounting’ from the University of Mumbai and Prof Megha Khedekar has obtained her Ph.D in ‘Retail & Customer Satisfaction in Fast Food Chains’ from North Maharashtra University.

We have come a long way but we are very conscious that there are several more goals to achieve and new dreams to be realized. We have come this far with the support of our staff both teaching and non-teaching, the endeavours of our students and the rock solid support and guidance of our management. Here’s too an even more glorious future for Saraf College.

Every day we read in the newspapers and watch on the tube at least one atrocious incident about a girl being raped and killed or a woman being horrendously molested. But merely discussing about these incidents over coffee with fellow mates the next day isn't the solution. The solution lies in becoming aware of and implementing the n number of rights and duties we, as citizens, are entitled to by the legal system of our nation.

To enlighten us with those very rights and duties, we, the members of the **Women Development Cell**, had invited **Mrs. Pooja Kute and Mrs. Mangala Marathe for a talk show on ROLE OF INTERNAL COMMITTEE IN DEALING WITH SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF WOMEN AT WORKPLACE**. The event started off with the lighting of the lamp followed by the beautiful hymn of Saraswati Vandana. After which, Convenor of WDC, Dr. Shagun Shrivastava shared a few words about WDC with the gathering. Shrishti Yadav, secretary of WDC, introduced both, the guest speaker and the guest of honour. Immediately after, Mrs. Pooja took over and began the talk. At the very outset, she interacted with the audience and asked questions about whether we, as students, have ever been faced with any such situation and what is it that we know about the existing laws and how have we made use of those laws. She, in detail, narrated incidents of females who've been victims of eve teasing and molestation and the stringent laws we have to protect them. She explained the laws in a very lucid language because of which we were able to understand them all. She also brought to our attention the existence of POSCO i.e. The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO Act) 2012 and why the Act has made compulsory that every college have their own internal committee that looks into such matters and deals with the grievances and complaints of the students.

She highlighted the importance and need of an internal committee and explained the procedure of lodging a complaint with the internal committee. We got to know about the role of the police to help us in such times- right from what cases don't under the ambit of the internal committee thus need to be taken to the police to how to lodge a complaint with the police. We also became aware of certain other various simple yet effective steps we can resort to when we encounter such a situation. Mrs. Pooja Kute was constantly engaging with the audience which encouraged the students to come forward and speak out.

The talk was followed by a short Question and Answer session where in students posed all types of questions and in turn received the most accurate and helpful answers from the guest speaker.

Every student, especially girls, in the end felt more empowered and enlightened than they did prior to the talk.

The vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Lipi Mukherjee which marked the end of a tremendously helpful, interactive and empowering session.

THIS IS WATER

There are these two young fish swimming along and they happen to meet an older fish swimming the other way, who nods at them and says “Morning, boys. How’s the water?”. And the two young fish swim on for a bit and then eventually one of them looks over at the other and goes “What the hell is water?”

The point of the fish story is merely that the most obvious, important realities are often the ones that are hardest to see and talk about. The plain fact is that undergraduates don’t have any clue what “day in, day out” really means. There happens to be whole large parts of adult life that nobody talks about in college. One such part involves boredom, routine and petty frustration.

By way of example, let’s say it’s an average adult day, and you get up in the morning, go to your challenging, white collar, college-graduate job and you work for 8 to 10 hours and at the end of the day you’re tired and somewhat stressed and all you want is to go home and have a good supper and maybe unwind for an hour and then hit the bed early, because you have to get up the next day and do it all again. But then you remember there’s no food at home. You haven’t had time to shop this week because of your challenging job. And so now after work, you have to go to the supermarket. It’s the end of office hours, so the traffic is apt to be very bad. When you finally get there, the supermarket is very crowded, because of course it’s the time of day when all the other people with jobs also try to squeeze in some grocery shopping. But you can’t just get quickly in and quickly out. You have to wander all over the huge, over-lit stores confusing isles to find the stuff you want and have to maneuver your trashy cart through all these tired hurried people.

And eventually, you get all your supper supplies except now it turns out there aren’t enough checkout lanes open even though it’s the end of the day rush.

So the checkout line is incredibly long, which is stupid and infuriating, but you can’t take your frustration out on the frantic lady working the register, who is overworked at a job whose

daily tedium and meaninglessness surpasses the imagination of any of us here at a prestigious college. But anyway, you finally get to the checkout lines front and pay for your food and get told to “have a nice day” in a voice that is the absolute voice of death. And then you have to take your creepy, flimsy plastic bags of groceries in your cart with the one crazy wheel that pulls maddeningly to the left all the way out through the crowded, bumpy parking lot and then you have to drive all the way home through slow, heavy, rush-hour traffic. Everyone has done this, of course. But it hasn’t—yet been a part of our actual life routine, day after week after month after year. But it will be. And many more annoying, seemingly meaningless routines. But that is not the point.

The point is that petty, frustrating crap like this is exactly where the work of choosing is going to come in, because the traffic jams and crowded aisles and long checkout lines give me time to think and if I don’t make a conscious decision about how to think and what to pay attention to, I’m going to be pissed and miserable every time I have to shop, because my natural default setting is that situations like this are really all about me, about me, my fatigue and my desire to just get home, and it’s going to seem, for the world, like everybody else is just in my way. And why are all these people in my way? And look at how repulsive most of them are and how stupid, dead-eyed and non-human they seem in the checkout line and look at how deeply, personally unfair this is.

If I choose to think this way, in the store and on the freeway—fine, lots of us do.

Except thinking this way tends to be easy and that it doesn’t have to be a choice. It is my natural default setting.

I can force myself to consider the likelihood that everyone else in the supermarkets checkout line is just as bored and frustrated as I am, and that some of these people probably have much harder, more tedious or painful lives than I do. Please don’t think I’m giving you moral advice, or that I’m saying you’re “supposed to” think this way, or that anyone expects you to just



automatically do it, because its hard, it takes will and effort and if you're like me, some days you wont be able to do it, or you just flat-out wont want to.

Of course, none of this is likely, but its also not impossible. It just depends what you want to consider. If you're automatically sure that you know what reality is and who and what is really important, if you want to operate on your default setting, then you, like me, probably wont consider possibilities that aren't annoying and miserable. But if you've really learned how to think, how to pay attention, then you will know you have other options. It will actually be within your power to experience a crowded, hot, slow, consumer-hell-type situation as not only meaningful but sacred, on fire with the same force that lit the stars. Love, fellowship, the mystical oneness of all things deep down. Not that that mystical is that you get to decide how you're going to try to see it. This, is the freedom of real education, of learning how to be well-adjusted. You get to consciously decide what has meaning and what doesn't. That is real freedom. That is being educated, and understanding how to think.

Awareness of what is so real and essential, so hidden in plain sight all around us all the time that we have to keep reminding ourselves over and over.

गणेशोत्सव – लोकमान्य टिळकांचा आणि आजचा

गणपती बाप्पा मोरया, पुढल्या वर्षी लवकर या ...
 काय मग मित्रांनो, नाचलात भरपूर या वर्षीच्या बाप्पाच्या मिरवणुकीमध्ये.
 बातम्यामध्ये मी पाहत होते विसर्जनाच्या दुसऱ्या दिवशी असणारी ती
 किनारपट्ट्यांची अवस्था. खरंच किनाऱ्यावरची ती विदारक दृश्ये पाहून मन
 अगदी हेलावून जाते. मोठमोठ्या मूर्त्यांचे अवशेष परत तसेच किनाऱ्यावर
 आलेले असतात. हे सर्व पाहून मनात हाच प्रश्न येतो की यासाठी का
 लोकमान्य टिळकांनी सार्वजनिक गणेशोत्सवाची सुरवात केली.

 करणे फार महत्त्वाचे झाले होते. भारतीय लोक हे अत्यंत धार्मिक आणि

 विचार रुजवण्यासाठी सुरवात केली. आजही २१ व्या शतकामध्ये

 जल्लोषाचे वातावरण असते.

सध्या या गणेशोत्सवाला काहीसे वेगळेच रूप प्राप्त झाले आहे. सगळीकडे
 श्रद्धा व धार्मिक भावना यापेक्षा पैसा, प्रतिष्ठा यालाच महत्त्व प्राप्त झाले आहे.
 गणेशोत्सव आला की सर्वजण उत्साहाने बाप्पाच्या आगमनाची तयारी
 करतात. त्यातूनच वर्गणी गोळा करणे, मोठमोठ्याने स्पीकर्स वाजवणे, देखावे
 उभे करणे यातच सर्व मंडळाची चढाओढ सुरू होते. बाप्पाच्या मिरवणुकीमध्ये
 कोणता बाप्पा पुढे असणार ? कोणाच्या बाप्पाच्या मूर्तीची उंची किती मोठी
 असणार ? कोणाचे पथक सर्वात मोठे असणार ? यावरून बाप्पाची प्रतिष्ठा,
 त्याचा मान ठरवला जातो. जेवढी मोठी मूर्ती, तेवढे मोठे नाव आणि तेवढा
 मोठा तो गणपती. अनेक सार्वजनिक मंडळे जबरदस्तीने अनेक लहानमोठ्या
 रस्त्यांवर गणपती बाप्पाची स्थापना करतात. अनेक स्थानिक नेते आणि
 व्यापारी आपल्या जाहिरातीसाठी अशा मंडळांना अमाप पैसे पुरवतात.



जागोजागी रस्त्यांवर उभारलेल्या मंडपांमुळे कधी कधी अर्ध्यापेक्षाही जास्त रस्ता अडवला जातो आणि त्यामुळे वाहतुकीची फार कोंडी होते. अशावेळी वाहन चालकांनी तक्रार केली असता, गणेशोत्सव मंडळाचे कार्यकर्ते त्यांना मारहाण करतात.

विसर्जनाच्या मिरवणुकीमध्ये मोठमोठ्याने वाजवले जाणारे संगीत ध्वनी प्रदूषणाचे कारणीभूत होते. अनेक गुन्हेगारी प्रवृत्ती सुद्धा डोके वर काढतात. गर्दीमध्ये होणारी महिलांची छेडछाड, दारू पिऊन होणाऱ्या हाणामाऱ्या असे अनेक प्रसंग घडतात. कित्येक सार्वजनिक मंडळामध्ये स्पर्धा निर्माण होते. त्यामुळे मंडळांमध्ये वैर, राग, स्पर्धा वाढली जाते. सध्याचा गणेशोत्सव म्हणजे श्रद्धा व भक्ती न राहता पैशांचा आणि प्रतिष्ठेचा बडेजाव उरलाय. विसर्जनानंतर किनारपट्टीवरील दृश्य अगदी विदारक असते. मोठ्या मूर्त्यांचे विसर्जन न होता त्या तशाच किनाऱ्यावर परत येतात. सध्याचे हे उत्सवाचे स्वरूप पाहून असे वाटते कि लोकमान्य टिळकांनी सुरु केलेल्या या उत्सवाचा उद्देश हरवलाय.

परंतु नाण्याच्या दोन बाजूंप्रमाणे, उत्सवाची चांगली बाजूही आहे. अनेक सार्वजनिक मंडळे देखाव्यांवर खर्च न करता अनेक स्तुत्य कामे करतात. समाजातील दुर्बल घटकांना सबळ करण्यासाठी पैसे वापरले जातात. अशा प्रकारे उत्सवांवर खर्च केल जाणारा अमाप पैसा आपण राष्ट्र उभारणीसाठी वापरला जाऊ शकतो. गणेशोत्सवाला प्रतिष्ठेपेक्षा एकतेचा दर्जा दिला तर आपण हे साध्य करू शकतो.

पूर्वीच्या काळी सर्वांच्या बालपणातील अविस्मरणीय भाग म्हणजे त्यांनी खेळलेले खेळ. खो खो, लंगडी, कबड्डी असे अनेक खेळ खेळले जातात. पण काही मुलांना तर या स्वरूप तर दूरच पण पुरेशी माहितीही नाही आहे. या धकाधकीच्या जीवनात या खेळांकडे लक्ष द्यायला कोणाला फुरसत नाही. काही जणांना खेळ म्हणजे वेळेचा अपव्यय वाटतो. पण मैदानी खेळांचे फायदे पाहता त्यांचे तोटे अल्प आहेत. पुरातन काळापासून खेळांचा उल्लेख केलेला आढळतो. पण सध्याच्या काळात विद्यार्थ्यांचे स्थान त्याला मिळालेल्या चांगल्या गुणांवरून ठरवले जाते. पण फक्त मिळालेल्या गुणांवरून माणसाचे भविष्य यशस्वी ठरत नसते. मैदानी खेळांमुळे विद्यार्थ्याला भावी आयुष्यात कार्यरत राहण्यासाठी मदत होते. मैदानी खेळांमध्ये सहभागी झाल्यामुळे विद्यार्थ्यांना त्यांच्या नेहमीच्या ताणातून मुक्तता मिळते.

धावत्या जगामध्ये वाढत्या अभ्यासक्रमांमुळे तसेच मोबाईल, संगणक इत्यादी गोष्टींमुळे मुलांना मैदानी खेळांकडे लक्ष द्यायला मिळत नाही. मुलांना ताजी हवा मिळणे तर दूरच राहिले आहे. मुले क्रिकेट, फुटबॉल सारखे

मैदानी खेळदेखील मोबाईल आणि संगणकावर खेळतात. त्यामुळे त्यांची शारीरिक तशीच मानसिक वाढ खुंटली आहे. कारण मैदानात खेळल्याने मुलांचा मानसिक ताण दूर होतो. सगळ्यांमध्ये मिळूनमिसळून राहण्याची वृत्ती वाढीस लागते. मुलांचा उत्साह तसेच आत्मविश्वास वाढतो. सहकार्याची भावना निर्माण होते. मुलांचा शारीरिक तसेच मानसिक विकास होतो. खिलाडूवृत्ती मुलांमध्ये उदयास येते.

पण पालकांच्या आणि विद्यार्थ्यांच्या बदलत्या मानसिकतेमुळे मैदाने आता ओसाड पडू लागली आहेत. अगदी लहान वयातच मुलांना वेगवेगळे आजार होत आहेत. मैदानी खेळ न खेळल्यामुळे स्थूलता, मधुमेह यांचे प्रमाण वाढत आहे. मुले एकलकोंडी होत आहेत. त्यांना सगळ्यांमध्ये सहभागी होताना त्रास होतो. काही मुलांमध्ये स्फोटक वृत्तीही दिसून येते. काहीजणांना खेळ म्हणजे वेळेचा दुरुपयोग वाटतो. पण खेळांचे महत्त्व लक्षात घेता काळानुसार मैदानी खेळांची सक्ती केली पाहिजे असे वातावरण तयार झाले आहे. कारण अनेक मैदानी खेळ काळाच्या ओघात लुप्त झाले आहेत. त्या खेळांचे महत्त्व कोणाच्या लक्षात येत नाही आहे याचीच खंत वाटते.
