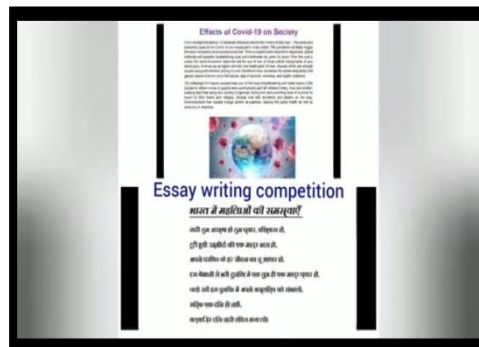
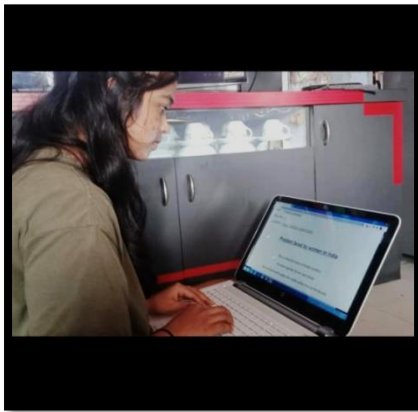

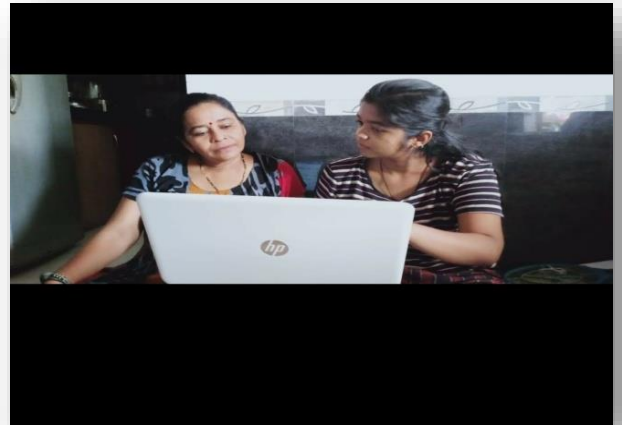

WEB LAUNCH OF **DIGITAL STREE SHAKTI &**

WEBINAR ON CYBER CRIME AND CYBER SECURITY

Organised by

Women Development Cell in association with

Maharashtra State Commission for Women & Responsible Netism

Date – July 21, 2020

Women's Development Cell of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College of Arts and Commerce along with Maharashtra State Commission for Women, and Responsible Netism organized the launch of 'Digital Stree Shakti', and a webinar on cyber security on Tuesday, 21 July 2020. **Adv. Yashomati Thakur, Honourable Minister, Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Maharashtra was the Chief Guest for the launch.**

The webinar started with the introduction of the topic by **Principal CA Dr. Jayant Apte** who highlighted the relevance and need of cyber security measures, especially for women in today's world.

This was followed by a brief history of the Institute provided by **Shri Ashok Saraf, President, RSET**. Mr. Saraf made a mention that among the 16,000 students currently enrolled in RSET institutions, more than 10,000 students are girls. As also among staff members, 80% of the total strength are female employees.

Dr. Lipi Mukherjee, Convener of Women Development Cell introduced the Chief Guest and the resource persons for the webinar.

Mrs. Aastha Luthra , IA & AS Member Secretary Maharashtra State Commission for Women highlighted the need of safeguarding oneself on various digital platforms in the current scenario of curbed physical mobility due to lockdown. She emphasized on the vital role played by 'Digital Stree Shakti' in empowering women by imbibing knowledge about the responsible use of internet.

The session started with the launch of 'Digital Stree Shakti' by Adv. Yashomati Thakur, Honourable Minister, Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Maharashtra, with an appeal to women to understand the various facets of cybercrime and report it to the authorities. The launch happened with the playing of a descriptive video emphasizing the role of such programmes in curbing cybercrimes.

The launch was followed by a fruitful session on ‘Cyber Crimes and Cyber Laws’ by Ms. Sonali Patankar, Chairman, Responsible Netism who laid emphasis on understanding the various kinds of cyber frauds and crimes that threaten the security of a person in a digital realm. Ms. Patankar specifically elaborated on cybercrimes against women, ranging from hacking of bank and social media accounts, to identity theft, cyber stalking, body shaming, cyber bullying and sharing of obscene content for harassment. The speaker also criticized the obsessive culture of ‘selfie’ that has many young boys and girls uploading their pictures on social media to seek validation for their physical attributes. The easy availability of these pictures to hackers, Ms. Patankar pointed out, pose an extreme threat to the security of a person’s data. The speaker provided an in-depth explanation of each cybercrime, and supported it with case studies. She expressed the need to tackle these crimes immediately, owing to their consequences on victims ranging from low self-esteem, to panic attacks, depression and suicidal tendencies. Ms. Patankar concluded her session with an appeal to young girls to have a mindful engagement with internet and technology and report cybercrimes to the authorities.

The presentation on cybercrimes and laws was followed by a session on ‘Security in Cyberspace’ by Mr. Umesh Joshi, Responsible Netism who provided a detailed explanation of various security norms that one needs to abide by in cyberspace. The speaker started with highlighting the crucial role of internet and communication technology in modern life, especially, given the current scenario of being in quarantine. He pointed out that the scope for misinformation and fake news is rampant on social media, given its reach and speed of communication. Mr. Joshi demonstrated the proper use of safety features on various social media accounts, elaborating on the need to update them, owing to the rise in cybercrimes. These safety measures included privacy settings for pictures, videos, location, and limiting unknown audience to one’s profile. He also stressed on updating applications and protecting one’s data with anti-virus software that blocks malware and phishing sites.

The session concluded with a Q & A session which was effectively hosted by **Prof. Bhavana Vaidya, Administrator, GSCC, DSJC and LRMC.**

The webinar received excellent reviews from all the participants.

Women Entrepreneurship – A Start Up Guide for Budding Entrepreneurs

India is witnessing a steady rise in the start-up culture as people are willing to consider occupations other than traditional professions. Keeping this in mind, the webinar focused on providing knowledge about entrepreneurship as the new business culture in India. On the occasion of International Women's Day, the webinar highlighted the success stories of several women entrepreneurs who have managed to create a path for themselves.

We were glad to have Mrs. Meenal Mohadikar as the resource person for the webinar. Mrs. Mohadikar is a first-generation entrepreneur herself, and the founder of 'Aamhi Udyogini Pratishtan' (We Entrepreneurs)- a forum that guides and supports the ideas of women entrepreneurs of Maharashtra with centers in the State, Goa and the UAE. She also started 'Anand Trade Development Services' which organizes trade exhibitions by the name 'Consumers' Shoppee' all over Maharashtra.

The webinar began with welcoming of all the panelists and participants and a formal welcome by Principal, Dr. Jayant Apte. Dr. Mmahek Chhabria introduced the topic of the day and Prof. Prajna Shetty introduced the speaker.

Mrs. Mohadikar began her talk by giving a brief introduction of her Forum, 'Aamhi Udyogini' and its journey in mentoring women entrepreneurs over the years in the form of capital, collaborations through people and workshops, and using government policies. A veteran in the field of entrepreneurship, she also shared her

experiences, successes and challenges faced as a first-generation entrepreneur in the family.

The speaker emphasized on the role of government schemes in realizing one's career as an entrepreneur. She aimed at the importance of understanding these schemes and the benefits that can be reaped from them. Mrs. Mohadikar focused on the 'Mudra Scheme' under 'Chief Minister Rozgaar Yojana' that has benefitted many budding entrepreneurs. After discussing in detail about the workings of the scheme and its benefits for entrepreneurs, she highlighted the importance of uniqueness of an idea. With her quote that 'idea is currency', she expressed that an idea would only sell if it were unique. The distinctiveness of an idea and its relevance in a particular place and culture, would ensure its sales and success.

Mrs. Meenal, then discussed success stories of several women entrepreneurs who came up with unique ideas and innovation in various fields like technology, pharmaceutical industry, and food industry. She stressed on the importance of exploring uniqueness in an idea, and systematically working on materializing it. Lastly, the speaker laid importance on timely expert guidance and support, and right mentoring especially for students who aspire to step into the start-up culture. Mrs. Mohadikar also runs a YouTube channel, the link of which she was willing to share with our students for guidance.

The concluding remarks on the talk were given by Dr. Lipi Mukherjee who thanked Mrs. Mohadikar for discussing her first-hand experience in the field of entrepreneurship and steering budding entrepreneurs in the right direction. The formal Vote of Thanks was proposed by Prof. Charmie Dalal. We immediately circulated feedback form to all the participants. The feedback analysis of the MCQ is attached herewith.

National webinar on

GENDER EQUITY AND COVID 19

Organised by Women Development Cell in association with

Gender Equity is the process of allocating resources, programs, and decision making fairly to all genders without any discrimination on the basis of gender and addressing any imbalances in the benefits available to people of different genders. In order to have gender equity, we need to change the narrative and shift the focus from fixing women to fixing the system. In the midst of this global pandemic threat that is sweeping across the humanity beyond oceans and borders, there lies a huge opportunity for deliberation, learning and transformation in the period of lockdown. This webinar was one such opportunity which aimed at a holistic understanding of Gender Equity.

The webinar was organised in association with University Women Development Cell. We could register 300 plus participants. The attendees were from various parts of the country including Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Chandigarh, West Bengal, Assam etc. including some German nationals as well. The session started with welcome speech by Principal Dr. Jayant Apte who shared information about college and his views about webinar. The introduction of the resource persons was done by Dr. Lipi Mukherjee convener, WDC.

The opening remarks were given by Dr. Gita Chadha Chairperson, UWDC which was followed by presentation and talk on the sub theme **Queer Perspectives** by speaker Ms. Samira Nadkarni .

Ms. Samira Nadkarni is a queer Indian academic and freelance maritime journalist focusing on human rights.

Ms. Nadkarni began the session with understanding the basics of queer theory- the difference between a person's sex and gender. She then moved to analyse the gender roles imposed on people and the way society demands adherence to the same. The speaker laid much emphasis on the need to understand the word 'queer' and to accept it in its entirety. The challenge then, Ms. Nadkarni said is more about acknowledging the existence of different gender identities and accepting them as a part of mainstream life and culture. This set the tone for the webinar. In the next two sessions Ms. Nadkarni, along with Dr. Gita Chadha furthered the theme of the webinar by putting light on the challenges faced by the queer community before and after COVID-19.

The second session was on understanding the challenges faced by the queer community before the current pandemic. This was followed by a round of questions by the participants, on the challenges the community faces on a daily basis- from their personal to social and professional spheres. The discussion was ably facilitated by Dr. Chadha, who also contributed her views on the challenges of queer community.

The last session of the webinar involved discussion on the lives of queer community during COVID-19. Ms. Nadkarni also threw light on the challenges of queer migrant labourers where their safety is doubly compromised.

The session concluded with a range of questions being answered by Ms. Nadkarni and Dr. Chadha. It was concluded that pandemic brought to the surface many lesser-known challenges of queer life, and these would only be solved by giving the queer community a domestic, social, and a professional space to flourish. Dr. Meher Bhoot Member Secretary, UWDC was also among the panellist and helped in organising the webinar.

The webinar came to end with vote of thanks given by Ms. Charmie Dalal member, WDC.

Feedback from 196 attendees was collected during the end of the session. The feedback reflects response to the webinar topic, organisation, resource persons and overall impact.

The topic was rare, complex, sensitive yet relevant and beautifully dealt with by the speaker thus was much appreciated by participants over the chat window as well as personal messages. The positive response received from the participants is a testament to the great success of the webinar.

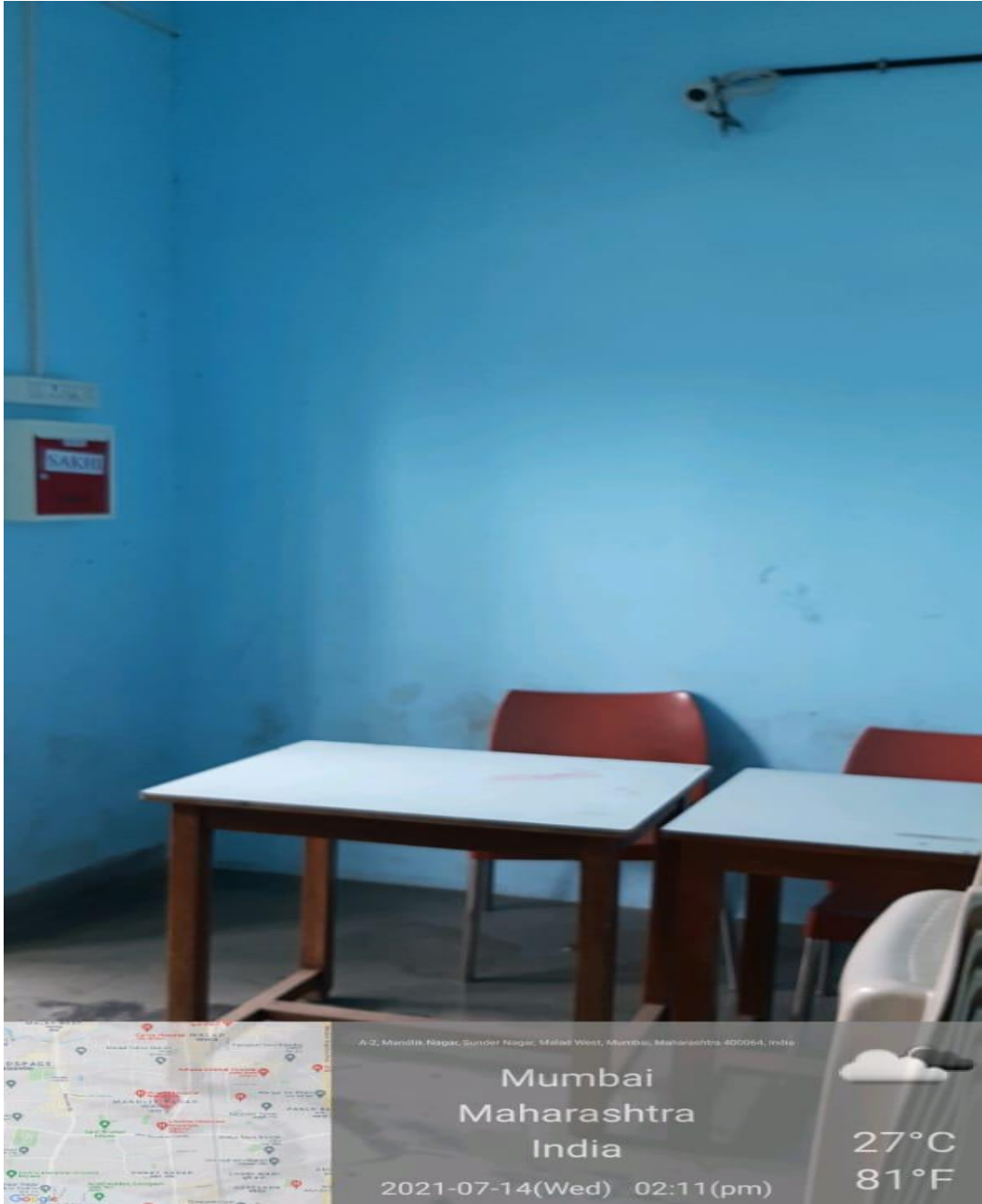

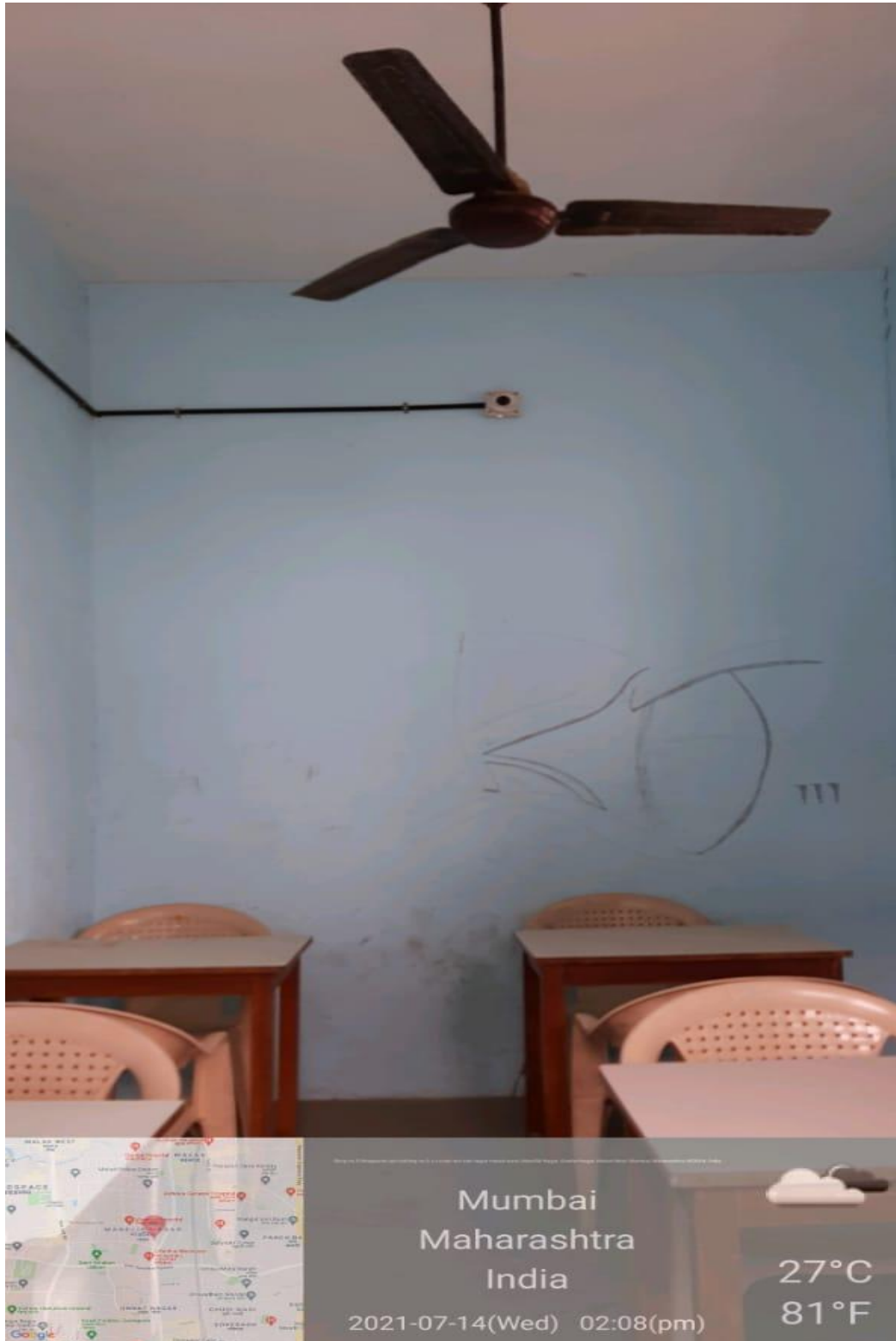
