- a) 38 students were selected by ICICI bank for internship for 60 days beginning from 23rd June, 2012.
- b) 45 students have done internship with Bajaj Finserv Ltd from 5th October 2012.
- c) PNB Metlife had conducted an orientation session on 15th February, 2013. List of shortlisted candidates is yet to be finalized.
- d) Times of India had conducted interviews of candidates on 8th March, 2013. 38 students are shortlisted for the second round of interviews.
- e) Integrity Placement Solutions had come on 16th March, 2013 to discuss about the placement opportunities with ICICI Bank.
- Department of Life Long Learning & Extension: The DLLE of the college has enrolled 82 students for the academic year 2012-13.
