- 6. A range of evaluation techniques are used, ranging from objective online assessment to class-tests, class-presentations and assignments or projects. Internal assessment also provides scope for individual mentoring to students when possible
- To evaluate the quality of teaching learning, the IQAC has developed the following process:

- 2. Analysis of learners' feedback about faculty members.
- 3. Assessment of Performance of learners in internal test and semester end examinations and overall result analysis.


