



REPORT ON WDC

Chief Guest - Dr. Anjali Kanitkar

Dr. Anjali Kanitkar was invited as the guest speaker, at the event organised by women development cell of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College of Arts & Commerce.

Dr. Kanitkar is a Post graduate from Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai. She is a retired Associate Professor from College of Social Work, Nirmala Niketan in 2016, and at present holds the position of director of Social Audit, Govt. of Maharashtra.

She informed the participants about the definition, constitutes and provisions under law of SH, and the process of redressal.

She discussed the case of Bhanwari devi and Vishakha guidelines (1997). She also made students aware of Nirbhaya Act (2013), the SH Act (2013) and UGC regulation for SH (2015).

She made students understand that SH is not only any unwelcomed physical assault but also verbal and non verbal conduct of sexual nature.

She said that even creating a hostile environment through an unwanted conduct with sexual undertones such as making sexually coloured remarks, physical contacts and advances and showing pornography also account for SH.

She discussed the importance of ICC at the level of institute and asked students to approach the same in case of any complaints regarding SH. She said that ICC is suppose to be a neutral body, constituted for the addressal of complaints and also it assists the victims in writing complaints, ensures safety of complainants and prevents victimisation.

She said that higher educational institutions shall conduct such programmes frequently and should also conduct workshop for all the students on SH.

Institutes shall focus on creating a campus which is free from discrimination, harassment, retaliation and sexual assaults at all levels.

Institutes shall treat SH as misconduct and initiate action against the perpetrator.

Her guidance on SH helped students understand it better and also helped them recognise the proper channel in order to report any such misconduct on the campus.
