

ANNUAL REPORT 2022-23

“A good education is a foundation for better future”

Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School is dedicated to the fond memory of late Kudilal Govindram Seksaria, the Institution's chief donor. Like him, his successors believe that the service one can do to an individual is to make him or her self-reliant and self sufficient. KGES believes, “For the last years words belong to last year's language. And next year's words await another voice. And to make an end is to make a new beginning.”

The School reopened for the teachers on 8th June. On 9th June the Std X students reported and the scheduled class test was conducted for them. Principal Mrs Mini Nayar conducted a staff meeting & inducted about the working as per the teachers duty list. She also appreciated the efforts the staff had taken to learn and unlearn and make the teaching interesting for the students. The Principal introduced the new teachers to the staff. Further the staff was expected to cooperate & co ordinate for the smooth functioning of the school. Orientation for the parents was conducted to orient them with the rules and regulations of the school. Parents were informed about the collection of book sets from the school according to the dates given.

A counselling session was held by RMCC for teachers of KGES by Ms. Bhoomi on 10th June, wherein the teachers were briefed about the early detection and intervention to be done of the

students facing learning, behavioural and emotional disability, so as to provide them with effective remedial sessions to ensure holistic development in the children .On13th June school reopened for the students at regular timings. Parents were informed about various sports activities & selection purely on the basis of child's ability. First PTM was held class wise on 18th June and election of the PTA representatives was also conducted. On 20th June students participated in the *Environment Day* by planting saplings. On 21st June *International Yoga Day* was observed. A large number of students, teaching and non teaching staff attended the event . Under the guidance of P.E teachers Ms Bhavika and Mr Dharamraj, various asanas followed by Omkar chanting, warm up exercises were performed. P.T. Teachers explained the importance and benefits of Yoga. In the pre-primary section a welcome activity was conducted grade wise:

On16th June. Principal attended a meeting with RMCC team Ms. Dixha and Ms. Bhoomi to discuss about counselling plan for the academic year. On 17th June the SSC results were declared. This year also the school achieved 100% SSC results with 43 distinctions and 4 students in first class. Secondary teachers attended a session conducted by Mr Nitin Mittal from IDF relating to MCQ testing and question bank on 18th June. Career guidance session by Phasor Academy was attended by parents of standard 9th and 10th on 18th June. Student photographs were clicked for ID cards on 22nd June. In the secondary section Class wise handwriting competition was conducted on 30th June with specific topics and themes and the winners were announced.

Post two years of online school, the students eagerly waited for the offline participation. The month began with the in-house competition *Rain drops Idea Pops* in the primary section. Class wise board decoration competition was conducted in the secondary section on 1st July. The winner class



was awarded in the school assembly. The topics were as follows:

Std. 9th and 10th - 'Creating a future for success'.

1st *PTA & Child Safety Committee * meeting was conducted on 2nd July by Principal Mrs. Mini Nayar in the presence of trustee Mrs. Neeraji Saraf, Headmistress Mrs. Indrani Balan and Members. Martial Arts & Dance activity classes started for the Students. Parents were informed about the collection of fees for the upcoming Olympiad exam & Rangotsav competition. Teachers were instructed to complete the portion for the upcoming 1st class test & submit the Question Papers for the same. Time table & portion was sent to the Parents well in advance. The primary section students participated in *Trashion pe Fashion* competition conducted by the Sanskriti Arts & brought laurels for the school by winning prizes. Mst. Reeyant Shah bagged the 1st prize & Ms. Aliza Shaikh won the Trash icon award. On 16th July, the school had the *Investiture Ceremony* with the newly elected council members. Our Trustee RSET Mrs. Neera Saraf and Special guest Mrs. Urmila Jain graced the occasion and guided the Student Council to carry out their responsibilities towards the school. On 16th July RMCC conducted a session for the Parents on helping the Students with Attention Deficit. On 20th July H. M. Mrs. Indrani Balan & supervisor Mrs. Manpreet Bakshi attended the department Meeting at PBHS. The Students from all the three sections participated in the various competitions such as handwriting, coloring, greeting card making, Sketching Collage making, Tatoo making, Finger and thumb painting, Photography competition, etc in the Rangotsav competition from 25th -27th July. "Camus visit" was organized for the kids on 26th July to make them aware of the school surroundings and the various RSET

Post pandemic and school kids

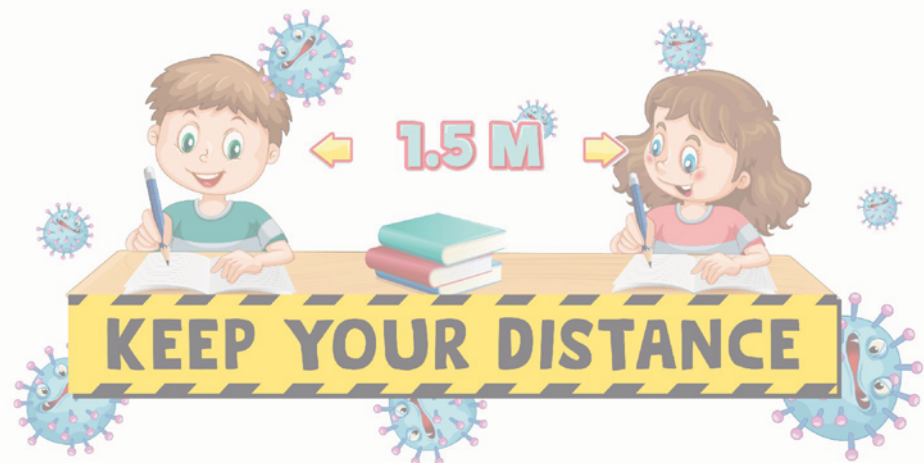

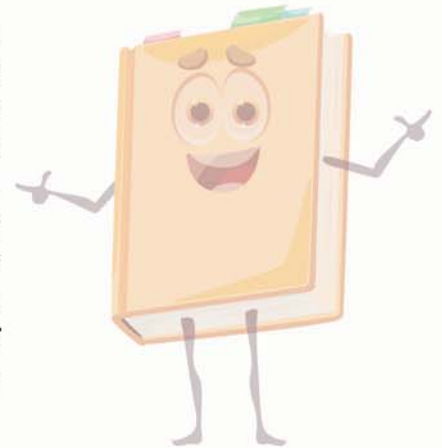
