CONTONMENT BOARD

Contonment Board is one of civic administration body in India under control of ministry defense. The board comprise elected members besides ex-officio and the nominated members as per the cantonments Act,2006. The term of office of a member of a board shall be 5 years. The cantonment board consists of 8 elected members, 3 nominated military members, 3 ex-officio members (station commander, Garrison Engineer and senior executive medical officer) one representative of the District Magistrate. Cantonments is divided into 4 categories namely:

- Category I - population exceeds 50 thousand
- Category II - population exceeds 10 thousand, but does not exceed 50 thousand
- Category III - population exceeds 2500, but does not exceed 10 thousand
- Category IV - population does not exceed 2500.
