


For more than a decade, artificial intelligence techniques have served as critical building blocks for cutting edge business applications. The first wave of AI based tools & applications for business process modeling (BPM) is just hitting the shore. Organizations such as IBM, EDS, the US Army, & Swiss Bank are among the first to adopt AI for BPM. Some are using traditional KBS tools such as ART*Enterprise & ProKappa, while others are turning to ReThink, the first AI tool designed specifically for BPM.

Introduction to AI in BPR

Business-process reengineering (BPR) is a general term encompassing a range of perspectives on how to bring more productive changes in organizations. There are at least two distinct roles for Artificial Intelligence (AI) in BPR. A role of AI in BPR is as an enabling technology for reengineered processes. The second role is less common but potentially important, in the tools to support the change process itself. Fundamentally, any business can be observed as an assemblage of processes that when taken together, respond to the demands of the customer by inventing, producing, delivering, & billing for goods & services. Although these processes differ from business to business, in a predominant number of cases, these processes & the institutions that implement them have not been engineered in any meaningful sense. These processes seem to have evolved over time in response to their business environments. Changing environments frequently defenestrate such companies from the competition unless they make a cognizant & recurrent, if not a continuous effort to reengineer these processes to bring changes in customer needs, suppliers & innovation in technology. Looking at a business as a compendium of customer-oriented processes is the core of *business process reengineering* (BPR), a generic term comprising a variety of perspectives, none of which are particularly rigorous on how to bring change in organizations. Even though, it is easy to set aside BPR as hype, but the phenomenon is tremendously important. (Caldwell 1994) In 1993, 60 percent of the management letters appearing with Fortune 500 company annual reports explicitly discussed reengineering efforts that were currently under way. It was recently projected that the annual market for BPR services in companies based in the United States at \$1.8 billion. Another projection predicts a growth of 20% per capita from 1994 to 1996. To assess the long-term impact of this, one ought to consider a multiple of this figure as the cost diminutions & enhancements in revenue brought about by today's reengineering. There is hype, nevertheless, the phenomenon is real.

Roles of AI in BPR

As mentioned above, there are two distinct roles for AI in Business-process Re-engineering. An archetypal success story of this sort places an expert system in the hands of a single employee who then may be able to carry out various steps of a process for a single consumer or order rather than having several workers in different departments handling

USE OF INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY AND ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN INVESTMENT BANKING

ABSTRACT

ICT & Artificial Intelligence is a coming-of-age and tipped to be the next big thing in the digital era that we know now. One of the areas that will be largely affected is Finance. Asset management is the industry most likely to be confronted by AI and there has been a lot of speculation suggesting that managing portfolios will soon become a robot's routine job. Another potential that can be derived from AI is biometric identification. When ICT & AI become mainstream, at least among banks, those jobs would be automated. It is expected that 4,000 investment banking jobs will disappear by 2025. However, we would expect to see an increase in technology-related jobs such as data analytics and programming.

1. Introduction

Information Communication Technology (ICT) is utilization of electronic systems to handle financial transactions. The major aspects of any finance organization runs basically on their systems; whereas AI is made up of algorithms that work together to formulate meaningful responses and actionable insights. We have all heard about automation, the idea of making things work by itself as if they were robots. Artificial Intelligence encompasses more than just automation. Machine learning is an extended form of automation that stems from the experiential learning ability of AI to remember all the steps that were performed by users without being explicitly programmed; it is continuously bound to improve decision-making with more data raked in.

1.1 Impact of ICT & AI in Investment Banking

Investment banks are typically made up of three operating arms: Sales & Trading, Corporate Finance and Research. When AI takes over investment banking, it will impact all three areas. AI should enable greater efficiency and cost savings through powerful interpretation of data, ease of use, and economies of scale.

In the Sales & Trading department, we will soon witness salespeople being replaced with digital assistants. Natural Language Processing (NLP), the ability of computer programs to understand the human speech, will play a big role in eradicating conversational, client-facing sales roles in investment banks. Traders can become obsolete with the arrival of AI, which is set to offer high-speed and ultra-precision in executing trades by the second. In fact, there has been a 20%-30% reduction in the front office sales and trading headcount over the past few years. Data mining also provide traders with alerts about new investment opportunities.

The Corporate Finance department is what usually composes the majority of an investment bank's business. With the arrival of ICT & AI, the massive amounts of data that investment banking analysts have to collect should be available to sort from in a nick of time. Searching for internal documents can take up 1.5 hours a day on average for analysts. Using advanced interpretation of key words when performing searches.

The Research department can realize the true value of IT & Artificial Intelligence systems through improved accessibility of public information. However, as a sell-side business, the reports generated for buy-side firms tend to be biased towards the issuing investment bank. The Research team can harness artificial intelligence systems by automating basic financial processes and facilitating the creation of neutral investment recommendations.



REPORT ON COST ACCOUNTING PRESENTATIONS (A.Y 2021-22)

TYBCAF Students gave the presentation in the subject of Cost Accounting on the topic "Inter-firm Comparison", wherein two firms from the same industry were compared with the help of ratio analysis.

24 Teams were formed comprising of 5 to 6 students per group. Presentations were given on 25th August, 28th August and 1st Sept. 2021 by TYBCAF DIV A and on 23rd August, 27th August and 30th August 2021 by TYBCAF DIV B.

Detailed report of inter-firm comparison is given below:

TYBCAF DIVISION A

GROUP 1

Netflix V/S Amazon Prime Video

The two companies used for inter firm comparison were Netflix and Amazon Prime Video. A total of ten ratios were analyzed including current ratio, quick ratio, proprietary ratio, capital gearing ratio, interest coverage ratio, gross profit ratio, net profit ratio, operating profits ratio, debtors turnover and creditors turnover ratio. From the analysis it was concluded that Netflix is in a better position than Amazon Prime Video as the profitability, solvency and liquidity ratios were in a much better position than that of Amazon Prime Video. This will have a positive impact on the shareholders, creditors, investors, employees and ultimately customers too and they will be satisfied.

GROUP -2

Bajaj Allianz Life Insurance and Exide Life Insurance Company

In this presentation on Inter-firm comparison, we have done comparison between two companies i.e., Bajaj Allianz Life Insurance and Exide Life Insurance Company. The Ratios used are Current Ratio, Proprietor's Ratio, Return on Proprietor's fund, Investment and Equity Capital and Profit Margin. With the data collected we can say that Bajaj Allianz is more efficient than Exide life insurance company.

GROUP -3

This Presentation is about the comparison between the firms Nerolac paint and Berger paint. Inter-firm comparison means a comparison of two or more similar business units with the objective of finding the competitive position. We have done comparison between both the companies based on their liquidity, profitability, net worth, proprietors funds and some more ratios.

From all the ratios we have concluded that Berger paint is a higher risk taker than Nerolac therefore it earns less profits compared to Berger Paint and have lower return dividend payout ratio comparatively.

GROUP-4

SWIGGY & ZOMATO

Comparison was done on the basis of ratios such as Current, Quick, Debt equity and many more. Analysis shows that Zomato is better than Swiggy. Zomato also had the IPO at a price band of Rs. 72 – 76 per share and Swiggy doesn't have such IPO. Zomato is better than Swiggy.

GROUP -5

AMBUJA Cement v/s Ultra Tech Cement

UltraTech cement has considerably higher debt as compared to Ambuja cements. Since Ambuja cement have less debt, their interest coverage ratio is higher as compared to Ultratech.



Presentation is based on the comparison between Ambuja Cement & UltraTech Cement
The comparison was done with the help of profitability, liquidity and leverage ratios.

GROUP-6

We are comparing the two major airlines **SpiceJet** and **Indigo**.

We have used **Efficiency** ratios, **Profitability** ratios, **Price** ratios and **Financial** ratios.

After calculating the ratios, we came to a conclusion that SpiceJet is trying to recover losses while INDIGO has earned more profits compared to SpiceJet while reducing the costs.

We would like to express our special thanks of gratitude to **Prof. Yogita Mahimkar** ma'am who gave us the golden opportunity to make a presentation on Inter-Firm comparison, which helped us in researching many new things and understanding the topic practically.

GROUP-7

Canara Bank and Bank of Baroda

- (1) Our Presentation is regarding between Two-Inter Firm Companies was of Canara Bank and Bank of Baroda.
- (2) The ratios we have used for comparison of both the banks are as follows: -(A) Canara Bank: - Dividend per Share, Book Value (Inclusive Reverse Reserve) Per Share (Rs.) and Return on Long Term Funds (%). (B) Bank of Baroda: - Basic EPS (Rs.), Book Value (Inclusive. Reval Reserve) / Share (Rs.), Net Profit / Share (Rs.), ROCE (%) and Operating Profit / Total Assets (%).
- (3) Final Conclusion of our Presentation Operating profit per share is lesser of Canara Bank in financial year 2020-2021 than compared to Bank of Baroda. Operating Margin of both the banks is showing a negative loss as per the financial ratios.

GROUP-8

Tata Motors and Mahindra

This Presentation is about the Comparison between the firms Tata Motors and Mahindra.

Inter-firm comparison means a comparison between of two or more similar business units with the objective of finding the competitive position. We have done comparison based on their Current Ratio, Quick Ratio, Inventory turnover, Debt to Equity, Operating Income Trend, Assets Turnover Ratio and some more.

From all this Ratios we have compared which company is more solvent And as per Quick and Current Ratios Mahindra has better short term solvency comparatively as it has maintained standard ratio. As per our observation M &M is better than Tata Motors.

GROUP-9

Wipro and L&T

Inter-firm comparison is the technique which studies the performances, efficiencies, costs and profits of similar firm in an industry with the help of exchange of information in order to have a relative comparison.

Group 9 did an Interfirm comparison on Wipro and L&T, firm, both based in the IT sector.

We have done comparison between both the companies based on their liquidity through current ratio profitability through net profit ratio and return on investment ratio, and return on shareholder funds.

From our analysis, we found out that Wipro has more profitability as compared to L&T, which has low profits due to heavy operating expenses. But L&T is more liquid and will be able to pay its current obligations better than Wipro.



GROUP-10

JIO V/S VI

Me and my friends have made the comparison of telecom firms that are JIO and VI. A telecommunications service is a service provided by a telecommunications provider, or a specified set of user-information transfer capabilities provided to a group of users by a telecommunications system.

We calculated many of financial ratio like Net Profit Ratio, Return Of Shareholder Funds , Inventory Ratio, Capital Turnover Ratio And Proprietary Ratio and analysis the ratio to compare and we get the conclusion as Jio is a higher risk taker then Vi because Jio has high profitability and liquidity then Vi . Vi has less liquidity than Jio, this firm faced continuous loses. Hence Jio is a good firm to invest in.

GROUP-11

Ajanta pharma & Sun pharma

In order to understand the performance of a company. We are doing analysis of two major companies Ajanta pharma & Sun pharma.

This reports will simplify financial statement and will do the ratio analysis which enable us to understand for an individual to invest for longer and shorter period of time they can invest or rely on Sun pharma.

GROUP-12

CARE & ICRA

Our group had done inter firm comparison on CARE & ICRA. We used four types of ratios namely Net Profit Ratio, Return on shareholders funds, return on proprietors equity ratio and the total of proprietors fund. We found out that CARE had a higher net profit ratio and also the returns on shareholders fund. ICRA had more proprietary funds but lower net profit and returns.

Report on "Inter-firm Comparison" presentations by TYBCAF Students (A.Y 2023-24)

TYBCAF Students gave the presentation in the subject of Cost Accounting on the topic "Inter-firm Comparison", wherein two firms from the same industry were compared with the help of ratio analysis.

21 Teams were formed comprising of 6 to 7 students per group. Presentations were given on 1st August, 2023 and 5th August, 2023 by TYBCAF Division A and on 31st July, 2023 and 7th August, 2023 by TYBCAF Division B. Students have presented their findings on various pairs of companies, conducting comparative analyses to assess the strengths and weaknesses of each company within its respective industry. This report summarises the key findings and conclusions from each group's presentation. Here is a summary of their findings:

TYBCAF DIV A

Group 1: HDFC Bank Ltd vs. ICICI Bank Ltd-

Group 1 compared HDFC Bank Ltd and ICICI Bank Ltd, concluding that both banks are fundamentally strong. However, HDFC Bank Ltd was found to be slightly better in terms of profitability and operational efficiency.

Group 2: Berger Paints vs. Nerolac Paints

In their analysis, Group 2 concluded that Nerolac Paints is one of the top brands in the industry, attributing its popularity and trust to continuous efforts.

Group 3: Uber vs. Ola

Group 3 compared Uber and Ola, finding that Uber is more profitable than Ola based on their analysis.

Group 4: Big Bazaar vs. Star Bazaar

Group 4 conducted an interfirm comparison between Big Bazaar and Star Bazaar and concluded that Star Bazaar is superior to Big Bazaar based on financial ratios.

Group 5: Tata Motors vs. Mahindra and Mahindra

From their financial ratio analysis, Group 5 concluded that Mahindra and Mahindra is more profitable, while Tata Motors is considered stable.

Group 6: Infosys vs. TCS

Group 6 determined that Infosys holds a better position compared to TCS, with TCS being considered stable.

Group 7: Tata Steel vs. JSW Steel

Group 7's comparison of Tata Steel and JSW Steel led to the conclusion that investing in Tata Steel is more preferable due to its status as one of the world's most geographically diversified steel producers.



Group 8: Paytm vs. PayPal

Group 8 recognized that both Paytm and PayPal have significantly impacted the digital payment landscape, offering valuable solutions to users worldwide.

Group 9: HPCL vs. BPCL

Group 9 conducted an interfirm comparison between HPCL and BPCL and concluded that BPCL is slightly better than HPCL based on their analysis.

Group 10: Raymond vs. Arvind Ltd

In their analysis of Raymond and Arvind Ltd, Group 10 found that Raymond is more profitable based on ratios and various factors such as product differentiation, market capitalization, and diversification. However, they noted that Raymond has a higher debt load and declining shares, while Arvind Ltd is still growing and has substantial potential.

Group 11: Bic Cello vs. Flair Industry

Group 11's comparison of Bic Cello and Flair Industry concluded that Bic Cello's reputation for reliability and affordability makes it a preferred choice for budget-conscious consumers, whereas Flair Pen's emphasis on vibrant ink colors and a smooth writing experience appeals to those seeking a more expressive and comfortable writing tool. Therefore, Bic Cello was considered superior to Flair Pens.

Group 12: Tata Power vs. Adani Power

Group 12 conducted an interfirm comparison between Tata Power and Adani Power and concluded that Adani Power is better than Tata Power based on their analysis of financial ratios.

TYBCAF DIV B

Group 1: Zomato vs. Swiggy

Group 1 compared Zomato and Swiggy, highlighting that both companies excel in delivering quality food to consumers. Zomato was identified as the market leader in terms of market share, marketing, innovation, and acquisitions. On the other hand, Swiggy stood out for its dedication to providing essential relief to delivery executives, leading to enhanced customer satisfaction.

Group 2: Indigo Airlines vs. SpiceJet Airways

Group 2 conducted an analysis of the aviation industry, concluding that Indigo Airlines outperformed SpiceJet Airways in market dominance, financial performance, fleet size, and potentially stronger customer service.



Group 3: Indigo Paints vs. Asian Paints

In comparing Indigo Paints and Asian Paints, Group 3 highlighted that both companies are reputable brands with a wide range of painting products. However, Asian Paints was found to have a higher book value and earnings per share (EPS), primarily due to its higher pricing strategy.

Group 4: D-Mart vs. Big Bazaar

Group 4 concluded that D-Mart is a top brand in the retail industry, earning customer trust through continuous efforts and offering attractive discounts.

Group 5: Tata Motors vs. Mahindra & Mahindra

Group 5 assessed Tata Motors and Mahindra & Mahindra in the automotive industry. They emphasized that both companies are formidable players, advising investors to carefully consider their investment objectives, risk tolerance, and long-term outlook when choosing between the two.

Group 6: Britannia vs. Nestle

Comparing Britannia and Nestle in the FMCG industry, Group 6 found that Nestle holds better long-term growth prospects due to its stronger brand portfolio, wider distribution network, and larger presence in emerging markets. Both companies are debt-free, though Britannia's debt increased slightly due to capacity expansion.

Group 7: Puma vs. Adidas

Group 7 conducted an interfirm comparison between Puma and Adidas, concluding that Adidas outperforms Puma based on their financial ratios.

Group 8: Ambuja Cement vs. Shree Cement

Group 8 appreciates both Ambuja Cement and Shree Cement for their excellence in different ways. Ambuja Cement excels in sustainable practices and environmental commitment, while Shree Cement stands out for efficient production processes and strong financial performance.

Group 10: Infosys vs. HCL Technologies

Group 10's interfirm comparison concludes that HCL Technologies outperforms Infosys in terms of returns, based on financial ratios.

In summary, students have presented the comparative analysis of various companies across different sectors providing valuable insights into their strengths and weaknesses. These analyses can serve as valuable references for investors, stakeholders, and individuals interested in understanding the competitive landscape and financial performance of these companies in their respective industries.
