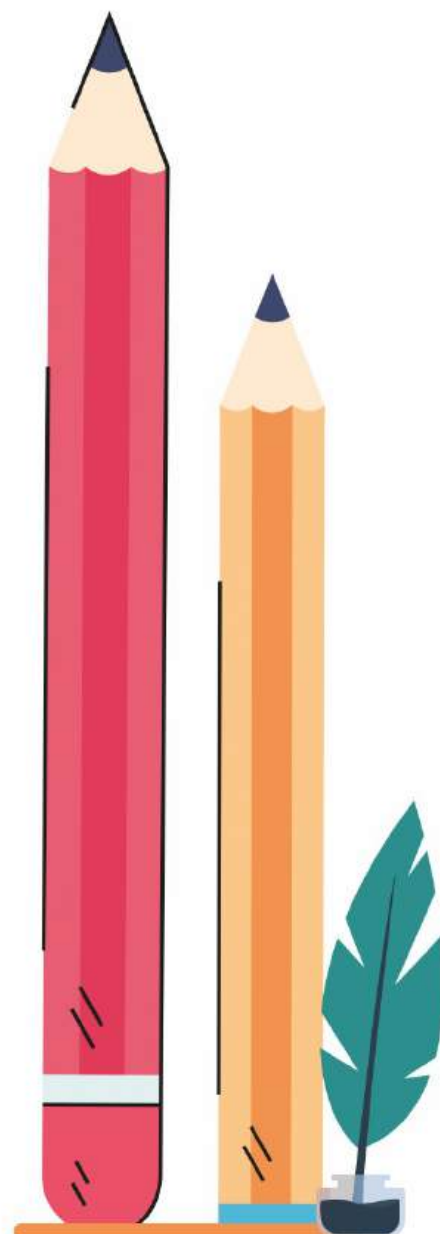

## ANNUAL REPORT

Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School is dedicated to the fond memory of late Shri Kudilal Govindram Seksaria, the Institution's chief donor. Like him, his successors believe that the service one can do to an individual is to make him or her self-reliant and self-sufficient.

The School reopened for the teachers on 8th June. On 9th June the Std X students reported and the scheduled class test was conducted for them. Principal Mrs Mini Nayar conducted a staff meeting & inducted about the working of the academic year. The Principal introduced the new teachers to the staff. Further the staff was advised to cooperate & coordinate for the smooth functioning of the school. Orientation for the parents was conducted to orient them with the rules and regulations of the school. Parents were informed about the collection of book sets from the school according to the dates given. A counselling session was held by RMCC for teachers by Ms. Bhoomi on 10th June, wherein the teachers were briefed about the early detection and intervention to be done with the students facing learning, behavioural and emotional disability so as to provide them with effective remedial sessions to ensure a holistic development of the children. On 13th June School reopened for the students at regular timings. Parents were informed about various sports activities & briefed them that the selection process will be purely on the child's ability. First PTM was held class wise on 18th June and election of the PTA representatives was also conducted. On 20th June students participated in the Environment Day by planting saplings. On 21st June International Yoga Day was observed. A large number of students, teaching and non-teaching staff attended the event. Under the guidance of P.E teachers Ms Bhavika and Mr Dharmraj, various asanas followed by Omkar chanting, warm up exercises were performed. P.T. Teachers explained the importance and benefits of

Yoga.

In the pre-primary section a welcome activity was conducted grade wise:

Nursery :- Fish Puppet

Jr.kg :- Ice cream Puppet

Sr.kg :- Crown

This year also the school achieved 100% SSC results with 43 distinctions and 4 students in first class. Secondary teachers attended a session conducted by Mr Nitin Mittal from IDF relating to MCQ testing and question bank on 18th June. Career guidance session by Phasor Academy was attended by parents of standard 9th and 10th on 18th June. Student photographs were clicked for ID cards on 22nd June. In the secondary section Class wise handwriting competition was conducted on 30th June with specific topics and themes and the winners were announced.

International Asteroid Day is an annual global event observed on June 30th, in a number of countries around the world, including India which is dedicated to spreading awareness about the potential impact of asteroids on Earth and the importance of space exploration. The theme for this year's Asteroid Day is



Education on Asteroids and space highlighting the importance and impact of space Down to Earth. To mark this event, the secondary section students celebrated world Asteroid day on 3rd July. Several activities were arranged for the students from Std V to IX. The students of Std V & VI were shown a documentary film on Asteroids. Std VII & VIII prepared posters on Asteroid Day. Students of Std IX wrote an essay on the same. The day is observed to educate the people about asteroids and the importance of defending our planet. Remedial assistance to weak students was done. The activity classes for dance, martial arts, band, scout & guide and Cub/Bulbul started from 1st July. On 4th July, Mrs. Manpreet Bakshi attended a department meeting held at I.B.Patel Goregaon-west. 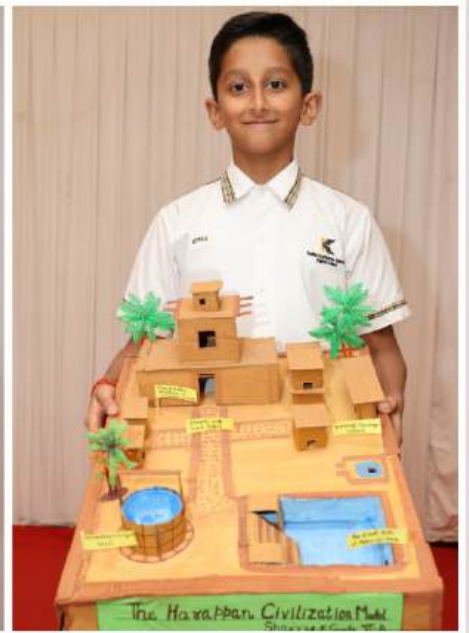

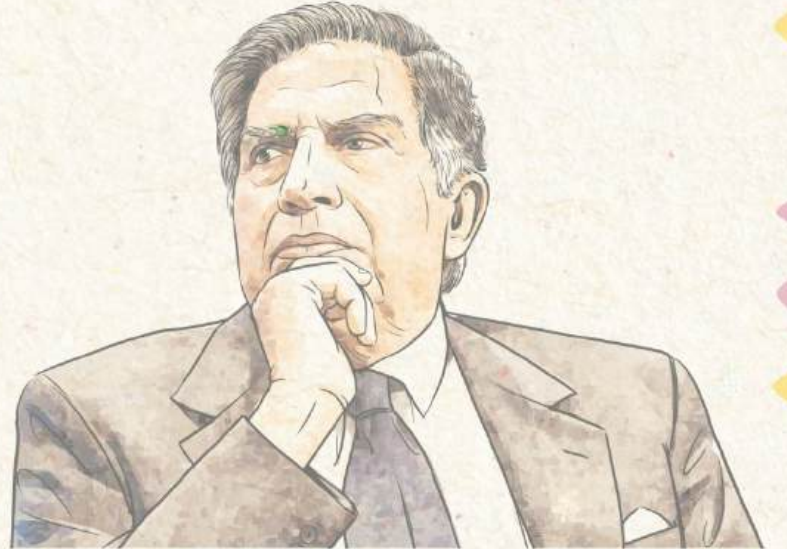

विषय : भारत हा विविध परंपरा आणि संस्कृतींनी नटलेला देश आहे. खाद्य, लेखन, वेष या सर्व संस्कृतींसोबतच भारतीय चित्रसंस्कृतीही तितकीच प्राचीन आणि दैदिव्यमान आहे. आपल्या भारतीय परंपरेचा चित्रकलेच्या बाबतीत एक गौरवपूर्ण इतिहास आहे. आजच्या लेखाच्या माध्यमातून आपण भारतीय चित्रकला परंपरेतील मैलाचा दगड ठरलेल्या ८ चित्रकला प्रकारांची माहिती घेणार आहोत.

**मधुबनी चित्रकला:-** मधुबनीची पाळंमुळं नेपाळ आणि बिहारच्या उत्तर भागातली आहेत. बिहारमध्ये मधुबनी नावाचा जिल्हा आहे, पण हिचं मूळ ते नेपाळच्या मधुबनीजनकपुर नगरीतल आहे. या चित्रकलेला मिथिला चित्रकला असेही म्हणत.

**राजपूत चित्रकला:-** ही चित्रकला सतराव्या आणि अठराव्या शतकात उदयास आली या चित्रकलेस राजस्थान चित्रकला असेही म्हणतात. राजघराण्यातील लोकांचे शिकारीची चित्रे, तसेच हिंदू पुराणांमधील चित्रे राजपूत चित्रकलेत रेखाटली गेली आहेत. राजपूत चित्रकलेत विविधता आढळून येते. राजपूत चित्रकलेचे खास वैशिष्ट्य म्हणजे चित्रकलेत वापरले जाणारे रंग हे दुर्मिळ आणि बनवण्यास अवघड असतात.

**गोंड चित्रकला:-** मध्यप्रदेश, बिहार, उत्तर प्रदेश, आंध्र प्रदेश आणि तेलंगण या राज्यांमध्ये गोंड भाषा बोलणारी जमात दिसून येते. या जमातीत उगम पावलेल्या चित्रकलेला गोंड चित्रकला असे म्हणतात. चित्रे काढण्यासाठी माती, कोळसा आणि पानांचा वापर केला जातो.

**वारली चित्रकला: :-** वारली ही बहुतरुन महाराष्ट्रात राहणारी आदिवासी जमात आहे. सहाद्रीच्या रांगा, डहाणू, पालघर, मोखाडा, जवाहर येथे वारली लोक राहताना दिसतात. ही अतिशय सुंदर दहाव्या शतकाच्या आधीपासून अस्तित्वात आहे. वारली लोकांची मातीशी घट्ट नाळ जोडली गेली आहे. त्यामुळे त्यांच्या जी चित्रात त्यांचे दैनंदिन व्यवहार, नित्याची कामे तसेच शेतीची कामे, उत्सव यांचे चित्रण केले जाते.

**तंजावर चित्रकला/ तंजौर चित्रकला:-** इसवी सन सोळाशेच्या सुमारास विजयनगरच्या रायानी तंजावर चित्रकलेच्या प्रकाराला प्रोत्साहन दिले. ही चित्रकला मराठा राजवट असताना बहरास आली. हिंदू मंदिरांतील चित्रे ही या काळात काढण्यात आली. पुराणकाळातील आणि हिंदू ग्रंथांतील विविध देव देवतांची चित्रे ही या चित्रकलेची वैशिष्ट्ये आहेत. यानंतर जैन, शीख आणि मुसलमान या धर्मातील चित्रे या शैलीत पाहायला मिळू लागली.

**कलमकारी चित्रकला:-** कलमकारी चित्रकला ही भारतात आंध्र प्रदेशात आणि तेलंगण येथे उदयास आली. या चित्रकलेचे दोन प्रकार आहेत. एक श्रीकलाहस्ती शैली आणि दुसरी मछलीपट्टन शैली. श्रीकलाहस्ती शैली ही एक अवघड प्रकारची चित्र शैली आहे. या शैलीत नेहमी पेनाचाच उपयोग जातो. कलमकारी चित्रकला ही मूलतः पट्टचित्र या नावाने ओळखली जात होती

**कालीघाट चित्रकला:-** कलकत्यात असणाऱ्या कालिघाट या बाजारावरून या चित्रकलेचे नाव कालीघाट चित्रकला असे पडले आहे. एकोणिसाव्या शतकात बंगालमधल्या खेड्यांमधून अनेक चित्रकार कालीघाट परिसरात देवीच्या मूर्ती बनवण्यासाठी आले आणि त्यांनी ही कला विकसित केली.

**मुघल चित्रकला:-** मुघल चित्रकला ही भारतात सोळाव्या ते अठराव्या शतकात उदयास आली. फारसी आणि भारतीय चित्रकलेचा संगम म्हणजे मुघल चित्रकला. या चित्रकलेत मुख्य म्हणजे मुघल सम्राट, त्यांचा राजदरबार आणि मानमरातब यांची चित्रे रेखाटली जात.

तर, हे होते ८ भारतीय चित्रकला प्रकार. या चित्रकला प्रकारांकडे बघून भारतीय कलेच्या समृद्धीचा सार्थ अभिमान वाटल्याखेरीज राहत नाही.

**धर्म, जाती आणि पंथ** : मराठी हिंदू अनेक धार्मिक व्यक्तींचा आदर करतात. बंका महार, भागू, दामाजीपंथ, काऱ्हेपात्रा, कर्ममेलम, निर्मला, सदाना, सखुबाई, सत्यकाम जबाली आणि सोयराबाई या प्रदेशात उगम पावलेल्या व्यक्तींमध्ये आहेत. 2011 च्या जनगणनेनुसार, हिंदू धर्म हा राज्यातील 79.83% लोकसंख्येचा प्रमुख धर्म होता, तर एकूण लोकसंख्येच्या 11.54% मुस्लिम होते. महाराष्ट्रात भारतातील सर्वात जास्त बौद्ध आणि जैन लोकसंख्या आहे. महाराष्ट्राच्या एकूण लोकसंख्येमध्ये बौद्ध धर्माचा वाटा 6% आहे, 6.53 दशलक्ष अनुयायी आहेत, जे भारतातील सर्व बौद्धांपैकी 77% आहे, जैन, ख्रिश्चन आणि शीख लोकसंख्येच्या अनुक्रमे 1.2%, 1.0%, 0.2% होते.

**पोशाख** : महाराष्ट्रातील पारंपारिक पुरुषांच्या पोशाखात धोतर, आणि फेटा या नावाने ओळखल्या जाणाऱ्या धोतीचा समावेश होतो, तर चोली आणि नऊ गुजची साडी स्थानिक पातळीवर नऊवारी साडी किंवा लुगडा म्हणून ओळखली जाते. पारंपारिक पोशाख पुरुषांसाठी ट्राउझर्स आणि शर्ट आणि महिलांसाठी पाच यार्ड साडी किंवा सलवार खमीज हे लोकप्रिय बदल म्हणून दुर्मिळ होत आहेत. पारंपारिक पोशाख केवळ विशेष प्रसंगी आणि सर्गामध्येच महाराष्ट्रीयन वापरतात. मराठी स्त्रियाही त्यांच्या महाराष्ट्रात फुलांनी बनवलेला गजरा किंवा वेणी घालतात. तनमणी, बोरमाळ, राणीहार, कोल्हापुरी साज, ठुशी असे दागिने गळ्यात घालायचे; हाताच्या कोपराच्या वरच्या भागावर बाजुबंद; पायंजन घोट्यावर घालायचे; कुडी, बुगडी, कुडका, वेल, कानावर बळी; नाकावर मराठी नथ; पायाच्या बोटांवर जोडवी.

**जत्रे आणि उत्सव** : गुढीपाडवा हा हिंदू वर्षाचा पहिला दिवस म्हणून साजरा केला जातो. गुढी ही बांबूची काठी रंगीत रेशमी कापडाने आणि फुलांनी हारलेली आणि गोड शीर्षाची प्रतीक आहे. गणेश चतुर्थी हा महाराष्ट्रातील सर्वात महत्वाचा सण आहे. दहा दिवस मोठ्या आनंदाने साजरा केला जातो. बाणगंगा उत्सव, भाऊबीज, एतिफटा उत्सव, एलोरा उत्सव, गंगा दशहरा, जीवती पूजा, कालिदास उत्सव, कोजागिरी पौर्णिमा, महाराष्ट्र दिन, नागा पंचमी, नारळी पौर्णिमा, पोळा, शिवजयंती आणि वटपौर्णिमा हे महाराष्ट्रातील काही महत्वाचे सण आहेत. दिवाळीत, मुलं मराठा राजा शिवाजीला श्रद्धांजली म्हणून स्थानिक पातळीवर 'किल्ला' म्हणून ओळखल्या जाणाऱ्या किल्ल्याची प्रतिकृती तयार करतात. ते माती आणि खडकांपासून बनवलेले आहेत आणि मोहरीच्या कांबांनी, मावळ्या किंवा खेळण्याचे सैनिक, खेळण्यातील तोफा आणि सूक्ष्म प्राणी यांनी सजलेले आहेत.
