Policy Statement on Waste Management

Introduction:

Waste management is important because improperly stored refuse can cause health, safety and economic problems. To prevent damaging the ecosystems and maintain a high quality of life, humans must manage and store their waste efficiently and safely.

Rajasthani Sammelan's, Ladhidevi Ramdhar Maheshwari Night College of Commerce, Malad West, Mumbai has deep concern to protect environment, health and well-being through implementation of effective waste management practices such as segregation, recycling, and composting. It is segregated and disposed of properly to the MCGM.

Objectives:

- To contribute in environment protection and sustenance through the initiatives like cleanliness drives and proper disposal of waste material
- To instil values of proper disposal of waste material among the students and stakeholders
- To make the campus plastic free
- To conduct lectures and awareness programmes on waste management and environment protection

Waste Management Policy:

A) Degradable Waste Management:

- Biodegradable kitchen waste from Canteen, Horticultural waste such as dried leaves, twigs be collected from all around the campus.
- Use of dustbins throughout campus for waste segregation
- Digitization of office procedures through electronic means via WhatsApp group, email and Google classroom; thus, reducing paper-based waste.

B) Non-Degradable Waste Management:

- Waste like plastic, metals, glass, newspaper and stationery are to be systematically collected
- The collected non-degradable waste has to be segregated and sold to authorized vendors for its recycling.
- E-waste management is done properly.

This policy is mandatory for all stakeholders to abide with the practice of waste management in and outside the campus.



2. Management of Degradable Waste and Non- degradable Waste

The college has facilities for management of degradable and non-degradable waste to reduce adverse impact on human health and environment. Several facilities are available for the management of degradable and non-degradable waste.

The following initiatives are taken in this regard:

The solid waste is collected in pits regularly and destroyed periodically. The dustbins are also used to separate the different waste like solid, biomedical, etc.

- For solid waste management different bins have been placed in campus and in different departments. The waste material is collected in dustbins through MCGM vehicle. The waste generated through newspapers is sold to scrap venders for recycling.
- Management of waste from Ladies Hostel is resolved by MCGM sanitary department.
- Solid Waste is collected every alternate day by the Garbage Collection Truck of MCGM. Biomedical waste is collected, segregated and disposed. Incinerator is available in ladies hostel and common room.
- The waste water which is discharged through washrooms and toilets are connected to corporation drainage system through underground pipelines.
