Mums, Dads n Munchies: A Heartwarming Start to a Parenting Initiative as RBHS Hosts 'The Curious Parent'

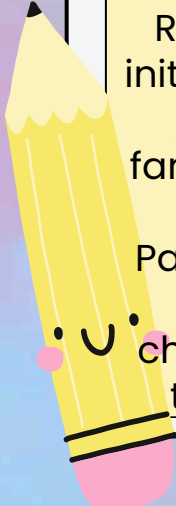
On 13th September 2025, RBHS had the privilege of hosting Mr. Harpreet Singh Grover, better known as The Curious Parent. An alumnus of IIT Bombay, co-founder of CoCubes, and co-author of the bestselling book Let's Build a Company, Harpreet is also a celebrated parenting content creator on Instagram. He inspires thousands of families with his thoughtful insights, which are rooted in entrepreneurial grit, childhood curiosity, and the belief that meaningful interactions with children matter deeply.

The exclusive workshop for parents focused on the challenges and opportunities of raising children in today's fast-changing digital age. Harpreet highlighted that successful parenting rests on three pillars: empathy, balance, and love. He encouraged parents to:

- Build empathy by listening attentively, validating their children's feelings, and leading by example.
 - Nurture independence by giving children manageable responsibilities and allowing them to make choices.
 - Manage gadgets wisely by creating tech-free zones, setting healthy limits, and offering engaging alternatives.
- An especially engaging discussion revolved around children's tendency to cling to parents. Harpreet explained that while healthy attachment is essential, children must also be gently guided toward independence—building confidence through small steps and responsibilities.

The workshop also marked a special milestone: the launch of RBHS's new parenting initiative, "Mums, Dads n Munchies." This initiative aims to create a warm, inclusive space where parenting journeys are celebrated, challenges are shared openly, and families collaborate to make this most important role even more meaningful.

Parents left the session inspired and empowered, equipped with fresh perspectives and practical strategies to support their children with empathy and care. It was a memorable beginning to a journey of building stronger school-family partnerships.

SENIOR KG ACTIVITY - SOLIDS, LIQUIDS, AND GASES



Senior KG children had a fun and interactive science session where they learned about solids, liquids, and gases through a live demonstration. The teacher used simple examples like an ice cube for solid, water for liquid, and air or steam for gas.

To make the lesson more engaging, children were invited to touch and observe the items and identify which represented a solid, liquid, or gas. They eagerly participated, enjoying the hands-on learning experience and discovering science in action!



SENIOR KG ACTIVITY - WALL HANGING ON BALANCED DIET

Senior KG children explored the concept of a balanced diet through a creative hands-on activity. Using a paper plate, they divided it into sections representing carbohydrates, proteins, fats, vitamins, and minerals, and drew corresponding food items in each section.

The children then brightly colored and decorated their plates, transforming them into attractive wall hangings. This activity not only helped them understand a complete diet plan but also turned their learning into a beautiful and creative display!

SENIOR KG ACTIVITY - TYPES OF BAGS



Senior KG children explored the wide variety of bags we use in our daily lives in a fun and interactive session. 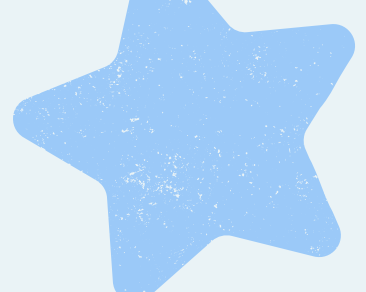
RBHS U/14 Girls Table Tennis Team Shines!
