Being the Role Models Our Children Deserve



Sitting in the airport lounge, waiting for my flight, my eyes rested on a mother and daughter tucked away in a quiet corner—both reading peacefully. There was a soothing stillness around them. In contrast, many adults around us had their faces lit not by calm or curiosity, but by the glow of digital screens.

This year, during our admission interactions, I met two families whose influence on their children deeply moved me. One mother spoke about how she helps her little one drift into sleep each night—with gentle musings and slow, rhythmic humming. Her daughter, only two and a half, now sings with remarkable intonation and grace. It felt like witnessing how a mother's quiet ritual becomes a child's innate gift.

Another mother left an even stronger imprint on me. She is the first woman from her village—hidden in a quiet corner of Gujarat—to graduate and become an engineer. Despite her challenges with English, she worked her way into a respected position in a US-based company. Every year during her visit back home, her sons not only reconnect with their roots but also learn about the hardships that still exist and the sheer determination that carried their mother beyond them. Her story has become their compass.

As parents and educators, we often tell our children to be their best selves. Yet, far more than anything we say, it is what we do that shapes who they become.

Our children watch us more closely than we realise. They learn not merely from our advice but from our everyday choices, habits, and reactions.

They observe the way we speak to people. They notice the way we speak about people. In those unguarded conversations, we are teaching them compassion or criticism, respect or judgement.

They watch how we use our gadgets—whether we are present or preoccupied, whether our screen time replaces conversations, family time, or even their little stories from school.

And perhaps most importantly, our children absorb what we truly value.

If we celebrate only material comforts, they grow to think joy lies in things.

But when we celebrate togetherness, gratitude, kindness, effort, and the small, meaningful pleasures of life—a shared meal, a walk, a heartfelt talk—they learn that real happiness comes from connection, not consumption.

Let us be the role models our children will someday thank us for—not because we instructed

- them on how to live, but because they watched us live with intention, humility, and heart.*


Smart Choices, Stronger Futures: RBHS Diabetes Awareness Workshop


A Feast of Fun & Healthy Flavours!

Shreshti Karmokar Selected for Prestigious ISRO & IMD Visits


