This quarter we were excited to have Ellie the Elephant - Asia's first life-size animatronic empathy-building elephant, voiced by actor Dia Mirza and brought to us by PETA India, exemplifies such a rare and profoundly impactful initiative.

"Ellie is a unique, empathy-building initiative available in English and Hindi. She's Asia's first realistic educational animatronic elephant, visiting schools across India to teach children about kindness and empathy."

Crafted with striking lifelike traits-blinking eyes, flapping ears-Ellie tells her own story: a heartbreaking separation from her mother, abuse endured in the circus, and eventual rescue leading to a sanctuary life filled with joy and safety.

Ellie's voice imbues authenticity and compassion, thanks to Dia Mirza, who not only voiced the character but also permeated the project with her deep commitment to environmental advocacy. Mirza, known as a UN SDG and UNEP Goodwill Ambassador. Ellie's presence did not merely fascinate our students-it catalyzed deep reflection and a renewed sense of responsibility toward animal welfare.

KGES, KGSS and RBHS welcomed Ellie into their schools and within moments, students gatheredeyes alight with wonder-as Ellie came to life, elegantly mimicking a real elephant's movements, and shared her poignant tale with them.

The classroom atmosphere shifted from idle chatter to rapt attention. With every blink, every ear flap, students leaned in, truly hearing the a deep, emotional understanding of animal narrative of hardship and redemption.

Post-session reflections revealed a remarkable shift. Students asked thoughtful questions about initiatives and ongoing empathy-focused

animal rights, the ethics of entertainment, and humane living environments. Several students, previously reserved, volunteered to lead empathy projects-organizing poster campaigns discouraging visits to circuses and fundraisers for wildlife sanctuaries. Teachers reported meaningful classroom conversations extending into home; a new echo of empathy resonated. Ellie's visit aligns with PETA India's Compassionate Citizen program-a free humane education initiative crafted for students aged 8 to 12. Remarkably, it has been implemented across over 2 lakh schools, reaching nearly 9.3 crore children nationwide.

- Experiential Learning: Ellie transformed abstract concepts into vivid, embodied experience-students didn't just hear about cruelty; they felt its emotional gravity.
- · Ethical Awareness: Her story triggered meaningful conversations about responsibility toward sentient beings.
- · Emotional Empathy: Students developed suffering.
- Motivation to Act: A wave of student-driven



dialogues affirmed that the visit catalyzed real change, not just awareness.

- Scalability: Digital like **Programs** Compassionate Citizen-can be enhanced through experiential add-ons like Ellie's tours to deepen impact.
- Community Engagement: Such visits can spark wider school - community engagement through exhibitions, campaigns and ongoing initiatives.

The apparatus includes the common place strikers, mortar and pestle, clay triangles, watch glasses, crucibles, crucible tongs, chemical spoon, stirring rods, filter funnels and a variety of stoppers. Not only it is used by the secondary students but the budding scientists from the Primary Section also make regular visits to the Lab to become familiar with the art of experimentation. The students are duly supported during practicals by the Lab Assistant who keeps the lab ready well in advance with the required equipment and chemicals.

It is a matter of great pride that students of MBIS gave 100% result at the IGCSE Examination. Veer Savla of IGCSE, secured the First position with 91%-(4A\* and 1 A).

A Level students also earned accolades with Samarth Goyal securing 90% (3 A\* and 1 A) and Ayushmaan Goyal securing 88% (3A\*). 



Going ahead TRIGON is set to grow, inspiring countless students, families, and educators every year.









#### Systematic Literature Review

Ms. Pooja Goswami and Ms. Kusum Pawar participated in a two-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on "Systematic Literature Review" held at N. L. 

#### with Memories to Cherish



The second quarter of 2025 unfolded as a dynamic season of growth, connection, and transformation at the Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre (RMCC). As the academic year bridged transitions between examination closures and new beginnings, RMCC's initiatives across career counseling, skill development, remediation, and overseas education reflected its commitment to nurturing confident, self-aware, and future-ready students. Throughout April, May, and June, RMCC assisted students, graduates, and professionals to navigate the maze of career possibilities. In these three months, a total of 91 students enrolled for career assessments, alongside three working professionals who sought tailored guidance. These assessments were conducted both online and offline, reflecting RMCC's flexible and inclusive approach to outreach. Each session, rooted in research-backed psychometrics, acted as a compass for individuals seeking clarity and direction in their academic or professional pursuits.

Beyond career guidance, RMCC counselors actively worked to support emotional resilience and self-growth. A series of personal skill-building and life coaching sessions helped students develop essential soft skills, cope with anxieties, and articulate their personal goals. The counselors' empathetic, student-first approach was evident in how they balanced structured psychometric tools with personalized conversations that addressed deeper aspirations, doubts, and anxieties. In June, the launch of the Career Development Program (CDP) witnessed ten enrollments, signifying a rising interest among students to invest in holistic career

planning that included skill building, vision setting, and guided exploration.

RMCC's commitment to identifying and addressing learning challenges remained steadfast. Over the quarter, students underwent a range of Psycho educational assessments which were critical in uncovering academic hurdles and designing meaningful remedial interventions. Counselors and special educators collaborated to ensure these tools were not just evaluative, but also empowering—giving students and parents actionable insights into the next steps of their learning journey.

The Mentorship Program, which had gained momentum in previous quarters, continued to flourish. Ten new students joined the program between April and June, with many more continuing their journey from earlier months. The mentorship offered a well-rounded experience, guiding students through exam preparations, university/college applications, and decisions around career and life transitions. Weekly follow-ups ensured consistent progress, while tailored roadmaps were crafted for each mentee. In

June, six students from the program celebrated a milestone as they received and confirmed their undergraduate admissions. Others remained actively engaged, with continued support for upcoming applications or school transitions.

Over the three months, a total of 247 remediation sessions were conducted, catering to students with diverse needs through one-on-one guidance, hands-on learning, and individualized strategies. Equally significant were the 18 parent meetings that facilitated open dialogue and collaborative problemsolving. These engagements ensured that parents remained not just informed, but actively involved in shaping their children's educational progress. Through these interventions, RMCC reaffirmed its belief that every child deserves a supportive environment to thrive, irrespective of learning differences.

Within RMCC's in-campus school support system, the second quarter marked a blend of continuity and new beginnings. At Ramniwas Bajaj English School (RBHS), April witnessed vibrant engagement through classroom observations, individual student counseling sessions, and parent meetings, many of which centered around accommodations for board exams. The counselors' presence created a safe space for students to voice concerns and receive affirming guidance. In June, a Teacher's enrichment workshop on identifying signs and symptoms of learning difficulties was conducted, fostering a school-wide understanding of inclusive practices. Counselors also extended transitional support to younger grades-Nursery, Grade 1, and Grade 5-as the new academic year commenced.

the quarter was shaped by both reflection and readiness. While mid-April and May saw the closure of the academic year with assessments and counseling follow-ups, June was spent preparing for the fresh school term. The well-being mentor proactively planned life-skills content, reviewed past referral cases, and designed targeted interventions for students requiring continued support. Orientation sessions across pre-primary to secondary sections laid the groundwork for consistent engagement, while logistical planning for students with physical disabilities reflected the centre's sensitivity to accessibility.

At Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School (KGES), RMCC's influence continued to grow. A career seminar in April introduced Grade 10 students and their parents to the possibilities and purpose of career counseling. This was followed by orientation sessions in June for both primary and pre-primary sections, where the school counselor introduced RMCC's services, emphasizing the center's role as an ally in the students' academic and emotional well-being.

On the global front, RMCC's Study Abroad division continued to be a crucial launchpad for students aspiring to international education. Between April and June, three students formally registered for overseas admission processes in countries such as the UK and the USA. Each application was supported by a team effort involving profile building, application documentation, and visa guidance. Success stories began to unfold-most notably with visa approvals for U.S. universities and offers from reputed Universities like UAL, London and University of Sheffield in UK. In parallel, university updates and country-specific information were regularly shared with RMCC's student database, ensuring every aspirant remained informed and inspired. Promotional campaigns and free registration drives also helped build awareness among new audiences, especially through outreach to local colleges and institutions.

April brought a high point in RMCC's engagement calendar with the much-anticipated Trigon 2025

event hosted by RSET. Over two days, RMCC set up an interactive stall that introduced students, parents, and faculty to the spectrum of services it offers—from psychometric assessments and mentoring to global education guidance. The stall attracted over 150 visitors, resulting in nine on-the-spot registrations. The energy of the event was further amplified through participation in workshops, video reels, and social media features that showcased the vibrancy of the RMCC team and the real-world impact of its work. Trigon not only amplified visibility but also validated RMCC's position as a central contributor to the larger academic ecosystem.

The months of April to June were marked by RMCC walking beside every learner, understanding their journey, and helping them discover their unique strengths. Through meaningful conversations, strategic guidance, and a genuine belief in potential, RMCC continues to illuminate the path forward for thousands of students—one story, one step, and one success at a time.

Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel is located at a walking distance from RSET Campus. The independent Hostel building has seven floors and provides accommodation for 152 students. At present there are 140 students in the hostel. All rooms are air-conditioned and aesthetically designed. There are air-conditioned study areas on all floors where the students can sit and study.. Also, all the floors have lounge and TV room for recreation of the students. Other facilities include communication room, dining room and Gym facilities. Some gym equipments such as tread mill, cycle, bench, dumbbells and other equipments have been provided in the Gym of the hostel so that students can work out as per their convenience. From the past few months, renovation of some areas has been undertaken by the Management.

All rooms have been painted before the onset of the rainy season, ensuring a fresh and clean environment for the residents. All airconditioners have undergone deep servicing, and necessary spares have been replaced to ensure optimal performance Additionally, gypsum board fixing has been done in all rooms to prevent damages or seepage of false ceilings. An AMC has been signed with a reputable vendor

for lift maintenance, which includes regular servicing and oiling to ensure smooth operation. In rooms, new pillows and bed covers have been provided to the residents, replacing the ones used earlier. For the safety of the students, the building is equipped with fire detection and fire fighting system. Recently fire extinguishers have been upgraded, and regular checks are being conducted to ensure compliance with safety norms. CCTVs have been installed for 24 x 7 security of the inmates of the hostel. Cameras have also been installed at the backside of the emergency exit on all floors to enhance resident safety. The building is maintained by professional house-keeping agency. Recently, new pest control, housekeeping and security agencies have been appointed to provide better services to the Hostel.

The inmates of the Hostel are provided with hygienic breakfast as well as dinner supplied by the in-house caterer of RSET. There is a Food Committee which meets once in every month. Feed back is taken from them and menu for the next month is prepared and handed over to the caterer. Recently, the Food Committee has revamped the menu to offer a wider variety of vegetarian options, ensuring that the residents have access to nutritious and delicious food.

Other facilities provided to the students include half yearly health check-up by Avaksha, the agency running Vijay Pal Singh Health Centre of RSET. The students staying in the hostel have also been given a slot in the morning (twice a week - Monday & Friday) to use Pravinchandra D. Shah Sports Academy ground for playing various games. The Warden of the Hostel as well as other staff take care of the comfort and safety of the inmates It is a matter of great pride that some students staying in the hostel have achieved excellent ranks in various national level examinations, reflecting their hard work and dedication. The Management ensures that all queries of the residents are addressed within a day. An online satisfaction survey has been which showed that the majority of the residents are fully satisfied with the facilities and services provided to them in the hostel.

Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel has a strict policy ensuring that residents adhere to the rules and regulations of the hostel. Residents who fail to comply have been served warning letters, and in some cases, parents and local guardians have been informed.






