

Subjective & MCQ type online tests were also conducted for midterm internal exams on Gold Academy's Learning Management System (LMS) for Institutes of RSET.

Keeping pace with changing digitization in learning, administration and business, we at RSET have provided all possible technological support to our staff and students for teaching -learning and to administrative staff for office administration.

The month of October arrived with the celebration of 'Gandhi Jayanti', the birthday of Gandhiji, Father of the Nation. 



## 10TH REMSONS International

RESEARCH CONFERENCE REPORT

Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies (DSIMS) and Durgadevi Saraf Global Business School (DSGS) organized the 10th Remsons International Research Conference 2024 on 31 August, 2024, under the aegis of Remsons Centre for Management Research (RCMR). The theme of the Conference was "Empowering Transformational Change in Business Landscape".

The conference commenced with the traditional lighting of the lamp, followed by the national anthem and Saraswati Vandana. Dr. Sumana Chaudhuri, the Chief Convener, welcomed the distinguished guests and participants, setting the tone for the day's proceedings. Dr. C Babu, Director of DSIMS, delivered the opening address, emphasizing the relevance of the conference theme in today's rapidly evolving business environment. He highlighted the unique qualities of the RSET President and the chief guests, drawing parallels to a recent article featuring fifty outstanding leaders, and underscored their embodiment of leadership excellence. Dr. Sarita Vichore, Director of DSGS, in her address, referred to McKinsey's 2023 report which was focused on the era of Artificial Intelligence. While discussing about the three key elements of Al: Narrow Intelligence, Generative Al, and General Al, Dr. Vichore

Mr. Ashok Saraf, President of Rajasthani Sammelan Educational Trust (RSET) and Chairman of DSIMS & DSGS, delivered the Presidential Address. He highlighted RSET's role in shaping more than 60,000 students. He reminisced about his father's (Shri Mahavirprasad Saraf) vision in establishing DSIMS to provide quality education through skill development initiatives. Mr. Saraf also addressed the role of AI in shaping students' futures, acknowledging both the challenges and strategies to overcome them through business education.

emphasized the importance of balancing Al

advancements with human touch.

Mr. Krishna Kejriwal, Chairman and Managing Director of Remsons Industries Ltd, focused on the evolution of family businesses and the impact of globalization on the Indian economy. He emphasized the shift towards professional structures in corporate management and the importance of adapting to dynamic

environmental challenges. Some key words of the inaugural speech of Mr. Kejriwal were - the automation, Al, data analytics in driving innovation and enhancing customer experiences, the shift towards customer-centric business models and personalized offerings. He cited example of Toyota's assembly line. He highlighted the importance of global market understanding and the need for flexible strategies in business. He stressed on the critical role of leadership in attracting and retaining talent, fostering emotional intelligence, and creating adaptable work environments. He concluded by narrating the evolution from intelligent leadership to collective leadership and collaborative culture for meaningful decision-making in today's business world.

**Dr. Sharad Kumar Saraf**, Chairman and Managing Director of Technocraft Industries India Ltd & the Chairperson of BoG of IIT Mumbai and IIT Jammu, delivered a keynote address. He emphasised the importance of management education to keep the momentum up with the India's Amrit kaal vision of 'Viksit Bharat' and 'Atmanirbhar Bharat,' while accentuating the

importance of embracing the technological change.

Dr. Sharad in his keynote speech covered several crucial aspects, including the definition of 'Empowerment' in the business landscape as the ability to accept and implement the transformational change. He cited examples of companies which failed to adapt to changing technologies, such as Polaroid and the advent of digital cameras. By sharing his personal experiences in embracing digital tools, he narrated the importance of being adaptable in the face of rapid technological advancements. He referred to Darwin's theory of evolution in the business world and emphasized that only the fittest can survive in a constantly changing environment and Change is the only constant parameter in the Universe. He lauded the role of MBA institutions which bestow different human values and principles and thereby prepare students to manage, lead and grow businesses in this evolving landscape.

A significant highlight of the event was the unveiling of the research journal publication, "The Management Quest" (Volume 6, Issue 1). This launch underscored the conference's commitment to promoting and disseminating quality research in management studies. The morning session ended with a vote of thanks proposed by the co-convener Dr. Sunita Pujar.

The Paper Presentation Session started right after the Plenary Session, chaired by Dr. Pankaj Trivedi, Professor and Dean at KJ Somaiya Institute of Management Studies and Research (KJSIMSR).

After preliminary screening followed by peer review, 18 selected research papers had been presented by the academicians, like the

The first presenter, Dr. Mmahek Chhabria (Ghanshyamdas Saraf College of Commerce), emphasized exploring leadership styles for managing Gen Z talent. Ms. Glancy Albuquerque and Mr. Rajeev Kamble (Siemens Technology and Services Pvt. Ltd and Research Scholars of DSIMS & Alkesh Dinesh Mody Institute for Financial Management Studies respectively) examined the role of Financial Literacy in Promoting Gender Equality in Mumbai's Workplace.

Dr. Ravindra Dey's (HoD HR, Xavier Institute of Management Studies & Research) study on Organizational Culture's Impact On Employee Resilience and Mr. Samir Sham Keskar's (Research scholar, DSIMS) exploration of Blockchain Technology in International Trade Facilitation added valuable insights to the conference. Prof. Dr. Shubhangi Salokhe (Associate Director, MIMA Institute of Management, Pune) investigated the Impact of Technology-Driven Services on Farmer Producer Organizations' Growth. Ms. Mansi Dangarwala (Ghanshyamdas Saraf College of Commerce) examined the pros and cons of Internet of Things in company operations. Dr. Nisha Dahiya (Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies) analyzed the Role of Storytelling In Boosting Brand Value And Consumer Engagement, while Ms. Charvi Hasmukh Shukla (FPM student at XLRI Jamshedpur and Alumni of DSIMS 2018-20 batch) presented a virtual case study on Understanding the Impact of Experiential Learning on Student's Learning Effectiveness: A Case Based on Zillennials

Student-Led Assessment Center.

Ms. Ananya Prabhu and Mr. Manav Jha investigated Customer Experience in Volatile Economic Conditions and explored Consumer Perception of Milk Product Benefits respectively. 

#### Parent Teacher Meeting & Personal Hearing

Parent-Teacher Meeting at DGMC was held on 10th August 2024 for Second Year (SY) and Third Year (TY) students and for the First Year (FY) students on the 19th Sept 2024 in accordance with the University Ordinance 6086. Also Personal Hearing with parents was conducted for SY-BAMMC (16 students) and SY-BAFTNMP (7 Students) on 30th Sept 2024.

Parents were invited to the meeting to discuss their wards' attendance records. The class coordinators and faculty members presented detailed reports on individual student attendance, highlighting those with attendance below the mandated 75%. The discussion focused on:

- A thorough review of each student's attendance was conducted.
- Parents were made aware of the potential academic consequences of low attendance.
- Faculty members informed parents about the implications of Ordinance 6086 of the University of Mumbai. The ordinance clearly states that students who fail to maintain a minimum of 75% attendance are at risk of being debarred from examinations and other academic activities.
- It was emphasized that attendance is a critical component of academic performance and that non-compliance could result in severe academic penalties.
- To ensure that the importance of attendance was understood, parents were asked to sign an undertaking. The undertaking served as a formal acknowledgment that they were aware of their ward's attendance situation and the potential consequences under the university's regulations.
- Parents agreed to support their wards in

improving attendance and ensuring compliance with university norms.

• The consequences of attendance falling below the required 75% threshold were clearly outlined to the parents. These include debarment from examinations, which can seriously affect the student's academic progression.

The faculty assured parents that they would receive regular updates on their ward's attendance and academic performance. Any signs of non-compliance would be addressed promptly.

On 19th July 2024, the third-year journalism students visited SRM Printing Press. This visit was organized to provide students with practical insights into the functioning of a printing press and to enhance their understanding of the printing and publication process.

Proprietor Mr. Yash gave the students a tour to the different sections of the printing press. He elaborated on the working principles of the offset printing machine, highlighting its role in producing high-quality printed materials. He explained the process of transferring ink from a plate to a rubber blanket and then onto the printing surface. Mr. Yash then introduced the digital printing machine, emphasizing its efficiency and suitability for short-run printing jobs. He described how digital files are directly printed onto the material without the need for printing plates. The tour concluded with an overview of the binding and finishing section. Students observed the machines used for cutting, folding, binding, and laminating printed materials. He stressed the importance of these processes in ensuring the final product's quality and durability. The IV to the printing press was an enriching experience for the third-year journalism students of DGMCMS. It offered them a deeper understanding of the printing process and the technological advancements in the industry.



The Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre (RMCC) continued its steadfast dedication to career guidance and student development throughout August and September 2024. The center's activities spanned career counseling sessions, assessments, webinars, skill-building workshops, and support programs aimed at nurturing both academic and emotional wellbeing. RMCC's holistic approach ensured that students, graduates, and professionals received individualized support in making well-informed decisions about their future.

Inthe quarter, RMCC had several new enrollments, offering comprehensive career assessments for school students and professionals. These sessions were conducted both online and offline, allowing participants to explore their strengths and align their educational paths with personal aspirations. RMCC carried out specialized Psycho educational assessments to help students better understand their learning profiles and address academic challenges.

Personal development and emotional support are integral aspects of RMCC's mission. During this period, the centre saw a significant demand for Life-Coaching and Personal Skill-Building sessions. These individual-focused interventions allowed participants to work on essential life skills and manage personal challenges, fostering resilience and self-awareness. RMCC's life-coaching services have been instrumental in guiding students and young professionals toward

personal growth and improved well-being.

The centre also placed a strong emphasis on inclusive education through its remediation services. RMCC's Special Educator conducted more than 300 offline remediation sessions, providing targeted support to students with diverse learning needs. These sessions were designed to help students overcome learning difficulties, and collaborative meetings with counselors and teachers further ensured that effective strategies were implemented.

Parental engagement remained a cornerstone of RMCC's approach to student success. Throughout August, nine parent meetings were organized, offering a platform for open communication between parents, counselors, and educators. These meetings allowed parents to stay informed about their children's progress and facilitated a collaborative effort in supporting the student's overall development.

RMCC's has been working with schools like Ramniwas Bajaj English High School (RBHS) and Mainadevi Bajaj International School (MBIS) to strengthen their student support systems. The hostel is managed by the Rector as well as other hostel staff who always take care of the comfort and safety of the inmates. There is an Asst. Rector who also help the Rector. The security staff appointed at the Boys' Hostel perform their duty with full punctuality and dedication. The house keeping staff keep the hostel spic and span by cleaning of all the areas at frequent intervals. For the safety and security of the students staying in the hostel, suitable fire detection and firefighting systems have been provided in the building. CCTVs are also installed for 24 x 7 security. There is Wi-Fi access to the entire building. 1Gbp high speed fiber internet has been provided in air-conditioned study areas.

The month of July has been a very busy month for Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel as admissions commenced for the new tenure of July 2024 to June 2025. # Media and its impact on the present generation

#### The world of media

Snack media, bite sizes, punchy headlines, razor sharp text. What am I talking about? Knowing these words could lead you directly into the hearts and minds of Gen Z. Or so media would have you think.

Gen Z, for the uninitiated, refers to those born roughly between 1997 and 2012. They are the drivers of both, media and technology, and hold more influence than their predecessors ever did. In fact, the term 'Media' has changed beyond recognition in the last century more than it had before - and yet, today when we speak of media in the present day, our experience of it was unimaginable even 2 decades back.

These 'Digital Natives' as they are sometimes referred to have information access more than and faster than before. They have access to smart phones, social media and constant connectivity which shapes how they perceive themselves, their world and it directly affects their chosen ways of social communication and interaction, besides how they consume everything.

#### What makes it possible?

With easy internet access, the availability of information, news, games besides interaction on platforms like Instagram, TikTok, Snapchat, and YouTube has given rise to a phenomenon popularly known as social media influencers, who have a powerful impact on their fashion choices, lifestyle decisions, and even political opinions.

If you think this is some kind of doomsday viewpoint, think about this: Social media allows Gen Z to explore and express their identities in ways not possible before and also influences how they perceive themselves and present their views to the world, moment by moment.

The pace and the personalisation of media today, is overwhelming and is making their generation anxious. Jonathan Haidt, an eminent social psychologist, in his book, 'The Anxious Generation' says, 'The collapse of adolescent mental health is an urgent and complex topic we can't understand from any one disciplinary perspective.' He has been studying morality, emotion and culture to get insights into this phenomenon.

Some issues like cyberbullying, FOMO (fear of missing out), and negative body image weren't rampant or even existent before. Managing the pressures of an always-online world can take a toll on their mental health - and this is not really limited to Gen Z.

#### The good news however...

Not all is bad with this rise of new media though. With the internet at their fingertips, Gen Z has unparalleled access to information, news, and diverse perspectives. They are more informed about global issues and social causes than previous generations at the same age. Hence, the younger generation's commitment to activism and social causes like justice, environmental sustainability, among others gets amplified and allows them to mobilize and raise awareness quickly and effectively. This has been a boon, although the instant 'headline' approach to things can create dangerous situations for entire populations.

The preference of digital streaming services and content online over traditional TV and radio, especially user-generated content and shortform videos has made the influence by social media and online reviews a reality which cannot be escaped. This however, helps increase the value of authenticity and the younger lot are more likely to support brands that align with their values.

Overall, the media landscape has a profound impact on how Gen Z thinks, acts, and engages with the world around them. It shapes their cultural norms, influences their opinions, and

provides platforms for both self-expression and collective action.

#### The impact on education in India

Educational content in India is helped immensely by the media and this is not restricted to access by the internet alone. Television with channels like Doordarshan's DD National, Discovery and National Geographic allow access to science, history, and environmental studies for millions, reaching even those in far-flung geographies.

The internet of course, has brought knowledge to the people's finger tips. All kinds of education, academic and practical, basic to advanced, simple to complicated, is now available through online courses. This has the added advantage of reduced infrastructure and pricing which makes it affordable to many, who couldn't have opted for learning due to their economic status earlier. In this sense, this also helps bring about a level playing ground for willing and meritorious students.

Technology and innovation has pushed the world of teaching and education further allowing learning to be more audio-visual than before and also facilitate interaction and simulation. Virtual labs in science simulating experiments is a case in point.

Real-time updates, global developments, digital news platforms and educational websites provide instant access to information to news and current affairs relevant to the world out there.

With time, the media of today has also had a huge impact on values and cultural perspectives among students. Television, OTT platforms and cinema cover topics which portray social issues, ethical dilemmas, and cultural diversity, prompting critical thinking and discussion among viewers. Of course there is a flip-side, due to a rise in hero worship, consumerism and wrong messaging which can hurt the social fabric in the short and the long-term.

#### Challenges for the individual and the society at large

Unreliable internet connectivity, fake news, biased viewpoints, no quality checks on accuracy and authenticity of online information create misinformation and confusion. Online scams, porn and social media addiction are other dangers posed by easy access of the media.

- These ideas can be engaged in: Promote fact-checking and thus create an atmosphere of responsible digital citizenship.
- Integrate all media when disseminating information, especially educative reliable content.
- · From policy makers to educators and parents, all stakeholders must get together on formal platforms consistently creating systems which aid safe ways of internet engagement.
- · Encouraging students to indulge in offline activities, play, social interaction, off days to disengage from screens, while promoting physical mobility in natural environments.
- Allowing screen-time consent for students

only above a certain age.

These are but a few of the things that may help harness the best effects of media for our students while safeguarding their childhood responsibly.
