The building plan has been approved by the BMC and we expect to start the University by June 2028.


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

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
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Hon. Secretary's MESSAGE

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
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Dear Reader,



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
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Independence Day Celebration by

11th Remsons International Research Conference Report



DDSIMS and DSGS organized the 11th Remsons International Research Conference 2025 on 2nd August, 2025, under the aegis of Remsons Centre for Management Research (RCMR). The theme of the Conference was "Building Atmanirbhar Bharat: Strategies for Sustainable Development".

Chief Patron of the Conference Shri Ashok Saraf, President RSET and Chairman DSIMS & DSGS, apprised the audience about the origin of Remsons Centre for Management Research (RCMR). He said that RCMR had been established with the magnanimous donation by late Remsons Group Chairman Shri Vishwaprakashji Harlalka, who had a vision to establish a Management Research Centre. He thanked Shri Krishna Kejriwal, Chairman and Managing Director Remsons Industries Ltd, for his continued support towards RCMR. He connected the dots among Atmanirbhar Bharat

(Self Reliant India) achievable through Education and widely promoted by RSET, a pioneer in the educational activities for the last 76 years, catering education to different sections of the society. He highlighted RSET's role in shaping more than 60,000 students so far. He informed that RSET is now in the process of establishing Skill Tech University at Malad Campus. He appreciated the effort of Conference organisers for choosing this apt theme as it will serve as catalyst for transforming changes, paving the way of sustainable future for the world.

Chief Guest Shri Krishna Kejriwal, Chairman and Managing Director Remsons Industries Ltd, delivered an insightful inaugural speech. Based on the context of Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan (May 2020 by PM Modi) to promote Indian goods in the global supply chain and help the country achieve self-reliance amidst Covid '19 pandemic and geopolitical crisis, he comprehended the

true meaning of citizenship of a self-reliant and a confident nation. He emphasised the importance of educational institutions in imparting the understanding of the roles and responsibilities of future citizen of India. He opined that Self Reliance is not about isolationism rather to strengthen our foundations, amplifying our capabilities and becoming a contributor to the global order. He said that it's a time to innovate, to manufacture, to dream, and to deliver not just for ourselves, but for humanity at large. He shared some strategies to make this vision to be truly transformative and lasting.

Shri Krishna Kejriwal further said that the Circular economy now should move from buzzword to blue print, wherein the businesses should not only be encouraged but also to be mandated to move towards Green Industrialisation. As a second strategy, he talked about empowering MSMEs by giving them access to credit,

technology and market. Then he talked about a few equally important strategies like-Digital Empowerment and fintech solutions, collaboration of technology incubation hubs with Research Centres, energy independence, empowering women and tribals, digital inclusion, smart, responsible and ethical governance along with citizen engagement, Atal Incubation Mission, Skill India, Defence corridor in UP and Tamil Nadu, indigenous capability for defence manufacturing, R&D, participation of private players and academic-industry collaboration for the growth of indigenous sectors etc. He concluded his speech by referring towards intergenerational equity and called for innovation, sustainability and inclusivity to achieve Swatantra Bharat (Sustainable India).

Guest of Honor Dr. Harivansh Chaturvedi, Director General, IILM Delhi and Alternate President of the Education Promotion Society for India (EPSI), presented his keynote address on Strategies for Sustainable Development: Pathway for a Viksit and Atmanirbhar Bharat. He talked about India's Historic Inflection Point and connected with the recent Amritkaal journey of India to attain the target of Viksit Bharat. He decoded the Triad-Sustainability, Development & Self-Reliance.

To showcase the inherent capability of India, he presented a Data snapshot of India's progress though different metrics, like- Renewable Energy, Digital Economy, GDP Growth and Human Development Index (HDI). He shared the 5 Pillar Framework Strategic Pathway-Green Economy, Human Capital, Energy Transition, Sustainable Infrastructure and transparent and stable Policy & Governance. As a revered academician, he emphasised the role of Business Schools for nurturing the Leaders of 2047. In this context, he explained the four major focus areas- Curriculum Innovation, Thought Leadership, Fostering Entrepreneurship and Industry-Academia Collaboration. He concluded by exhibiting a Confluence of Visions. He said that Sustainable Development is not a cost but a strategic investment to achieve the twin

goals of Development and Self Reliance, builds resilience, and creates an equitable society. In his concluding remark he called the fellow citizen to move forward with the conviction that what is good for the planet, is best for the economy and our people.

The Plenary session was followed by Paper Presentation Session.

After preliminary screening followed by peer review, fifteen selected research papers had been presented by the academicians of various Management Institutes as well Industry professionals. Each of the presented papers caters to the different industries, their sustainable practices and strategies to become self-reliant and grow further.

The first participant Mr Sureshraj Zallare (Research Scholar, Alkesh Dinesh Mody Institute for Financial Management Studies (ADMIFMS)) and his co-author Dr. Ashish Hattangadi presented their work on Digital Collection Challenges in Mumbai's Microfinance Sector.

Ms. Yogita (Ph.D Scholar, Department of Business Economics and Financial Studies, University of Delhi) presented her research manuscripts on Green Investments & PPPs in Infrastructure: Assessing India's Progress towards the SDGs.

Mr. Alok (Research Scholar, Ramanand Arya D.A.V. College) and his Research Guide Dr. Sunil Karve's work was on Consumer Satisfaction in India's Ride Hailing Services.

Dr. Ravindra Dey (HoD, HR of Xavier Institute of Management Research) presented The Influence of Leadership Effectiveness on Job Satisfaction and Job Retention.

Ar. Mildred Jose' (Assistant Professor, LS Raheja School of Architecture (LSRSOA)) presentation on The Genesis of 'Othering': Examining Public Spaces for Women, which is interesting and quite

different from the mainstream.

Ms. Rachna (Research Scholar, ADMIFMS) and Dr. Naina Salve also presented a Women centric presentation, titled as- A Bibliometric Analysis of Role of Women in Leading Communities Towards Efficient Waste Management.

In the Digital space, there were another two papers. Dr. Mmahek Chhabria (Ghnashyamdas Saraf College of Arts and Commerce) presented her paper titled as – Go Digital: A Roadmap towards Atmanirbhar Bharat.

Dr Urvi Pillai and Dr. Rejendra Patil's paper was on Fintech and Digital Inclusion.

Post Presentations there was a Summarisation by Mr. Maneesh Gupta, followed by the address





of the Session Chair Dr. Krupa A Rai, Associate Professor, KJ Somaiya Institute of Management Studies and Research and Ph.D guide as well an alumna of Global School in Empirical Research Methods, University of St. Gallen, Switzerland.

After each presentation, Dr. Krupa shared her expert opinions and constructive suggestions to each of the authors. In her address, she discussed the future research directions in the field of business and management. She advised the researchers to be cautious while using Generative AI in their research manuscripts.

She also said that logical understanding and soundness of theory is crucial for academic writing. She congratulated the Organising team for the successful event wherein the merit based selected papers presented the diverse perspectives and diverse learning related to the theme of the conference. She shared some tips for journal publication. She also appreciated some of the papers which has potential for publication in indexed journals.

On the basis of fair evaluation by the blind reviewers and the session chair, two presenters

had been chosen as the Best Paper Awardees. Prize money of ten thousand had been awarded to The Best Paper Awardees Mr. Parth Lajwala & Mr. Maneesh Gupta. Mr Sukeshraj Zallare and Dr. Ashish Hattangadi received the second best paper award and prize money of seven thousand.

The Conference was indeed a grand success as there were lot of learning, exchanging intellectual thoughts and ideas throughout the day.





She explained the key differences between the New and Old tax regimes, and highlighted common financial planning mistakes and underscored the significance of filing tax returns for long-term financial security.





The months of July to September 2025 have been a period of remarkable growth, reflection, and renewed purpose for Ramdhar Maheshwari Career Counseling Centre (RMCC). Through its multifaceted programs, the Centre has continued to strengthen its commitment to holistic student development—fostering emotional well-being, academic progress, and global readiness.

Empowering Through Assessments and Counseling

Throughout the quarter, RMCC administered a diverse range of career assessments, supporting school students, graduates, and working professionals alike. The Centre conducted several psychoeducational and IQ tests to identify learning needs and provide targeted guidance. The steady rise in enrollments for the Career Development Program (CDP) reflects the growing trust and confidence that families place in RMCC’s expertise.

Counselors also facilitated life-coaching and personal skill-building sessions, helping students strengthen confidence, communication, and decision-making abilities. These personalized engagements underscored RMCC’s belief that true career success is achieved when emotional balance and self-awareness form the foundation.

Strengthening Inclusion through Remediation

RMCC’s Special Education team played a pivotal role in ensuring that every child—regardless of learning challenges—received the support they needed. Collaborative planning with teachers and counselors led to the design and implementation of tailored interventions across

partner schools.

Over the three months, more than 300 offline sessions were conducted, accompanied by consistent parent engagement meetings. These collaborative efforts built a strong bridge between school and home, reinforcing strategies to enhance academic performance, confidence, and self-esteem among learners.

Mentorship for College Applications and Readiness

The Mentorship Program remained one of RMCC’s most impactful initiatives this quarter. Jointly led by school and study-abroad counselors, the program continues to guide students through their academic journeys and university application processes—instilling goal clarity, self-discipline, and confidence.

Students began receiving college acceptance letters, a testament to the program’s structured support and the mentors’ unwavering commitment. Beyond academics, mentors also extended emotional and parental support, ensuring families felt heard and reassured during the often-stressful admission phase.

School Counseling and Student Engagement

RMCC’s presence across its partner schools—Ramniwas Bajaj English School (RBHS), Mainadevi Bajaj International School (MBIS), and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English & Sarvodaya Schools (KGES and KGSS)—remained strong and purposeful.

At RBHS, classroom observations, teacher consultations, and over 30 parent meetings facilitated open communication and collaborative problem-solving.

At MBIS, well-being counselors conducted engaging classroom activities on emotional regulation, discipline, and body safety awareness, sensitizing even the youngest learners about personal boundaries through creative and age-appropriate methods.

At KGES, sessions on career counseling and future readiness were organized for Grades 9 and 10, while at KGSS, early-grade assessments revealed significant learning gaps that guided intervention recommendations and future

Below is a summary of our updates and activities from July to September 2025.

HOSTEL OVERVIEW

We at DSWH strongly believe in ensuring that our students have access to all the amenities which would make their stay comfortable and homely. We have washing machines and an area for drying the clothes available in the laundry room itself. We have refrigerators installed on both floors.

Besides this, the students have access to free Wi-Fi and newspapers as well as magazines handy to help them thrive their learnings. One LCD is fixed for the students in Recreational Area. The hostel consists of a recreational area, a Dining Hall, a dry pantry. The corridors of the hostel are naturally lit and ventilated by big skylights.

We serve two meals i.e. Breakfast and Dinner respectively. The dining area is of sufficient capacity with 2 inductions and a microwave available for the utility purpose. We also have 2 lifts (1 main and an emergency lift) along with a supply of water and electricity for all 24 hours. The aqua guards are also installed on both the floors.

Recently we added Volleyball, Basketball, Carrom, Chess and Badminton for our students' physical growth. Students have started making sports groups for internal sports competitions.

Damaged doors were replaced. Several rooms have been repainted, and minor patchwork has been carried out wherever necessary. Hostel committees have been formed to address students' concerns and resolve their queries without delay. The Food Committee is playing a key role by preparing the menu in consultation with student groups. The Sports Committee is actively involved in organizing inter-hostel competitions to foster sportsmanship among

students. The Cultural Committee is also preparing plans for upcoming festivals and events to encourage student participation and engagement.

The hostel is close to the railway station, bus stand, and airport, ensuring that students can commute to their colleges and other destinations with ease.

The hostel consists of students preparing for various professional courses, including MBA, BBA, , CA, Engineering, Fine Arts and students preparing for CAT. Amenities & Facilities provided


